MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

As summer rapidly approaches, the Board wishes all of KAJ's members an enjoyable, safe and restful summer season.

FROM THE RABBINATE: SHEMITA 5782 UPDATE

The following products of Eretz Yisroel on the American market are subject to Isur Sefichin: cherry tomatoes, peppers, scallions, carrots, young potatoes, and almost all other vegetables, as well as all herbs that grow like vegetables (e.g., dill, parsley), but not those which grow on bushes.

The "season" of Kedushas Sheviis for **fruits** from Eretz Yisroel is about to start. Currently, it affects only fruit that is not sold on the American market (such as peaches, nectarines, lemons, and lychees). Over the summer, Kedushas Sheviis will begin to affect fruits available in the USA, including:

*Mangos, as of the beginning of July

*Pomegranates, as of mid-July

*Avocados, as of the end of July

*Oranges, mandarins, and grapefruits, as of the end of August

Kedushas Shevi'is

I. A product that has Kedushas Shevi'is should not be purchased. If such a product was mistakenly purchased, it should not be returned to the store. Instead, the product may be consumed, and one must

save any peels, pits, and other leftovers in a bag until they are completely decomposed and rotted, at which point they may be discarded. There are **no** Terumos and Maasros on Peiros Shevi'is.

2. Please note: a) Before purchasing, check the bag or box for any note of its being a "product of Israel."
b) The above-mentioned Hilchos Shemita must only be observed in the event that it is clear that the product comes from Eretz Yisroel. Otherwise, one may purchase the product as usual (on the presumption that most products of that kind do not come from Eretz Yisroel).

Isur Sefichin

The prohibition known as Isur Sefichin for vegetables and herbs applies to those which have started to grow during the Shemita year—this is an Isur DeRabbonon. The same prohibition applies to legumes which have not grown a third of their growth before the beginning of Shemita. In the case of Isur Sefichin, their consumption is prohibited; however, since they have Kedushas Shevi'is, if purchased they should be kept until completely decomposed and rotted.

This Isur, like all other Isurei DeRabbonon concerning foodstuffs, also affects any Keilim involved.

Anyone who finds vegetables other than those mentioned above, currently on the market and marked as imported from Israel, is asked to please inform the Rabbinat.

Please note: Currently, mandarin oranges from Israel are being sold in stores in our area. These mandarins do **not** have Kedushas Shevi'is; they may be purchased, and Terumos and Maasros must be taken.

SHOVUOS 5782

Our Beis Knesses was once again resplendent in flowers and greenery, as befitting Zeman Mattan Toroseinu. This year, even the central Ner Tomid was swathed in flowers, and two smaller crowns adorned the bench at the back of the Almamar (both visible in the pictures, following). Since this "transformation" begins about two days before Yom Tov, some of our Yeshiva's classes were able to catch a glimpse of the work in progress. Our many thanks go to Mr. Avram Gutmann for the dedication and work involved in this annual "עבודת פרה," as well as to his able crew—Messrs. Chazon Ezra Lasdun led the Tefillos on both Shabbos Parashas Bemidbar (Erev Shovuos) and the second day of Yom Tov. Mr. Levi davened on the first day of Yom Tov. Chazon Lasdun leined and read the Akdomus on the first day, while Mr. Dovid Herbsman leined the second day (and at the first day's 4:20 AM Hashkomo Minyon). Mr. Kenny Sommer led all three days' Tefillos at Hashkomo. Thanks are due to them all, as well as the Choir, for ensuring the dignity and beauty of the Tefillos.



The annual Shavuot-night learning took place in both the Beis Medrash and Moller Hall. Rav Mantel spoke to the assembled at one AM.

Rav Mantel gave the Yom Tov lecture on the first day of Shavuot, after Mincha in Shul. The Rav discussed the necessary prerequisite of Yiras Shomayim for truly learning and internalizing Torah.

On the second day of Yom Tov, after Yizkor-Matnas Yad, Rav Mantel spoke in Shul, and discussed the obligation we have with sharing our rich Torah-heritage with the less affiliated of our brethren. In the afternoon, a MatnasYad reception was held at the home of Rav and Rebbetzin Mantel, allowing a grateful Kehilla to thank the Rabbonim for the Brochos bestowed during Matnas Yad, as well as to fulfill the dictum of Chazal, to visit one's Rav on Yom Tov.

