



## Maestro Gregory Woodbridge



Gregory Woodbridge assumed the role of Music Director and Conductor for the Hershey Symphony in the spring of 2023 after captivating audiences as the principal guest conductor in previous seasons.

Currently celebrating his 11th season as the Associate Conductor of the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra, Maestro Woodbridge wears multiple musical hats. He not only guides the artistic endeavors of the orchestra but also leads the Harrisburg Symphony Youth Orchestra (HSYO) and serves as Director of Education for the Harrisburg Symphony.

A proud alumnus of Penn State University, Maestro Woodbridge honed his conducting skills under the tutelage of renowned mentors such as Michael Jinbo at the Pierre Monteux Conducting Institute, Leonid Korchmar at the Kirov Opera and St. Petersburg Conservatory, Ennio Nicotra (founder of the Ilya Musin Society), and received invaluable insights from Gustav Meier and JoAnn Falletta at the Conductor's Institute Richmond Symphony Masterclass.

Prior to his current roles, he served as a music educator for over 25 years. Maestro Woodbridge served as the Music Director and Conductor of Central Pennsylvania Symphony and various youth orchestras, including the Wednesday Club Youth Orchestra and the York Youth Symphony Orchestra.

Playing piano since age 7 and violin since age 9, Maestro Woodbridge has also conducted the York Symphony, PMEA Region IV-V State Orchestra Festival, Lebanon Valley College Community Orchestra, and the Messiah College Orchestra. His ability to evoke impassioned performances has garnered acclaim from orchestras spanning the spectrum, from student ensembles to seasoned professionals.

Maestro Woodbridge resides in Mechanicsburg, PA, with his wife Heather and their two children, Delaney and Liam. He is honored to serve the Hershey Symphony and help grow the orchestra after an exceptional first 55 years.

Gregg Mauroni has most recently served as adjunct professor at Penn State's University Park campus, honored to be the conductor of Essence of Joy, one of five choral ensembles in the Penn State School of Music. Mr. Mauroni's studies in Music Education have explored how participation in a choral ensemble has been shown to increase wellness, including physical, mental, and emotional wellnesses. Further areas of focus are maximizing expressivity in choral performance through conductor gesture and ensemble communication.

He has served as the Assistant Director of Music and Arts at Monumental AME Church in Steelton, PA, and Director of Music for First Presbyterian Church of Succasunna, NJ. He remains an invited accompanist, clinician, vocal coach, and commissioned arranger for many individual musicians and ensembles.

### The Hershey Symphony Foundation

The Hershey Symphony Orchestra Foundation was established to ensure the long-term future of the Symphony. Established as a supporting foundation in 1988, it receives, holds, and invests permanent gifts in an endowment fund, with on-going distributions that directly benefit the Hershey Symphony Orchestra. Governed by a board of directors made up of members of the community and the orchestra, it depends upon the support of friends like you who treasure the innovation and artistic excellence of the Hershey Symphony Orchestra.

Gifts to the Foundation provide long-term support to the Orchestra. In addition to making cash gifts, planned gifts can be made in a variety of ways, including beneficiary designations for your retirement plan, life insurance, investment accounts, or remembering the Hershey Symphony Orchestra in your will or living trust. Qualified retirement plans, such as traditional Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) and 40l(k) plans, may be the most tax-efficient way to make a planned gift to the Foundation. These assets have never been taxed and, as a charitable organization, the Foundation would not have to pay any taxes on a gift from a retirement plan. Gifts of appreciated securities are another tax-efficient donation in which the Foundation receives the full market value of the securities. The donor claims the same amount on their tax return and avoids the capital gains assessment on a future sale. Lastly, if you are 70½ or older, you can instruct your IRA custodian to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). QCDs can fulfill some or all of your annual required minimum distribution. They are excluded from taxable income, but they do not produce a charitable contribution deduction.




