Welcome from the AIS President

It is my immense pleasure to welcome you to the 37th Annual Meeting of the Association of Israel Studies, its first virtual conference.

Although we regret not being able to get together in person, we are thrilled to be able to engage each other virtually, to learn about and discuss the cutting-edge Israel Studies research you are all conducting.

The conference is the culmination of a year-long effort on the part of AIS to continue to make Israel Studies research accessible to its members in the midst of this challenging year. Throughout the year the AIS has been able to co-sponsor symposiums and lectures, and get the word out about the many virtual events sponsored by our institutional members. We offered a virtual early-career workshop for graduate students led by Arieh Saposnik, and we launched a new AIS Distinguished Lectureship Program so that the research of our distinguished scholars could be highlighted throughout the year as they lecture to universities across the globe.

The highlight for the AIS each year is its conference. It was with deep regret that we had to cancel the AIS conference in June 2020 organized by Professors Michael Cohen, Brian Horowitz, and Ari Ofengenden at Tulane University. I thank them for their hard work for what certainly would have been a very successful conference. Unfortunately, none of us had, at that moment, the experience or technical know-how to hold a virtual conference on relatively short notice.

Attendees and presenters will explore Israel's diversities, grappling with its past and present and thinking through its possible futures, always attentive to the aspirations toward and need for greater equality. As always, the field of Israel Studies not only offers

a deeper interdisciplinary understanding of the complexities of Israel, but also offers a lens through which to better compare and understand other countries who likewise work through issues of diversity, identity and (in)equality. The intellectual stimulation and satisfaction of sharing the growing and diverse scholarship in Israel Studies through our conferences is vital to the field of Israel Studies.

We are also proud to present the AIS Life-Time Achievement Award, AIS Young Scholar Award, Yonathan Shapiro Award for the Best Book in Israel Studies, and the Ben Halpern Award for the Best Dissertation in Israel Studies. These awards are an indication of the excellence in Israel Studies that the AIS is helping to support.

On behalf of the AIS and its Board, I want to extend a huge thank you to the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign for hosting this conference, and especially to Conference Chair Professor Rachel S. Harris for her incredible vision and execution of this tremendous conference. Welcome from the Conference Chair

I am delighted to welcome you to the University of Illinois for the 37th Association of Israel Studies annual conference—even if it is only virtually.

For 14 years the University has been home to the Israel Studies Project (ISP), housed in the Program in Jewish Culture & Society. Through the resources of the ISP we have strategically implemented a robust array of Israel Studies programming across campus, including organizing visits from prominent cultural figures, developing conferences and workshops, and offering multiple courses within the Program in Jewish Culture & Society. Through this programming, we estimate that over the last 10 years more than 2,000 people participated, including over 700 students completing semester-long coursework. This work has enabled us to promote greater understanding of and engagement with Israeli culture and society, in all of its complexities. The hosting of the international organization's annual conference is the next step in our efforts to advance the University of Illinois's role in the study of Israel.

This year's conference theme "Pluralistic Israel: Women, Minorities, and Diversity" recognizes efforts we began in 2013 to focus on bringing a diverse range of Israeli voices to campus and celebrating the work of Israeli women, Arabs, Ethiopians, Palestinians and Mizrahi writers and scholars. In 2019, we hosted a taskforce on the situation of women in Israel Studies, launching a major initiative for the AIS which has led to a new mentoring program and the creation of a women's caucus. Drawing on these particular strengths within our own community, we envisaged a conference that explores diverse communities in Israel, including religious minorities (Christian, Muslim, Bahai and Druze), ethnic minorities and women. These hopes have been realized in a rich and inclusive conference program.

In addition to the hundreds of conference papers, presentations and roundtables on these themes, you will find program highlights that address these topics. We draw your attention to our plenary "Women, Activism and Israeli Law" on the ways women are using the law to advocate for women's rights across traditional divisions in Israeli society, fighting against gender based violence, discrimination and inequity featuring journalists Dahlia Lithwick and Allison Sommer and scholaractivists Amal Elsana Alh'jooj and Ruth Halperin-Kaddari.

The opening night events include a conversation with the former United States of America Ambassador to Israel Dan Shapiro, who grew up in Urbana-Champaign, and whose father Michael Shapiro was a faculty member in the Department of English for many years, and served as co-founder and inaugural director of the Program in Jewish Culture & Society. He will be in conversation with Tamara Cofman Wittes, a senior fellow in the Center for Middle East Policy at The Brookings Institution.

