

One of 500 copies, numbered and signed by the publisher. This "Burke's Peerage for Portugal," originally published in an edition of only 320 copies, Braga 1932-34, has been extremely difficult to find for many years, and has commanded high prices on the market. The present reprint was sold out within weeks of publication.



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the royal family of Bragança, which was to rule Portugal continuously from 1640 until 1910, and Brazil from 1640 to 1889. In this work Alvia de Castro traces the lineage of the Condes de Barcelos (a title created in 1298) back to the early Christian kings of Castille and Navarre. He also describes the fortuitous unions which commingled Barcelos blood with that of the royal houses of Spain and Portugal: the third Conde de Barcelos, for instance, was the illegitimate son of D. Dinis; and the eighth Conde (and first Duque de Bragança) was the legitimized son of D. João I.

Alvia de Castro states in the dedication that he wrote this work "en muestras de mi inclinacion a su grandeça," and the *Panegirico* passed the scrutiny of the censors in Lisbon and Madrid. In hindsight, however, this is a rather subversive work: it justifies the claim of the author's patron, D. João (1604-1658), Duque de Barcelos, to the Portuguese throne. The previous royal line had been extinguished upon the death of D. Sebastião at the disastrous battle of Alcácer Quibir in 1578, and Portugal was now under Spanish dominion. D. João succeeded his father as eighth Duque de Bragança in 1630 and, in 1640, was proclaimed King João IV of Portugal.

Born in Logroño, Alvia de Castro (1572-1640?), a knight of Calatrava, served as inspector-general of the Spanish royal armada and of Spanish naval and military forces in Portugal. While in Portugal he also published several other works, including a collection of military and political aphorisms (1621) and the *Memorial y discurso politico por la muy noble, y muy leal ciudad de Logroño* (1633).

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. This history of the Vasconcelos family traces their origins to Dom Dinis through his son, Dom Pedro, Conde de Barcelos. The house of Vasconcelos is also traced to the Conde don Rodrigo Velloso, son of don Pedro Frojas, Conde de Traua in Galicia, brother of Conde don Fernan Paez de Trastamara, second husband of Dona Teresa, mother of Dom Afonso Henriques. Another ilustrious ancestor was said to be Martin Moniz, grandson of Count Osorio de la Lamia. The author demonstrates various other relationships between the house of Vasconcelos and the royal families of Portugal and Castile, as well as links with many of the most prominent families of the Iberian Peninsula. Members of the family held posts such as Master of the Order of Santiago, and governor of Ceuta. The work contains a few lines of poetry in Portuguese.

The author, a native of Monção, was a presbyter and doctor of canon law at Coimbra University. After 1640 he became a staunch defender of the rights of D. João IV to the Portuguese throne. Dom Francisco Manuel de Melo referred to him as a "douto escritor", and according to the *Grande enciclopédia* he was an "escrupuloso linhagista".



First (and only?) Edition in Portuguese. This biography was translated by the Jesuit Francisco de Mattos from the Jesuit Johann Bodler's (1620-1698) *Lebens- und Sterbens-Lauff in einer Summa Weiland dess durchleuchtigisten Furstens Philip Wilhelm, Pfaltz-Grafen bey Rhein*, Dillingen, 1690. After the biography is a discussion of the genealogy of the Graf's daughter Maria Sofia, who in 1687 married D. Pedro II of Portugal (see pp. 249-84). The translator, a native of Lisbon, traveled to Brazil as a novice, aged 16, in 1652. A noted pulpit orator and teacher of theology and philosophy, he spent a good part of his life in Rio de Janeiro and Bahia, dying at Bahia in 1720.

Second edition of a work first published by Sancha in Madrid, 1793, and frequently since. Ticknor compares it to Montesquieu's *Persian Letters* and Goldsmith's *Citizen of the World*, but notes that it is more concerned with literary discussions and satire than either of those works. *Cartas marruecas* includes sections on Spanish character, customs, nobility and commoners, language, pride, respect for the aged, love of luxury, Barcelona, moneymaking, history and historiography, Don Quixote (pp. 143-5), pedantry and scholars, forced marriages, coquetry, and more.

Cadahalso y Vasquez was born in Cádiz in 1741, served as a colonel in the Caballería de Borbón, and was killed during the siege of Gibraltar in 1782. He is considered one of the canonical Spanish Enlightenment authors.

FIRST EDITION. Covers the government, language, religion, nobility, military, etc. of Germany, Spain, France, Great Britain, Russia, Naples, Poland, Portugal, Denmark, Switzerland, Hungary, the Ottoman Empire, the Papal States, Venice, Holland, Genoa, Lucca, Tuscany, Bologna, Malta, Parma and Modena. Of the author, Colmeiro writes, "Es el único que hasta ahora ha intentado ilustrar la historia de la economía política de España, y ha mostrado el camino que debe seguir quien abrigue el loable deseo de completar su pensamiento" (Biblioteca de los economistas españoles pp. 56-7).

