# RABBI RONA SHAPIRO

This week's parasha begins with the commandment to keep Shabbat. Despite the importance and presumable urgency in the building of the mishkan, the portable sanctuary in the desert, its construction is preceded by the commandment to keep Shabbat. In other words, the building project will not override Shabbat. Shabbat will be essential to its sanctity just as the copper utensils and golden accoutrements are.

The word sabbatical comes from the word Sabbath and the concept itself comes from the custom of shemitah or sabbatical in the Torah in which the land is rested every seven years. A sabbatical is a longer Shabbat, a chance to stop, breathe, and notice.

As you know, I was on sabbatical for the month of January. Before my sabbatical, I wrote to you about all my exciting plans. The one thing I hadn't planned on was omicron, and omicron unfortunately upset all my plans — literally everything I planned was cancelled. As one thing after another fell, like dominoes, in mid-December, I became anxious and concerned. How would I have a sabbatical? Maybe I should just postpone it?

In the end, I decided that I really needed the time — it has been a very intense couple of years — and I would figure out how to best make use of it.

I am thrilled and grateful to report that it was everything I needed and more. I got some much needed rest and relaxation. I found time to meditate more regularly, to read, to cook, and to move according to my own rhythms. Several conversations with colleagues helped me clarify my thoughts about the synagogue and where I wanted to go with it and how we might start to shape a future after this pandemic. I gained some much needed perspective. I spent a few days at a retreat center in northern Connecticut, walking in the snow, writing by the fire, eating delicious meals,

and joining in compline, their evening prayers. I began working on my book in earnest, and although I have not been able to return to it since I came back to work, I have a sense of what it is and where it is going. I can't say it's exactly real yet, but it's more real than it was a month ago, and I am actively thinking about how to find some more chunks of time to keep it going. In the face of so many cancellations, I also told David we had to go somewhere warm for a week and lie on the beach, and so we headed south to Miami where we had a wonderful time.

In the end, I felt myself come back into myself in ways that had been missing for a while. I think that is what we mean when we say, "Shabbat vayinfash" God stopped [creating] and was ensouled. All the things that we do can sometimes take up a lot of room inside of us, and we can lose touch with our souls. Shabbat — stopping, breathing, being — is a powerful practice through which we reconnect.

Through your generosity, I had a full month of Shabbat. And my soul was restored. I am also grateful that every week I return to Shabbat, it anchors my week. Throughout the pandemic, even in the many weeks and months when it was just David and me alone, we set the table in the dining room on Friday and ate Shabbat lunch and dinner there. During a time when every day was groundhog day, it gave structure and meaning to our week.

I know that everyone is not able or may not be ready to celebrate 25 hours of Shabbat each week. But could you light candles and enjoy them for 10 minutes? Could you have dinner in the dining room without cellphones? Could you go for a long walk on Shabbat and leave your phones home? It's not all or nothing, but I can promise you that any bit of Shabbat you keep, will help you restore your soul. When we stop filling our lives with all the things that keep us busy, we can fill them with what really matters and discover that we are not, in fact, human "doings" but rather human beings. We can gain back our souls.

Thank you again for this invaluable gift.


And, then, there is a unique opportunity for a mindful moment to pause and look all around the sanctuary and to feel the love from all assembled to celebrate your simcha.

# **JCARR's Newest Family**

In August 2021 Shokoria, a 28-year-old Afghan woman with four children in tow, made her way through the chaos of Kabul onto a plane bound for the United States. She was among the approximately 83,000 Aghans who were evacuated to the U.S. in what the Department



of Homeland Security calls Operation Allies Welcome. In February, 2022, the Jewish Community Alliance for Refugee Resettlement (JCARR) became the family's co-sponsor group with Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services (IRIS). Shokoria and the four children are the seventh family that JCARR has co-sponsored since its founding in 2015.

In addition to Shokoria, the family includes three daughters, aged 9, 7, and 9 months, as well as her husband's nephew, aged 14, whose father is dead and whose mother remains in Afghanistan. Shokoria's husband, Mohamad, is currently in Dubai, anxiously awaiting a visa to join the rest of the family in New Haven. He worked as an interpreter for the U.S. military for 18 years and speaks excellent English. Several JCARR volunteers have already spoken with him by phone, and he has provided helpful information about the family. The nephew speaks some English, but the rest of the family does not. They are eager to start learning.

Shokoria and the children have been in New Haven since November, living in a small apartment with Mohamad's brother, who arrived here two years ago. Finding and furnishing an affordable apartment and helping Shokoria and the children move in were just the first steps on the journey to resettling this family. In addition, JCARR has already begun taking them to their initial health assessments at Fair Haven Community Health Center. They will receive COVID and other vaccinations, and begin to get regular check-ups and necessary treatment. JCARR will help them apply for social services, such as SNAP, Medicaid, and cash assistance, and direct them to local food pantries. We will enroll the children in school and arrange for Shokoria to go to ESL classes. She does not read or write, which will make adjusting to life here even more challenging, especially in terms of finding a job. Financial independence will be difficult for Shokoria

without Mohamad here to work. JCARR will help her learn how to manage.



