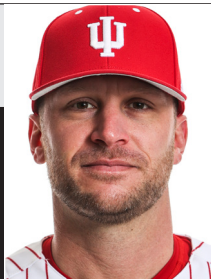

Jeff Mercer enters his third year as head coach of the Indiana baseball program in 2021.

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2, in seven innings.

Individually offensively, OF Grant Richardson was a standout, posting a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored. The sophomore led the Big Ten in in homers, runs, runs per game (1.5), slugging percentage and total bases (47) and ranked fifth in the nation in runs per game, 11th in total bases, 12th in slugging percentage and 19th in RBI.

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten Regular Season title, earning Big Ten Coach of the Year honors. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

Mercer became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in his first season as the skipper. He was just the second coach in IU history – in any sport, men's or women's – to win an outright Big Ten championship in his (or her) first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year as both baseball and basketball coach.

Indiana earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski, who was selected in the second round (57th overall). Gorski was the highest-drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber in 2014 (1st round, fourth overall).

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten First Team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Matt Gorski each made the second team, while Elijah Dunham earned third team laurels. Grant Richardson picked up All-Big Ten Freshman Team honors, while Drew Ashley was named the Sportsmanship Award winner.

Mercer, a native of Bargersville, Indiana, is widely regarded as one of the top young baseball coaches in the country. Known for his strength as a recruiter and talent developer as well as his innovative use of advanced analytics, Mercer was named the 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year with the Wright State Raiders. Mercer has recruited exceptionally within the state of Indiana and Midwest, developed twelve players he recruited into Major League Baseball draft picks since 2015, and led Wright State to 77 wins, including six wins against ranked opponents in just two seasons as head coach.

"Predictably, we had very strong interest in this position," said Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass. "Jeff Mercer quickly rose to the top of an impressive field. I have no doubt that he is the right person to build on the success of Indiana baseball, including taking us back to Omaha."

"I have loved baseball and the state of Indiana my whole life and it is an honor to be the head baseball coach of the state's flagship institution," said Mercer. "With the talent that the Midwest is producing, top notch facilities, the commitment of the school, and our ability to recruit and develop players at the highest level, the sky is the limit for IU baseball. I cannot wait to get to work."

Mercer was named Wright State head coach in July of 2016 and was the first former Raider player to lead the program. In his two seasons at the helm, WWSU posted a 77-38 record (.670; average of 38.5 wins per season), a regular season and conference tournament title along with an appearance in the 2018 Stanford NCAA Regional, and the program's first ever national ranking in 2017. Mercer's squads posted a 43-15 record (.741) in conference games over the two seasons.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he has been a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over those three appearances, having reached the regional finals twice.

The 2018 Horizon League Champions, Wright State closed the season winning eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19. The Raiders took home the league title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 in the tournament. Mercer's squad, which posted a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, was one of the top offensive clubs nationally in 2018, as it ranked eighth in the country in scoring (7.8 runs per game) and stolen bases (110) and was 21st in on-base percentage (.394), while hitting .294 as a team. The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was 10th nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple

Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 total Raiders who earned league honors, including five first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, all of whom were drafted within the first 21 rounds. Weiss, a starting pitcher, was selected in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall), as he posted a 9-2 record with one save and 92 strikeouts over 98 innings. Fellow starter Caleb Sampen was picked in the 20th round by the Los Angeles Dodgers, while Snyder went in the 21st round to the Minnesota Twins. Second baseman Matt Morrow additionally signed a free agent contract with the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In his two years as a head coach, Mercer made a name for himself as a recruiter. Wright State compiled its first ever top 100 ranked recruiting class (2018) in program history (87th nationally).

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017, finishing the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking second in the nation with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and a first team all-conference selection along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second team All-League honoree along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss and Gray were selected to the All-Freshman Team while Weiss was later named a Freshman All-American and second team ABCA All-Midwest selection. Sexton signed a free agent contract with the San Diego Padres.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in September 2013. WSU set a school record for wins with 43 in 2015 and broke it again a year later with 46 wins.