A note in *NUC* says that this work was originally published in 1783, as part of a work entitled *Compendio historico*, *geográfico y genealógico de los soberanos de España*. No work by that title is listed in Palau, *NUC* or Sempere y Guarinos. However, a search for the *Descripcion* in OCLC finds *Compenoio* [sic] *cronologico-historico de los soberanos de Eudropa* [sic]: *comprehende los imperios*, *reynos*, *principados*, *república*, *y demás estados soberanos*, *hoy existentes en Europe* (10384338, with no comment on the relationship of this work to the *Descripcion*).


FIRST EDITION of this work arguing that Philip II of Spain (son of the Emperor Charles V and his wife the Infanta Isabel of Portugal) and his heirs are the legitimate kings of Portugal: "Reçucitan oy amotinados Portugueses un cadauer, que nunca vivió; un derecho, que nunca fué; una causa, que nunca pudo subistir" (f. \*\*1v). Pages 9-36 are a reprint in the original Portuguese of a work by Portuguese patriot Antonio Pais Viegas, *Manifesto do Reino de Portugal*, 1641, which had been widely circulated. Most of the remainder of this volume (pp. 37-156) is Caramuel Lobkowitz's response to Pais Viegas. He includes 30 pages of genealogical arguments, among which are a discussion of the marriage (or not) of the unfortunate D. Ines de Castro (d. 1355) and D. Pedro I of Portugal (pp. 85-107). The final section (pp. 158-198) is Caramuel Lobkowitz's reply to 9 other works that supported D. João's claims.

Another edition of the *Respuesta* was published at Santangel de la Fratta, 1665. There is also an edition of La Coruña, 2008. A Latin translation by Leandro van der Bandt appeared in Louvain, 1642: *Joannes Bargantinus Lusitaniae illegitimus rex demonstratus*.


The *Respuesta* is a rare and previously unrecorded use of Civilité type, not listed in the appendix to Carter & Vervliet, *Civilité Types*.

The work is dedicated to the first Conde de Assumar, Francisco de Melo, who was granted the title by Philip III in 1630. When the Conde remained loyal to the Habsburgs after D. João IV ascended the Portuguese throne in 1640, his title was revoked by the Portuguese monarch, but continued to be recognized in Spain.

Juan Caramuel Lobkowitz (Madrid, 1606-Vigevano, Lombardy, 1682) had a brilliant career as a clergyman and was the author of over 200 works. After studying mathematics and Asian languages (especially Chinese), he entered the Cistercian order at La Espina (Palencia). While attached to the monastery of Dunes in Flanders, his sermons attracted the attention of the Infante Ferdinand, governor of the Low Countries. In 1638, the University of Louvain bestowed an honorary Doctor of Theology degree upon him. Caramuel Lobkowitz notes in the dedication (f. \*2v) that he had penned *Philippus Prudens Caroli V. Imp. filius Lusitaniae Algarbiae, Indiae, Brasiliae legitimus rex demonstratus*, Antwerp, 1639,



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to defend the Habsburg right to the throne. That work provoked Antonio Pais Viegas to publish the *Manifesto do Reino de Portugal*, which in turn provoked the present work. Judging from the *aprobación* on f. \*\*4v, when this work appeared, its author was titular abbot of Melrose (in Scotland).

Caramuel Lobkowitz subsequently served as envoy from the king of Spain to the court of Emperor Ferdinand III, abbot-superior of the Benedictines in Vienna, grandvicar to the archbishop of Prague, bishop of Konigratz, archbishop of Otranto, and bishop of Vigevano. His published works range from grammar, poetry, and canon law to mathematics (he focused on combinatorics and probability), logic, astronomy, and asceticism. Alphonsus Liguori (later sanctified) condemned Caramuel Lobkowitz as "Prince of the Laxists."

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Excellent work, unfortunately little-known outside of the picturesque town of Sobral de Monte Agraço, situated between Bucelas and Torres Vedras, about 50 kilometers north of Lisbon. The founder of the house of Sobral was Joaquim Inácio da Cruz Sobral, 1º Morgado do Sobral (also after 1768 2º Morgado da Alagoa? 1725-1781; born and died in Lisbon), a key collaborator of the Marquês de Pompal. He had an engraved bookplate, and we have seen evidence that he was a keen bibliophile. On the bookplate, see Avelar Duarte, *Ex-libris portugueses heráldicos 678*; also Henrique de Avellar in *Arte do ex-libris*, fascículo 91, vol. XII, pp. 1-9. 



FIRST EDITION. An attractive set of this important work on the history of Terceira from its discovery by the Portuguese through 1832; at the end of each volume are reprinted numerous documents. The author was a native of São Sebastião, Ilha Terceira. A facsimile reprint appeared in 1981.

Francisco Ferreira Drummond (Vila de São Sebastião, 1796-Vila de São Sebastião, 1858) was a historian, paleographer, musician and politican figure. This is his principal work. It has occupied an important place in the historiography of the Azores in general, and the Island of Terceira in particular, serving as a base for more recent historical studies. As a liberal, Drummond suffered political persecution after the Vila-Francada (1823), fleeing Terceira, only able to return after the Abrilada (1824). He participated actively on the liberal side during the 1828-1834 civil war; some of his actions are related in the *Annaes*.

