

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

In the footsteps of Leonardo

A new museum, La Vigna di Leonardo, has been opened to the public, just a short distance from the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie where Leonardo painted The Last Supper.

At one of the landmark locations frequented by Leonardo da Vinci, an unknown piece of history, imbued with mystery, has finally been brought to the attention of the world-at-large. A captivating story that is bound to fire the imagination of all Leonardo aficionados. To mark the advent of Expo 2015, researchers have excavated the plot where Leonardo's vineyard once stood in the gardens of the Casa degli Atellani. The public can finally visit the House and Vineyard thanks to a oneof-a-kind **museum tour** divided into seven designated areas (the courtyards of Piero Portaluppi, the Zodiac Hall, the Luini Hall, Ettore Conti's studio, the Staircase Hall, the Garden of Earthly Delights - the novellas of Matteo Bandello and Leonardo's Vineyard).

THE CASA DEGLI ATELLANI

The Casa degli Atellani is a magnificent Renaissance dwelling situated in front of the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie. Partly renovated by architect Portaluppi, who lived here, this historical palazzo, albeit modified over the centuries, is the only building in corso Magenta that still retains

its Renaissance appearance intact.

Due to this, numerous frescoes are still visible such as, for example, those housed in the Zodiac Hall, also featuring exquisite mosaic flooring adorned with planets and signs of the zodiac which Portaluppi redesigned to match the frescoes on the walls.

The tour, enhanced by audio guide

commentary and descriptive panels located along the way, takes in **7 exhibition spaces**. Lasting for roughly 30 minutes, the tour caters to groups consisting of a maximum of 25 people every 15 minutes.

Audio guides are available in 10 languages (English, German, French, Spanish, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, Chinese, Russian and Italian) plus a version in Milanese dialect.

Milano city of water

What many people might not know is that, since time immemorial, Milan has had a special relationship with water, using its characteristic network of canals as a means of trade, communication and entertainment. A relationship that still exists today and one that is continually evolving!

he Navigli were a widespread network of navigable canals that surrounded the city until the 1930s, making it a real 'city of water'. Today you can still see traces of this enormous network of waterways in the picturesque **Naviglio Grande**, the oldest and most fascinating, abounding in scenic venues and the heart of the summer 'movida', and the **Naviglio Pavese** which can also be visited by taking one of the many boat tours available (www.naviglilombardi.it - www.zaniviaggi.it). A masterpiece of engineering, conceived with the help of Renaissance genius **Leonardo da Vinci**, during medieval times, the Navigli were used to transport people and goods, including the precious Candoglia marble blocks required to build the Duomo. And, in fact, 'Il Nibbio', one of the city's historical boats, formerly used to transport goods, has returned to cruising the waters of Milan and is currently docked at the Darsena, a unique venue designed to host events, concerts and cultural initiatives...absolutely unmissable!

Thanks to a restyling of the old port and the redefinition of its adjacent spaces, including the Ponte del Ticinello and piazza XXIV Maggio, the **Darsena** dock, an historical location and a symbol of Milan, has been restored to its former splendour. The area is only accessible by bike or on foot and its small iron bridges offer some great views over the waters of the Naviglio, dotted with canoes and barges Boasting a Belle Epoque atmosphere, its hundred or so metres of cobbled street hosts an array of venues, galleries and charming views but not only. The street is also lined with small picturesque shops, antique dealers, wine bars and a slew of upmarket bars and restaurants.

Milan is also a city of fountains, the oldest of which, designed by renowned neoclassical architect Piermarini in 1770 and decorated


with mermaids and dolphins, is located in piazza Fontana.

After leaving the Duomo behind you, head in the direction of **Castello Sforzesco** without first forgetting to take a souvenir photo in front of the **large fountain** which, with its plays of water, vies for attention with the imposing Filarete tower and then continue onwards for a leisurely stroll through Parco Sempione. You can cross its small romantic lake by walking over the **Ponte delle Sirenette**, a lowered arch decorated with four statues of mermaids. In days gone by, the bridge was located on the Naviglio della Martesana on via San Dominiano, now known as Visconti di Modrone.

