The factory existed from 1887 to 1904, but at the given address only 1887-1888. Our sheet is signed on Herz-Ober („Attila“) by the engraver: „Jos: Sürch 60“, who had made the pack for Georg Geiselreiter from Wiener Neustadt. Another version was offered around 1860-65 by Jozsef Wilner from Pest. Picture cards and aces (deuces) depict historical figures from Hungary's history.

Daveluy advertises here his „Collection de Gravures sur Pierre, Réhaussés en or et couleurs Exécutés à la Lithographie“ (Collection of stone engravings, heightened with gold and colors, executed in lithography). The year 1841 is mentioned possibly because Daveluy married in that year and the couple moved to the new workshop. The card is signed „KINSBERGEN. FET“ (Isidore van Kinsbergen 1821-1905?, see wiki).







The sheet is signed: „A Paris Chez N Arnoult rue de la Fromagerie a l'Image S. Claude aux halles [...]“ (at the store sign with St. Claude at the Halles). According to caption, the pompous lover is abandoned as soon as he runs out of money. A friend of the gambling lady, standing behind his back, helps to speed things up with a mirror. The ladies wear Fontange hairstyles: upswept hair garnished with lace, the introduction of which is attributed to the Duchess of Fontanges, a mistress of Louis XIV.

All boxes are signed „mariaval le Jeune a Paris fecit“ on the inside lid, each is dedicated to a suit: red = spades, white = hearts, yellow = clubs and green = diamonds. The lids have an ornate dial with an opening revealing the numbers 1, 2, etc. to X, probably to record the tricks in a game like the then very fashionable quadrille. They are further decorated with dancing people, including a hunchback and a drunk, in a border of pomegranate branches. On the inside of the lids are lush flowers, inside are 19 to 20 oblong (about 10x70 mm) and 4 to 5 rectangular (about 23x37 mm) game chips of the corresponding color, decorated on both sides, the latter being inscribed with a value. The bottoms have not been forgotten, there we have animals, a swan, a butterfly, a grasshopper and a fox. The metal parts are made of gold-plated brass.

The large case rubbed, the inner lining damaged, the small boxes slightly rubbed, the inner lid of the red box somewhat damaged at the edge, otherwise very good conservation.

The sheet is signed: „A Paris chez Bance rue St. Denis près celle aux Ours“. The engraver and publisher J.-L. Bance, called „Bance aîné“ (Bance the Elder, 1761-1847), resided there around 1800-1805. Satirical sheet showing the Prince of Wales, later George IV, as a chubby young man in a colorful costume. He holds a halberd in his right hand and a flask of rum in his left, with his regiment of Jacks of Spades standing at attention in front of him. His father, King George III, and his mother, Queen Charlotte, encourage him from the left. Background: In 1803, Bonaparte had a large army camp set up at Boulogne-sur-Mer in preparation for the invasion of England. The Prince of Wales was known as an easy going man, holding a then already antiquated weapon, an allusion to the British sergeants' pike, and commanding an army of paper soldiers.





The sheet is signed: „A Paris chez Bance rue St. Denis près celle aux Ours“. The engraver and publisher J.-L. Bance, called „Bance aîné“ (Bance the Elder, 1761-1847), resided there around 1800-1805. And it carries the mention: „dessiné et gravé par ch..... [sic]“ (drawn and engraved by ch.....) A young man has lost everything at the game, he wants to shoot himself in the head and has already written a suicide note, when his wife rushes in and holds his infant out to him. There are cards on the floor, and card players in the back room.

Maker's name on King of Diamonds, Queen of Clubs, Jack of Spades, 9 of Clubs, 9 of Diamonds and 8 of Spades. Circa 1810.

The court cards represent Roman gods and goddesses (Jupiter, Juno, Mercury...), while aces and numerals are transformed. Here we see a potpurri of scenes, from the Chinese pagoda to the „suprême bon ton“ (the highest good taste = people according to the latest fashion), a boxing match, an Arab bivouac... Funny images printed on pages numbered from 1 to 8 (one number per rank, king = 1, ace = 4 and then the numerals from the 7 to the 10), just as in the Donation Marteau. Our impressions are on somewhat firmer card stock. Mozard is not listed in either Duchartre/Saulnier [1944] or D'Allemagne. In 1808, he places an advertisement in a newspaper informing confectioners that he has in stock all kinds of papers with mottoes, rebuses, songs, etc. (as wrappers, inserts?)

According to Depaulis, he was active from 1803 to 1828. Besides playing cards, he also made cardboard and all kinds of papers for office use (see „Nota“ at the end of the sheet).

BnF calls him „Teissier“, gives for him the dates of 1819 to 1830 and dates the sheet around 1823. Grotesque figures play écarté at 2 tables, in the background we see a couple dancing.



Behind her a pensive devil, all around all kinds of people looking into the cards. Jeuxanciensdecollection.com reproduces our sheet and calls it the cover illustration of a game. According to the same Coyen was active from 1868 till 1900.



The cards caricature the opponents of the Jewish staff captain Alfred Dreyfus (1859-1935). After a bogus antisemitic trial, he was sentenced to life imprisonment in 1894. New evidence and the intervention of major personalities led in the end to his vindication in 1906. King of Diamonds (FELIX) shows President Félix Faure; Jack of Diamonds, Jack of Clubs and Jack of Hearts display the nationalist writers and politicians Rochefort, Déroulède and Drumont, while Jack of Spades is marked by a black star in a corner: we see here the staff officer Esterhazy, who faked the principal piece of evidence against Dreyfus.

Hardly any evidence of Johann Müller's export activity survives, but it is documented, as Max Ruh reports in *Schaffhauser Spielkarten*, 2005, pp. 41-42: After he [Johannes Müller I] had also included the Spanish-suited cards in his assortment, he tried to gain access to the South American market in 1869.



Breitkopf suspects that the origin of playing cards lies in the Orient, he derives the game from chess, traces the words Naipes (Spanish) and Naibi (Italian) back to the Arabian and discerns the relationship between the Italian, German and French suit signs: it is the way things actually stand. He discusses the pharaonic thesis of Court de Gebelin, which he calls an agreeable joke.

The plates illustrate the 22 trumps of the Besançon Tarot, the ones, as Breitkopf says, that, according to C. de Gebelin, should date back to the 7th century BC, 9 cards from the copper-engraved deck after Schongauer (15th century, Albertina [1974] pp. 76-78 and 81-82), various German cards from the 17th century, Chinese cards and games, paper mills and a Japanese paper factory.
