


There was no systematic training at Corah until after World War II, when large numbers of women who had left the factory during the war did not return. By the time of the 1960s, Corah training programmes were being offered at the Leicester College of Technology and Commerce (now DeMontfort University).








St Nicholas Street, Leicester, in which Nathaniel Corah, the founder of the Corah knitting factory, lived in 1815






King George V and Queen Mary visit the Corah factory in 1919.










High speed knitting machine






