Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo gears up

Troy Lerwill, also known as the "Wild Child", among other award winning acts, will be returning to the 84th annual Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo to perform some death-defying stunts and comedic antics for the crowds.

Lerwill is no stranger to the rodeo, being named the Coors Man in the Can twice and the

Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association's Act of the Year six times. Pete Carr, owner of Pete Carr Pro Rodeo, a livestock firm from Dallas, said in a press release "...he (Lerwill) brings a whole new dimension to each show."

"Then you add his motorcycle act into the mix, and it's just over the top," Carr continued. "Everybody wants to come back the next day just to see it again."

Another featured act set for the rodeo this year is Madison McDonald-Thomas and her Magic in Motion show.

"McDonald-Thomas will share the arena with one of her students, 12-year-old Emilee Charlesworth, and the duo will entertain the crowd with death defying tricks at break neck speed," stated a press release.

At 24-years-old, McDonald-Thomas has been riding for

more than 18 years and has performed internationally in Canada, Mexico, and across the United States in rodeos and events.

This year's rodeo will also feature two dances starting at 9:30 p.m. both Friday and Saturday in the air-conditioned Howard County Fair Barn with live music played each night. Jake Hooker and the Outsiders will play at the Friday night dance on

June 16, and Jimmy and the Johnsons will open for Jason Boland and the Stragglers at Saturday night's dance. Tickets for Friday's dance are \$10 per person, and tickets for Saturday's dance are \$20 per person.

Going on its 84th year, the Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo is planning on another exciting event for this

Unfortunately, many children in foster care do not have a reliable father figure in their lives. Re-

moved from their homes due to evidence of abuse or neglect, they are not guaranteed to be placed in state care near their loved ones. It is a constant cycle of uncertainty.

However, CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) volunteers from CASA of West Texas can help provide stability for these children. CASA volunteers, everyday members of

Fired FBI director Comey's testimony puts spotlight on Trump

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a hugely anticipated hearing, fired FBI director James Comey will recount a series of conversations with President Donald Trump that

he says made him deeply uneasy and concerned about the blurring of boundaries between the White House and a law enforcement agency that prides itself on independence.



investigation into ties between the Trump campaign and Russia.

Comey's account of demands for loyalty from the president, and of requests to end an investigation into an embattled Trump adviser, are likely to sharpen allegations that Trump improperly sought to influence the FBI-led probe.

Comey's detailed and vivid recollections of his one-on-one conversations with Trump were revealed in seven pages of prepared testimony released Wednesday, the day before his appearance before the Senate intelligence committee.

He'll testify under oath that Trump repeatedly pressed him for his "loyalty" and directly pushed him to "lift the cloud" of investigation by declaring publicly the president was not the target of the probe into his campaign's Russia ties.

The remarks paint a picture of an FBI director so disconcerted by his interactions with the president that he began keeping written memos of their private discussions, including one he hastened to type out in an FBI vehicle immediately after a Trump Tower meeting.

He'll tell lawmakers he believed the president was trying to create a "patronage relationship" with him and describe in detail an Oval Of-

fice meeting in which Trump urged him not to investigate ousted National Security Adviser Michael Flynn's contacts with Russian officials.

But the ex-FBI director also will validate Trump's assertion that he was not personally a target of the federal counterintelligence investigation into possible campaign collusion with Russia. Comey says he did offer the president that "assurance," but resisted Trump's appeals to make that information public.

"The FBI and the Department of Justice had been reluctant to make public statements that we did not have an open case on President Trump for a number of reasons, most importantly because it would create a duty to correct, should that change," Comey says in the prepared remarks.

Trump's personal lawyer said Trump was cheered by the testimony.

"The president is pleased that Mr. Comey has finally publicly confirmed his private reports that the president was not under investigation in any Russian probe," attorney Marc Kasowitz said in a statement. "The president feels completely and totally vindicated. He is eager to continue to move forward with his agenda."

Comey has not spoken publicly since he was abruptly fired by Trump on May 9. His dismissal, four years into a 10-year term, fueled claims Trump's ultimate aim was to quash the investigation and

obstruct justice, potentially a federal crime or an impeachable offense. Some legal experts said Comey's account could bolster such a case.

Ryan Goodman, a professor at New York University School of Law, said Trump's efforts to protect Flynn provide "strong evidence" of obstruction of justice. However, Jonathan Turley, a law professor at George Washington University, said that while Trump's dealings with Comey were inappropriate, "We do not indict people for being boorish or clueless."

