

The Parthenon Dancers of Greece to perform at Mandeville

The Parthenon Dancers of Greece will present an evening of Greek songs and folk dances at 8 p.m. Saturday, October 31, in the Mandeville Center Auditorium at the University of California, San Diego.

The songs and dances range from Macedonia and Thrace to the Ionian Islands, from Pontos, Epirus, Crete, Dodekanese, Roumeli, Peloponesus, and Cyprus. The company of 40 is under the direction of Kaiti and Andreas Frangedakis, in collaboration with Athan Karras.

Along with an impressive variety of musical instruments, the Parthenon Dancers of Greece brings with it hundreds of authentic, colorful heirloom costumes.

The San Francisco Chronicle termed its performance "an outstanding display of folk art filled with brilliance and virtuosity."
