FROM THE DESK OF RABBI ROSENBAUM

Can you read the photograph on the right?

Give it a try — take a minute if you need.

OK, if you haven't figured it out yet, don't feel bad; it took me a little bit of time when I first saw it. This is what it says:

"Intelligence is the ability to adapt to change." — Stephen Hawking

The legendary scientist, who died this past March, almost certainly didn't compose the quote with numbers.

Rather, this t-shirt is an exercise in the very meaning of its words, asking us to take an everyday activity — reading — and to twist it by substituting some of the letters with numbers whose shapes somewhat resemble those letters.

On one hand, the challenge of reading this t-shirt is ridiculous — when are we ever going to need to read numbers like letters? But on the other hand, the challenge illustrates the importance of stretching our minds to places they've never gone.

When you think about it, most great works of human progress emerged from people doing things just as unusual as reading numbers like letters. The heart of the scientific process is experimentation, the act of doing things that seem absurd until something new and important is created. Great works of art were formed by men and women who dared to make something unique that spoke to their hopes and fears. The most impactful political and social movements were borne from leaders who took striking chances to make their ideas heard. The common thread in these great achievements were people who saw that the world had changed, and who knew that they needed to think boldly and differently if they had any chance to move society forward.

And now we face change once more. Believe it or not, we're a little more than one month away from Rosh Hashanah, from a yet another Jewish new year. Maybe it's easy to say, "Here we go again," or to marvel at how quickly the previous year passed. But we aren't satisfied just going through the motions once again, are we? It can't be good enough to assume that we'll approach the same way this year as we did last year, right?

Indeed, as we approach 5779, let us dedicate ourselves to adapting to change, to take stock of society as it evolves faster than ever before. And then, let us try new and different ways at approaching the challenges of the day.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hello Congregants,

We hope that you are enjoying your summer and that you are trying to stay cool.

We, here at your synagogue's office, continue to be diligent in keeping you and your families safe. In that regard, we are pleased to share that we have changed the configuration of the exterior doors leading to the administrative offices. New magnetic locks (Mag Locks) have been installed and we have removed the center post between the doors, which was a potential safety hazard.

What does this mean for you? You will hit the buzzer on the exterior wall to enter the building, same as usual. We will buzz you in, unlocking the door, same as usual. When you leave the building, there is a pad, marked "exit" on the right side of the interior wall. You will hit that exit pad and the door on the right will unlock and then lock behind you once you leave.

Many thanks to Kenny Barfield and our Building & Grounds Committee chairs, Al Hawkins and Chet Fischbein and Building and Grounds Committee members, Ellen Hoffman and Linda Krawcheck who partnered with the team in the office to make these changes.

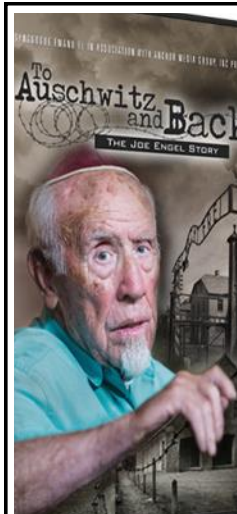

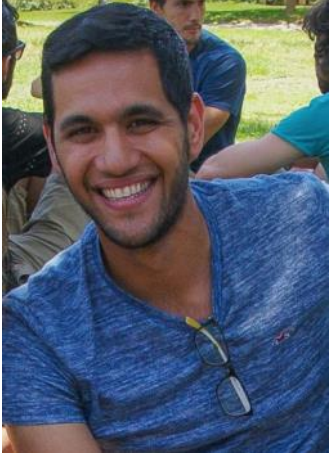