He assisted then head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF. As an assistant on Lovelady's staff, Mercer coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

Working with all aspects of the program, Mercer was the recruiting coordinator responsible for bringing in the majority of the talent. One of Mercer's primary responsibilities was his role as the hitting coach. During the 2016 season, WSU's 47 home runs were the most in a season since 2009. He also worked with the infield and outfield, and coached third base.

Mercer came back to WSU after serving two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he primarily worked with pitchers and outfielders, but was also instrumental in the development and organization of baseball camps and handled other day-to-day operations.

Prior to WKU, Mercer was a volunteer assistant during the 2011 season at the University of Michigan. During his time there, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

Mercer played two seasons at Dayton before transferring to Wright State, where he was a two-time first team All-Horizon League honoree as a first baseman. He was named to the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper All-American third team in 2009 after hitting .357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. He was also named the Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009 and was named to the league's All-Tournament team after he tied the WSU single-season records for RBI, doubles, games played and games started. In 2009, the Raiders played in the Fort Worth NCAA Regional.

Mercer earned a degree in organizational leadership from Wright State in 2009. He and his wife, Stephanie, had their first child, Grady, born on June 20, 2018. Mercer's father (Jeff Sr.) served as an IU baseball assistant coach from 1988 to 1989 and helped found the noted Indiana Bulls baseball organization.

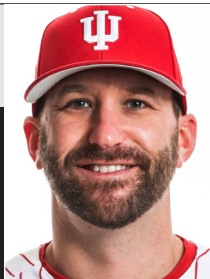

Justin Parker enters his third season with the IU baseball program and his second as associate head coach in 2021. Parker is responsible for the Hoosiers pitching staff.

In the shortened 2020 season, Parker helped lead the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2, in seven innings.

On the mound, the Hoosiers posted a team ERA of 3.56, striking out 134 batters in 129.0 innings pitched. RHP Gabe Bierman posted a 2.45 ERA and a record of 2-1 in his four starts, while LHP Tommy Sommer was 2-1 on the year with a 2.61 ERA in four starts.

In 2019, Parker help guide the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten Regular Season title - the seventh in program history and the first for IU since 2014.

Indiana earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski, who was selected in the second round (57th overall). Gorski was the highest-drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber in 2014 (1st round, fourth overall).

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten First Team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Matt Gorski each made the second team, while Elijah Dunham earned third team laurels. Grant Richardson picked up All-Big Ten Freshman Team honors, while Drew Ashley was named the Sportsmanship Award winner.

"Justin and I played together in college, then were assistants together for several years, it's been very gratifying to see him become one of the best pitching coaches in the country," said head coach Jeff Mercer at the time of Parker's hiring. "Indiana University baseball is better in every way with Justin joining the organization. He is an incredible asset to our entire program, not just our pitching staff."

"I couldn't be happier to be back home in Indiana, to work with Coach Mercer again and to continue to build on the tradition here," said Parker. "As far as recruiting Hoosiers and player development, I am just really looking forward to doing that here at home."

Prior to joining the Hoosiers, Parker served as the pitching coach at UCF for two seasons. He was formally named pitching coach for the Knights on July 18, 2016 after spending the previous six seasons with the Wright State program as an assistant coach.

During the 2018 campaign, Parker's staff posted a 3.32 ERA, the eighth sub-3.50 ERA season in school history. Pitchers struck out 556 batters, good for second in program history behind 2001's 597, while the Knights set a new program record with 7.1 hits allowed per nine innings and gave up the third fewest hits at 405. UCF's bullpen had a strong year as well, as Knight relievers inherited 74 runners this season and allowed just 20 to score. Thad Ward was a first team all-conference reliever with a 2.88 ERA and a team-high 52 strikeouts in 40.2 innings of relief this season.

