Baseball game - Longest

I'm afraid I am not going to be much help, but here is what I was able to find. My original notes are somewhere in a non-descript notebook lying in a forgotten corner somewhere. I WAS able to find the script, which was based on the newspaper account, so here goes:

The game was held July 4, year unknown, but I would guess it was in the 1880's or 90's. It was held between Ghent and Carrollton on the "commons". It started at 9:00 a.m. and lasted until 10:00 p.m.

The players stopped for dinner on the grounds. One of the players was a big fellow called Doc Brittin, who was 6'2" and weighed about 300 pounds. Every time he scored or ran around the diamond, he would lie down on the grass and some of the players would take turns fanning him.

Ghent won the game by a score of 179 to 70.

Carroll County was formed in 1838 from Gallatin County and was named after Charles Carroll and was a signer of the Declaration of Independence. It is located on the Ohio and with the Kentucky Rivers dividing it in half. Carrollton was named Port William until 1838. It contains land area of 130 square miles. The elevations of the county range from 420 to 940 feet above sea level. The two rivers changed the county several times over the many years. There have been four major floods in this area. The greatest, of course, would be the 1937 flood. It not only affected many people lives and their way of living, but to a genealogist today, it has been trouble as well. There have been many records destroyed and many landmarks, such as with cemeteries. Finding cemeteries has long been a task of many genealogists. The following is a list of cemeteries that have been at one time or another located here in Carroll County. As noted some of the locations are very vague and some cannot be currently located because of destruction and/or because of age.

ADCOCK: located on Gilgal Road.

ARONLD: located on James Cook farm, US 42.

BAIRD: located on Dividing Ridge Road.

BARRETT: located on 36 at Easterday.

BEALL: located on Stafford Ridge Road on the McBurney Farm (same as Mill?).

BLACKMORE: located on East Highland Avenue, Carrollton.

BLANTON: located on the Ghent Power Plant property, north side of US 42, east of Ghent.

BROWN: located on Owl Hollow Road near I-71.

BERSOT: located on Buck's Run Road on the Joe Hughes farm.

BULTER: located near 11th and Highland in Carrollton.

William **BUTTS:** located on the west side of Jackson Road about 100 yards south of its intersection with Buffalo Creek Road, (aka Jackson Cemetery).

BUTTS #2: located on a hill back of Worthville, no markers left and one field stone grave.

CARLISLE: located on Carlisle Road.

CARRICO: located on Wright's Ridge Road on the Simmons farm.

CARRICO #2: located on 227.

CHADWELL-HINES: located on a hill on White's Run. (Same cemetery as Hines?)

CHRISTIAN CHURCH, also known as the **Reform Meeting House cemetery**: located on Lot #40 in Ghent. Destroyed. Some stones may still exit off grave. One recorded in 1905; John Sander 1738 -Aug 1805.

CITY: Destroyed circa the turn of the 20th century. Located on the sw corner of 4th & Seminary streets on plat lots 148 & 149. Now covered by a city structure. Only a few of the stones removed to Gap Hill.

COGHILL: located on US 42 west.

COGHILL #2: located on King's Ridge Road. Destroyed.

COLEMAN: located at top of hill on Gilgal Road.

COUNTY INFIRMARY: located on 36, east.

COVE HILL BAPTIST CHURCH: located on Highway 549.

CRAIG: located on US 42 immediately west of Ghent on the south side next to a large frame house.

CRAIG #2: located on Fitchen farm, east US 42.

CRAIG #3: located on Riverview Farms, near house.

CULL: located on Cull's Ridge Road.

DARBRO: located on the south side of 457 near Eagle Station on what was the Mabel Shirley farm.

DARBRO #2: located on the hill north of Eagle Station and between 36 & Ghent/Eagle Station Road.

DARNOLD: located on Highway 55, 2 miles south of Cove Hill.

DAVIS: located on Dividing Ridge Road.

