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## Smythea lanceata at Kranji

Subject: Smythea lanceata (Magnolioophyta: Rhamnaceae).

Subject identified by: Contributor.

Location, date and time: Singapore Island, Kranji Nature Trail, back mangrove; 19 August 2011; 1005 hrs.

Habitat: Back mangrove.

**Observer**: Contributor.

**Observation**: An example of this rare mangrove climber was seen on the landward side of the mangrove forest along Kranji Nature Trail.

**Remarks**: *Smythea lanceata* is a critically endangered climber in Singapore (Chong et al., 2009). This species has become locally rare as most of Singapore's back mangrove habitats have been destroyed for land development.