Under Parker in his first season with the Knights in 2017, the pitching staff was one of the best in the nation, finishing 10th in WHIP (1.22), 24th in strikeout-to-walks ratio (2.74), 28th in strikeouts per nine innings (8.9) and 52nd in walks per nine innings (3.26). The crowning achievement for Parker's players was the fifth best ERA in the nation at 3.00. Freshman Joseph Sheridan and senior Robby Howell both won 10 games and finished tied for 13th in the country in that category.

JUSTIN PARKER

Parker has consistently produced pitchers selected in the MLB Draft. Of his 16 draft picks, seven have gone in the first 10 rounds. In just two years at UCF, Parker sent nine arms to the professional ranks.

Following the 2018 season, Parker and UCF had five pitchers selected in the draft, the most since 2002 and tied for the second most ever in school history. Thad Ward (5th Round, Boston Red Sox), JJ Montgomery (7th Round, Baltimore Orioles), Bryce Tucker (14th Round San Francisco Giants), Eric Hepple (27th Round, Colorado Rockies), and Cre Finrock (29th Round, Toronto Blue Jays) each heard their names called.

UCF's Jason Bahr was a fifth-round selection by the San Francisco Giants in 2017. He was followed by Robby Howell in the 10th round, who went to the Cincinnati Reds. Jordan Scheftz (23rd round, Cleveland Indians) and Andy Rohloff (37th round, San Francisco Giants) also heard their names called after one year under Parker.

Dating back to his days on staff at Wright State, Parker guided Jesse Scholtens to a ninth-round selection by the San Diego Padres in 2016. Fellow Raider Robby Sexton was also tabbed in the 14th round by the Boston Red Sox in the same draft. His first player ever drafted was Andrew Elliott in the 30th round of the 2015 Draft to the Baltimore Orioles.

Parker's ability to work with freshmen and veterans has been showcased in seven All-Americans selections. At UCF, Joseph Sheridan (College Baseball News and Perfect Game) was tabbed as a Freshman All-American, and Robby Howell earned Collegiate Baseball All-American status.

His Wright State pitching staff had four honorees in Scholtens (Third Team) and Caleb Sampen (Freshman) in 2016, and Elliot (Third Team) and Sean Murphy (Freshman) in 2015.

In six seasons with the Raiders, Parker's pitching staff helped Wright State to four Horizon League Championship Games, winning in 2015 and 2016.

The Raiders pitching staff enjoyed a great deal of success under Parker. In 2016, Wright State freshman pitcher Sampen was named Horizon League Newcomer of the Year, while senior ace Scholtens compiled a 10-1 record, which included the first perfect game in school history.

Parker's pitchers guided Wright State to the Horizon League Championship in 2016. The Raiders posted a 46-17 record and ranked fifth in the country in walks per nine innings at 2.45, 33rd in ERA at 3.49 and 10th in WHIP at 1.2, all of which led the Horizon League. Scholtens finished the season 18th in wins (10), 70th in strikeouts (95) and 51st in walks allowed per nine innings.

The 2015 season finished with the Raiders leading the league in almost every pitching category, including ERA (3.54), strikeouts per nine innings (7.2), hits allowed per nine innings (8.84), shutouts (4) and WHIP (1.33). Luke Mamer was 19th nationally for fewest walks allowed per nine innings (1.19) while Elliot came out of the bullpen to record 11 saves.

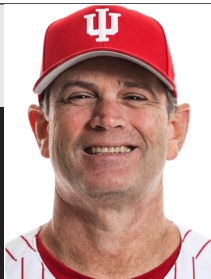
The Raiders ranked in the top 100 in hits allowed per nine innings (8.64) and shutouts (4) in 2014, while Elliot posted 13 saves, good for 19th nationally. In 2013, the Raiders averaged 7.5 strikeouts and 8.98 hits per game to rank 46th and 99th, respectively.

Following a professional career, Parker returned to coach his alma mater in 2011.

