THE PASSING OF A LEGEND

On 3 March 2007, one of the most well known members of our Special Forces community left us after a long illness. MSG (R) James C. "Jimmy" Dean was a charter member of the Special Forces Association (SFA D-30), and is the past Secretary/Administrator of the Special Forces Association (SFA) where he served for 18 years. He was also the Editor of the Drop. Jimmy joined the 77th SFG (A) in September 1954, and later served in the 110th Reconnaissance Unit in Italy. During his tour with the 7th SFG (A), he was the team sergeant on FTT 30 during operation White Star conducted in Laos in 1962. Jimmy retired from the military in May 1966. He played a key role in establishing the Special Forces Decade club, and was influential in changing the name from Special Forces Decade club to the Special Forces Association. He served two terms as past SFA National President, as SFA National Treasurer, Chairman of SFA Executive Secretary/Administrator SFA, and served as President of Chapters I,

from Special Forces Decade club to the Special Forces Association.

Secretary/Administrator SFA, and served as President of Chapters I,
V, and Secretary/Treasurer of Chapter-VI. Chapter X is the "Jimmy Dean" chapter. He was also influential in getting SFA non- profit status with the IRS, and the state of North Carolina. Jimmy directed the purchase of the Memorial Building, the Grounds, where the SFA is presently located.
Other events that Jimmy was involved in were taking on CNN over the malicious attacks on Special Forces & those involved in Operations Tailwind. In 1995, he saw that the JFK Museum Association needed some help, so he got together a group of volunteers to get it up and running again. He served as the

Secretary and then as Vice President. During his tenure, he



organized the Bank-to-Bank Walk that raised over \$130,000.00 for the Museum. He also went over boxes of old records, and forms to build a database of members. recruited a replacement Secretary and oversaw the beginning of this newsletter. In the finance end, he recruited an outstanding Treasurer, made sure that the Association funds were invested in order to achieve the best possible return. He was a friend, a mentor, and a great administrator. Jimmy was always available when you needed help, advice, or ideas. Jimmy said that he did want any service or funeral but wished to be cremated, and his ashes to be put in the pond on the SFA grounds. Of course Jimmy did not realize that all his many friends would let him go without some form of sendoff. As a result, over 200 of them attended a wake held at the Green Beret Sport Parachute Club on Ft Bragg. Present were many in uniform to include SF, AF, and even a group of Navy Seals. In addition to the firing

party which was provided by the 7th SFG(A), there was a bugler for taps, and a piper that played the Ballad of the Green Berets. Jimmy is survived by: his wife **Dot**; a son, **James**, **Jr**.; a daughter, **Patricia Gibbs**; two grandchildren, **Matt Gibbs**, and **Missy Griffin**; and a great grandson, **Tyler Griffin**.

Advisory Council Member, **Bob Gilstrap**, took a lot of pictures at the Green Beret Club, and we are happy to include most of them in this issue.

Total amount donated by 104 contributors to date is: \$12,705.00. The Executive Board and Advisory Council looked into several ways to use these funds to memorialize Jimmy. We are still trying to get Command approval to start a paver program in the Plaza area. This would be similar to those programs that are in existence at the ASOM Museum in Downtown Fayetteville, and also at most other Army Branch Museums. To date we have not been successful in this endeavor. The Curator is looking into the building of a solarium on the side of the Museum that faces the Plaza. This will require some architectural drawings that would have to be

submitted with our request for approval. The solarium would provide a place to hold meetings of visiting groups, as well as serve as a reception area during graduations. The plaque we are having made would be put in this solarium. We are holding off on completing the plaque until after the SFA Convention, so we will be able to include all donations in his memory. A suggestion that we place a small brick paver outside the Canopy Lounge was also considered, but not approved by the Advisory Council.

MEMBER TAPS



Major (R) Herbert Brucker, 85, of 445 McBain Drive, Fayetteville, a retired Major with the United States Army Special Forces died Friday, 16 March 2007, in Carroll S. Roberson Hospice. Although born in West New York, New Jersey on 10 October 1921 to a French father and American mother, he grew up in France. In 1938, Brucker was brought back to the United States by his father.

Despite speaking little English at the time, he joined the United States Army in 1940. There he became fluent in the "universal language" of Morse code while being trained as a radio operator. In late 1943, based on his French background, **T/4 Brucker** was recruited into the Office of Strategic Services (OSS), an organization designed to

perform clandestine warfare behind enemy lines. After training in the OSS Special Operations (SO) branch, **Brucker** was detailed to the British Special Operations Executive (SOE). Commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant, he jumped into occupied France near Blois on 27 May 1944 to serve as the radio operator of the network code named HERMIT. **Brucker** remained in France until 11 September 1944. For extraordinary heroism during the mission, **Brucker** was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, second only to the Medal of Honor, and the French Croix de Guerre with Silver Star. He has subsequently been honored on a memorial emplaced near Blois by his French compatriots.

After the liberation of France, **Brucker** volunteered to serve with the OSS in the China-Burma-India Theater. After briefly being attached to OSS Detachment 101 in Burma, he was sent to China. There he was a member of team IBEX, which was part of an OSS effort to use Chinese troops to conduct a guerrilla war against the Japanese occupation.

After WWII, **Brucker** remained in the United States Army. He served until 1949 as a member of the Counter-Intelligence Corps in Germany until reassignment to the 505th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, NC. In 1952, Brucker was recruited for United States Army Special Forces. As a pioneer in Special Forces, he conducted escape and evasion courses and was an original member of the 10th Special Forces Group in Germany. He later served with the 77th Special Forces Group at Fort Bragg and was an instructor for the SF qualification or "Q" course. In 1959, Brucker participated in Operation HOT FOOT in Laos, later renamed Operation WHITE STAR. **Brucker's** greatest contribution to Special Forces has a lasting legacy. While at Fort Bragg, before the 10th SFG went to Germany. He and fellow SFer **Captain Roger Pezzelle** ordered the first batch of green berets for local use. Eventually the entire Special Forces branch adopted this beret as their distinctive headgear, earning them the popular nickname of "Green Berets." After 20 years of service to the Army, **Brucker** retired as a Major. In the mid 1960's Brucker served on behalf of USAID in Vietnam. He then became the second president of the Special Forces Association (D131), and his wife served as the SFA Secretary for more than 20 years.

Brucker lived in Fayetteville for nearly fifty years. His wife of forty years, the former **Lieselotte Löwe** of Germany, passed away in 1989. He is survived by his son **Richard**, daughter-in-law **Elaine**, and grandchildren **Eric** and **Samantha**, all of Fayetteville. A viewing was 19 March in Rogers and Breece Funeral Home. 