After Mincha, a Neilas HaChag was held in Moller Hall. Mr. Alan Ettlinger, in his introductory remarks noted that the event was sponsored leZecher Nishmas Moreinu Dr. Raphael Moller—whose Yahrzeit is on Isru Chag Shavuot—by the Moller family. Mr. Ettlinger also expressed his and the Kehilla's gratitude to all those who made Yom Tov as special as it was. Those present then heard some thoughts with which to conclude the Yom Tov from Rav Mantel and Rabbi Avrohom Hoffman.

children. To fully enumerate all the Avodos HaKodesh they have been, and are, involved in would be a lengthier task than the space here allows.

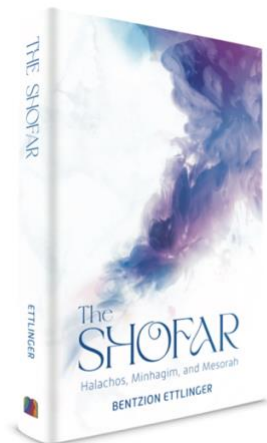

Whether the subject was Regents Mathematics, Gemoro, or the Aleph-Beis, Rabbi Weis instilled a love of learning, and a palpable Yiras Shomayim, as he not only imparted knowledge to his students but served as a sterling role model for them of Ahavas Torah and Midos Tovos. **SHINING SPOTLIGHTS**

SPOTLIGHT ON: Gidon and Ruthy Feigenbaum

What's It Like To: Move to Israel

Every single member of the community is precious and when anyone leaves Washington Heights it is a great loss. When a family makes aliyah, however, it is certainly with joy (and maybe a bit of envy) that we bid them farewell. This past summer, Gidon and Ruthy Feigenbaum moved to Eretz Yisrael with their children. They were gracious enough to share their experience with us.

KAJN: What made you decide to move to Israel? When did you start thinking about it?

Gidon: When my oldest son, Yeshaya, decided to stay in Israel after yeshiva and became a lone soldier, I understood that he had made the right decision and that we had to follow. I felt like I was doing something wrong when I traveled to Israel, prayed at the Kotel and then turned my back, returning on the next plane back to New York. It meant that I considered my life in the diaspora as “normal” or, worse, that I preferred it over living in Eretz Yisrael. I also had the concern that my sons would embrace an American lifestyle, especially the mentality and being absorbed into general culture.

Ruthy: Gidon and I met and got married in Israel. Initially, Gidon was learning, and Israel was great for that, but ultimately, we had to decide where we wanted to start our life and family. It was a difficult decision because, although we would have liked to stay in Israel, we were afraid that we would not be able to make a living. I guess we just weren't ready at the time. But we always wondered if we had made the right choice.

KAJN: Can you tell us about the process of making aliyah? Was the process affected by COVID in any way?

Gidon: The overall process took roughly 3 years. The main consideration was our two younger sons' schooling. When our second son, Gavriel, indicated that he would also want to live in Israel, we waited until our third son, Ezra, finished high school. COVID had a big effect in delaying the application process, making it more difficult in dealing with the various offices. But good planning ahead solved this problem.

Ruthy: First I have to say that Rule #1 in making aliyah is that you just have to have a lot of bitachon! Just when you think your ducks are in a row...you get surprises (many surprises! Including UPS losing our paperwork on its way back from receiving its final seal of authenticity from Albany - See

Rule #1 and start over!).

COVID was also one of our surprises. Due to COVID, many government offices were closed for a while, which made the process of getting paperwork and government seals of authenticity (apostilles) a lot more difficult. Interviews were conducted on Zoom and obtaining paperwork needed appointments, which could only happen once the government offices reopened.

We used Nefesh B'Nefesh to help us organize our paperwork and follow the application process. Their website has a lot of helpful resources. Once you have all of your paperwork, with all of the official apostilles, NBN lets you know that you're now ready to approach the Jewish Agency and ask for an appointment to initiate your aliyah. We got an appointment and handed in our paperwork and then we were assigned an aliyah shaliach who scheduled an interview with us (via Zoom, of course). The interview was really quite enjoyable; we had a really nice and helpful shaliach who held our hands throughout and raised a ruckus when our paperwork got stuck in a bureaucratic log jam later on. He approved our request in April and said that we were on track to make aliyah in July and sent our paperwork on to the office of the interior (Misrad HaPnim) in Israel. There it sat...and sat...and sat... while we sweated and postponed our lift TWICE. Then we just had the bitachon to pack up our stuff and ship it off to Israel and two days later (on the day that we thought we would be landing in Israel) we got our approval! After being approved we brought our passports to the Jewish Agency to receive our aliyah visas and we booked our flight!