Parker was drafted by the Minnesota Twins in the 43rd round of the 2005 MLB June Amateur Draft from Fort Wayne High School (Fort Wayne, Ind.) but opted to play for Wright State University. He was drafted again, this time by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 6th round of the 2008 MLB June Amateur Draft where he spent three years playing for the Diamondbacks minor league affiliates.

As a player at Wright State, Parker earned first-team Horizon League selections in 2007 and 2008, as well as second team ABCA All Region in 2007, and was an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District recipient in 2008.

Parker graduated from Wright State with a bachelor's degree in Organizational Leadership in 2012. He is married to Angela Parker and is the brother of former MLB pitcher Jarrod Parker.

Dan Held enters his third season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the IU baseball program in 2021.

In the shortened 2020 season, Held helped lead the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2, in seven innings.

In 2019, Held help guide the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten Regular Season title - the seventh in program history and the first for IU since 2014.

Indiana earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski, who was selected in the second round (57th overall). Gorski was the highest-drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber in 2014 (1st round, fourth overall).

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten First Team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Matt Gorski each made the second team, while Elijah Dunham earned third team laurels. Grant Richardson picked up All-Big Ten Freshman Team honors, while Drew Ashley was named the Sportsmanship Award winner.

"I've known Dan for over 10 years," said head coach Jeff Mercer at the time of Held's hiring. "He hired me for my first coaching job with the Indiana Bulls directly after college. Working with him over the years it became obvious he'd make a terrific recruiting coordinator. His experiences in professional baseball as a player and coach will translate well to our player development processes. His many relationships with high school and summer coaches will make for a smooth transition into leading our recruiting efforts."

"I am really excited to join Jeff Mercer and Justin Parker at IU," said Held. "It's going to be an awesome staff, and I'm really excited to get going."

Held came to Indiana after serving as the Executive Director of the Indiana Bulls Baseball Organization. He brings nine years of pro baseball playing experience and 16 years coaching experience, including four in the major leagues, to the Hoosiers.

The Bulls is a travel baseball organization based out of Indianapolis that has had the goal of developing homegrown baseball talent in the state of Indiana. Held oversaw the organization, that as of 2018, had a total of 26 teams that ranged from eight to 18 years old. He was responsible for hiring all the coaches within the organization.

Since joining the Bulls organization in November 2006, Held has seen four Bulls players reach the big leagues. Those players include Tucker Barnhart, Micah Johnson, Alex Meyer, and Cameron Perkins. A total of 80 Bulls players have been drafted since Held took over club.

A 42nd round draft pick in 1993 by Philadelphia, Held played nine total seasons in the minors in the Phillies and New York Mets farm systems. He returned to the Phillies organization in 2002 as a hitting coach with Batavia (Short-Season A) and then served as a bullpen assistant with the St. Louis Cardinals from 2003 to 2007 where he was a member of the 2006 World Series Champions coaching staff.

During his minor league career, Held hit 121 career home runs and drove in 474 runs. He spent three seasons at the Triple-A level, playing for Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Norfolk.

Held and his wife, Lynn, have a daughter, Téa (15), and a son, Boston (11).

Derek Simmons is in his second season as an assistant coach with the Hoosiers in 2021. Simmons will work with hitters, infielders and handle baserunning for Indiana.

In the shortened 2020 season, Simmons helped lead the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2, in seven innings.

“Derek and I have been good friends for 10 years,” Mercer said at the time of Simmons’ hiring. “I’ve always admired and respected his work ethic and baseball acumen. He’s a man of the highest integrity and shares our passion for player development. Derek has been extremely successful everywhere he’s been and we’re fortunate to have him and his family joining Indiana Baseball.”

Simmons came to Indiana from Kent State, where he was an assistant coach since 2017. He worked closely with position players and hitters, while also serving as the recruiting coordinator. Entering the 2018-19 school year, Kent State’s incoming freshman class was ranked 25th nationally, according to Collegiate Baseball.

