## MINISTERIAL ORDINANCE

### Ministry of Finance Ordinance No. 105

October 2, 1946

The special exceptions concerning the date of payment of Salaries and Allowances of government officials shall be provided for as follows:

The date of payment of the salaries and allowances of government officials of October 1946 shall be advanced by seven days from the date fixed in the annex table of the Detailed Rules of the payment of Salaries and Allowances of government officials, and under the provisions of Paragraph 2 of the Supplementary Provisions of the Ministry of Finance Ordinance No. 112 of 1943, notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1 of the Detailed Rules of the payment of Salaries and Allowances of government officials and Paragraph 2 of the Supplementary Provisions of the Ministry of Finance Ordinance No. 112 of 1943.

Supplementary Provision:

The present Ordinance shall come into force as from the day of its promulgation.

### Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry Ordinance No. 57

### Price Board Notification No. 98

In accordance with the provisions of Article 4 of the Price Control Ordinance, the controlled prices of the A.C. electric arc welders are designated as follows, and Ministry of Commerce and Industry Notification No. 295 of March, 1942 (concerning the designation of the Maximum Selling Prices of the electric welder and its accessories) shall hereby abolished.

- The electric welder stated in the above List is that of the standard type for general use, and its test rating depends upon the Temporary Japanese Standard Rating (JES Rin No. 548 and JES Rin No. 549).
- The controlling price of the A.C. electric arc welder is to be as follows:
  - It is to be of portable type with neither ammeter nor voltmeter equipped.
  - The primary voltage is to be single phase A.C. 220 V., 200 V. and 180 V.; the frequency 50 C. or 60 C.; and the secondary load voltage 30 V.
  - The regulating range of the secondary current is to be from 30% to 100% of the rating current, and the secondary highest no-load voltage is to be under 80 V. for the Kind 1 and under 170 V. for the Kind 2.
- The controlling price of high frequency A.C. electric arc welder is to be as follows:
  - It is to be a portable type with neither ammeter nor voltmeter arc equipped.
  - The primary voltage is to be single phase A.C. 220 V., 200 V. and 180 V.; the frequency 50 C. or 60 C.; and the secondary load voltage 30 V.
  - The regulating range of secondary current is to be from 15% to 100%, and the secondary highest no load voltage is to be under 80 V. for the Kind 1.
- In the controlling prices stated in the above List no accessories for welder are included.
- The controlling price of second-hand one is to be less than 80% of the controlling price stated in the above List.
- In the controlling prices stated in the above List the packing expenses are included.
- In the controlling price in case where no packing expenses are included is to be the sum acquired when the controlling price in the above List is subtracted by 2.5% and the amount less than 1 yen is omitted.

Memorandum For: Imperial Japanese Government.

Subject: Confiscation of Propaganda Publications.

1. The Japanese Government is directed to collect from all public channels, including warehouses, book shops, book dealers, publishing companies, distributing agents and all commercial establishments, or agencies of the Japanese government where these publications are held in bulk, the following listed propaganda publications:
