FROM THE RABBINATE: SHEMITA 5782 UPDATE

Vegetables:

All vegetables from Eretz Yisroel that were cut **after** Rosh HaShono may be purchased, and require the taking of Terumos uMaasros. However, those vegetables which were cut during the Shemita year (that is, before Rosh HaShono) remain אסור, forbidden, forever (איסור ספיהין).

Since **carrots** and **potatoes** can have a long "shelf life," it should be noted that those which were cut before Rosh HaShono remain אסור; only those which were cut **after** Rosh HaShono are allowed. **Sweet potatoes** from Eretz Yisroel are אסור until mid-July as they still are from the Shemita-year crop.

Fruits labeled as coming_from Eretz Yisroel continue to have Kedushas Shevi'is until further notice, including, for example, **Jaffa grapefruits, clementines, and avocadoes** which are currently being sold on the American market. Please note that the **Jaffa grapefruits and clementines** will be אסור (הגיע זמן by mid-July, and the **avocadoes** by the beginning of September.


Some fruits purchased may even be הגיע (הגיע זמן הביעור) now, including **Sharon fruits** (persimmons), **Jaffa pomelas**, mangoes, pomegranates, olives, figs, and dried or fresh dates (unless bearing a reliable Hashgocho).

Sabra fruits from Eretz Yisroel **may** be purchased; Terumos uMaasros must be taken.

<u>Canned Vegetables</u> (for example, pickles, peppers, etc.) from Eretz Yisroel, without a reliable Shemita Hashgocho, are אסור since they are all from Shemita.

RAV DR. SHLOMO BREUER זצייל

The 6th of Av (this year, July 24th) marks the ninety-seventh Yahrzeit of Rav Dr. Shlomo Breuer, son-in-law and successor of Rav Shamshon Raphael Hirsch. Born in Pilisvorosvar, Hungary, Rav Breuer learned under his maternal grandfather, Rav Shimon Wiener, as well as in Nitra, before joining the Pressburg Yeshiva then under the leadership of the Ksav Sofer, Rav Avrohom Shmuel Binyomin Sofer.



Rav Breuer led the Frankfurt Kehilla from 1890 until his petiro in 1926. Rav Breuer strengthened and expanded what his father-in-law and predecessor, Rav Hirsch, had built up the Frankfurt Kehilla to be, most noticeably with the establishment, in 1893, of the Frankfurt Yeshiva, (Torah Lehranstalt). It was also during Rav Breuer's Rabbonus that the imposing Friedberger Anlage Shul was built (pictured above right)

Rav Breuer established the "Orthodoxer Rabbinerverband" and the "Orthodoxer Gemeindeverband," to strengthen both his Kehilla as well as the other Kehillos of Germany and beyond. It was in this same vein that Rav Breuer played a major role in the founding of Agudath Israel, in 1912. Rav Breuer's sermons, collected and redacted in *Chochmo uMusar*— recently republished in a revised, one volume format—as well as his Sefer *Divrei Shlomo*, all continue to be learned to this day.

RAV ELIYOHU GLUCKSMAN

This coming 4th of Av will mark the nineteenth Yahrzeit of our unforgettable Dayan Eliyohu Dov Glucksman. Originally from Germany, Rav Glucksman, with the support of his wife, Rebbetzin Ruth Glucksman, had the rare opportunity to learn in the Kollel of the Chazon Ish לוציד, where he shared a bench with Rav Yaakov Yisroel Kanievsky, the Steipler Go'on לוציד. Rav Glucksman's Seforim—Birkas HaShulchon (original frontispiece pictured following, right) and his Tziyunim on Shas—are well-known.





Rav Glucksman developed a unique teaching style that endeared him to hundreds of Talmidim and Talmidos. Rav Glucksman joined the Kehilla in the 1960's not only as Dayan, but as Youth Director, a role which led to the decades of his teaching in both the Rika Breuer Teachers Seminary and our Beth Jacob high school. Rebbetzin Glucksman, too, taught in YRSRH, as a beloved sixth-grade Morah for many years. Even when Rav Glucksman, due to failing eyesight, stopped officially teaching, he still would address the classes on occasions such as the anniversary of Kristallnacht, until very close to his petiro.

RAV MOSHE YEHUDA JACOBOVITS זצייל

The Yahrzeit of Dayan Moshe Yehuda Jacobovits, the 29th of Av, will fall this year on August 16th. Rav Jacobovits was born in 1890 in Lackenbach, one of the Sheva Kehillos. His father, Rav Shlomo Zalman Jacobovits, was the Dayan of the Kehilla there, a position Rav Moshe Yehuda's maternal grandfather had also held. Rav Moshe Yehuda learned in Galanta, under Rav Yosef Tzvi Duschinski, and in Pressburg under Rav Akiva Sofer.

Rav Jacobovits served as Rav in Köln for twenty years, until the Nazis' rise to power and the impending Churbon Europe forced him to flee, first to Strasbourg, where he served as Rosh Yeshiva until the outbreak of World War II, then to various locations in France, and ultimately to Switzerland.



Through all of his travails, Rav Jacobovits drew those he met close to Torah. Under exceedingly difficult circumstances, he looked to care for the Tzorchei Tzibur of the place he was in, both in France and later in the D. P. camps, seeing to the baking of Matzo for Pesach, the making of Shoforos for Rosh HaShono, to Talmud Torah, the establishment of Shuls, and, in one instance, the construction of a Mikve. After the war, Rav Jacobovits established a Yeshiva in Lugano, Switzerland.

