Dear Joint Review Panel members,

I'm writing to express serious concerns about the Frontier Oil Sands Mine Project, proposed by Teck Resources.

The proposed mine would disrupt critical habitat for endangered caribou and bison herds and undermine the treaty rights of local First Nations who rely on them for food and cultural practices. In fact, the mine is proposed for an area that the Athabasca Chipewyan First Nation has declared off limits to industrial development. Both the Athabasca Chipewyan First Nation and the Mikisew Cree First Nation oppose the project, and I urge the panel to respect their opposition.

Furthermore, the project would produce an unacceptable level of greenhouse gas emissions. The Frontier project is incompatible with Alberta's 100 MT cap on oil sands emissions, and would undermine Canada's ability to achieve the emissions reduction targets required to meet our Paris Climate Accord commitments.

The Teck Frontier Oil Sands Mine would threaten endangered species, undermine Indigenous rights and unleash unacceptable levels of greenhouse gas emissions. I urge you to reject this project.

While I recognise that economic activity is deemed a social good and that development is considered necessary I question whether development should be exempt from the normal economic considerations of costs and benefits.

My observation of mega-projects, particularly in the mining sector, is that nearly invariantly the decision to proceed entirely neglects to consider the true cost of clean up in the aftermath of development.

The Alberta Tar Sands development has been controversial since I was first taught about it in the 1960s and the spectacle of the ruin that this development has made of Canada's north is a mute testament of why it was, and remains, controversial.

The mess that some profit driven companies have made of our environment is, with small exception, left to the public to bear. Whether through persistent degradation of our environment or through the expenditure of vast amounts of public money to ameliorate the injuries.

There is only one way where development on the scale proposed is acceptable and that is on the basis of cleaning up as one goes. Of course, insisting on this often will make such projects 'uneconomic' to their proponents. Which reveals all one needs to know about the 'economic' arguments in their favour.

Leaving the cost of remediation to the end of a project's economic life is a guarantee of the public dealing with a corporate shell without assets to finance the task required. Taking money 'on account' to deal with future remediation is equally disingenuous. These funds are never reserved to use for their intended purpose and the costs of remediation always greatly exceed any accrued reserve in any case.

I am neither blind to the political issues which underlie these decisions nor to the excessive influence that large amounts of money seems to have on our elected officials and public officers. One does not have to take a bribe to benefit from deciding in favour big money. I wish to bring to your attention a number of serious concerns about the proposed Teck Frontier Oil Sands Mine.

Having lived and worked as an Ecologist in Northern Alberta for several years, I am aware of the details of this proposal, many of which make me very concerned for the long-term environmental and cultural impacts on this region. This proposal has been through many rounds of Supplementary Information Requests but there is good evidence that it has been advanced through the EIA process because of tight deadlines and confusion over the previous government's changes to the Environmental Assessment Act, rather than the merits of the application. This has left many major unresolved issues as the project is about to be presented for the panel.

The proposed mine would disrupt critical habitat for Woodland Caribou and Wood Bison (in particular, leading to potential disruption of the disease-free status of the Ronald Lake Bison Herd). The proposed mine is directly on the migratory pathway and breeding area of a number of birds that are Species At Risk, which have not been adequately surveyed or assessed in this region or in Canada (examples include the Whooping Crane, Yellow Rail, Common Nighthawk, Cliff Swallow, Barn Swallow, Tree Swallow, Red Knot, Upland Sandpiper, Ruddy Turnstone, Solitary Sandpiper, American Golden-Plover, Bar-tailed Godwit, Short-billed Dowitcher, Dunlin, Olive-sided Flycatcher, Canada Warbler, and Rusty Blackbird). Furthermore, current (and proposed) methods of assessing and mitigating impacts on migratory and breeding birds are extremely inadequate, particularly for birds other than waterfowl (e.g. passerines, shorebirds, and aerial insectivores).

Teck has also failed to articulate how it plans on mitigating the impacts of invasive plant species, industrial noise (including noise from the proposed airport), and light pollution (with potential to impact Wood Buffalo's status as a Dark Sky Preserve).

The mine will also impact the rights of Indigenous people, including the Mikisew Cree, Athabasca Chipewyan, and Metis. The proposal has not adequately outlined impacts on these people, including impacts to their health, livelihoods, and spiritual and cultural wellbeing, as well as access to traditional territories. Teck has not provided clear ways of mitigating these impacts.

Furthermore, the project would produce an unacceptable level of emissions of contaminants (PACs, PAHs, and methyl mercury) and greenhouse gases. The Frontier project is incompatible with Alberta's 100 MT cap on oil sands emissions, and would undermine Canada's ability to achieve the emissions reduction targets required to meet our Paris Climate Accord commitments.


