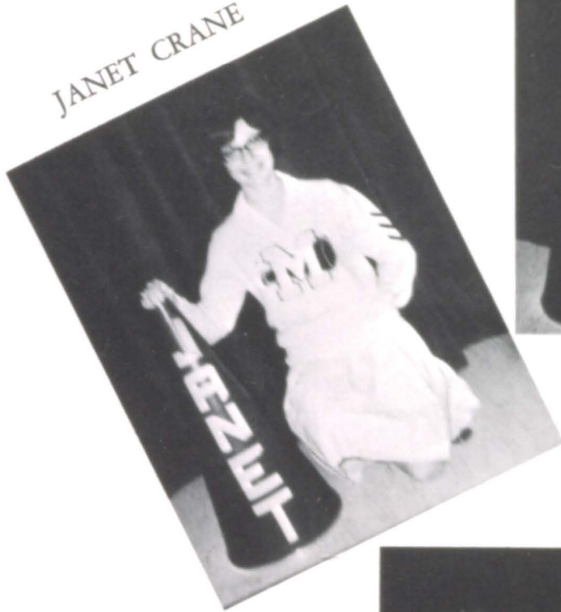

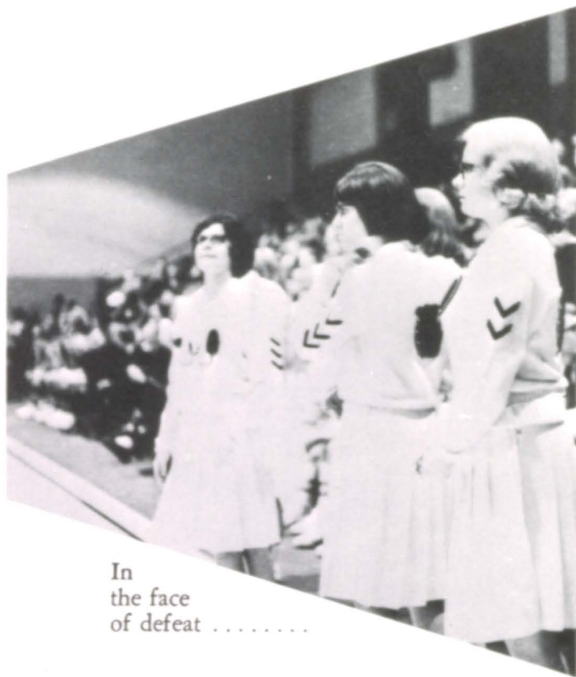

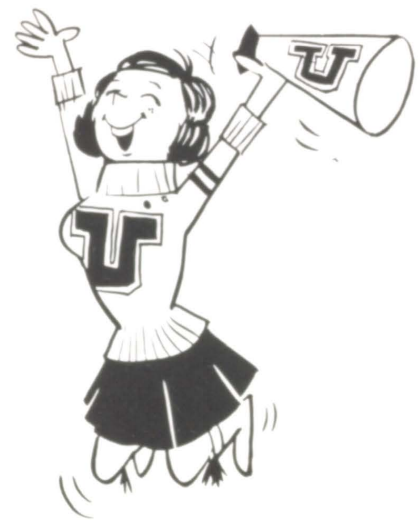

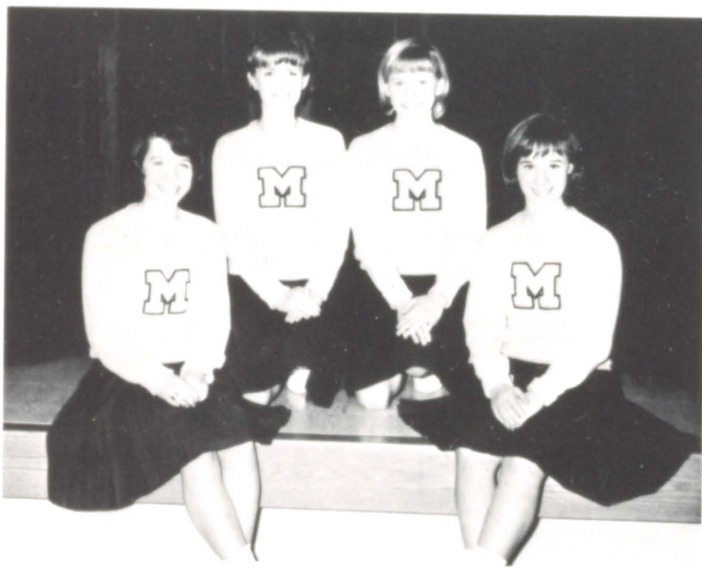

Heavyweight wrestlers Mike Hines and Bruce Sterling demonstrate the starting position for the second or third round. Top position is determined by the toss of a coin before the match begins, the winner choosing odd or even. If he chooses odd, wrestlers one, three, five, etc. from his team get their choice of top or bottom the second round, and wrestlers two, four, six, etc. from the opposing team get their choice. If he chooses even, the situation is just reversed. The winner's choice will usually be determined by the playing position of his weakest wrestler.

