# MISSION

Together we give a positive direction to the future of children at risk and their families.

**Fundatia Inocenti - Romanian Children's Relief** is a non-profit organization that helps children reach their full potential. We support children, young people and their families through structured programs run by specialists in the field to prevent and alleviate at risk situations.

We have been operating in Romania for more than 30 years, helping children from disadvantaged backgrounds to go beyond their limits. We work in hospitals, schools, family homes, at the beneficiaries' homes or in the community, providing professional and personalized support to both children and their families. Starting with 2018, prevention and education on mental health was added as a new component to our mission.

We are committed to professional development and consider our most valuable asset to be our team of more than 40 employees, together with more than 100 volunteers, all of them helping annually more than 2000 children at risk in **Bistrita-Nasaud**, **Bucharest**, **Ilfov county** and **Cluj-Napoca**. Our teams and volunteers provide psychological support, recovery activities, formal and non-formal education, training and financial help when needed.

# THE VOICE OF THE INOCENTI, **LIVE**



*“Children of similar ages were admitted to a ward for polyp removal surgery. They had their teddy bears, and after sharing their teddy bears’ names, the conversation moved on naturally to what was the hospital experience like for them and how they were feeling. We played for a while with the IV cannulas, described to the teddy bears why these medical items are useful, what to expect every step of the way during their hospitalization and what is in their power to do in order to feel a bit better. At the end, when we were getting ready to say goodbye, they lined up several little toys and told us casually that it was time for us to help the others understand what was happening inside the hospital. We might call this an illustration of a game. But for us it gave us the confirmation that they’ve allowed us into their world, in order to build together a safe place of understanding and acceptance. We use medical play often and, most of the time, children want*

*to take home the medical instruments we play with, to show them to their friends and to pass on the story of why they are useful and how their experience was in the hospital”*, **Mirabela Stoinoiu, psychologist, Child Life Program, Bucharest.**