DEAN: located inside General Butler State Park. The Carroll cemetery book shows this as destroyed if so, it held the remains of Rev War Veteran, John Dean.

DEAN #2: located on the Sullenger farm on the Worthville/Eagle Station Road.

DEAN #3: located at the mouth of Eagle Creek at the KY river.

DEAN'S CHAPEL: Once located on the west side of State Road 227 about ¾ of a mile northwest of Worthville, Destroyed...some graves removed to **Ghent, Carrollton IOOF and Worthville Masonic**.

DEATHERAGE: located on 47 just outside of Sanders.

DEMINT: located on the Green Bottom Road at I-71. Aka Carrack (This road no longer reaches English.).

DONATHAN: located on Taylor Road, right of Fairview Ridge Road, at top of hill.

DRISKELL: located on the hill back of Worthville.

DUNN: located on Carlisle Road

DUNN-TAYLOR: located on Carlisle Road. Destroyed.

DUVALL: located on US 42W on a hillside above the old bridge. Completely destroyed.

EASTERDAY: located ½ mile south of Easterday on the east side of 1112, on the hilltop. Hard to pull off...with signs "KEEP OUT" & "NO TRESPASSING." Can't be seen from 112.

ENGLISH: located west of English, KY, on Highway 389, immediately south of its junction with I-71.

FAIVIEW/PATTERSON: in Locust precinct, on the south side of Fairview Ridge Road about a half mile west of its junction with Hunter's Heights Road.

FURNISH-ROSELL: located at Eagle Station and Sanders Road.

GAP HILL: located east of General Butler State Park and south of 36 between Hilltop Drive and Camp Kysoc in East Carrollton.

GARDNER: located on the Ghent/Eagle Station Road on the Cecil Searcy farm.

GARRIOTT: located off Jackson Springs Road.

GAUNT: located at intersection of 42 & 227 in east Carrollton.

GENERAL BULTER: located at General Butler State Park, west side.

GEX: on the Mylor farm, US 42, east of Ghent. Has been destroyed.

GHENT CONSOLIDATED (Scott, Masonic & IOOF): located on the west side of Main Cross Street (47) just south of Ghent. Platted individually in 1858-now consolidated into the second largest cemetery in Carroll County.

GHENT BAPTIST CHURCH: This Ghent cemetery was destroyed in late 1913, rented & plowed in May of 1914 for a tobacco field, then turned into a croquet game area, then planted with a stand of trees which is how it appears today, just south of the Church building at Main & Ferry Sts. No trace of a stone. The few that turned up during the plowing and were photographed have now disappeared. Some say that these are stored inside the church building.

GHENT 2ND BAPTIST: located in Ghent at the southeast end of Carroll Street.

GILTNER: located 300 yards south of 36, on the property west of ST Peter's Lutheran Church on Nugent industrial land.

GRASS HILL (aka Lewis Sanders): located on the Ghent/Eagle Station Road immediately south of I-71 on the first lane east. Lane marked with a Kentucky historical marker.

GRIFFITH: located on the Ghent/Eagle Station Road on the Searcy farm.

GRIFFITH #2: located on Buck's Run Road about a mile from 47.

HAINES: located on 36 on a hill overlooking White's Run creek.

HAINES #2: located on old James Haines farm on South Fork Road.

HANDLON: located on Kendall Road, off King's Ridge Road.

HANKS: located on dividing Ridge road. Bulldozed and destroyed, too much notoriety.

HAWKINS: located on US 42 on the James Cook farm. Covered by Ohio River sediment.

HAYDEN: Once located on Lock Road. This cemetery has been destroyed. Some bodies removed to Carrollton IOOF.

HAYDON: located on US 42 west.

HEATH: located on Carlisle Road.

HOAGLAND: located on the west side of Hampton Lane, about a half mile south of 36 in Hunter's Bottom, on posted industrial property.

