Greetings,

Reflecting on this year, we are reminded of the sheer goodness of human beings, of the power of the human spirit, and how the human spirit brings us hope and healing. This year we've witnessed the unrelenting dedication of our staff and their bravery. 

Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) Look-Alike



IWS secured the designation of a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) Look-Alike. An FQHC Look-Alike is a community-based healthcare provider that meets the requirements of the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) Health Center Program, which includes providing primary care services in underserved areas, providing care on a sliding-fee scale based on ability to pay, and operating under a governing board that includes patients. Although FQHC Look-Alikes do not receive HRSA program funding, IWS is now eligible to apply for new funding opportunities and receives additional reimbursement for healthcare services, which strengthens our financial standing.

IWS Associate Board members are young professionals who champion our mission and dedicate their free time to support IWS.

This year, the Associate Board met in a local park to safely assemble kits, games, and activities for the speech therapy program. Families and children use kits in weekly sessions and at home to practice their skills.

At the Logan Square Farmer's Market, the Associate Board generated awareness of IWS and recruited new patients.


Next year, the Associate Board looks forward to resuming the in-person Back-to-School event for children and families.
















MESSAGE from the AUXILIARY

Hope, Healing, and the Human Spirit certainly embodies the essence of the Auxiliary's Fiscal Year 2021. The year began with most of our Chapters in the midst of planning for their annual, large, in-person fundraising events to support the Angel Harvey Family Health Center. But, as the pandemic unfolded, it became apparent that those events would need to be reimagined. So our members did just that. They rolled up their sleeves, got to work and delivered one success after another.

HOPE. After two years of planning, and having to postpone the scheduled April, 2020 launch of its nationally acclaimed Showhouse, our Lake Forest Chapter worked tirelessly to open the Showhouse in July 2021. With record attendance while satisfying all safety protocols, it provided welcome hope for an eventual return to normalcy. Similarly, the Wheaton-Naperville and Mount Prospect Chapters successfully converted their Fall 2021 fundraising events to donation-only campaigns. Holiday luminaria sales in Clarendon Hills and Wheaton-Naperville also achieved record results. Employing the magic of Zoom, our Oak Brook, Clarendon Hills and Hinsdale Chapters virtually hosted their annual Mistletoe Medley, Light Up the Night and Tablescapes events to rave reviews. Not to be outdone, our North Shore Chapter sponsored its annual No-Frills Fundraiser, and our Downers Grove Chapter hosted a Luck-of-the-Irish Raffle on St. Patrick's Day. In each case, our Chapters received an overwhelming response and support from their donors and communities. That, and the dedication and enthusiasm of our members, provided a beacon of hope during a most challenging year, and enabled the Auxiliary to contribute \$600,000 to the IWS operating budget.

HEALING. Healing takes many forms. Recognizing that more than just financial support is needed by patients at the Angel Harvey Family Health Center, the Auxiliary went above and beyond to directly assist patient families experiencing food insecurity and other needs this past year. More than 1,800 grocery items, 144 Spring Food Boxes, and more than \$6,000 in grocery gift cards were delivered to the Center to aid families most in need. During the holiday season, 365 children received a Holiday Gift Bag assembled by Chapter members as part of our annual See Santa program for Center patients. And, through our valued partnership with CD One Price Cleaners, the Auxiliary distributed 1,961 new and gently used coats plus hundreds of new hats, scarves, and mittens to Center patients and community members. Chapters individually donated diapers, wipes, baby shower items, household goods and linens, dental supplies and bean soup kits for patients, and PPE and cleaning supplies for the Center's staff. Each of these initiatives not only helped heal, but provided hope, to struggling families.

THE HUMAN SPIRIT. The strength of the human spirit is demonstrated every day by the dedicated staff at the Angel Harvey Family Health Center. Their deep commitment to the health and well-being of the Center's patients is evident in the smiles and gratitude regularly seen on the patients' faces. To celebrate the Center's staff as the 2021 Champions for Children, the Auxiliary proudly donated \$10,000 to renovate the Staff Lounge on the lower level. We hope the new space provides a welcome respite on long and challenging days.

Hope, Healing, and the Human Spirit were exhibited in everything our members did. Their energy is infectious. Their commitment, creativity and resourcefulness over the past year were amazing to witness.






