Description

An inland <u>species</u> 100–200 mm high with a narrow, smooth leaf 50–90 mm long by 3–5 mm wide at its widest point and up to two pink, mauve or purple blotched flowers 30–50 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Curly-locks (Thelymitra spiralis) by its slightly smaller, usually mauve or purple blotched flowers.