Provenance: Aníbal [or Annibal] Fernandes Thomáz [or Tomás], 1849-1911. Writer, government official, and distinguished bibliophile, he was also a collector of ex-libris, super-libris, rare books, and prints. Fernandes Thomaz was born in Figueira-da-Foz and served as a postal inspector in Lisbon, as well as in other government posts. Concurrently he formed an outstanding library of books and prints and published prolifically on bibliographical and historical topics. His writings include works on Camões, Portuguese bookplates, Portuguese super-libris, Portuguese engravers, and engraved and lithographic portraits. His library was sold at auction in 1912; the catalogue is one of the most important for Portuguese books. Apparently purchased at the 1912 sale by Luís Felipe de Andrade Albuquerque Bettencourt (1876-?).


Names mentioned in the text include Francisco Duran de Torres, father of Juan Duran de Torres, and Fuente de Cantos and Mérida (Extremadura).

The engraving laid into the second work is a dark, clear impression of a plate probably executed in the eighteenth century. It includes the arms of Navarre, a double-headed eagle, two lions rampant, a crown, the motto "Nomen sempiternum dabo eis / quod non peribit, Esaie 56" ("I will give them an everlasting name, that shall not be cut off, Isaiah 56.5"). In the cartouche are the words, "Insignia Sive Stemmata Genearchae Palatij Familiaeque de Torres ex Regia Stirpo & Prosapia Navarrense Oriundi" ("Insignia or pedigree of the Torres palace [?] and family, of royal stock and Navarran ancestry").

FIRST EDITION. A second edition appeared in 1740, and a third in 1791. The main part of the book is made up of eight discourses: (1) on the population of Portugal, (2) the military organization of the kingdom, (3) the nobility, (4) a history of its coinage, going back to the Roman times, (5) the universities and sciences in the Iberian Peninsula in



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general, and in Portugal in particular, (6) the evangelization of Guiné, (7) the causes of shipwrecks, and (8) a miscellaneous section on travel, Portuguese cardinals, eulogies, etc.

The first discourse (pp. 1-33) is an appeal for increasing the population of Portugal. It is argued that a large population is needed to promote industry and agriculture, as well as to man the army, navy and merchant marine. Comparisons are made to China, which is said to be able to sustain a large population, and to use the manpower to increase industry and agriculture. Germany, Flanders, England and Italy are also cited as positive examples. The kingdom of Grenada is given as a bad example, having declined after the expulsion of its Moorish population. There are references to the Azores, Madeira, Angola, Mozambique, Brazil, Cabo Verde, São Tomé, Goa, Diu, Cochim, Colombo, the Malucas, Ormuz, Malaca and Mascate.

The second discourse (pp. 34-84) is a sweeping analysis of the military organization of Portugal. It deals with the role of the king, of the constable, and of other officers, both from an historical perspective as well as the practices of the day. Composition of the army is discussed, as is military law, and the traditional hostility between Portugal and Castile. Ordinance and armaments are described, including the role in supply of various places in continental Portugal, as well as Funchal, Ponta Delgada, Angra, Ribeira Grande in Cabo Verde, the Island of São Tomé, Salvador da Bahia, Olinda, and Rio de Janeiro. Fortresses and defense of the frontiers is discussed. There is a section on the navy, the office of Admiral, and a part on the composition of the fleets, including their deployment in Africa, India and Brazil. North African and French pirates are mentioned. A section on the arming of merchant ships includes mention of São Tomé, Brazil, and Flanders. There is also a reference in this section to the Companhia da Bolsa do Brasil. The final part of this discourse (pp. 77-84) deals with the military orders of Avis, Santiago, Christ (successor to the Templars in Portugal), and the Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem.


The third discourse (pp. 85-149) deals with the noble families of Portugal. It discusses their antiquity, the origin of names, coats-of-arms, and titles of nobility.

Severim de Faria (1583-1655), a native of Lisbon, is best known for this work and his *Discursos varios políticos*, Évora 1624. His *Relação universal do que succedeu em Portugal ...*, Lisbon 1626, is considered the first periodical published in Portugal, and includes a famous account of the loss and reconquest of Bahia. Severim de Faria was Resende's successor in archeology, and his fame came to rival that of his uncle; he also collected a choice library of rare books. Innocêncio describes Severim de Faria as "um escriptor geralmente respeitavel, e que nas suas obras deixou muito bons subsidios para a historia civil, não menos que para a da litteratura, da lingua, e da critica litteraria em Portugal. A sua dicção e geralmente pura e fulente ...."

The fourth discourse (pp. 150-201) is about coinage, beginning with Roman coins current in the province of Lusitania. There are sections for Visigothic kings, and a brief treatise on Arab coins. The coinage of the kings of Portugal is covered, from Dom Sancho I, the first for whom there was incontrovertible proof that he operated a mint, to Dom João IV (with the notable exception of the Spanish monarchs D. Filipe II, III, and IV, who ruled Portugal as D. Filipe I, II, and III). There are fifteen fine engravings in the text, each showing the head and tail of a specific coin.

