
I am extremely proud of the Class of '36! We survived the Great Depression; a world conflict; major social changes and are still "standing tall". We can be justifiably proud!

If a group picture is made, would it be possible to send me a copy — collect?

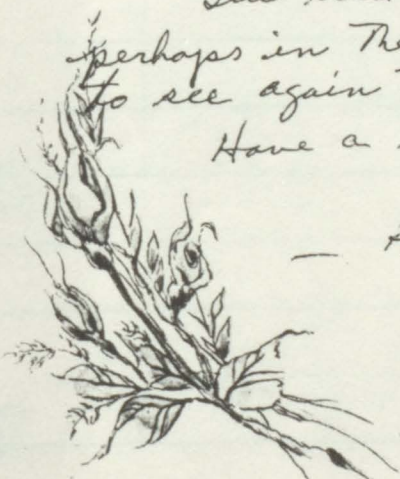
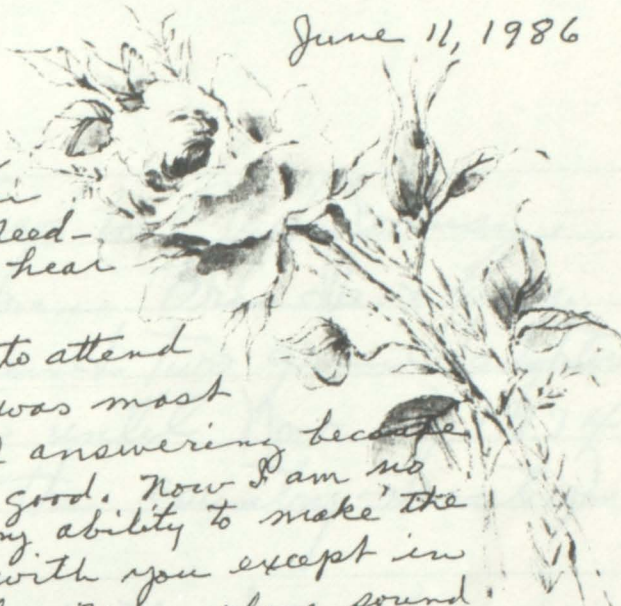
Now if fifty years have made as much difference in you as they have made in me, I naturally will need identifying names.



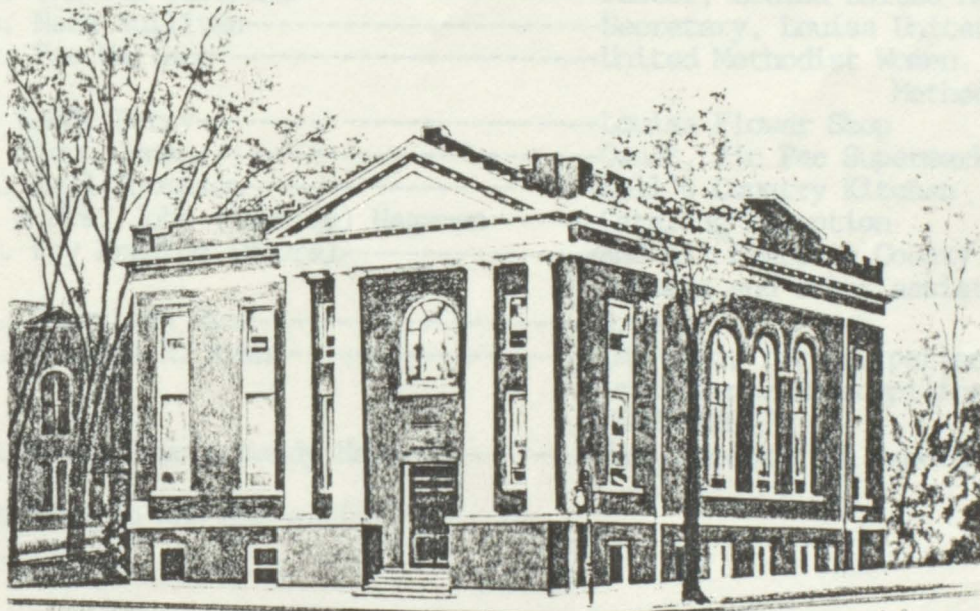
