
- Development cooperation

- · Political dialogue


#### SOUTH-SOUTH AND TRIANGULAR COOPERATION (SSTC)

# EMPOWERING WOMEN AND YOUTH



# **CARIBBEAN**

BIOPAMA, a joint ACP- EU initiative, supported a training of trainers course on the management of marine protected areas in the Caribbean region. The course was organised by the Caribbean Marine Protected Area Network and Forum (CaMPAM). The course, which took place in Barbados, trained twenty participants from thirteen Caribbean countries.