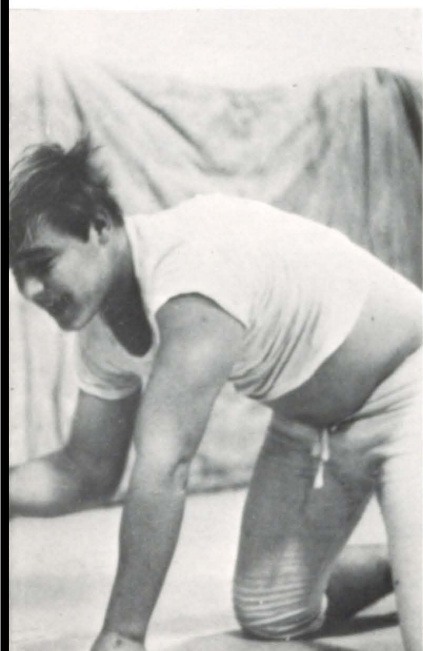

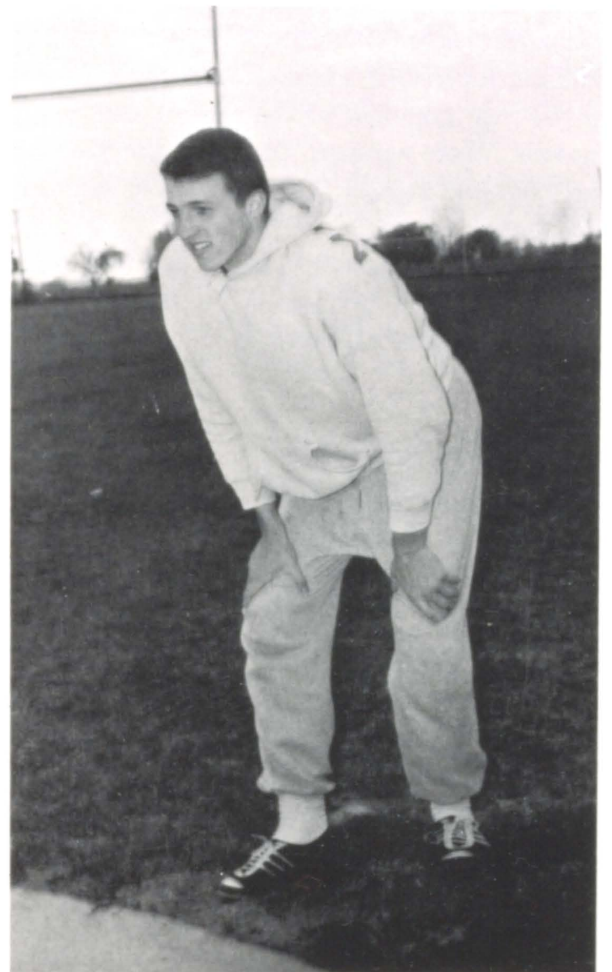

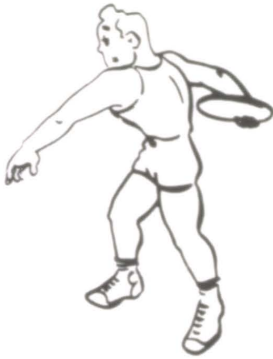

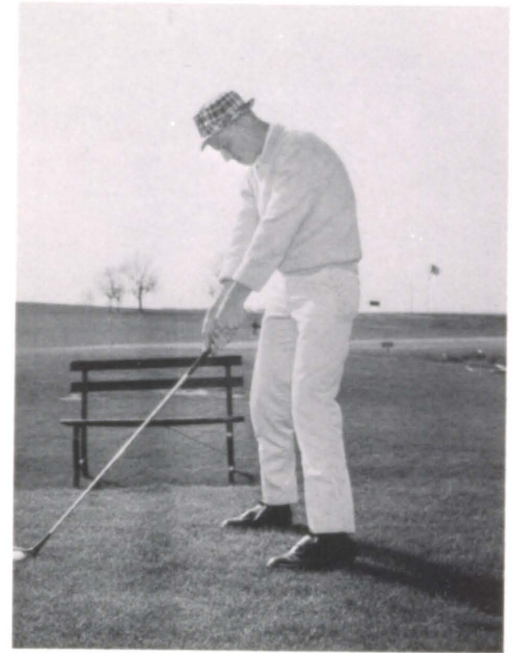


Mike Hines puts the shot a distance of 56' 8" at the Sioux Falls Region