The fifth discourse (pp. 202-23) is titled "Sobre as universidades de Hespanha". It includes notices of Universities at Coimbra, Évora, Salamanca, Toledo, Siguença, Alcalá de Henares, Osma, Ávila, Valladolid, Oropesa, Ossuna, Sevilla, Granada, Baeça, Murcia, Santiago de Compostela, Onhate, Oviedo, Huesca, Zaragoza, Lerida, Perpignan, Barcelona, Tarragona, Girona, Valencia, Luchente, Origuela, Gandia, Hirache, Estella, and Pamplona. While some of these were active learned institutions, others were founded in principle, but never achieved much, or anything. There is a section on the beginnings of the sciences in Lusitania.

The sixth discourse (pp. 224-40) is titled "Sobre a propagaçam do evangelho nas Provincias de Guiné". It also includes notices regarding the nearby islands of Cabo Verde,



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as well as mention of Goa, the Congo, Luanda, Cacheu, Mina, São Tomé, and Sierra Leon. There is a brief reference to martyrs in Japan, China, Siam, India, "Cafraria" (i.e. Southeast Africa) and Brazil.

The seventh discourse (pp. 241-7) deals with the many shipwrecks which befell ships returning to Portugal from India. The famous account of João Baptista Lavanha on the *São Alberto* is noted, while the superiority of English, and especially Dutch vessels is emphasized. It is mentioned that these Dutch ships were waging war against Portugal in India and Brazil.

The eighth discourse (pp. 248-342) begins with a brief, rather abstract essay on travel. This is followed by a memorial to various Portuguese who achieved the rank of Cardinal in the Catholic Church (pp. 258-77), and a series of Eulogies, to Frey Bernardo de Brito (pp. 278-88), the city of Évora (pp. 289-90), and king Dom João III of Portugal (pp. 291-305). Finally, included in this discourse is a work by João de Barros, "Panegirico a mui Alta e esclarecida princesa Infanta Dona Maria nossa Senhora" (pp. 306-42).

A final section includes eulogies of Portuguese cardinals.

The first discourse (I, 1-69) is an appeal for increasing the population of Portugal. Severim de Faria argues that a large population will promote industry and agriculture, and provide men for the army, navy and merchant marine. He cites China, whose large population provides manpower for industry and agriculture. Germany, Flanders, England and Italy are also cited as positive examples. As a counter-example he cites the kingdom of Granada, which declined after its Moorish population was expelled. In this discourse, Severim de Faria also mentions the Azores, Madeira, Angola, Mozambique, Brazil, Cabo Verde, São Tomé, Goa, Diu, Cochim, Colombo, the Malucas, Ormuz, Malaca and Mascate.

The second discourse (I, 70-177) is a sweeping analysis of the military organization of Portugal from historical and contemporary points of view. Severim de Faria's topics include the role of the king, constable, and other officers, the composition of the army, military law, and the traditional hostility between Portugal and Castile. In discussing ordinance and armaments, he considers problems of supply in continental Portugal, Funchal, Ponta Delgada, Angra, Ribeira Grande in Cabo Verde, São Tomé, Salvador da Bahia, Olinda, and Rio de Janeiro. Also discussed are fortresses and the defense of the frontiers, the navy, the office of admiral, and composition of the fleets, including their deployment in Africa, India and Brazil and the problems of North African and French pirates. A section on the arming of merchant ships mentions São Tomé, Brazil, Flanders, and the Companhia da Bolsa do Brasil. The final part of this discourse (I, 163-177) deals with the military orders of Avis, Santiago, Christ (successor to the Templars in Portugal), and the Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem.

The third discourse (I, 178-318) deals with the noble families of Portugal: their antiquity, and the origin of their names, titles, and coats of arms.

The fourth discourse (II, 1-106) is on coinage, beginning with Roman coins that circulated in the province of Lusitania and continuing with the coinage of Visigothic kings and Arabs. The coinage of the kings of Portugal is covered from Dom Sancho I (the first king known with certainty to have operated a mint) to Dom João IV. Notably absent is the coinage of the Spanish monarchs D. Filipe II, III, and IV, who ruled Portugal as D. Filipe I, II, and III. Subsequent editors added comments on the coinage of D. João IV's successors through D. Maria I.

Illustrations for the discourse on coinage vary from edition to edition. The 1655 edition of the *Noticias* has engravings within the text (pp. 151-191) that illustrate the recto

and verso of 15 coins. The latest is a coin issued under D. João IV (r. 1640-1656) whose verso bears an image of N. Senhora da Conceição and the inscription "Tutelaris Regni". The 1741 edition has 18 images of coins within the text (pp. 146-186): the three additions date to 1695, 1726, and 1733. In our 1791 edition, the 18 illustrations have been shifted to four engraved plates. Although text was added to cover coins minted under D. José I and D. Maria I, the text makes no references to additional illustrations. Hence we assume Innocêncio's call for five engraved plates in this edition is in error.

The fifth discourse (II, 106-143) begins with an essay on the universities of Spain, then discusses the study of science in Portugal and goes on to brief mentions of the universities at Coimbra, Évora, Salamanca, Toledo, Siguença, Alcalá de Henares, Osma, Ávila, Valladolid, Oropesa, Ossuna, Sevilla, Granada, Baeça, Murcia, Santiago de Compostela, Onhate, Oviedo, Huesca, Zaragoza, Lerida, Perpignan, Barcelona, Tarragona, Girona, Valencia, Luchente, Origuela, Gandia, Hirache, Estella, and Pamplona. Some of these became highly respected institutions; others were established but achieved little.