KAJN: Were your children involved in the decision? What were their thoughts about moving?

Gidon: Our children were definitely involved in the process especially the two youngest ones who needed a lot of explanation and preparation regarding learning a new language, schooling and how to find new friends outside Washington Heights.

Ruthy: We took them to the Nefesh B'Nefesh Aliyah Fair so that they could see all of the information and ask questions (they had a special program just for kids!) and they were really a big part of the decision.

KAJN: How did you decide which area suited you best?

Gidon: We decided to land in Ramat Beit Shemesh because of our two younger children. The school where we send them has an integrated ulpan and we knew that they would be able to find enough English speakers in order to make new friendships. Also, the city of Beit Shemesh has plenty of connections to Tel Aviv or to Jerusalem, allowing for an easy commute to work. On the other hand, one downside of living in RBS is that you can get by without Hebrew. It makes it more difficult to learn Hebrew when one is not fully immersed in the language. Ultimately, in the future, we envision a more

rural life in the periphery of the country.

KAJN: Please tell us about some of the benefits of living in Eretz Yisrael.

Gidon: The main benefit of living in Eretz Yisrael is to be able to fulfill the mitzvah of Yishuv Eretz Yisrael especially if one internalizes the thought that the Torah was given to be practiced in Eretz Yisrael. Israel is a developing society, a new Jewish society one can participate in without having to please or accommodate a non-Jewish environment. One can also live one's own "Yiddishkeit." We hope, G-d willing, our children will grow up with the Torah and be able to live the Torah in the fullest extent it is possible today in the place the Torah ought to be lived and be productive members of society. I think Israel allows for that balance of learning Torah and professional life.

KAJN: What are some of the challenges you've been facing? What are some of the cultural differences you're encountering, some of the things you miss from the States?

Gidon: The main challenge is obviously learning the language. So far, we are able to work with English-speaking companies but that is not ideal. In order to integrate into society and contribute to it, a mastery of Hebrew is a must if one wants to avoid living like in "Chinatown." I do miss online shopping, which does exist here but not as developed as in the United States. I personally hate shopping, having to go to a particular place and walk around for hours and still not be able to find what I'm looking for. Hence ordering online with an easy return service was just a dream for me come true.

The overall culture is more spontaneous and less formal, an aspect I struggled with some thirty years ago but have learned to live with and sometimes prefer.

The major loss in my life since I made aliyah is the Kehilla life I enjoyed in Washington Heights and our friends (we are still friends! :)). There is nothing that compares to the davening and minhagim of KAJ and our friends in the Heights. I'll bring a joke here I made several times already when speaking to friends: I told my wife that for Yom Kippur I'll go to "my" Uman, a.k.a. KAJ. The other challenge is to find another KAJ, ... an impossible task.

Ruthy: Living in Beit Shemesh we probably aren't exposed to as many cultural differences as we would be elsewhere. Kids have a lot more freedom to roam and ride buses unaccompanied. They are also expected to have a higher level of maturity. In school they receive notification about school changes and are expected to relay that to their parents. Sometimes I find myself a little shocked with the level of safety; a lot of kids don't wear helmets as they cruise down the hills on their scooters - but my kids still do!

The language barrier can be difficult, but Israelis are so used to Olim that they go out of their way to

help us communicate. And contrary to popular belief, the bus drivers have been so nice when we get on the wrong bus or end up in the wrong place. One even told us, "Get back on the bus and I'll drive you up to the right bus stop" - it was the end of his route.

The things I miss are my friends. Everyone here has been really nice, welcoming and helpful, and I'm sure that we'll all make friends in time (the boys have already made a whole slew of friends, BH!) but I still miss my friends from the Heights. You all helped me raise my kids and kept me going when the world got crazy! I also miss working at Moriah and the Mikva. I was blessed to have those opportunities and to feel like I made a difference in people's lives, and I always received as much as I gave in those positions.

KAJN: Do you have any advice you'd like to share with others contemplating aliyah?

Gidon and Ruthy: Remember Rule #1 (i.e., have a lot of bitachon) and learn Hebrew, Hebrew, Hebrew!