HUMPHREY: see **MOUND HILL**.

JACKSON: see William **BUTTS**.

KARR: located on the Adcock farm, Highway 55.

KING: located on west Locust Road, near Trimble Co line.

KING'S RIDGE (aka Nesselroad Cem): located on the east side of King's Ridge Road.

KNOX: on an elusive hilltop. Seems to be a single grave cemetery containing Rev War veteran, Robert Knox. Best possibility: on 1883 Schirmer property on South Fork Road. Second best possibility: on 1883 Schirmer property (2) on Buck's Run Road.

LAWRENCE: located on the Lawrence property on Mound Hill. Private cemetery for the burial in 1007 of Robert E Lawrence.

LEACHMAN: located on William's Run at the foot of Blossom Hill, turn left and go up a high hill.

LEWIS: located on 227, and Goose Creek Road.

LEWIS #2: located on the Mayme Goodman farm on the Goose Creek Road.

LINDSAY: located on Dividing Ridge Road on the property opposite Raisor Road. Enclosed in a stone wall, on a knoll, clearly visible from Dividing Ridge Road.

LINDSAY-SCOTT: located on Sharon Road, 5 miles south of Ghent on the old John Lindsay farm, now owned by Mrs. Kate Gex.

LUCKETT: located .2 mile off King's Ridge Road o Kendall Road and east of the point 50 yards. The cemetery is visible from Kendall Road and enclosed by a modern fence and well attended.

MAY: located on 549 (the Mound Hill/Cove Hill road) about a mile south of the top of the hill coming from Prestonville.

MASTERSON: located on US 42 about a half mile east of the 36/227 junction. North side of the highway, surrounded by a chain fence.

METHODIST CHURCH: located Carrollton, KY at Highland and fourth.

MILLS: located on the Stafford Ridge Road on the farm of the late Floyd McBurney near Buffalo Creek, Jordan precinct.

MILLS-HANKS: located on US 42, near Little Kentucky River.

MITCHELL: located on the Searcy farm on 36 & White's Run Road.

MOUND HILL (aka Humphrey): located on Mound Hill road, half mile from top on west side, across from Smith's body shop.

MULLIKIN: located on US 42, near Little Kentucky River.

NESSELLROAD: see King's Ridge Cemetery.

OHNE: located off King's Ridge Road, near MT. Hermon Baptist Church.

OLD SCHOOL HOUSE: located near Eagle Station.

O'NEAL: located at Ghent, in a field about two blocks south of the Second Baptist Cemetery and three blocks west of the Ghent Cemetery.

PETTIT: located on Lanham Road on a hill on the George Ogburn family farm. Reported as destroyed.

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH: located on Highland Ave, Carrollton.

PRICE & SCANLAND: located at Martin's Nursery.

PRIDE-OF-THE-GHENT 100F: located just south of and immediately next to the Ghent Consolidated Cemeteries on 47.

PULLIAM: located on the south side of 36 (Milton Road), east of Notchlick Road about a city block, in a hollow.

RAMEY-FARES: located on Boone Road, top of hill, right.

RICE: located on Black Rock Road.

ROBBINS: located on Rio Vista, Highland Ave, Carrollton.

ROBERTSON: located about a quarter mile west of English.

ROLLING: See DEMINT

SAINT JOHN'S: Catholic cemetery located in Carrollton behind the school and church building on Fifth St., between Clay and Polk Street.

SANDERS: located on Dow Corning property on US 42.

SCOTT #1: see GHENT Cemeteries.

SCOTT #2: located on dividing Ridge Road. Exact location unknown. Two graves.

SEARCY: located on the Lindsay farm on Goose Creek Road.

SEBREE: located on Black Rock Road.

SANDERS 2ND BAPTIST: located off McDaniel Street in Sanders.

SKIRVIN: located off 47.

SPICER #1: located near White's Run Christian Church on 36.