The ex-FBI director's testimony recounts his conversations with the apparent precision of a veteran lawman. Comey notes he had nine one-on-one interactions with Trump over a four-month stretch, compared to two private conversations with President Barack Obama between September 2013 and the end of 2016.

He also says he did not keep written memos of his interactions with Obama.

The first meeting with Trump after the inauguration occurred on Jan. 27, during a private dinner at the White House that Comey came to view as an attempt by the president to "create some sort of patronage relationship."

According to Comey, Trump asked if he wanted to remain as FBI director and declared: "I need loyalty. I expect loyalty." Comey says he replied that he could offer his honesty, and that when Trump said he wanted "hon-

est loyalty," Comey paused and said, "You will get that from me."

Comey also describes at length a Feb. 14 meeting in the Oval Office in which he believed Trump asked him to back off an investigation into Flynn.

"He then said, 'I hope you can see your way clear to letting this go, to letting Flynn go. He is a good guy. I hope you can let this go,'" Comey says, according to the prepared remarks. He says he believed the president was talking only about Flynn, not about the broader Russia probe.

White House spokeswoman Sarah Huckabee Sanders said she was unsure if the president read Comey's testimony after its release. Asked whether the president stood by earlier assertions that he had neither sought Comey's loyalty nor asked for the Flynn investigation to be dropped, she said: "I can't imagine the president not standing by his own statement."

Sen Mark Warner of Virginia, senior Democrat on the Senate intelligence committee, said in prepared testimony released early Thursday: "I do want to emphasize what is happening here — the president of the United States is asking the FBI director to drop an ongoing investigation into the president's former National security advisor."

Earlier Wednesday, Trump announced that he planned to nominate Christopher Wray,

a former Justice Department official, as Comey's successor.

Trump allies have raised questions about Comey's credibility ahead of his testimony, noting that the FBI had to correct some of his remarks from his last appearance on Capitol Hill. They've also questioned why Comey did not raise his concerns about Trump publicly or resign.

Comey's prepared testimony does not fully answer that question, though he does say he asked Attorney General Jeff Sessions to help prevent him having any direct communication with the president in the future.

Trump has repeatedly cast the Russia investigation as a "hoax" and denied having any improper ties to Moscow. According to Comey, Trump was acutely aware of the political toll of the investigation, complaining that the probe had left a "cloud" that was "impairing his ability to act on behalf of the country."

In a phone call on March 30, Comey says, the president asked him what could be done to "lift the cloud."

He says Trump also volunteered that "he had nothing to do with Russia, had not been involved with hookers in Russia, and had always assumed he was being recorded when in Russia" — referencing an unverified intelligence dossier detailing compromising information Moscow had allegedly collected on Trump.

the community who are specially trained and appointed by judges to advocate for children in the foster care system, are often the only consistent adult presence in these children's lives.

"Our advocates volunteer and devote their own time to get to know the child, and for that reason, judges seek their recommendations regarding placement as well as the child's mental and physical health and educational needs," said Patty Pisklak, executive director of CASA of West Texas. "Ultimately, CASA volunteers work diligently to find the child a safe, permanent home as quickly as possible."

Children who have CASA volunteers typically spend less time in foster care, receive more services needed to heal, and perform better academically. CASA volunteers advocate first and foremost for reunification with the child's family. When there is not an able or willing relative to care for the child, CASA volunteers work to help place him or her with a caring adoptive family.

There were 134 children from Howard County in the custody of Texas Department of Family and Protective Services in 2016 and currently there are only 21 CASA volunteers in Howard County.

"We need more involved members of the community to step up and make a difference by becoming that one present and engaged adult in a child's life," said Pisklak. "Please consider becoming a CASA volunteer so that more children in foster care can celebrate Father's Day and start making memories with loving adults and families."

Lana Kraeszig, member of the Board of Directors of National WASP WWII Museum and a woman pilot, lives at Pecan Plantation and is passionate about giving WASP a chance to reunite with old friends. "These women gave of themselves at a time when they were not even considered a true military unit. They tested experimental military aircraft, towed targets for ammunitions practice and some gave the ultimate sac-

rifice. The hospitality we show is only a small way we say Thank You", Kraeszig said.