While strolling through the garden of the **Triennale di Milano**, you can also admire I **Bagni Misteriosi**, a highly unusual, recently

restored fountain designed by de Chirico. Also worthy of note just a stone's throw from Parco Sempione is the **Acquario Civico** where, until 6 September you will have a chance to visit the exhibition entitled "**Leonardo e l'acqua**". Featuring ancient drawings and prints, the exhibition reconstructs the inspiring narrative of Leonardo's studies and projects related to water, an element that in terms of its physical and dynamic aspects fascinated the Maestro throughout his lifetime. www.acquariocivicomilano.eu

Lastly, escape the hustle and bustle of the city centre and take a relaxing break at **Parco delle Cave**. Situated just a short distance from the San Siro Stadium, this oasis of greenery is the ideal spot for a long walk or a bicycle ride where you can admire the various bird species that inhabit this beautiful nature park. www.parcodellecave.it

Enjoy the Acquario di Genova

Designed by famed architect Renzo Piano, the Acquario di Genova is located in the harbor area of the city (only 140 km from Milan). Today it boasts a continually updated exhibition area, stretching over almost 20,000 square metres with 70 tanks featuring an array of practically all the aquatic ecosystems of the world.

The Aquarium hosts loads of **events** and **activities** including, for example, the daily "A tu per tu con l'esperto", enabling visitors to participate in dolphin training sessions, and gain insight into the day-to-day lives of these fascinating mammals or, on Fridays, as part of its Expo 2015 program, "Venerdì pesce", a new, fun way of learning about the basic notions of sustainable fishing resources. On weekends, don't miss "Acquario segreto", a guided tour, led by an expert, which combines a traditional visit of the facility with a behind-the-scenes experience, to discover all the secrets of the Aquarium. **www.acquariodigenova.it**



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






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he shores of Lago Maggiore wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy in Italy, while its more austere northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island, lying just off **Stresa** - a small, elegant town, rich in neoclassic and liberty buildings and a shopping mecca boasting a myriad of boutiques - is **Isola Bella**, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic Palazzo Borromeo, built in the 17th century and rich in art treasures, including the private collection of Milan's most famous aristocratic family.

The Borromeo clan also owned Rocca di **Angera**, an imposing fortress (12th-17th century) boasting opulent ambiences, of which the most famous is the Sala di Giustizia. The "Rocca" also has a medieval garden (Visits daily from 9am-5.30 pm. www.borromeoturismo.it). The new "Lago Maggiore Express" now also offers daily excursions by train and boat from Milan (www.trenord.it/it/free-time).

Lake Como, on whose shores Alessandro Manzoni drew inspiration for his masterpiece "I Promessi Sposi" ("The Betrothed") is the romantic and worldly older sister of Maggiore and Garda and takes its name from the city of Como. "Must-visit" sights include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio and the neoclassic Villa **Olmo**. Lying just a stone's throw northwest of Como is **Cernobbio**, a small fashionable resort frequented by the wealthy of Europe because of its deluxe hotel Villa d'Este and Villa Erba where director Luchino Visconti spent his childhood (www.villaerba.it). Continuing north, we find Isola Comacina a jewel of art and nature, rich in Mediterranean vegetation and one of the most important archaeological sites of the dark ages in Northern Italy (www.isola-comacina.it). In nearby Tremezzo, don't miss a visit to the Baroque-style **Villa Carlotta**, featuring an Italian garden and sculptures by Canova. At the junction of the southern arm of the lake lies **Bellagio**, also referred to as the pearl of Como, set in a strategic position to soak up the panorama.