SPICER #2: located on 36, between Easterday and Eagle Station. Destroyed.

SPILMAN: located on Wright's Ridge Road.

STAFFORD: located on Stafford Ridge Road, south of I-71, on north side in a clump of trees just after the road turns west.

STARKEY: located on a hill opposite the old Hugh Starkey house on East Locust Fork Road. The house is on the NW side of the road ¼ mile below Panther Run and ¼ mile above the Baptist Church, while the cemetery is on the se side of the road.

STRINGFELLOW: located on 36, near Indian Hill.

TANDY: located on the Searcy farm on Goose Creek Road.

TANDY #2: located on Lanham Road, one mile from 36.

TANDY #3: located on the Lula Abbett farm on 227.

TANDY #4: located on Dividing Ridge Road.

TAYLOR: located on the west side of Wright's Ridge Road within 50 yards of the junction of Panther Run Road. Cemetery is enclosed and cared for.

TAYLOR #2: located on Fairview Ridge Road.

THOMPSON: located on the hill above Panther Run.

THOMPSON #2: located on 47 near Ghent.

UNNAMED CEMETERY: located at Highway 55 & 389, at entrance to T.B. Forbes farm.

UNNAMED CEMETERY: located on the James Coghill farm on US 42 (west)

UNNAMED CEMETERY: located at Standard's Material Co, on 36 at Hunter's Bottom.

- DRISKELL Cemetery (CC#-85) :** Located on the hill back of Worthville.

- DUNN-TAYLOR Cemetery :** Located on Carlisle Road. Destroyed.
- DUVALL Cemetery :** Located on US 42 (west) on a hillside above the old bridge. Completely destroyed.
- EASTERDAY Cemetery (CC#-64) :** Located 1/2 mile south of Easterday on the east side of 1112, on the hilltop. Hard to pull off...with signs "KEEP OUT" & "NO TRESPASSING." Can't be seen from 1112. Peggy Samland volunteered her data.
- ENGLISH Cemetery :** Located west of English, Ky., on Highway 389, immediately south of its junction with I-71.

- GENERAL BUTLER Cemetery :** Located at General Butler State Park, west side.
- GEX Cemetery :** on the Mylor farm, US 42, east of Ghent. Has been destroyed.
- GHENT CONSOLIDATED Cemetery (Scott, Masonic & I.O.O.F.) :** Located on the west side of Main Cross Street (47) just south of Ghent. Platted individually

in 1858 - now consolidated into the second largest cemetery in Carroll County. **GHENT BAPTIST CHURCH Cemetery** : This Ghent cemetery was destroyed in late 1913, rented and plowed in May of 1914 for a tobacco field, then turned into a croquet game area, then planted with a stand of trees that was recently cleared, just south of the Church building at Main & Ferry Sts. GILTNER Cemetery : Located 300 yards south of 36, on the property west of St. Peter's Lutheran Church on Nugent industrial land.

GRASS HILL Cemetery (aka Lewis Sanders cem): Located on the Ghent - Eagle Station Road immediately south of I-71 on the first lane east. Lane marked with a Kentucky historical marker.

GRIFFITH Cemetery (CC#-118) : Located on the Ghent/Eagle Station Road on the Searcy O'Neal farm.

GRIFFITH #2 Cemetery (CC#-121) : Located on Buck's Run Road about a mile from 47.

HAINES Cemetery (CC#-89) : Located on 36 on a hill overlooking White's Run Creek.

HAINES #2 Cemetery (CC#91) : on old James Haines farm on South Fork Road.

HANDLON Cemetery (CC#-125) : Located on Kendall Road, off King's Ridge Road.

HANKS Cemetery : Located on Dividing Ridge road. Recently bulldozed and destroyed to much notoriety.

HAWKINS Cemetery : Located on US 42 on the James Cook farm. Covered by Ohio River sediment.