Track Meet for the best throw in the state this year.

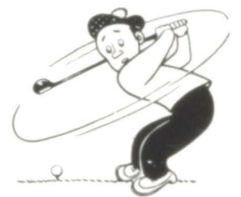
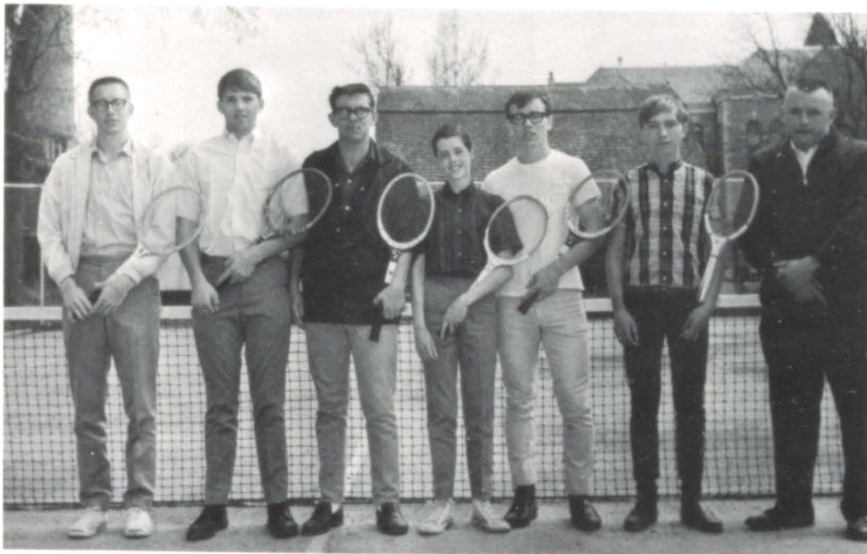


Junior shot-putter, Dan Skaff, places with this throw at another dual track meet held in Madison.