The sixth discourse (II, 143-177) is titled "Sobre a propagaçam do evangelho nas Provincias de Guiné". Severim de Faria mentions not only Guiné but Cabo Verde, Goa, the Congo, Luanda, Cacheu, Mina, São Tomé, and Sierra Leão. Also included are brief references to martyrs in Japan, China, Siam, India, "Cafraria" (i.e., Southeast Africa), and Brazil.


The seventh discourse (II, 178-193) considers why so many ships returning to Portugal from India were wrecked, mentioning the famous account of João Baptista Lavanha on the *São Alberto*. Severim de Faria points out the superiority of English and Dutch vessels, noting that at this time, the Dutch were waging war against Portugal in India and Brazil.

The eighth discourse (II, 193-215) discusses when and where travel can be beneficial. The *Noticias* ends with eulogies of twenty Portuguese who achieved the rank of cardinal in the Catholic Church (II, 215-296).

Severim de Faria (1583-1655), a native of Lisbon, is best known for this work and his *Discursos varios politicos*, Évora 1624. His *Relação universal do que succedeu em Portugal* ..., Lisbon 1626, is considered the first periodical published in Portugal, and includes a famous account of the loss and reconquest of Bahia. Severim de Faria was Resende's successor in archeology, and his fame came to rival that of his uncle; he also collected a choice library of rare books. Innocêncio describes Severim de Faria as "um escriptor geralmente respeitavel, e que nas suas obras deixou muito bons subsidios para a historia civil, não menos que para a da litteratura, da lingua, e da critica litteraria em Portugal. A sua dicção e geralmente pura e fluente ...."

Frutuoso (Ponta Delgada, 1522-Ribeira Grande, 1591), historian, priest and humanist, was a native of São Miguel in the Açores. He received both a bachelor's degree after studying under Domingos de Soto at the University of Salamanca, and a doctorate in theology from the Salamanca, or perhaps from the Jesuit university at Évora.



Some critics consider this the author's best work, apparently first published in Valladolid, 1539, and frequently reprinted. A series of essays usually in epistolary form, with title and style taken from Cicero, it was translated into Italian, French, English, Dutch and German. There are multiple sixteenth- and seventeenth-century editions in these languages. Among the subjects are the ancient art of writing and its characteristics, qualifications of a warrior, instructions to knights, benefits and disadvantages of medical care, privileges of old age, the proper attitude of husbands and wives towards one another, disputes with the Jews of Naples on the mystery of the Trinity, Plutarch's epistle to Trajan, whores, and much more. The letters express the author's views on society, morality, theology, politics, love and fidelity, history and Scripture.

The final 10 preliminary leaves, ¶-¶¶4, ¶¶¶2, contain a "Resumen de la genealogia de las ilustres Casas de Saavedra, y Guevara." Of the 31 copies mentioned in the online Spanish CCPBE, only one at Toledo (Biblioteca de Castilla-La Mancha / Biblioteca Pública del Estado) appears to have these leaves. REBIUN refers to a copy in the Biblioteca de Catalunya which contains them. Palau includes them in his collation, but they are not mentioned in any other source we have consulted.

The printer's device is the same as that used by Juan de la Cuesta, and which had belonged to P. Madrigal.

A didactic, ascetic, and learned writer of distinguished ancestry brought up at the court of Ferdinand and Isabella, Fray Antonio de Guevara (1480?-1545) exercised considerable influence on Spanish prose of the sixteenth century, and is acknowledged as one of the leading prose stylists before Cervantes. He entered the Franciscan Order

in 1504, returned as Court Preacher in 1521, and was appointed Royal Chronicler to Charles V in 1526. He accompanied the king on trips to Italy and other parts of Europe, as well as to Tunis in 1535. Much influenced by Cicero's rhetoric and biblical imagery, Guevara attained a European reputation, especially in France and Italy, for his *Libro aureo de Marco Aurelio*. Printed anonymously and without permission in Seville in 1528, it received at least 25 editions within the next 100 years, and was translated into French, Italian, English and Latin. It was augmented as *Libro llamado relox de príncipes*, printed in Valladolid, 1529. This authorized version had 16 editions.

Guilherme João Carlos Henriques (William John Charles Henry, born London, 1846-Quinta da Carnota, 1924) was included by Fonseca despite being born abroad, "não só pelas suas obras de interesse e assunto verdadeiramente portuguez, como pela dedicação que tem à sua pátria adoptiva." Arriving in Portugal in 1860, he lived with his godfather, John Smith Athelstane, first Conde de Carnota, and inherited his godfather's quinta in 1886. Henriques was the first to study Alenquer's history in detail (Alenquer e seu Concelho, 1873); he also edited several volumes of correspondence of the Duque de Saldanha.