Simmons is one of 20 assistant coaches nationwide named to Baseball America’s Coaches to Watch List in 2018 and 2019 and one of 30 assistant coaches invited to the Surefire Baseball Forum for elite assistants in January 2018 and 2019.

In addition to aiding Kent State to a MAC regular season and tournament title in 2018, Simmons coached 12 All-Conference Selections, four All-Americans, including Justin Kirby who was the MAC Freshman of the Year. The Flashes offense finished the 2019 Season in the Top-50 nationally in scoring, batting average, doubles, stolen bases and slugging. Simmons saw seven former Flashes get drafted during his time there, including three who were selected in the top 10 rounds. Simmons also coached two Johnny Bench/Buster Posey Award semi finalists and a John Olerud semifinalist as well.

“I would like to thank Jeff Mercer and Indiana University for giving me this incredible opportunity to be a part of Hoosier baseball,” said Simmons at the time of his hiring. “Indiana University is without a doubt the flagship school in this state with a national brand baseball program. For me, leaving a program like Kent State and the people over there, it had to be a once in a lifetime opportunity and Indiana provides that. I am so fortunate to be here and my wife, Erin, my two kids, Bella and Braxton, and myself are fired up about being here Bloomington! I can’t wait to get going and help continue to develop these players and get back to Omaha.”

Prior to his time with the Golden Flashes, Simmons was at Alabama, where he was an assistant coach during the 2016 season. With the Crimson Tide, he oversaw the infielders, assisted with the hitters, coached first base, was the camp coordinator, on-campus recruiter, and was the academic liaison. Alabama’s infielders led the SEC with 50 double plays.

Prior to Alabama, Simmons coached for four seasons at Kennesaw State, helping grab the program’s first regular season Atlantic Sun championship in 2016, a Super Regional appearance, and the first conference tournament championship in program history in 2014.

He helped mentor the Johnny Bench Award winner, Atlantic Sun Player and Defensive Player of the Year, the ABCA District Player of the Year, a Georgia Dugout Club Player of the Year, five All-Americans, 31 All-ASUN honorees, and had 19 players selected in the MLB Draft, including nine top-10 round picks. With the Owls, Simmons oversaw the team’s hitting, recruiting, administrative duties, academics, and camps.

Under the guidance of Simmons, the Owls batted .294 as a team and ranked fourth all-time in program history for a single season, propelling Kennesaw State to a 17-4 mark in conference play in 2016. The Owls totaled 85 doubles, 12 triples, and 40 home runs, leading to the team’s first regular season ASUN title in program history.

DEREK SIMMONS

Simmons played a key role for Kennesaw State's historic run in 2014, in which the team won its first ever Atlantic Sun Conference Championship as well as the NCAA Division I Tallahassee Regional. The Owls finished the season third in the nation in total hits (677) and 18th in batting average (.297).

The Owls finished the 2014 season being ranked 13th in the country by Collegiate Baseball. 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 Recruiting Classes all named "Top Classes" by Collegiate Baseball and named Best in the Atlantic Sun by Baseball America. Recognized by Perfect Game as one of 10 coaches who nationally "Who Are Everywhere Recruiting."

Prior to KSU, Simmons was the hitting coach and volunteer assistant coach at Central Michigan from August 2010 to July 2012, helping the Chippewas claim a 2011 MAC West title and place seven student-athletes on the All-MAC team.

Simmons has been a part of USA Baseball since 2012 having coached and been an evaluator for the Tournament of Stars and the 18U National Team. He was also an assistant coach for the 14U NTDP team in 2018.

Simmons started his playing career at the University of Montevallo, qualifying for the Division II College World Series in 2006. After earning two letters there, he went on to be a two-year letter winner and captain at Georgia State. He earned first team all-conference accolades, becoming the first player in Georgia State history to be a first-team honoree twice. He finished his career ranked in the top ten in numerous single season categories, including home runs, runs scored, and RBI while posting a .344 career batting average for the Panthers.