When Rav Jacobovits arrived in Washington Heights in 1947, he was appointed Dayan and supported Rav Breuer in all facets of the young Kehilla, including, crucially, Kashrus, as well as taking over for Rav Breuer when the Rav was recuperating from a heart attack. Dayan Jacobovits was Niftar only three years later, in 1950, on Shabbos, the 29th of Av. Some twelve years after his petiro, his widow, Rebbetzin Hanna Jacobovits, and sons published some of his Kisvei Yad on Chumash, the Megillos, and the Hagada shel Pesach, under the title *Zichron Moshe*. An expanded edition has been reprinted by his family.

As the Yeshiva's school year concluded, a special staff brunch was held in her honor on Friday, June 16/27 Sivan. Mrs. Gottesman was presented with an honor book containing letters of Hakoras HaTov and well-wishes from alumnae and parents. Across the preschool, elementary, and middle school departments, YRSRH currently boasts at least eight teachers who are themselves alumnae and former talmidos of Mrs. Gottesman.

On a personal note, this writer (a former Talmida as well) was witness this year to just a small part of the tremendous amount of Mrs. Gottesman's devotion and exactitude, as Mrs. Gottesman ensured that this year's eight-grade yearbook, whose theme revolved around the Mesora ("She'al Avicha"), accurately portrayed Rav S.R. Hirsch and the Torah Im Derech Eretz legacy of our school. To commemorate Rav Hirsch's Yahrzeit this past January, Mrs. Gottesman also accompanied the eighth-grade class on a very special visit with Mrs. Meta Bechhofer, daughter of Rav Dr. Joseph Breuer and a great-granddaughter of Rav Hirsch.

The position of Menaheles will be filled by Mrs. Esti Rogin. An experienced educator who has taught in both Limudei Kodesh and general studies capacities, Mrs. Rogin has been the fourth-grade Morah and girls' Mechaneches for the past few years. Mrs. Rogin has strong connections with staff, parents, and students. We wish her much hatzlocho in her new position.

GRADUATIONS

Our Yeshiva celebrated the graduations of the Mesivta's twelfth-grade seniors, the Bais Yaakov Middle School's eighth-graders, and the Pre-Mesivta eighth-grade boys on, respectively, the evenings of Tuesday, June 12/24 Sivon and Wednesday, June 14/25 Sivan, and on Sunday morning, June 18/29 Sivon.

The Mesivta graduates were first up, on Tuesday, in Mount Sinai Jewish Center's ballroom. Those present heard from Rav Mantel; Rabbi Shraga Soloveitchik, the Mesivta's Menahel; and Rabbi Ephraim Fischer, general studies principal of the Mesivta. Mr. Dovid Weinreb, father of graduate Betzalel Weinreb, addressed the graduates as Parent Representative. The Class Representatives to speak were Sruli Roth and Yehuda Lehrer, who both mentioned the growth they have experienced in their four years in the Yeshiva.

This year's Bais Yaakov Middle School's graduation was not only a farewell to the eighth-grade girls, but to their principal as well—Mrs. Hena Gottesman, who, as mentioned above, is retiring after nineteen years in YRSRH. Mr. Pinchas Katzenstein spoke in tribute to Mrs. Gottesman, after which Mrs. Judy Bechhofer presented her with a special, inscribed gift from Eretz Yisroel.



At the graduation, held in Mount Sinai's ballroom, Rav Mantel spoke about how much more a child will accomplish when he or she believes in his or her capabilities. The Rav noted that he is looking forward to hearing much Nachas from the graduates. Mrs. Gottesman then spoke and told the students that while she won't be in school for visits, she would very much like to hear from them. Dr. Raphael Rosenbaum, father of graduate Miss Chana Rosenbaum, was the parent representative and spoke about Hakaras HaTov. This was followed by each graduate saying some words.

The eighth-grade boys closed out the graduations the following Sunday morning, in Moller Hall. Those present heard from Rav Mantel, introduced by Rabbi Yehuda Moller, Menahel. The class representatives to speak were Akiva Axelrod and Dovid Chaim Koenigsberg. The boys' rebbi, Rabbi Shlomo Zuckerman, also shared some thoughts, before Rabbi Moller and Rabbi Samuels distributed the diplomas. Rabbi Moller concluded the program, stressing the importance of the boys making their learning "their life".





Rav Breuer (1850-1926) was a *talmid* of the *Ksav Sofer* and successor to his father-in-law, Rav Samson Raphael Hirsch, as Rav of the Frankfurt Kehilla, known as *Adas Yeshurun*. He was founder and Rosh Yeshiva of the Frankfurt Yeshiva. Rav Breuer preserved in written form his *Shabbos* and *Yom Tov* shul sermons, which were built on original interpretations of various Midrashic sources, and included moving inspirational messages and timeless lessons for our people. Rav Breuer's sermons are a rich source of wisdom and exhortation --- *Chochmo u'Mussar*.



Originally published as separate volumes in German (1930-1936) and In English (1972-1977), this thoroughly revised 624-page volume presents Rav Breuer's profound and intricate expositions in a clear, modern idiom and is a welcome addition to the study of the weekly *parshah*. 