Don't miss a visit to the other lakes that are also easily accessible from Milan. These include Lake Orta, with the old Island of San Giulio, traversed by the "Via del silenzio e della meditazione" ("Road of silence and meditation") and dominated by the Romanesque basilica, the Palazzo Vescovile and the monastery (by car from Milan: take the A26 autostrada and exit at either Borgomanero or Arona). Situated just moments from the lake, we find the UNESCO world heritage site of Sacro Monte di Varallo (16th century) with its magnificent basilica and reconstruction of the life of Christ in 45 chapels. As an alternative, we suggest a trip to Lake Varese and Lake Lugano (see page 91).







or the second time running (the first was in 1906 with 'only' 40 countries) Milan is embarking upon an adventure of international scope, bringing the world-at-large a totally innovative, one-of-a-kind event. Not simply an exhibition but a major event involving numerous players focusing on one singular theme: 'Feeding the Planet, Energy for Life'. Based on their individual cultures and traditions, each country will be asked to examine its own position and offer solutions regarding the major challenges related to the future of food. A real journey in discovery of tastes. Visitors involved in this one-of-a-kind experience related to the complex topic of nutrition will have a chance to take a real trip around the world in discovery of the flavours and traditions of people from across the globe. Expo Milano 2015 will be the first Exposition in history to be remembered not only for its products but, above all, for its contribution to the ongoing education and debate on nutrition, food and the planet's resources. www.expo2015.org

THE EXPOSITION SITE

The design of the Expo site is inspired by the plan of a Roman 'castrum', shaped like a cross, with two large perpendicular streets, known as the **Cardo** and the **Decumano**.

The Exhibition site is located just a few kilometres from the centre of Milan, in an area boasting a well-developed infrastructure, and is easily accessible thanks to direct connections to the city's three airports (Linate, Malpensa and Orio al Serio) and highly efficient public transportation networks: Metropolitana Linea 1; autostrade A4 Torino-Milano-Venezia, A8/A9 Milano-Como-Chiasso and Milano-Varese, and Tangenziale ovest; and a high-speed rail connection in correspondence to the West gate. Simple and intuitive, the project will help visitors find their way around the area hosting events and exhibitions where they can sample the traditional enogastronomic specialities of people from all over the world. Expo's large main square, **Piazza Italia**, a symbolic place where Italy will meet the world, is situated at the intersection between the two streets.

The Mediterranean Hill, Expo Centre, the Lake Arena and the Open Air Theatre, a large space dedicated to open-air events, designed to accommodate approximately 11,000 people on its lawn and tiered seating,

during concerts, performances and official ceremonies, are situated at the four ends of the Cardo and Decumano. Solar panels have been installed in the structure covering the stage so that the energy required to generate power for performances can be recovered, if necessary even from renewable sources.

TO EACH THEME A ROUTE

The central theme 'Feeding the Planet, Energy for Life' encompasses **five thematic routes** that connect the areas and spaces within the Exhibition site: 'The Story of Mankind, stories of food'; 'Feast and famine: a contemporary paradox'; 'The future of food'; 'Sustainable food = an equitable world'; 'Taste is knowledge'.

Additionally, **five Thematic Areas** interpret the leitmotif of Expo with themed exhibition spaces designed to involve old and young alike, serving as both an educational and sensorial experience. Developed by prestigious international curators, they are located at the main entrances and other key points of the Expo site: Pavilion Zero, Future Food District, Children Park, Biodiversity Park and Arts & Foods.

WHO IS FOODY? He is the whimsical mascot of Expo Milano 2015 who embodies the key themes of the event in a positive, original and empathetic manner. Foody represents the community, diversity and food in the broadest sense of the term, a source of life and energy. It comprises a family of eleven different elements, acting as real characters in their own right which, by being expressed as a single face, represent an ideal synergy between countries of the world.







EXPO AMBASSADORS

Who are Expo Ambassadors? They are the spokespeople elected to relay the message of the event. Each Ambassador has interpreted what the global theme of Expo means to either him or her: they have made Expo their own in a bid to embrace, share and transfer their knowledge. Writers, athletes, philosophers, entertainers, actors, creatives, architects, designers, chefs, musicians, singers and directors from all over the world have embraced this role and accepted the challenge of endorsing the event. All united by a desire to personally experience, interpret and spread the message of Expo Milano 2015. Each ambassador, based on their own expertise, represents an aspect of Expo.