Simmons played one season in independent baseball before entering the coaching profession. He and his wife, Erin, have two children, Bella and Braxton.

Indiana baseball head coach Jeff Mercer named former eight-time Gold Glove winner and seven-time National League All-Star Scott Rolen as the Director of Player Development.

Rolen will assist with on-campus recruiting in accordance with NCAA rules. In addition to collaborating with the coaching staff when preparing for practice and competition, he will also give valuable advice to players on lifestyle choices and making informed decisions when pursuing pro baseball careers.

"I couldn't be more excited to add Scott Rolen to our staff," said Mercer. "The impact Scott will have on the student athletes in our baseball program will be unique among college programs. The value for the staff and players, gaining knowledge daily from someone with such a historic career and who truly values the growth of young people, is special."

For his MLB career that lasted from 1996 to 2012, Rolen played with four clubs (Phillies 1996-02; Cardinals 2002-07; Blue Jays 2008-09; Reds 2009-12), was a World Series champion (2006), and a Silver Slugger Award winner (2002). He was a lifetime .281 hitter with 2,077 hits, 316 home runs, 1,287 RBIs and scored 1,211 runs. In 2011, he became just the fourth third baseman to have 2,000 career hits, 500 doubles, 300 home runs and 1,200 RBIs, joining Mike Schmidt, George Brett and Chipper Jones in that group.

Rolen reached the major leagues for the first time in 1996 with the Phillies and was named the National League Rookie of the Year the following season. During the 1998 campaign with the Phillies, he won the first of his eight Gold Glove awards. The eight Gold Gloves rank third all-time amongst third basemen, trailing Hall of Famers Brooks Robinson (16) and Schmidt (10).

In 2002, he was traded to the St. Louis Cardinals and later that year earned the Silver Slugger Award, given annually to the best offensive player at each position in both the National and American leagues.

His 2004 season was one of the best of his career, as he hit .314 with 34 home runs and 124 RBIs, finishing first in the All-Star voting and fourth in the NL MVP voting while his team won the NL Central. Later that postseason, he hit a two-run home run in game seven of NLCS that proved to be the game-winner.

In 2006, he returned from an injury and hit .292 with 22 home runs and 95 RBI, as the Cardinals went on to win the World Series. He was a nominee for NL Comeback Player of the Year after missing 2015 with the injury.

A native of Jasper, Ind., Rolen attended Jasper High School and was named Indiana's Mr. Baseball during his senior season in 1993. He additionally played basketball and tennis, and was a runner-up for Indiana's Mr. Basketball. He was drafted by the Phillies in the 1993 MLB Draft.

ALL-TIME HEAD COACHES

JAMES HORNE – 1899-00

Overall Record: 10-8-0 (.556)

James Horne was the first Hoosier baseball coach and, in his two years, led Indiana to a 10-8 record. In 1901, he became the first men's basketball coach at Indiana.

ROBERT WICKER – 1901, 1908

Overall: 10-12-0 (.455)

Big Ten: 2-5-0 (.286)

Robert Wicker coached the Hoosiers in 1901 and 1908. In 1901, he led them to a 3-3 record. In 1908, Wicker returned to the bench and led them to a 7-9 record with a 2-5 record in conference play.

GEORGE MOORE – 1902

Overall: 6-10-0 (.375)

George Moore was Indiana's third head coach in four years. He guided the team to a 6-10 record his only season.

PHILIP O'NEIL – 1903-04

Overall: 17-11-0 (.607)

In his two seasons as coach of the Hoosiers, Philip O'Neil led the team to a 17-11 record.