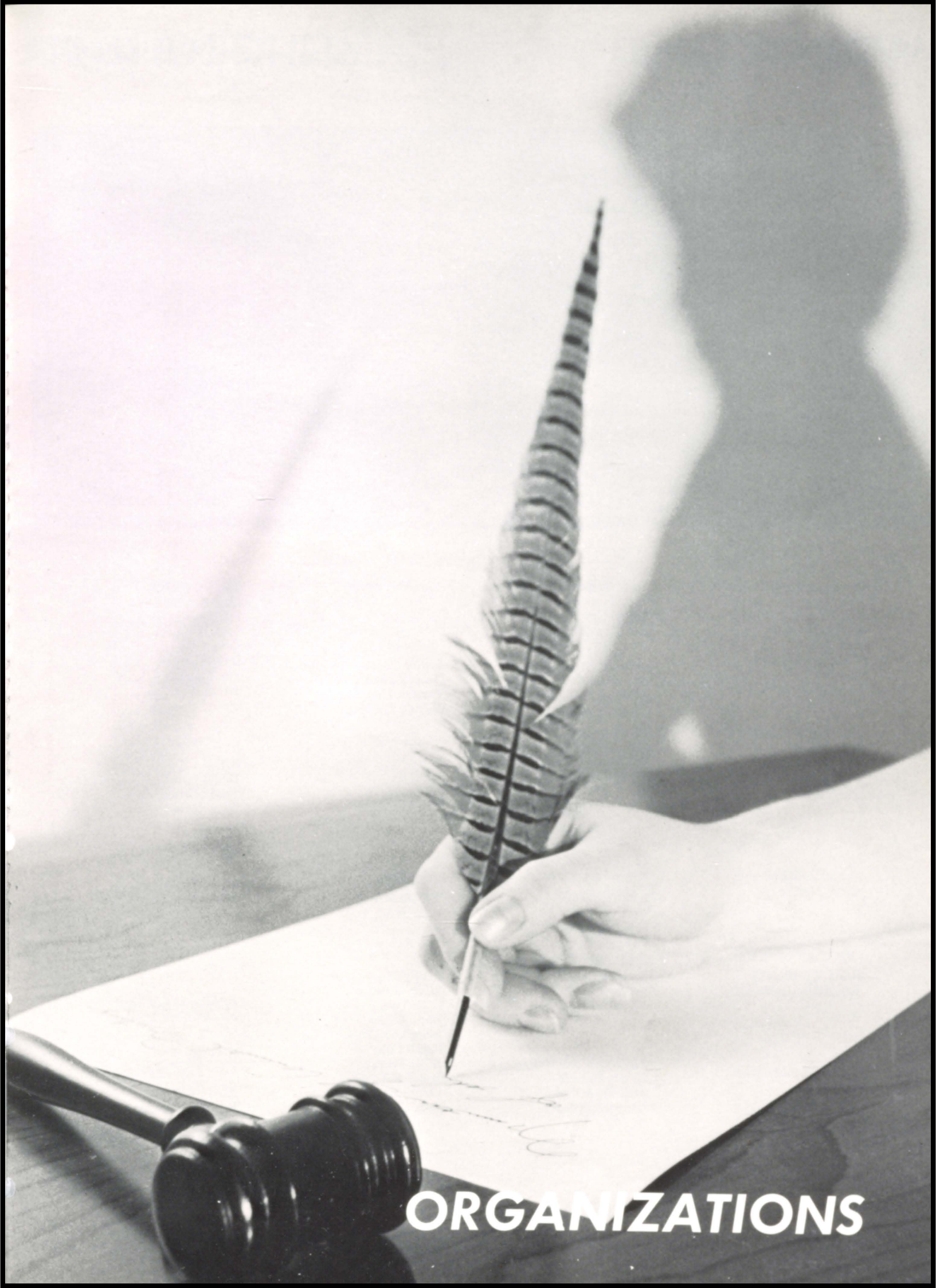
# CALL OF THE GREAT OUTDOORS!!!

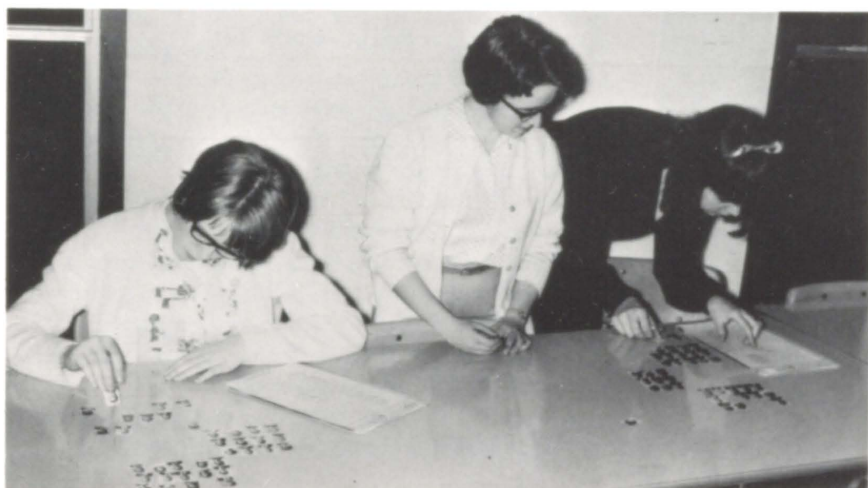

Joel Severson has this to conclude about this year's MAROON:

It was a year of change and experimentation for the 1965-66 MAROON.

We changed from letterpress to offset printing, doubled the page size and laid emphasis on news photography. Going offset meant a sacrifice from the old high-gloss paper to standard newsprint, but enabled us to use photographs and photograph lay-outs freely. High gloss paper would have affected picture reproduction.

Not one word of gossip was printed. The smut lovers and red-faced gigglers objected to our deviation from the beaten path.

We adhered to a definite style. The MAROON followed the Associated Press stylebook.

We placed emphasis on book and movie reviews. Not one editorial about school spirit was printed. We initiated pros and controversy to give the student body a chance to express itself. Students did the actual paste-up.