Shokoria and her family arrived in the U.S. with "Humanitarian Parole." This means that the usual vetting required for a visa or refugee status was waived because of the humanitarian crisis that developed when the Americans withdrew from Afghanistan and the Taliban gained control. Humanitarian Parole allows the family to stay in the U.S. for two years with authorization to work and to receive government benefits. However, it does not provide a path to permanent residence. The family will need a lawyer to help them apply for asylum. Once asylum is granted, they can apply for permanent residence. They will also need a lawyer to help Mohamad obtain the documents needed for him to join the family in New Haven. An American veteran with whom Mohamad worked has already begun this lengthy legal process, and JCARR has procured an excellent pro bono immigration lawyer who will work on the case.

As JCARR volunteers get to know Shokoria and her children, we see them as unique individuals with distinctive personalities. We see their resilience, hope, and courage, as well as their fear, sadness, and anxiety. We also gain a better understanding of how international crises and national policies play out in the lives of individuals. We can't solve the crises that caused refugees to flee their homes, or shape the U.S. policies that determine how they are treated here. But we can furnish a home for them, show them how to take their children to school and to the doctor, and help them on their way to making a new life in a new country.

JCARR needs volunteers to help with the continuing support offered to families as they settle in. We need drivers to transport families to doctors' appointments, ESL classes, and other important meetings. If you are available to drive, please contact Joel Jacobson at jjacobson@ snet.net . Drivers with minivans or SUVs capable of carrying 5-6 passengers would be especially helpful for transporting Shokoria's family, but sedans are fine for transporting other families.

Two of our teachers shared what's been happening in their classrooms this fall.

#### Morah Rashi Mendelson - Grades 3 and 4

The children of the third and fourth grades learned all about the Aron (holy ark) in the Tabernacle: how it was made, and who carried it, as well as about their clothing and the clothing of the kohen gadol (the high priest). The students each made a choshen (breastplate), and immediately put it on and wore it home.

After this project, they continued to learn about the story of Purim and the four mitzvot of Purim. We will continue to have the students make their very own Megillat Esther, during the next few weeks.

After that, their next project will be the Passover Haggadah to be used at home for the Seder.



#### Morah Taly Ashkenazi - Grades 5 and 6

It was a pleasure seeing everyone back in class again. We enjoyed the Zoom time together because we were able to use our computers in many productive ways. For example, we played some Hebrew words game, watched videos in relation to our curriculum about the Jewish life cycle and even saw images and videos about Israel and Zionism's history (like the symbol of the state, Herzl, and Eliezer Ben-Yehuda).

Since we are back at school, we continued, as always, with our prayer book, learning prayers and the roots of common prayer words. We also progressed with our biblical stories unit and recently learned about Samson. In the Israel curriculum, we started to learn about the people of the state, and what Sabra really means. And, what we really enjoyed doing recently is working together on our Purim part of the play.

# **Selling Chametz**

Chametz is the general term for all leavened foods. Foods and drinks with ingredients of wheat, rye, barley, oats, or spelt, as well as derivatives of these grains, are presumed to be chametz unless they are reliably certified "Kosher for Passover." Any chametz owned by a Jew during the week of Passover is forbidden for actual use forever. Chametz that one is not inclined to discard may be disposed of via sale to a non-Jew. You may authorize Rabbi Shapiro to serve as your agent to effect such a sale.

All chametz in your possession should be collected and locked in a spare room, closet, or trunk. All chametz dishes and utensils should also be placed in a special room or closet until after Pesach, after having been thoroughly scoured and cleansed. You should then see the rabbi personally to authorize a bill of sale. If that is not possible, simply mail this form to the rabbi. It is customary to make a donation for tzedakah as part of this transaction.



A Zoom Presentation on her poetry collection

# "Many to Remember"

Many to Remember enters the archive's unconscious to reveal the melodies hidden within the language of the past. The collection unravels Kaufman's historical research of New Mexican crypto-Jews and the Mexican Inquisition alongside the poet's own family histories. The book navigates questions of memory, transmission, media, and translation and asks: How can poetry translate history and the rhythms and form of the archive?



Rachel Kaufman is currently pursuing a PhD in Latin American and Jewish History at UCLA. Her poetry has appeared on poets.org and in the Harvard Review, Southwestern American Literature, Western Humanities Review, JuxtaProse, and elsewhere, and her prose has appeared in the Yale Historical Review and Rethinking History. She received a BA in English and History from Yale University.

In the archive, the poet calls to the past, and the past responds. Her family narrative intertwines with remote chapters of her people's chronicle; the struggles of grandparents and great-grandparents are juxtaposed with the struggles of the Marranos in the southwest of the seventeenth century which she devotedly studies. Histories overlap; life stories resonate; unexpected parallels emerge. Translation is the key: "At the edge of words," she tells her ghosts, "I accompany you, seeing." From poem to poem in this deeply moving first book, Rachel Kaufman keeps the commandment: Zakhor! Remember! - Norman Finkelstein

History's pieces do not arrive to us whole. But in poems, they are set afloat, as the poet puts it in "Me'am Lo'ez": "We're told/our souls will grow/accustomed to hearing echoes/of our customs—these chantings/set apart from myth to keep/some holiness adrift." To receive these pieces is to experience some of this holiness. - Jake Marmer in Tablet Magazine



# BIRD AND NATURE WALK AT MILFORD AUDUBON CENTER


Sunday May 22 at 1:30 pm




