MINISTERIAL ORDINANCE

Ministries of Agriculture & Forestry,
Commerce & Industry, Trans-

tions Ordinance No. 3

October 7, 1948

The following partial amendments shall be made to the Regulations governing the Enforcement of Telecommunications Facilities Construction (Ministries of Agriculture and Forestry, Commerce and Industry, Transportation and Communications Ordinance No. 1 of 1948) under the Temporary Materials Demand and Supply Adjustment Law (Law No. 32 of 1946):

The following one paragraph shall be added after Article 2, Paragraph 1.

Maintenance mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall mean the minimum upkeep necessary to continue a facility in sound condition. However, maintenance shall not include the improvement of any plant, facility or equipment by replacing material which is still usable with material of a better kind, quality or design.

Article 3-(2). No applicant for telecommunications facilities construction shall make any replace-

ment of telecommunications equipment or facilities unless such replacement meets one or more of the following requirements:

1. Essential maintenance in order to insure protection and maintenance of existing service.
2. Essential additions to existing services cannot be made except by replacing the existing facilities.

Notwithstanding the provisions in the preceding paragraph, in the case where any applicant for telecommunications facilities construction deems to be necessary to improve the existing services they shall make specific applications in the form of Appendix No. 5 certifying that the improvement cannot be made without replacing existing facilities together with the application for permission of the construction project sheets mentioned in Paragraph 1 of the preceding Article and get the approval of the competent Ministries.