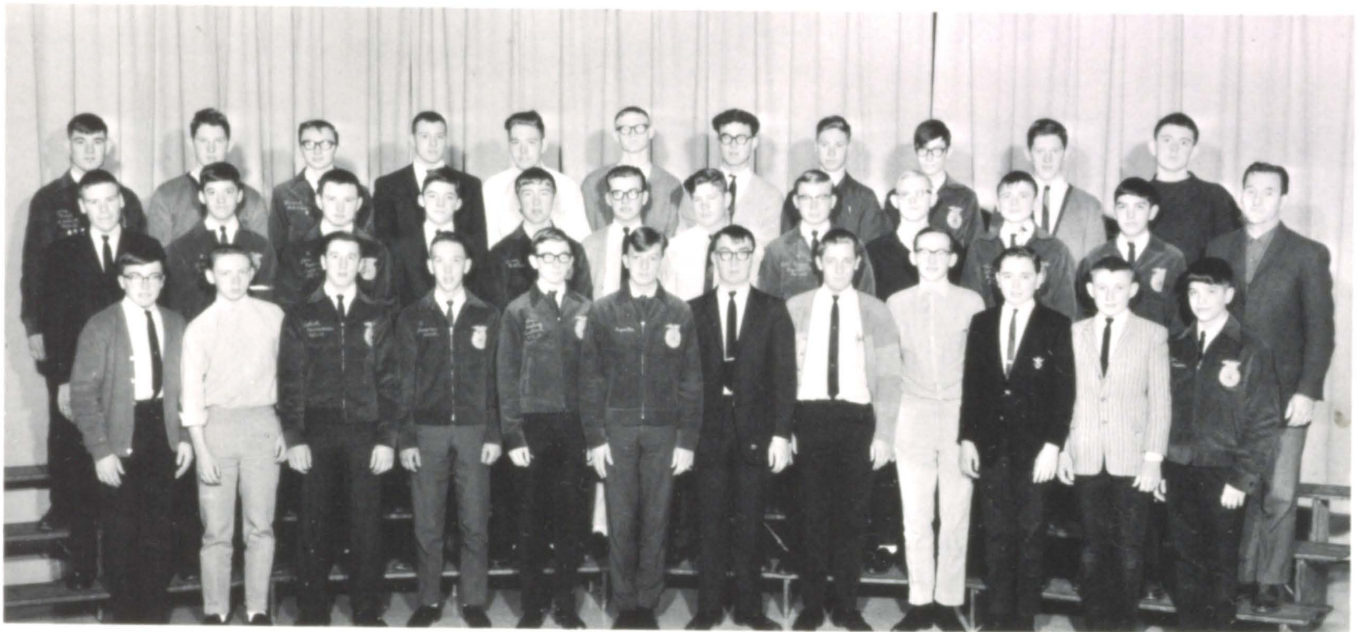

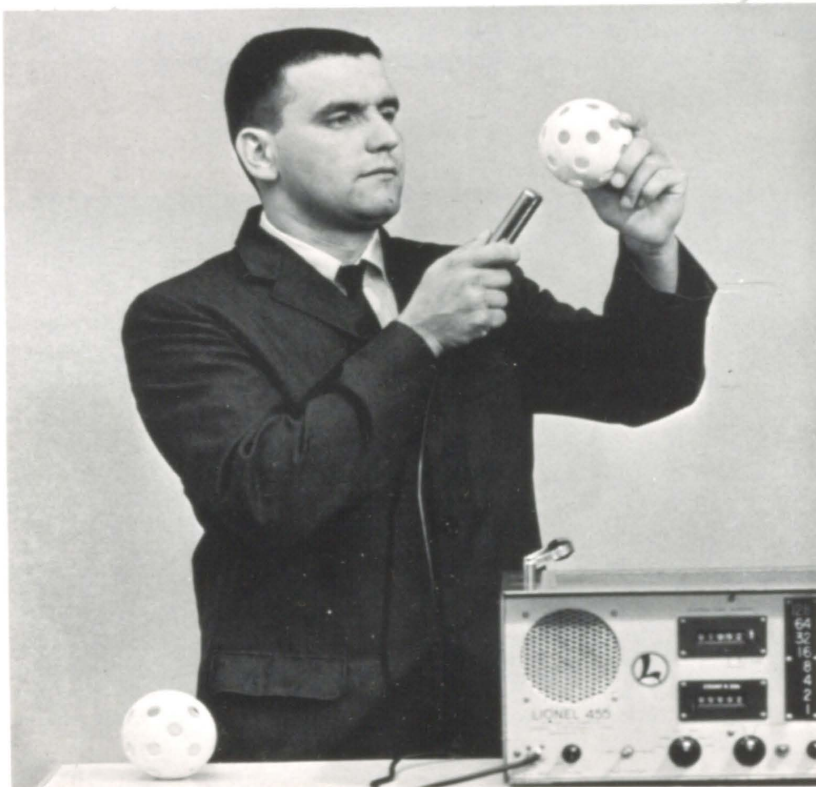