The heads of the Lemos family were Lords of Trofa do Vouga, in the concelho de Águeda, from 1449 to the beginning of the nineteenth century, when the 10th holder of the title, Bernardo de Lemos de Carvalho e Vasconcelos, died without issue. D. Duarte de Lemos, (1485-1558), the third Lord (capitão-mor do Mar e da Costa da Etiópia e da Arábia in the government of the Portuguese "Estado de Índia" of D. Afonso de Albuquerque) was responsible for the construction of the Lemos Pantheon in the Church at Trofa—a lovely national monument, significant for as an example of sculpture and architecture from Renaissance Portugal.



Rodrigues Lopes (Maranhão, 1803-Rio de Janeiro, 1895) held the title of Barão de Mattoso in Portugal, and various other honors in Portugal and Brazil, including a medal earned during the campaign in Paraguay. A member of the Instituto Histórico e Geografico Brasileiro from 1841, he rose through the Brazilian military to the rank of Marechal de Campo, and served as Secretario do Conselho Supremo Militar, later the Supremo Tribunal Militar, from 1859 until his death.



FIRST EDITION of this history and genealogy of Conde D. Henrique, the father of the first king of Portugal, D. Afonso I (also known as Afonso Henriques), who reigned 1139-1185. The introduction advises the Conde de Souré on the benefits of studying history. The final page offers a statement from P.G. de Sainte Marthe, historiographer to the king of France, that the Portuguese kings can indeed trace their history back to the French royal line. A second edition appeared in Lisbon: na Offic. de António Isidoro da Fonseca. 1743.

The justification of Portuguese royal genealogy was a frequent subject during the wars of the Restauração, but we have not located this work in any of the major Restauração collections.

Duarte Ribeiro de Macedo (1618?-1680)—along with Father António Vieira and Dom Francisco Manuel de Mello—is considered one of the best writers of Portuguese prose during the seventeenth century: in fact, one of the greatest prose writers in the history of the language. Barbosa Machado writes that he had "hum estilo claro, e discreto." Innocêncio notes, "Occupa um logar mui pouco; mas o que d'elle temos foi o que bastou para os criticos lhe daram logar entre os classicos de primeira nota." Ribeiro de Macedo received his degree in law from Coimbra University. He became an advisor to D. Pedro II and served as ambassador to France for nine years, during which time he observed Colbert's promotion of industry there, and later as ambassador to Spain. Ribeiro de Macedo is known for his efforts to end the economic crisis in Portugal during the second half of the seventeenth century. He outlined a plan for industrial growth and favored the development of national crafts for export as a way of obtaining gold and balancing external trade.

Francisco de Pina e Mello (1695-1773), who rarely used the "de Sá" part of his name which appears on the title pages of the present four volumes, was born and died at Montemor-o-Velho. Coming from a family of the lower nobility, he studied at Coimbra but never took a degree, reading what interested him, being particularly influenced by the Baroque. A trip to France in 1753 put him in contact with pre-romantic French authors. He ran afoul of the Marquês de Pombal, was imprisoned, and spent his final years engrossed in literary theory. A member of the Real Academia de História, the Academia dos Aplicados, and the Academia dos Ocultos, he was something of a contradiction as a poet: bucolic and very much influenced by Gongorism, condemned by the *árchadas* (Correa Garção and Cruz e Silva considered him to be marginal, "o corvo do Mondego"), but finally defending Neoclassicism. In short, he is representative of the contradictions of the confused pre-romantic aesthetics of the period in a synthesis of Gongorism with French Neoclassicism. The poem is dedicated to Sebastião Joseph de Carvalho e Mello, Conde de Oeiras (later Marquês de Pombal), and includes a flowery six-page address to him beginning on the second leaf recto. The first two pages of the main text contain an "Argumento do epithalamio." The poem celebrates the marriage of Pombal's eldest son: an obvious attempt by the author to ingratiate himself with the powerful minister who had had him imprisoned in 1762. The final leaf contains a "Cathalogo de algumas obras deste autor, as quaes se achão de Antonio da Sylva da Costa mercador de livros na rua Augusta, na travessa de S. Nicolão." 

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. In eight *discursos* and a *narración*, Miranda traces the genealogy of the Zúñiga family, sketches Zúñiga's life and character, and describes the funeral rites held in Lisbon in his memory. After studying at Salamanca, Zúñiga entered military service in 1577. Following action in Italy, he was sent to Flanders and distinguished himself at the capture of Rosendael (1580). Appointed captain, Zúñiga became a trusted aide to the Duke of Parma. Miranda provides much information on Zúñiga's participation in the campaigns in Flanders and France from 1589-96, as Philip II sought to win the French throne through military and diplomatic maneuvers. In 1601 Zúñiga was sent to Lisbon, first as commander of Spanish forces there and later as Captain-General of Portugal, where his first assignment was to help plan the abortive Spanish invasion of Ireland. Preceding the *Discursos* are four sonnets in Spanish, including one by Juan de Torres Portugal and another by Manoel de Govea de Vasconcelos, a sonnet in Portuguese, and two *décimas* in Spanish by Alférez Sotomayor.

Miranda, a soldier before entering the service of the dukes of Bragança, published several collections of dialogues on moral and philosophical subjects. The *Discursos* is his only published work in Spanish.