ZORA CLEVINGER – 1905-06

Overall: 16-22-1 (.423)

Big Ten: 1-5-0 (.167)

Not only was Zora Clevinger the Hoosiers' baseball coach from 1905-06, but he also served as head basketball coach during those same years. He coached both teams to their first Big Ten victories and guided the baseball Hoosiers to a 16-22-1 overall record with a 1-5 record in conference play. Clevinger later served as the athletics director and was a 1982 inductee into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

JAKE STAHL – 1907

Overall: 8-5-0 (.615)

Big Ten: 2-1-0 (.667)

In his only season on the bench, Jake Stahl guided the Hoosiers to their first Big Ten winning season with a 2-1 record and a third-place finish in the conference. The team also finished with an overall record of 8-5.

RALPH ROACH – 1909-11

Overall: 21-15-0 (.583)

Big Ten: 8-11-0 (.421)

Ralph Roach coached the Hoosiers from 1909-1911. During those years, he guided the team to a 21-15 record and a third-place finish in the conference in 1910.

JOHN CORBETT – 1912

Overall: 5-9-0 (.357)

Big Ten: 0-8-0 (.000)

John Corbett led Indiana to an overall record of 5-9 and for the first time in its history, IU finished the Big Ten season winless, going 0-8.

ARTHUR BERNDT – 1913-15

Overall: 18-17-0 (.514)

Big Ten: 11-15-0 (.423)

Arthur Berndt guided Indiana to an 18-17 overall record and an 11-15 conference record in his three seasons as coach. He also led the Hoosiers to a third-place finish in the conference in 1913. Berndt was a 1997 inductee into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

FREDERICK BEEBE – 1916

Overall: 8-4-0 (.667)

Big Ten: 4-3-0 (.571)

Frederick Beebe coached Indiana in 1916, leading IU to a winning overall and conference record. The Hoosiers were 8-4 and finished third with a 4-3 record in the conference.

ROY WHISMAN – 1917

Overall: 5-10-1 (.344)

Big Ten: 5-4-0 (.556)

Roy Whisman led the Hoosiers to yet another third-place finish in the Big Ten with a 5-4 conference record and a 5-10-1 record overall.

GUY RATHBUN – 1918

Overall: 9-7-0 (.563)

Big Ten: 0-5 (.000)

Guy Rathbun coached the Hoosiers to a winning record (9-7) in 1918, despite the fact that they finished winless in Big Ten play (0-5) for only the second time in school history.

HARRY SCHOLLER – 1919-20

Overall: 21-15-1 (.581)

Big Ten: 6-10-0 (.375)

In his two seasons as head coach, Harry Scholler guided Indiana to a 21-15-1 record and a 6-10 Big Ten record.

GEORGE LEVIS – 1921-22

Overall: 11-17-0 (.393)

Big Ten: 6-9 (.400)

George Levis coached Indiana in 1921 and 1922. He led the Hoosiers to an 11-17 record and 6-9 mark in the Big Ten.

ROSCOE MINTON – 1923-24

Overall: 11-23-1 (.329)

Big Ten: 6-11-0 (.353)

Roscoe Minton coached the Hoosiers in 1923 and 1924. He led the Hoosiers to a 11-23-1 mark and a 6-11 record in the Big Ten.

EVERETT DEAN – 1925-38

Overall: 172-93-8 (.645)

Big Ten: 78-55-1 (.586)

Everett Dean coached Indiana from 1925 to 1938, leading it to six top-three finishes in the Big Ten, including three first-place finishes. During his tenure, Indiana was 171-92-8 with a 78-55-1 record in the Big Ten. He was the first Indiana baseball coach to break 100 wins. Dean was a 1982 inductee into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

PAUL HARRELL – 1939-47

Overall: 101-65-2 (.607)

Big Ten: 39-41-0 (.488)

Paul Harrell coached Indiana from 1939 to 1947. He led the Hoosiers to a 101-65-2 record with a 39-41 Big Ten record, including a second-place finish in 1939. Harrell was a 1983 inductee into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

DONALD DANIELSON – 1948

Overall: 15-10-0 (.600)

Big Ten: 3-9-0 (.250)

Donald Danielson coached Indiana in 1948 and led IU to a 15-10 record with a 3-9 record in the Big Ten.

