

FROM THE RABBINATE: SHEMITA 5782 UPDATE

New— Vegetables only:

Starting from the first day of Chanuka, all vegetables from Eretz Yisroel that were cut **after** Rosh HaShono have lost their איסור, may be purchased, and require the taking of Terumos uMaasros. However, those vegetables which were cut during the Shemita year (that is, before Rosh HaShono) remain אסור, forbidden, forever (איסור ספיחין).

Since carrots and potatoes can have a long "shelf life," it should be noted that those which were cut before Rosh HaShono remain אסור; only those which were cut **after** Rosh HaShono are allowed, as of Chanuka. Young "winter potatoes" from Eretz Yisroel are definitely "fresh," and were not stored from before Rosh HaShono, so they do not have any איסור related to Shevi'is; Terumos uMaasros must be taken.

Fruits from Eretz Yisroel continue to have Kedushas Shevi'is until further notice.

134th YAHRZEIT OF RAV SAMSON RAPHAEL HIRSCH

27 Teves, which this year falls on Friday, the 20th of January, marks the 134th Yahrzeit of Rav Samson Raphael Hirsch.

As is well known, Rav Hirsch did more for the preservation and revival of Torah learning and Torah living in Germany than one could reasonably have expected of one man in one lifetime. The Frankfurt Kehilla which he established under the principles of *Austritt* and strict adherence to Halocho became a model Kehilla. Through the extraordinary efforts of his grandson, Rav Joseph Breuer, this Kehilla and Yeshiva were re-established on these shores after the Nazi Churbon.

The great opus of Rav Hirsch's writings continues to illuminate the Torah for us, for the children educated in our Mosdos, and for the wider Torah world, where the newly re-translated Hirsch Chumash and other works have been received with much enthusiasm.

Today, our Kehilla and Yeshiva, proud bearers of Rav Hirsch's name, continue to carry on Rav Hirsch's sacred legacy of Torah Im Derech Eretz.

CHANUKA 5783





SPOTLIGHT ON: Alex Kaminsky WHAT'S IT LIKE TO: Integrate into the KAJ Kehilla?


