DECT 50





Safety Notice:

- Only use the battery which has been approved for use with the handset (3,7V 1.0Ah).
- Only exchange battery of the same type or similar type recommended by the manufacturer.
- The battery will get warm during the charging process, this is normal.
- Do not use any other charging device other than the designated charging cradle.
- Do not use the handset in the rain, bath tub or handle with wet hands.
- Take care that the charging contacts will not get in contact with other conductive material.
- In thunderstorms it is recommended to disconnect the unit from the mains supply.
- This is a rechargeable product. In day to day use it is normal for the unit to get warm.

 Therefore it is advisable not to place the product on antique, veenered or wooden surfaces.
- To clean the product use a damp cloth (not wet) or an antistatic cloth. Never use a dry cloth as this could staticly charge the unit. Never spray any cleaning agents directly on the handset or the base unit.
- Phone calls (including emergency calls) are only possible if the DECT S0 Base plus and the telephone system are connected to power. NO calls can be made in case of a power failure.

BATTERIES AND RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES

If your product contains batteries or rechargeable batteries, then these must be disposed of at designated collection points.

About this User Guide

This user manual is intended for the telephone system with the firmware installed at the time of shipment. Should the telephone or the telephone system be updated with new firmware made available from the manufacturer then some sections of the user guide may no longer be applicable.

The display diagram in this user guide are only partly shown and may differ from the real display of the DECT 50 handset.





Insert Battery




To open the battery compartment, press the cover with your thumb and slide this towards the charging contacts, then lift the cover upwards.

Insert the battery in such a way that the contacts of the battery touch the spring contacts of the handset.

To refit the cover follow the steps of opening in reverse order.

Approved Rechargeable Batteries:

Only the enclosed battery is approved for use with this handset. **Do not use any other battery.**



Using the DECT 50 for the first time

Insert the rechargeable battery into the handset (see above).

Connect the enclosed power supply unit to the charging cradle and plug the power supply into the mains socket.

Remove the protection film from the display and insert the handset into the charging cradle to charge the batteries.

The charging symbol will be shown in the display to indicate that the DECT 50 is now being charged. Once the batteries are completely charged the charging symbol will change to green. Now continue to register the DECT 50 (refer to page 8).







Information Display of DECT 50

The status information of the handset will be displayed by pressing the left softkey ("Info" button) when the handset is idle. This will display the time & date, extension number - and extension name of the DECT 50. If the DECT 50 is paired with another phone then it will also display which telephone has been paired with the DECT 50.

Pressing the softkey again ("More" button) will display the features allocated to each of the navigation buttons.

By pressing the right softkey ("Stop" button) the information display will be exited.

Select Symbols Displayed



Up to 9 symbols can be displayed at the same time. All available symbols may be switched on. A symbol set to "On" to be displayed will be indicated by an X or a dot.



If no X or dot is within the symbol, then this means that the symbol is not switched on. The dot means that the symbol is switched on and will be displayed. An X does indicate that the symbol is switched on but cannot be displayed. This could be due to the following:

- There are more than 9 symbols switched on.
- The function which will be indicated by this symbol is not programmed for your DECT 50 (such as Diversion or Call Filter)!

TIP.

You may also set these symbols via TK-Suite Set. To do so go to "Phone Settings/System Phone Setting" and open the TAB "Display".





You can lock the keypad of your DECT 50 in order not to press any buttons accidentally.


Call Log

Missed calls will be logged if the call log is enabled for your extension within the telephone system. A green envelope shown in the upper display area means that there are new missed calls in the call log. The envelope will change to white if information on missed calls have been displayed but not yet deleted.





Call History

The call log history will store the last 1000 incoming and outgoing calls made. If 1000 entries are exceeded, then the oldest entry will be overwritten in order to store the newest 1000 entries. A reset of the telephone system will delete the call history.

If Caller ID (CLIP) is offered by the network provider, then the telephone number of the caller will be displayed before you answer the call. Should the telephone number be stored in the phone, or the telephone system, then the stored name instead of the number will be displayed.



DECT 50 Internal Phone Book

Each entry may have up to 16 characters for name and up to 24 digits for the telephone number. Using this telephone phone book will not affect the telephone book of the telephone system.






The Phone Book of the Telephone System

Up to 1000 telephone numbers and names can be stored in the phone book of the telephone system. Entries can be made easily by using TK-Suite.

Telephone numbers can be retrieved from the telephone system in either alphabetical -, numeric location entry or as vanity search.





Do Not Disturb (DND)

You can set your phone to "Do Not Disturb". Depending on your preference you can select various settings for this feature. You may select that no call shall be signalled, or if the display should flash, a short alert or vibration alarm can also indicate a call. The various settings may also be combined.

A crossed out bell in the display will indicate that "Do Not Disturb" is set to on.

Pairing - the DECT 50 as an intelligent Cordless Phone Receiver

By using the pairing function the ST 40 and DECT 50 are treated as **one** telephone. Dial a number on your ST 40 and continue the call on your DECT 50 or vice versa. Broker between the telephones by just lifting the handset. The call can be simply continued on the other phone. Activated features on the ST 40 will also be indicated on the display of the DECT 50. Furthermore the DECT 50 has 10 function buttons of its own and therefore the total number of function buttons available between the ST 40 and DECT 50 is 30. Just to round up the overall concept both phone have a joint call log and answering machine control.

Pairing Setup

The pairing function has to be set up before you can use this feature between the telephones. The setup can either be carried out on the ST 40, or if preferred, by using TK-Suite Set.


By following the procedure below you can setup the Pairing Function on your ST 40:



The phones are now paired and the feature can be used.

Setup pairing function by using TK-Suite Set:

In TK-Suite select "Extensions / Devices: Digital System Phones" and select the required DECT 50 as headset for your ST 40. Click on "Apply" to send the new setting into the telephone system. The pairing function is now enabled.

To disable the pairing function carry out the following on your ST 40:






- The DECT 50 will also display the set/enabled features of the ST 40 once the handsets have been paired.
 - Exceptions: EIB objects, relays and sensors will NOT be displayed. These functions may be programmed separately for the DECT 50.
- All switchboard functions can be setup via the ST 40, this system menu will be hidden from view on the DECT 50

Meter Mode

Using the meter mode you are able to define the reception area of your DECT 50. Follow the steps below to enable the meter mode of your DECT 50:



To switch off the meter mode follow the instruction above and deselect "Meter Mode".






A good radio coverage is provided with a reception quality of between 60 to 64 and a field strength between 76 to 99.