Look out for a musical performance by Mira Awad and Guy Mintus. We are also screening Awad's 8-episode television series Muna. We conclude the conference with a dance party/workshop for non-dancers with Gaga practitioner Omri Drumlevich.

Keynote Dany Bahar will speak about Israel's response to COVID and the success of its swift vaccination program. His respondent Rebecca Smith was part of the University of Illinois taskforce on COVID, which served as a model for universities across the United States.

There is also a full film program available 6-13 June through the conference platform, and conversations with filmmakers and directors throughout the three days of the conference including Awad, Ethiopian filmmaker Esti Almo Wexler, and feminist filmmakers and activists Smadar Zamir and Lior Elefant. Also look out for our wellness corner where you will be able to follow Ariana Starkman as she leads us through some light yoga. Feel free to engage her anytime through the on demand video.

And don't forget to check out our exhibition space where you can find information about the latest publications by AIS members, resources available to faculty from Israel—or teaching Israel Studies, and a dedicated channel for tech support where you can test your equipment or ask for instructional support for navigating the program platform and managing zoom functionalities.

We look forward to sharing this exciting conference with you!

Schedule

To access the conference sessions go to the event schedule.

Here you can see speakers, use the search engine to find the titles of sessions, use the filter function to find presenters.

On the left hand side of the conference platform you will see this information:

Live: directs you to a list of live sessions taking place at that time.

My Schedule: By checking the box to the left of conference session titles you wish to attend you can create your own schedule. When you click on the 'my schedule' link you can restrict what you view in the program to sessions you have chosen.

Event Schedule: Shows you the entire conference schedule

Exhibitors: The "exhibitors" icon offers you access to the exhibition hall. Here you will find exhibitors, the film program, and the IT Help Desk.

IT Help Desk/ VPN

The IT Help Desk offers a live zoom link with tech support that allows you to test your equipment (camera and mic), ask questions about zoom functions, and get advice about the conference platform.

Session Information

All sessions can be accessed through the online platform. They will either have 'on demand' videos that can be started by the attendees at any time, or through zoom links that will appear before the start of the session. We recommend all participants have a zoom account as it facilitates smooth interaction with the platform (these are free). If you do not already have an account you can sign up here: zoom.us/freesignup

Zoom session slots will open 10 minutes before the listed time.

All sessions will officially begin 5 minutes after the listed start time to allow participants to enter, and for presenters to be afforded zoom function privileges. All sessions will close at the listed time.

Film Program 6-13 June

The film program is located in the Exhibitors section. After clicking on the link you will be asked for a password. You can find the password on the left of the screen above the film synopsis.

Information for Session Chairs

Begin the session 5 minutes after the time noted, so that there is time for everyone to enter the space. Please ensure **presenters** stick to their timeframe and that you are in contact with the **tech moderator** during the question period. Please also pay attention to the "hand raised" icon in case someone wishes to ask a question themselves.

The session ends automatically at the end-time noted.

Information for Session Tech Moderators

The role of the **tech moderator** is to assign co-host privileges to **presenters**, monitor the chat function, mute microphones or shut off video if necessary, and collect and pass on questions to the **chair** during the Q & A.

Tech moderators and chairs should arrive 10 minutes before the start of the session where possible (unless presenting in the previous slot). Please reach out to the IT Help Desk for any problems on the day by email or by visiting the IT Help Desk in the Exhibitor area.

- Please make sure all **presenters** are marked as "co-hosts" so that they may share their screen if they wish.
- The record function should work automatically, but check that it is on, and if it is not please manually start the record function.
- During the session, please mute any live microphones other than the speaker and monitor the chat feature for good questions the chair may pose.
- You can also use the spotlight feature to keep the panelists featured on screen. Please note, there are only a maximum of 9 participants that can be in the spotlight.
- The **tech moderator** can also advise the **chair** if attendees have used the "raised hand" feature so he/she may call on audience members should they so wish.

Information for Session Presenters

Presenters are asked to stick to the time allotted (15 minutes if there are 4–5 people in the session, 20 minutes if there are 3 or less presenters). Roundtables are run by their **chair**, who will determine the amount of time for each **presenter** and for Q&A.

The online interactivity is facilitated by Zoom, and thus includes a gallery view of all who join the session, and ability to "share your screen" if you wish to show slides while you speak. Please be sure to turn off this feature when you conclude your talk.

There is time for Q&A in every session.

Please note: Should you be presenting in a session where the chair or moderator has not shown up, please assign someone these roles and begin the session at the designated start time.

