Black-headed collared snakes at Mandai and Kranji

Subjects: Black-headed collared snake, *Sibynophis melanocephalus* (Reptilia: Serpentes: Colubridae).

Subjects identified by: Contributor.

Location, date and time: Singapore Island -

- 1) Mandai Lake Road, in the compound of the Night Safari; 5 January 2016; 0915 hrs.
- 2) Kranji, Turut Track; 14 January 2016; 1055 hrs.

Habitat: 1) Parkland adjacent to secondary forest. 2) Road bordered by scrubland.

Observers: 1) Contributor with Roopali Raghavan. 2) Contributor with Shamla Subaraj.

Observations: Two individuals, both around 20 cm total length, were recorded -

- 1) An example was found under leaf litter at the forest edge (Fig. 1).
- 2) One individual was encountered crossing the road between wooded patches (Fig. 2).

Remarks: In Singapore, the black-headed collared snake is known from the Central Catchment Nature Reserve (Baker & Lim, 2012: 108), where an example was recently observed at Upper Peirce (Lee, 2015). In the Kranji area, a 35 cm roadkill was found along Neo Tiew Road on 27 December 1992 (Lim & Subharaj, 1992: 6). The present observation from Turut Track confirms the presence of this species in the Kranji area.
