



When asked about the experience on the field, jenior Michael McCoy said, "Being out on the field with my teammates and winning the game makes all the practices worth it,"












The night of August 30th was an exciting night that brought all sports fans running to the Jerry Brewer Alumni Stadium. Jasper's varsity football team, as well as the boys and girls cross country teams, faced off against one of their oldest adversaries, the Southridge Raiders, for the last time in the foreseeable future. Due to Jasper joining the SIAC (Southern Indiana Athletic Conference), the Wildeats' schedule has no room for the age-old rivalry. The Wildeats and the Raiders have faced off for almost 50 years, with a Wildeat winning record of 40-8. Alas, the Wildeats' strong efforts in the gracling battle at the goal post gathering resulted in a 21-17 loss. The entire sports community came together to show their support in this final fight.

This long-lived rivalry began in 1972 under the legendary head coach Jerry Brewer. The Goal Posts trophy is a treasured accolade of all the competing schools. However, the trophy was lost for many years, before it was found in a closet 15 years ago. During the stint without the trophy, the rivalry almost ended due to a lack of competition between the two teams in the early 1990s. The Raiders first beat the Wildeats in 1998 and have won only 7 more times since then. The last time Southridge nabbed the trophy was after a 28-21 win in 2016. Nevertheless, Jasper regained the winning title the following year, led by senior captain Ryan Ewing. Now, after the Raiders 8th and final win against the Wildeats, the coveted relie will find its home at the Huntinghurg school.

year. Gayso previously taught at class D powerhouse, Forest Park.






Maving one kid At a time