INTERNATIONAL PAVILIONS

More than 150,000 square metres of the Exhibition site are devoted to countries who have decided to set up and build their own Pavilions (i.e. self-built pavilions) along the main road known as World Avenue.

A layout designed to offer maximum exposure

featuring futuristic architecture and a skyline of self-built pavilions set against a unique backdrop. Not only an evocative setting but also one that will benefit the environment due to the fact that each participant must guarantee full compliance with the regulations enforced in order to ensure that visitors are offered an unrepeatable, eco-friendly experience. For the first time, countries are not grouped by collective pavilions based on geographic criteria but by **thematic identities** (5 thematic areas) and food groups, i.e. 9 Clusters characterized by communal areas, featuring functional spaces like a market and areas for exhibitions, events and tastings.

THE PADIGLIONE ITALIA

Innovative, unique and in constant interaction with its surroundings, Padiglione Italia faces onto the **spectacular setting of piazza dell'Acqua**. A reference point for entrepreneurs and researchers, designed to highlight the concepts of Italian excellence and Made in Italy, Marco Balich is the 'brainchild' behind Padiglione Italia. **Palazzo Italia** is a space that interacts with the surrounding environment, a symbol of the new pact between our Country and its surrounding landscape; an urban forest where visitors can explore and discover four display levels and a panoramic terrace.

TOP ITALIAN FOOD

Entitled **Identità Expo**, it is a large 'event within an event' featuring distinctive haute cuisine. For six consecutive months, each day, visitors will be treated to lessons, events, conferences, show cookings and a world-class pop-up restaurant. Once a week, starred Italian and international chefs will take turns to offer their creations at an exclusive, stylish location with a view over the Decumano. Always in the Decumano, colossus **Eataly** will set up a space dedicated to 20 regional restaurants. Designed to accommodate more than 1,500 diners, several of our country's best restaurants will interpret Italian gastronomy.

>> AQUAE VENEZIA 2015

The theme of Expo is also dealt with by several Italian regions, with exhibitions and installations including a new multi-purpose pavilion set up in the Marghera area of **Venice**. The building was designed by architect Michele De Lucchi, under the artistic direction of Davide Rampello. The exhibition includes screenings, interactive displays and multi-sensory experiences. www.aquae2015.org

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

After ascending to the upper spaces via two lifts (designed to carry 8 people at a time) and crossing a terrace, it will be possible to access the walkway. EXCLUSIVE SHOPPING EXPERIENCE

In addition to being a stunning feat of architecture, the Galleria can realistically be considered the oldest shopping arcade in the world. Those crossing under its magnificent glass dome are treated to a one-of-a-kind shopping experience. The arcade is lined with several of the world's most famed and fabled designer stores, workshops steeped in history, landmark restaurants and cafés plus several intriguing, well-stocked bookstores. Depending on the time of the day, you will either encounter hordes of tourists, hurried office workers, foreigners from all parts of the globe or the Milanese either on their way to the theatre or to one of the area's numerous museums or nearby attractions (the Duomo, Teatro alla Scala, Gallerie d'Italia, Palazzo Reale, Grande Museo del Duomo and the Museo del '900). Two key reference points designed to help tourists discover all that the city has to offer are InfoMilano and the Urban Center.