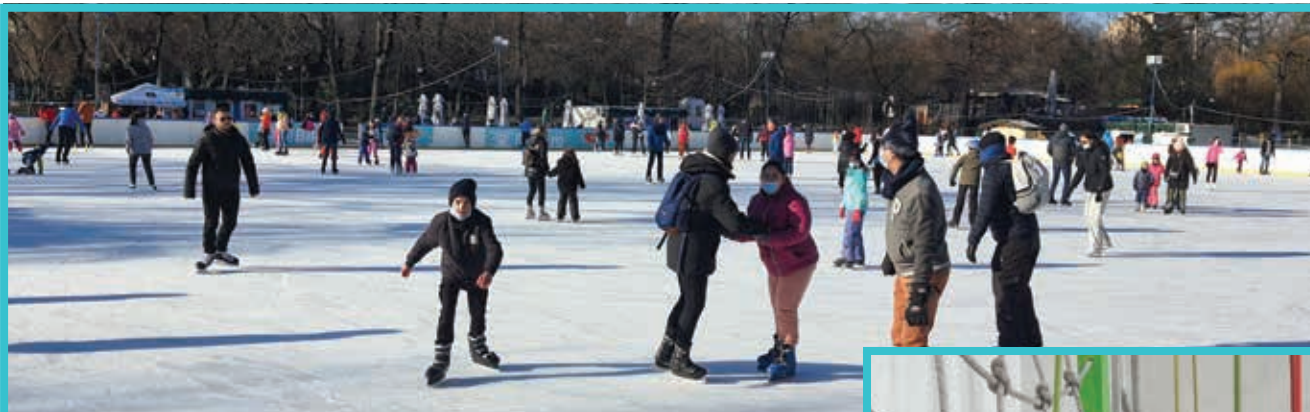
## INOCENTI FOUNDATION, AWARDED AT THE NATIONAL GALA OF GOOD

## MENTAL HEALTH LITERACY FOR TEENAGERS IN BUCHAREST

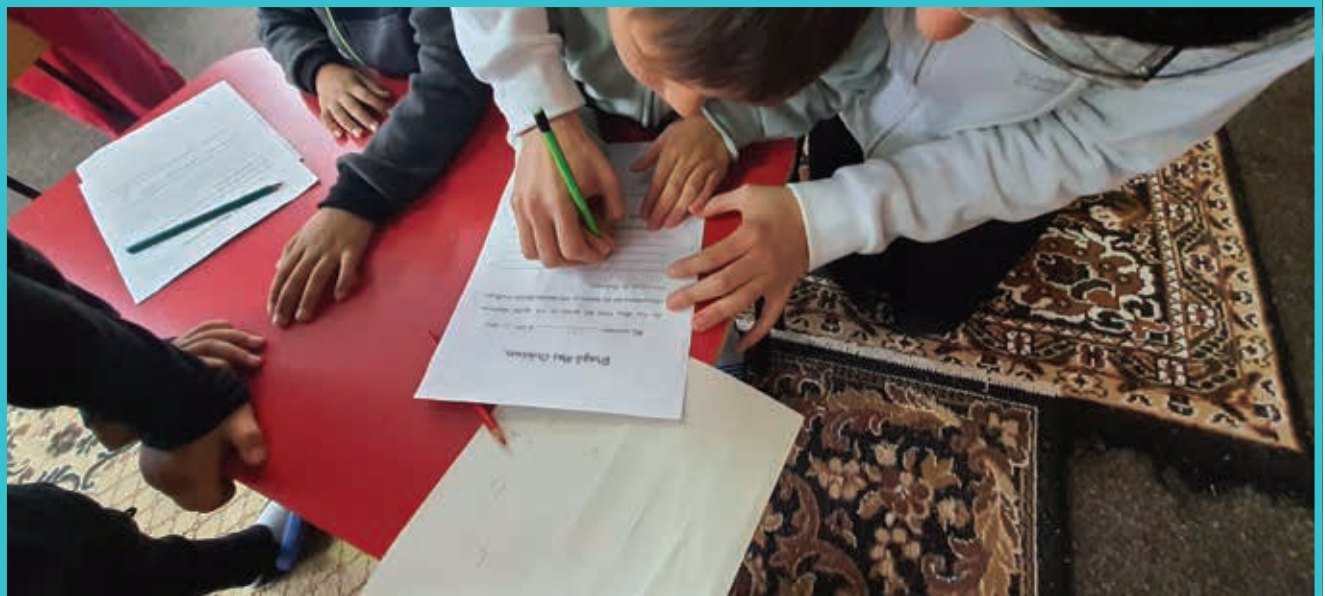

## RUFI THE DRAGON, THE CHILDREN'S FRIEND

Rufi the Dragon stories were born out of a call for support from the medical staff of the Cluj Clinic for Pediatric Psychiatry and Drug Addiction. They are not only playful and creative, but also an important tool in tackling mental health issues such as depression, anxiety, ADHD and anger with children. Our team has developed these four stories in which Rufi the Dragon talks to children and parents about difficulties and ways to weather "inner storms" constructively. The booklets are meant to be read together, children and parents, but can also be read individually by children over 8. More than 15,000 children have already been introduced to Rufi the Dragon.







## **EXCHANGE OF BEST PRACTICES BETWEEN ROMANIAN AND AMERICAN SPECIALISTS**

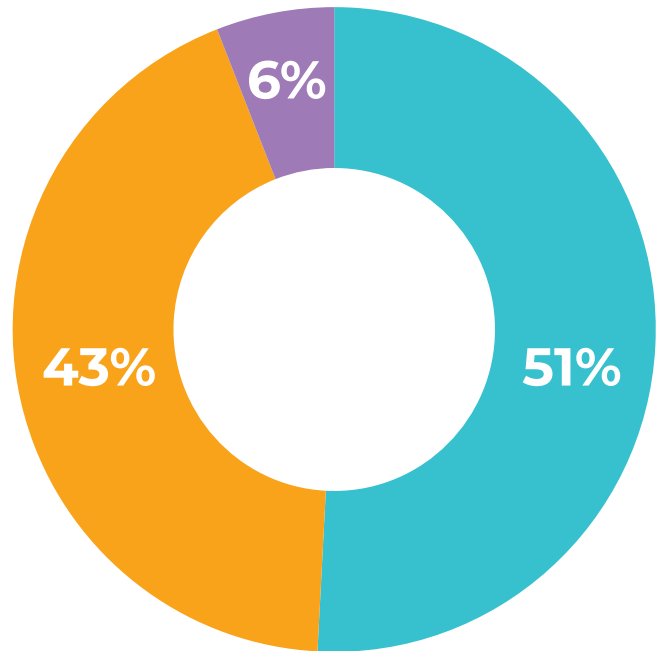
In October, our colleagues, Elena Georgescu and Ioana Mesterelu, were part of the Open World delegations, travelling to the United States of America for an exchange of experience between Romanian and American specialists. They were part of the delegation that was hosted by Albuquerque, New Mexico, where the focus was centered around Mental Health and Counseling. Our colleague, Elena Perry, accompanied as facilitator the delegation from Kalamazoo, Michigan, whose theme was Community Development, with a focus on the integration of refugees. The program was funded by the Congressional Office for International Leadership, implemented in Romania with the support of the American Councils for International Education - Romania. It involved 10 days of activities on various themes, designed to give specialists a new perspective and the opportunity to collaborate with foreign experts working in the same field.

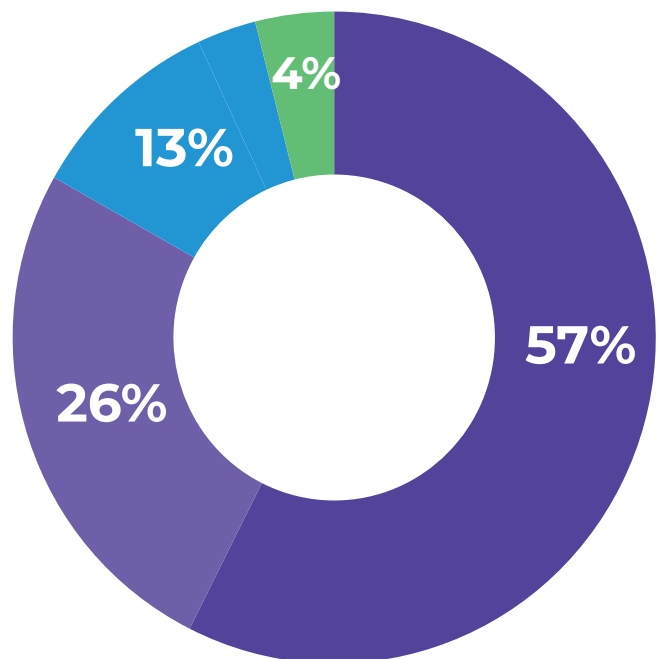