HAYDEN Cemetery : Once located on Lock Road. This cemetery has been destroyed. Some bodies removed to Carrollton IOOF.

HAYDON Cemetery (CC#-21) : Located on US 42 (west).

HEATH Cemetery (CC#-18) : Located on Carlisle Road.

HOAGLAND Cemetery : Located on the west side of Hampton Lane, about a half mile south of 36 in Hunter's Bottom, on posted industrial property.

HUMPHREY Cemetery (CC#-02) : see MOUND HILL cemetery.

JACKSON Cemetery: see William BUTTS Cemetery.

KARR Cemetery (CC#-05) : Located on the Adcock farm, Highway 55.

KING-BRADLEY Cemetery : Located on west Locust Road, near Trimble Co line.

KING'S RIDGE Cemetery (aka Nesselroad Cem): Located on the east side of King's Ridge Road.

KNOX Cemetery (CC#-111) : on an elusive hilltop. Seems to be a single grave cemetery containing Rev War veteran, Robert Knox. Apparently not located off Black Rock Road. Best possibility: on 1883 Schirmer property on South Fork Road. Second best possibility: on 1883 Schirmer property (2) on Buck's Run Road.

LAWRENCE Cemetery (no CC#) : Located on the Lawrence property on Mound Hill. Newly created private cemetery for the burial in 1997 of Robert E. Lawrence.

- LEACHMAN Cemetery (CC#-87) :** Located on William's Run at the foot of Blossom Hill, turn left and go up a high hill.
- LEWIS Cemetery (CC#-79) :** Located on 227 and Goose Creek Road.
- LEWIS #2 Cemetery (CC#-80) :** Located on the Mayme Goodman farm on the Goose Creek Road.
- LINDSAY Cemetery (CC#93) :** Located on Dividing Ridge Road on the property opposite Raisor Road. Enclosed in a stone wall, on a knoll, clearly visible from Dividing Ridge Road.
- LINDSAY-SCOTT Cemetery (CC#-112) :** Located on Sharon Road 5 miles south of Ghent on the old John Lindsay farm, now owned by Mrs. Kate Gex.
- LUCKETT Cemetery :** Located .2 of a mile off King's Ridge Road on Kendall Road and east of that point 50 yards. The cemetery is visible from Kendall Road and enclosed by a modern fence and well attended.
- LUTHERAN Church Cemetery:** Located behind St. Peter's Church on Highway 36 in Locust precinct.
- MAY Cemetery :** Located on 549 (the Mound Hill/Cove Hill road) about a mile south of the top of the hill coming from Prestonville.
- MASTERSON Cemetery :** Located on US 42 about a half mile east of the 36/227 junction. North side of the highway. Surrounded by a chain fence.
- McBURNEY Cemetery (CC#-98) :** see BEALL/McBURNEY
- METHODIST Church Cemetery :** Located Carrollton, KY at Highland and Fourth.
- MILLS Cemetery :** Located on the Stafford Ridge Road on the farm of the late Floyd McBurney near Buffalo Creek. Jordan precinct.
- MILLS-HANKS Cemetery :** (Same cemetery as Mills above. GCW)
- MITCHELL Cemetery (CC#-100) :** Located on the Searcy farm on 36 & White's Run Road.
- MOUND HILL Cemetery (aka Humphrey):** Located on Mound Hill Road, half mile from top on west side, across from Smith's body shop.
- MULLIKIN Cemetery (CC#-25) :** Located on US 42, near Little Kentucky river.
- NESSERROAD Cem (CC#-26) :** see King's Ridge Cemetery.
- OHNE Cemetery (CC#-29) :** Located off King's Ridge Road, near Mt. Hermon Baptist Church.
- OLD SCHOOL HOUSE Cemetery (CC#105) :** Located near Eagle Station.
- O'NEAL Cemetery :** Located at Ghent, in a field about two blocks south of the Second Baptist Cemetery and three blocks west of the Ghent Cemetery.