Accompanied by military escorts carefully selected from a competitive application process, the WASP returned to The Wishing Well, where they gathered for a reunion photo and saw each other, some for the first time in years. Barbara "Bobbie" Heinrich, celebrating her 101st birthday, made her first trip to National WASP WWII Museum Homecoming. Ann Hobing, Executive Director of the Museum, said, "What an honor and privilege to lead hundreds of people in singing Happy Birthday to a living legend. This is my inaugural Homecoming and I am overjoyed to be in the presence of such amazing wom-

en."

Homecoming 2017 also welcomed two contemporary women pilots to share their stories and give homage to the WASP who blazed the trail for those after them. Major Heather "Lucky" Penney, most recognized for her service to our nation on September 11, 2001, brought a luncheon audience of 300 to tears as she recalled the morning she scrambled into a fighter jet in Washington D.C. to protect our skies over the Pentagon. "Because of WASP who broke the mold so many decades ago, I was able to serve the idea of freedom and democracy we call America", Penney said. She now serves as National Chair for the Commemorative Air Force's RISE

across the nation about the Women Airforce Service Pilots.

Homecoming 2017 reached its highest attendance in its 12 years, with nearly 2000 people at the Museum. Some flew into Avenger Field in private aircraft, and one family drove over 1200 miles from South Carolina to show gratitude to WASP. "WASP came from across the United States, to serve our nation, to defend our homeland and to protect our freedom. And so, we are here today to celebrate and remember a group of veterans so groundbreaking in their service that their footprint on women who came

after is deep and permanent.", said Hobing.

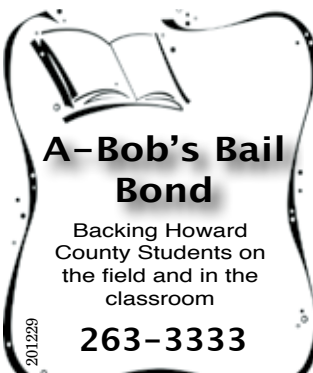

Cavs' best effort not good enough to beat the Warriors

CLEVELAND — LeBron James and Kyrie Irving couldn't be stopped. J.R. Smith finally got started.

The Cleveland Cavaliers were so much better than in the previous two games.

They're just not good enough to beat what may be one of the NBA's best teams ever.

The Cavaliers fell into a 3-0 hole in the NBA Finals after the Golden State Warriors pulled out a 118-113 victory on Wednesday night.

Blown off the court in the second halves of the first two games, the Cavaliers surged ahead with a big third quarter and were still ahead by six with less than 3 minutes to play.

"I'm human, as well as my teammates, and to lay it all on the line like that, you want to come out on the winning side," Irving said. "But we gave a great effort, and the result just didn't turn out the way we wanted to."

But the heavy minutes Cleveland's superstars were forced to play may have taken their toll down the stretch. The Warriors finished with an 11-0 run to steal the victory and all but assure themselves of taking Cleveland's title. No team has blown a 3-0 lead in the NBA.

"I thought our team scrapped and competed," Cavaliers coach Tyronn Lue said. "I can't be disappointed with the effort and how we played, but they made the plays down the stretch that we didn't execute defensively or offensively, and they took advantage of it."

James had 39 points, 11 rebounds and nine assists, but his attempt at a tying 3-pointer was blocked by Andre Iguodala and James stepped out of bounds after recovering it, slamming the ball to the court in frustration.

Irving bounced back from a rough Game 2 with 38 points, including a couple of dazzling layups where he jumped and scored.

Smith made five 3-pointers and scored 16 points, and Kevin Love gutted his way to nine points and 13 rebounds on a night he shot just 1 for 9.

The Cavaliers might have beaten anybody else the way they played, just as they did in Game 3 of last

year's Finals and as they did while rolling into the Finals with a 12-1 record.

But Golden State and Irving are on another level than the teams Cleveland roughed up in the Eastern Conference, and the Cavs just couldn't hold them down long enough.

James delivered another performance that reminded everyone he remains the NBA's best player.

He's just going up against a better team.

Vargas leads Royals past Astros 7-5

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — No Dallas, no win for Houston.

Jason Vargas tossed five solid innings for his eighth victory, Cheslor Cuthbert drove in three runs and the Kansas City Royals defeated the Astros 7-5 on Wednesday night after Houston ace Dallas Keuchel was a late scratch with an illness.