ERNIE ANDRES – 1949-73

Overall: 402-377-3 (.516)

Big Ten: 140-221-1 (.388)

Ernie Andres coached Indiana for 24 seasons (1949-73). He was the first Indiana baseball coach to capture 400 wins (401-377-3) and more than 100 conference victories (140-221-1). Andres was a 1983 inductee into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

BOB LAWRENCE – 1974-80

Overall: 132-164 (.446)

Big Ten: 44-71-0 (.383)

Bob Lawrence coached the Hoosiers from 1974-1980. He led Indiana to a 132-164 record with a 44-71 record in the Big Ten and a third-place finish in 1976.

LARRY SMITH – 1981-83

Overall: 73-75-1 (.493)

Big Ten: 13-30-1 (.307)

Larry Smith coached Indiana to a 73-75-1 record and a 13-30-1 record in the Big Ten with a third-place finish in 1983.

BOB MORGAN – 1984-05

Overall: 782-499-4 (.610)

Big Ten: 245-323-1 (.432)

Bob Morgan completed his 22-year career as IU's head baseball coach with 782 victories, the most in the program's history. After finishing the 1996 regular season with a school-record 18 wins against conference opposition, Morgan took his team to the Big Ten Tournament, where Indiana's 6-4 victory over Illinois in the championship game gave the Hoosiers their first conference title since 1949 and an historic first NCAA Tournament appearance.

TRACY SMITH – 2006-14

Overall: 287-237 (.548)

Big Ten: 127-111 (.534)

Tracy Smith led the baseball program for nine seasons, completing his illustrious run as IU's coach in 2014.

Smith the 2013 National Coach of the Year and Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2013 and 2014 lifted Indiana University Baseball to heights unseen in the program's history over his final two seasons. The Hoosiers made their first ever College World Series in 2013, ending a 29-year CWS drought for the Big Ten Conference. Indiana's magical run included an 18-game winning streak, Big Ten regular season title, Big Ten Tournament crown, hosting of an NCAA Regional, Super Regional sweep at Florida State and an appearance in the College World Series. In 2014, Indiana repeated as Big Ten regular season and tournament champions, clinching the No. 4 seed

in the NCAA Tournament and hosting the regional.

Indiana's first Big Ten title under Smith came in 2009 when the Hoosiers dominated the conference tournament, outscoring the competition 49-6 en route to four consecutive victories and berth to an NCAA Regional. More Hoosiers earned All-American honors under Smith than the rest of IU Baseball history combined.

CHRIS LEMONIS – 2015-18

Overall: 141-91-2 (.607)

Big Ten: 55-37-1 (.597)

Chris Lemonis took over an IU program in 2015 that had gone 93-31 the previous two seasons, including its first-ever College World Series appearance in 2013 and the No. 4 overall seed in the 2014 NCAA Baseball Championship. With a new look roster, his program immediately lived up to the expectations, posting a 35-24 overall record and earning a berth into a third-straight NCAA Regional.

With a 34-24-2 overall record and a 14-9-1 mark in Big Ten play, Indiana was selected to the 2017 NCAA Baseball Tournament field. Lemonis and the No. 2-seeded Hoosiers earned a berth into the Lexington Regional.

In 2018, he lead the program to a 40-win season and a regional final appearance in Austin, Texas. He became the only coach in program history to make three regionals in his first four seasons as IU's skipper. He ties Tracy Smith (2009, 2013, 2014) for the most NCAA postseason appearances in program history.

JEFF MERCER – 2019-Present

Overall: 46-29 (.613)

Big Ten: 17-7 (.708)

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten Regular Season title, earning Big Ten Coach of the Year honors. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

Mercer became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in his first season as the skipper. He was just the second coach in IU history – in any sport, men's or women's – to win an outright Big Ten championship in his (or her) first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year as both baseball and basketball coach.

Indiana earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski, who was selected in the second round (57th overall). Gorski was the highest-drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber in 2014 (1st round, fourth overall).