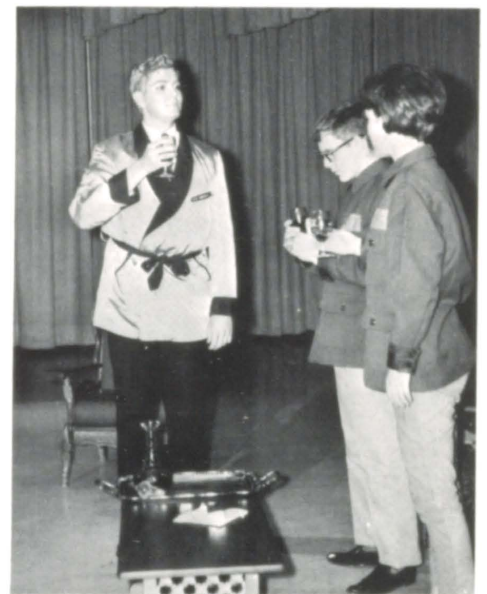

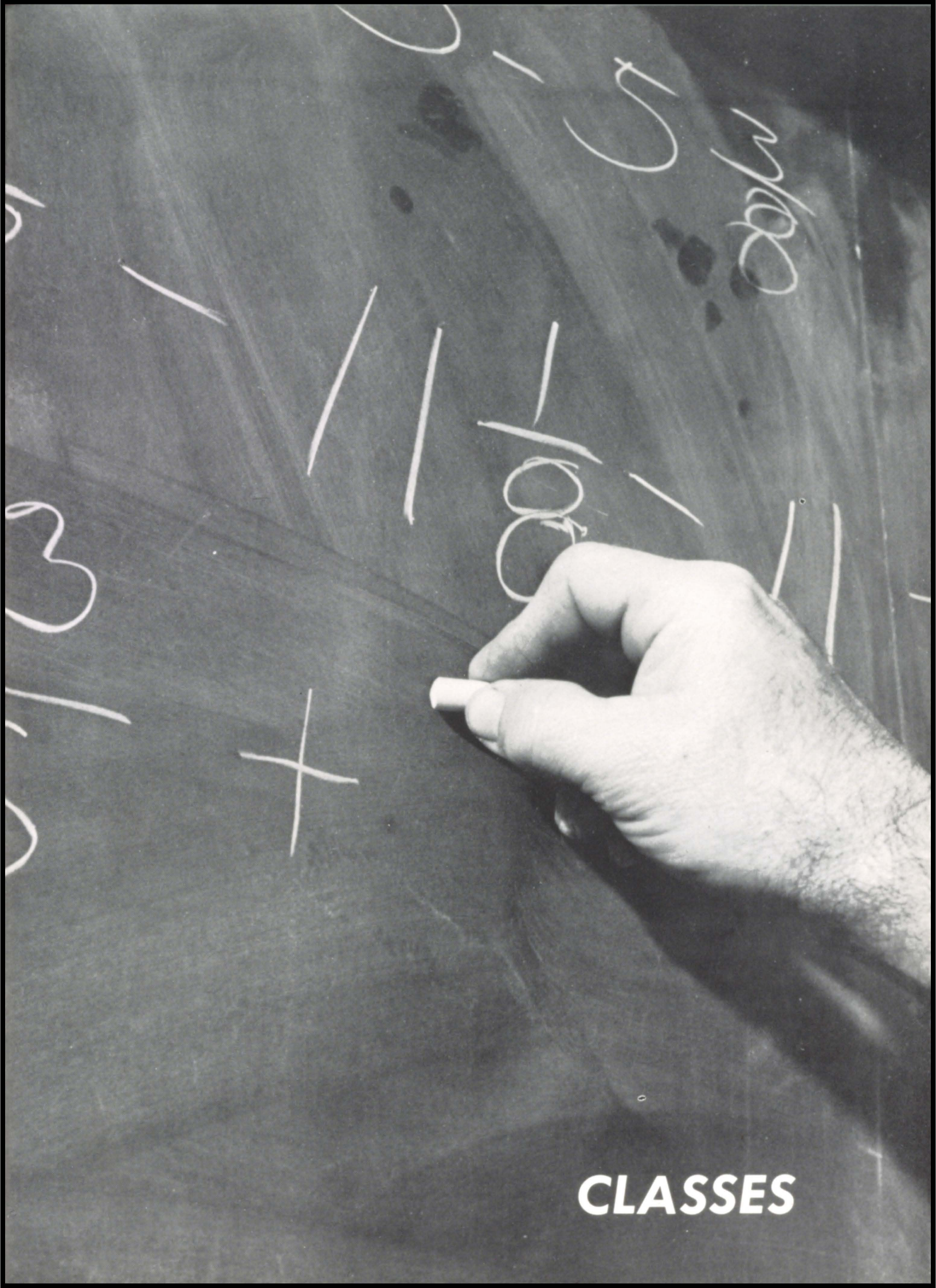