That cancelled the anticipated pitching duel between Vargas and Keuchel, who have the two best ERAs in the majors. A few minutes before the game was to start, Astros manager A.J. Hinch told Royals manager Ned Yost that Keuchel would not be starting.

"A.J. said he's been sick and throwing up," Yost said. "(I thought) OK, I'm glad we don't have to face him."

Hinch said Keuchel had been "sick for the last couple of days."

Instead, the Astros started right-hander Dayan Diaz, who was just called up from Triple-A Fresno. Diaz (0-1) gave up three runs and four hits, including Lorenzo Cain's solo homer, in 2 2/3 innings.

"Like 15 minutes before," Diaz said through an interpreter of when he learned he was starting. "So there wasn't much time when they told me I was going to start."

Vargas (8-3), who pitched a shut-out against Cleveland in his previous start, allowed two runs on Brian McCann's home run and RBI single. He gave up six hits, a walk and hit a batter. Vargas' ERA inched up from 2.08 to 2.18 in the win, the Royals' second straight over the Astros.

"I felt like we made good pitches when situations were really key," Vargas said. "They are where they're at in their division for a reason. They're a good ballclub."

Cuthbert had an RBI double in

the second and a two-run single hit. Alcides Escobar had a pair of RBI singles.

McCann's homer came in the second inning, and his fourth-inning single scored Carlos Beltran, who had doubled. It was Beltran's 549th career double, moving him one past Alex Rodriguez and into a tie with Chipper Jones for 29th place on baseball's career list.

The Astros scored three runs in eighth to cut the Royals' lead to two when Jake Marisnick singled in a run and Escobar's fielding miscue with the bases loaded allowed two more runs to score.

Kelvin Herrera worked the ninth for his 13th save in 15 opportunities, striking out three and allowing a single to McCann, his fourth

hit.

The Royals made four roster moves, including recalling IF Ramon Torres, who they signed as a 16-year-old in 2009 out of the Dominican Republic. Torres, who was hitting .327 in 53 games with Triple-A Omaha, went 2 for 4 with a double and RBI in his big league debut. The Royals also activated LHP Scott Alexander from the disabled list. They optioned RHP Kevin McCarthy, who did not allow a run in 6 1/3 innings, and OF Billy Burns to Omaha.

The Astros optioned LHP Reynmin Guduan, who had pitched the past two nights, to Triple-A Fresno to make room for Diaz. Guduan had a 9.00 ERA over three innings in three relief appearances.

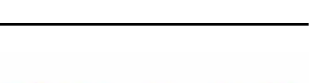

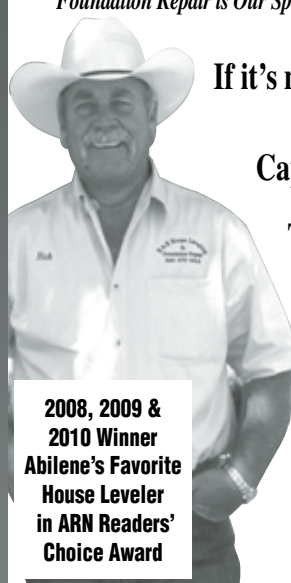

The bidding:
North East South West

Opening lead — jack of spades.

It is normal to lead fourth-best on opening lead and also during the later play, but, as with all general rules, there are exceptions. For example, no one would lead the fourth-best spade from the West hand in this deal. Leading the top card of a three-card sequence takes precedence over the fourth-best rule. But what East return after winning West's opening spade lead

with the king? Certainly a club — but which one? In the actual case, East returned his fourth-best club, the deuce, and West won South's king with the ace.

West then went astray when he returned the jack of clubs, and declarer wound up with 10 tricks after drawing trumps and losing a diamond finesse to East. The only tricks South lost were a spade, a diamond and a club. Had West returned the eight of clubs instead of the jack, South would have made the contract by putting up dummy's ten.

West's jack-of-clubs return was clearly incorrect, but, even so, East was also at fault. East should have returned the club nine — "top of nothing" — at trick two instead of the deuce. It was far more important at this point to tell his partner that the nine was his highest club than to show that he had four clubs by leading the deuce.

Had East returned the nine, West would have known that declarer had the K-Q and would have ducked South's king. When declarer eventually got around to taking the diamond finesse, East would have won with the king and returned another club, and West would have scored the ace and jack for down one.
