

Lent Begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22 Embrace the Journey

This year we are making a few changes to the Ash Wednesday Schedule and wanted to give everyone notification.

The Ash Wednesday schedule is as follows:

7am Saint Maria Goretti Church (Mass) 8:30am Saint Teresa Church (Mass) 4pm Saint Teresa Church (Mass) 7pm Saint Teresa Church (Mass)

How do you celebrate lent? Yes, celebrate! Some see lent as a 'have to'. I have to give something up I love for 40 days. I have to give up meat on Fridays. But do we stop to really think about why? Do we stop to thank Jesus for all he gave up for us?

Lent is the most sacred season of the year for us, because we have the opportunity to prepare and celebrate the greatest mysteries of our faith ... the Pasion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. Within this most sacred season, we are asked to take the time to prepare our hearts and our minds.

Here are a few ways that we can celebrate during the Lenten Season:

Prayer

Prayer is a conversation with God. It's a time of speaking and listening. What a great time to develop prayer individually and as a family.

- Count your daily blessings on your way to work or school
- Go to daily Mass an extra day or two outside of Sunday
- Prayer the Rosary as a family in the car
- Come to Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings at 7PM, St Teresa Church
- Take time to visit the Adoration Chapel for a few minutes during the week





Fasting

Fasting can be more than only abstaining from some kind of food or drink during Lent. There are so many 'daily' moments where we can fast, abstaining or simplifying from . . .

- Take the worst parking spot you can find
- Turn the radio off in the car
- Eat more simply overall
- Don't swear or gossip
- Don't buy any 'extra' snacks

Almsgiving

Almsgiving has a basic definition of giving to the poor as an act of charity to those in need. But just like fasting can be so much more, so can almsgiving. Almsgiving is an act of justice that pleases the heart of God when we care for our neighbor in need. Did you ever consider ...

- Each day of Lent, write an affirmation note to someone
- Make a meal for someone in your neighborhood, just because
- Show an act of kindness randomly to someone, just because
- Give up complaining and take up gratitude instead



The question is, how are you preparing your heart and mind to be able to celebrate all that Jesus gave up for you. Lent is not about getting it 'perfectly' right, but asking the Holy Spirit how He wants to make you more like Jesus and then having the courage to following that promptly within your Lenten practices this season.