Virtual Event Code of Conduct

The University of Illinois and the Association for Israel Studies are committed to promoting productive engagement and the exchange of scholarly ideas. In order to support these aims and in keeping with established policies, all attendees, speakers, sponsors, vendors, partners, staff and volunteers at the AIS conference and any related events are required to adhere to the following Code of Conduct.

Participants must register for the conference and provide an email, or other contact information, where they can be reached during the virtual meeting. Registration constitutes consent to audio and visual recording at the meeting (and use and alteration of the recording) by the University of Illinois for non-commercial purposes aligned with the University's mission.

Our aim in hosting a virtual AIS event is to build a stronger community. Our goal is to create an environment where everyone feels welcome to participate, speak up, ask questions, and engage in conversation. This requires a harassment free and inclusive environment that recognizes the inherent worth of every participant--regardless of gender, gender identity and expression, age, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, ethnicity, or religion (or lack thereof). We do not tolerate harassment of participants in any form. Sexual language and imagery except when directly related to the topic of the session is not appropriate during any aspect of this virtual event/ conference, including talks, workshops, parties, social media such as Twitter, or other online media.

We invite all those who participate to help us create a safe and positive experience for everyone.

Following a Code of Conduct ensures all participants are treated with respect that facilitates intellectual exchange and productive engagement in a scholarly community.

Expected Behavior

- Exercise consideration and respect in your speech and actions.
- Be mindful of a live mic if you are not speaking/ presenting.
- Refrain from demeaning, discriminatory, or harassing behavior and speech.
- Be mindful of your surroundings and of your fellow participants. Do not interrupt speakers. Ask questions through the conference chair (by raising your hand) or the tech moderator (by messaging in the chat). We all recognize that turn-taking can prove especially challenging over Zoom. In cases of open exchange, we encourage all participants to minimize overlapping speech to whatever extent possible and to be patient with one another when overlaps or other technical challenges occur.
- Do not make audio or visual recordings of the meeting in any medium—and do not distribute audio or visual recordings of the meeting (via social media or any other means). Only the University of Illinois or its representatives may do so
- Do not take or distribute pictures of or copy research posters/presentation materials unless explicit permission is granted.

IN MEMORIAM



Rachel Feldhay Brenner 1946-2021

President, Association for Israel Studies 2007–2009 Vice President, Association for Israel Studies 2005–2007

We mourn the loss of our friend and colleague. Her death after a short battle with cancer was a shock to the AIS community. She served on this year's program committee, and continued to teach until only a few days before she died. We will miss her strong presence, thoughtful guidance and tireless commitment to the field.

Brenner was the author of seven books and eighty articles. Her 2019 book, *Polish Literature and the Holocaust: Eyewitness Testimonies*, 1942–1947, examines literary responses of Poles to the genocide of Jews during the Nazi occupation. Her book *The Ethics of Witnessing: The Holocaust in Polish Writers' Diaries from Warsaw, 1939–1945* received the University of Southern California Book Prize in Literary and Cultural Studies. Brenner's other monographs include *Inextricably Bonded—Israel Jewish and Arab Writers Re-Visioning Culture* and *Writing as Resistance: Four Women Confronting the Holocaust: Edith Stein, Simone Weil, Anne Frank, and Etty Hillesum.* In recognition of her distinguished publishing record, she was awarded the Max and Frieda Weinstein-Bascom Professorship of Jewish Studies, which she held from 2009 to 2014. In 2020, she was selected to be the inaugural Harvey L. Temkin and Barbara Myers Temkin Professor in Hebrew Language and Literature.

During her career she held numerous fellowships including at The US Memorial Holocaust Museum where she was Fellow at the Research Workshop on Diaries and Autobiographical Writings (2004), the Sosland Foundation Fellow (2005), and Fellow at the Workshop on Microcosms of the Holocaust (2016). Brenner held fellowships in Oxford Centre for Hebrew and Jewish Studies (2001), and was a Visiting Professor at Hebrew University for The Mosse Faculty Exchange Program at the Hebrew University, Jerusalem (2004). She was Senior Fellow, Institute for Research in the Humanities (2028-2013). Her awards include, Canadian Studies Research Grant awarded by Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, the Standard Research Grant awarded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (1990), National Endowment Fellowship (1990) awarded by the USA Government. The University of Wisconsin-Madison awarded her the Kellet mid-career award (2011), the Hilldale award (2015), and the WARF Elaine Marks named professorship (2019).

Brenner is survived by her children Guy Brenner and Shelly Brenner, her brother Yoram Feldhay, and her four grandsons, Jacob Asoulin and Eli, Levi, and Ari Brenner.