First and Only Edition in Portuguese; judging from the caption title and the note on f. 2r, Mascarenhas translated Moulay Ismail's will from a Spanish edition, but compiled the facts of the sultan's life from other sources.

Moulay Ismail Ibn Sharif (1643 or 1645-1727) was one of the most famous figures in Moroccan history. After becoming the second sultan in the Alaouite dynasty in 1672, he fought a series of battles to persuade the Ottoman Turks to respect Moroccan independence and captured Tangier and other important seaports from the Spanish and English, earning himself the nickname "The Warrior King."

The prologue gives details of Muley Ismaïl's ancestry and his actions, which included the murder of thousands, heavy taxes, the acquisition of hundreds of concubines and the siring of hundreds of children, and his transfer of the capital to Meknes, where he was building a huge new city and royal complex. The testament (ff. 2v-4v) includes provisions for his slaves, concubines, children, Christian slaves, the Franciscans at Meknes, counterfeiters, thieves, vagabonds, prostitutes, and Jews. At the end is a glossary of Arabic terms such as *alcaçova*, *bamarkan*, *janezes*, and *xarife*.



FIRST EDITION of this detailed history of Spain from the Moorish invasion in 711 to the death of Ferdinand V in 1516. Divided into nine books, the *Histoire* takes for its theme the gradual Christian reconquest of Spain from the Moors and the unification of Castile and Aragon under Ferdinand and Isabella. Orléans finished only the first seven books, the last two being completed by Pierre Joseph Arthuys and Pierre Brumoy. The *Histoire* was reprinted at The Hague, 1734; Paris, 1737 and 1787, and an Italian translation appeared at Venice, 1737. The folding map, specially engraved for this edition, was prepared by the French cartographer Jean Baptiste Nolin.

The folding engraved plate in volume II is a genealogical tree (drawn to look like an actual tree) showing the pretenders to the throne of Aragon in the early fifteenth century.

Orléans (1641-1698) was born in Bourges and entered the Jesuit order in 1659, later serving as an instructor in rhetoric. He had earlier written a similar work, *Histoire des revolutions d'Angleterre* (Amsterdam, 1689), which met with considerable success, being reprinted many times and translated into several languages. Among his many other published works are biographies of noted Jesuits.


Apparently the FIRST and ONLY EDITION. *O Passatempo*, edited by José Avelino d'Almeida, was the first periodical printed in Valença. This issue includes an excerpt on Valença from a work by Fr. Francisco da Piedade on the principal towns of Portugal and the genealogy of important Portuguese families; the work was apparently completed in 1827, but left in manuscript. The remainder of the issue is taken up with poetry and *maximas morais*. Innocêncio mentions this periodical in passing, without any information on when or for how long it was published. Almeida (b. 1807 in Vianna) settled at Valença to teach Latin, and while there established Valença's first theater as well as a printing press.



Attractive eighteenth-century manuscript copy of one of the seminal works of genealogy and history for the Iberian Peninsula in the Middle Ages. It was written in the fourteenth century in Gallego-Portuguese. In a highly stratified society a person's lineage was crucial, and D. Pedro's work was a model for many later genealogical accounts. It includes not only lists of names and relationships, but narrative accounts of the lives of many of those listed. Despite some criticisms of its accuracy (especially for the earliest period), it is the only source for many relationships of noble families in thirteenth- and fourteenth-century Castile.

The *Nobiliario* was frequently translated into Portuguese and Castilian, often with additions. It first appeared in print at Rome in 1640. It has been often reprinted, and the fact that it is in print today in several editions is a testimony to its importance for historians.

By birth and by marriage, Pedro Afonso, conde de Barcelos (1287-1354), was affiliated with the highest nobility of the Iberian Peninsula. The illegitimate son of D. Dinis of Portugal (r. 1279-1325) and great-grandson of Alfonso X el Sabio, he first married into the Portuguese Sousa family and then into the Aragonese Ximenes family. During a period of exile he absorbed the culture of the Castilian court, and after his return to Portugal he transformed his estate at Lalim into a cultural center. While at Lalim, D. Pedro composed two of the most important medieval prose works in Gallego-Portuguese: the *Cronica Geral de Espanha* in 1344 and this book, known as the *Livro de Linhagens do conde D. Pedro*, in 1340-44.

Like D. Dinis, D. Pedro was a poet and troubador. His lost "Livro de Cantigas," a collection of Galician songs, was probably an archetype for the medieval Spanish and Portuguese *cancioneros*. Hence D. Pedro is at least partially responsible for the preservation of many important medieval texts that would otherwise have been lost.

Jacinto da Silva Mengo (1808-1866) served in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (see Innocêncio III, 246). Simão da Silva Ferraz de Lima e Castro, Barão e Conde de Rendufe (1795-1857), began his diplomatic career in 1827. From February 1842 to November 1845 he served as minister plenipotentiary to Berlin, and during part of this period (1844) was also Portuguese representative to the court of Saxe-Coburg-Gotha. He negotiated treaties of commerce and navigation with Prussia in 1844 and with several other German states in 1844 and 1845. In early 1846 he was sent as minister plenipotentiary to Madrid, to negotiate a treaty regarding Spanish, French and English intervention in the "Maria da Fonte" movement. After an assignment in Paris, he married a wealthy Belgian noblewoman in 1849.

