

Vermont Raingarden Native Plant List

The following plants have been selected because they are tolerant of both occasional inundation and drier periods. However, the 'zone' column describes whether you should place the plant in the wettest spots in your raingarden (W) where water will pond during a rain event, slightly moist areas (M) or around the drier, drained edges of the garden (D). All are native species to Vermont, and should need minimal maintenance once established. Your raingarden will be most successful if you buy one or two-year old plants to transplant into your garden instead of using seed, although seeding is also acceptable if you are on a tight budget. Do not harvest plants from the wild.