FIRST EDITION of this poetical genealogy of the Royal House of Denmark, dedicated to Queen Sophie Amalie of Brunswick-Lüneburg. It is also a veiled attack on Protestantism. Two sonnets in Italian appear in the preliminary leaves.

Don Bernardino de Rebolledo, Conde de Rebolledo, Señor de Trian, etc., was born in León (1597; died Madrid, 1676). He had a long and distinguished military career, serving in Italy, the Mediterranean, Flanders and Germany, becoming Governor and Captain General of the Lower Palatine, general of artillery, Spanish Minister to the Court of Denmark, and Minister of the Supreme Council of War, playing a prominent role on the Hapsburg side in the Thirty Years' War. He was influential in the conversion of Queen Christina of Sweden to Catholicism. With four volumes of verse to his credit in addition to his military and diplomatic activities, he was one of the most unusual Spanish poets of the mid-sixteenth century in that he took no account of Gongarism.

The text is concerned with the priority of the Hieronymites in Spain, i.e., when they were established and how much authority they have or ought to have. The Hieronymite order, following the rule of St. Augustine, controlled royal monasteries such as the Escorial and Santa Maria de Guadalupe in Extremadura in Spain and the Jerónimos monastery at Belém in Portugal.

Beginning on the third unnumbered leaf and continuing to the final preliminary leaf are "Memorias para la vida de D. Luis de Salazar," including a "Cathalogo de las obras impressas, y manuscritas de Don Luis de Salazar, formado del de Frankenau, y de su Bibliotheca manuscrita" of four pages. Don Luis was a leading genealogist, having written extensively on the subject, and his library was rich in genealogical manuscripts. An interesting biographical detail is that Don Luis's bed was normally covered with books. He was known as an expert in both civil and canon law, using his knowledge of the latter on several occasions to attempt to resolve disputes between religious orders.



The title page, printed in red and black, has a fine small allegorical engraving (5 x  $6.6\,\mathrm{cm}$ .) by Debrie, which shows a celestial scene in which a putto has just been crowned by three other putti, one bearing a laurel branch, one a shield, one two trumpets. The recto of third leaf has another fine engraving by Debrie, dated 1754 (10.7 x 19.3 cm.). The portrait of D. José I is within oval frame, with the legend "Joseph I. Rex Portug." inscribed on its pedestal. The king is flanked by Minerva and History (with a pen and a large book). The whole is set within a landscape and an elaborate frame of strapwork and floral elements. On the same page is a fine engraved initial "A", also by Debrie. Guilherme Francisco Lourenço Debrie was one of the most skilled and most prolific engravers in Portugal under D. João V.

Within the main text, each of the 101 pages has a genealogical table topped with a woodcut royal crown. At the foot of each page, putti flank the roots and trunk of a tree, one holding a crown, the other a trumpet. Each name in the genealogical table is set within a double rectangular woodcut border.

The author was born in 1728 in Penella (bishopric of Coimbra), and served as infantry lieutenant in the regiment of the Marques das Minas. He married in 1770.

The first Duque de Cadaval (1638-1727) fought in the war against Spain in 1657 and played an important role in deposing D. Afonso VI in favor of D. Pedro II; thereafter he held high rank at Court. This eulogy emphasizes his pious virtues, each of which is linked to one of his ancestors (e.g. "Piedade com os pobres, a imitação de seu vigesimo avô S. Macolmo 3. Rey de Escocia," p. 41).

Sousa (1658-1734) was a *clerigo regular theatino* and a member of the Academia Real da História. He published nearly 300 works, according to Innocêncio, most of them in Latin.

A wealth of historical information is included, with references to Portuguese activities in Asia, Africa and America.

Little is known of Francisco Soares Toscano, except that he was a native of Évora, devoted to letters, still alive in 1621.

Francisco Xavier de Meneses, 4.º Conde de Ericeira (1673-1743), significant military figure, served with distinction in the War of the Spanish Succession, later attaining the rank of mestre de campo general. He was even more important in a cultural, enlightenment role, having been President of the Academia dos Generosos, protector and host in his palace of the Real Academia de História Portuguesa, taking part as well in the

Fernandes de Vila Real [or Villa Real], a merchant born in Lisbon, served as Consul of Portugal in Paris under D. João IV, and in that capacity helped the king gain acceptance and consolidate his government. When he returned to Portugal in April 1649, however, he was denounced before the Inquisition for having brought books listed on the Index into the

country, and also for having written a work whose content was suspect. In 1652 he was handed over to the secular authorities in an auto-da-fé at the Terreiro do Paço, garroted and burnt. He was a friend of Antonio Enriquez Gomez, is listed in Kayserling, and almost certainly was Jewish.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Alist of heads of household sorted by street and address, with notes on which have paid the 2 *reales* that the police were sent to collect. At the end is a list of expenses. Judging from the expenses, the funds were to be used for erecting street signs in Santiago. The author seems to have been in charge of the money once it was collected, and had apparently been accused of misusing or embezzling the funds. OCLC identifies the author, who signed the work as "J.F.Z.," as Juan Francisco Zegers.