Ambrosiana, Picture Gallery and Library

Duomo

The cathedral is open daily 7am-7pm. The recently renovated Grande Museo del Duomo (see listing at the MUSEUMS section) houses hundreds of works of art dating from the 15th century to the present day. Maybe you've just seen **Leonardo's Last Supper** and are in need of a relaxing walk to ward off the possible onset of Stendhal's syndrome. Maybe you've got just one hour before seeing a musical at **Teatro Nazionale** or maybe your hotel happens to be located in the neighbourhood. Or, maybe you simply wish to take a stroll through one of Milan's less touristy areas. In all of these cases, the **Vercelli-Belfiore district**, midway between the Conciliazione and Wagner metro stops, is a perfect itinerary: one of Milan's best-kept secrets – though not by chance home to **several of the world's best brands**

- this area, though mainly residential and frequented during the day, is capable of surprising those visiting it, thanks, for example to an extremely wide, cosmopolitan offer of restaurants. One of the most characteristic and strategic tram routes in the city (from here trams run to Fieramilano City and its congress centre, the Expo district, but also the historic centre, where you can catch a glimpse of the spires of the Duomo as the tram trundles along), this district is definitely worth a visit, shopping bag in hand. It's up to you to choose between one of the two, either

Calzature Belfiore, handcrafted shoes since 1950, or

Calzature Cardinale, a small family-run business since 1977. On the contrary, at number 6, you'll find Mortarotti, a cult destination of Milanese style carrying the creations of the best Italian fashion brands.



BACK IN CORSO VERCELLI AND VIA RASORI

By retracing your footsteps, you'll find yourself back in corso Vercelli, where you can browse the other side. Starting from the other end, you'll find **Coin**, the upmarket department store stocking a good collection of most of what you have seen until now. Further on, at number 14, you'll find yet another classic of Made-in-Italy, i.e. **Geox**, which doubles up just a little further on down the road at number 8, with its upmarket cousins Fay, Hogan and Tod's. Always at number 8, there's also Nadine, an Italian chain of women's fashion clothing. If children are your target, make a small deviation into the parallel of via Rasori, where, at number 4, you'll find a delectable boutique, simply spilling over with surprises, SophiePetit. And while you're here, bear in mind that there's another gem, whose "toys", in this case, are more likely to appeal to the ladies: Martino

& Mazzolini, at number 8, is an intriguing goldsmith's workshop that creates bronze jewellery using an ancient technique that has almost disappeared. Finally, walking towards Sant'Ambrogio, don't miss a visit to the famed Belgian chocolate atelier

Neuhaus.



Green Milanese summer


Parks, gardens and nature in Milan: it's time to take deep, full breaths of the green spaces of the city!

Public, private and hidden greenery We are not here referring to the new Pantone oclour card but to Milan . Step outside and enjoy all the open-air venues that Milan has to offer. Though not particularly widespread, its green spaces are ever-present and can be found in all of the city's districts whether upmarket, bourgeois or community-oriented. The appellation of urban park does not really apply to Milan since the real ones are located on the outskirts. surrounding the city, almost in keeping with Ebnezer Howard's dream. Several of them, like Parco Sempione (1) are adorned with works of art, while others, like the **Botanical Garden of** Brera (2) and the Gardens of Porta Venezia (3), still show visible traces of a glorious past. The latter boasts the remains of a zoo and the spring waters that fed its small lake. Small spaces that have literally been taken over by the people living in the area. However, a number of brand new parks, based on the masterful designs of archistars, have also come into being and include Porta Nuova Garibaldi, City Life and Charles Jencks' Portello Park. And, then again, shops, galleries and hotels boasting dream-like gardens or historical residences open to the

public with or without a ticket. A day spent browsing gardens and parks should definitely include an aperitivo at the **Bulgari Hotel**(4) situated just a short distance from either the Orto di Brera or the **Sheraton Diana** (5), located just a stone's throw from Villa Necchi Campiglio, a private residence and a real gem of 1930s architecture open for public viewing. Not too far from this stunning residence is the **Via Lincoln** (6) district, a true marvel that deserves a small detour. The joy of strolling through this fabled village is made even more special thanks

to its proximity to Pasticceria Giacomo (7), one of the most delectable pastry shops in the city. In all seasons, for those who are able to locate it, the magic of Vivaio Riva reveals all the charm of a non-place in a non-time when the centre of Milan was given over to monasteries and cultivated fields. Even former industrial spaces have left signs that have been delightfully re-interpreted. One such example is Rossana Orlandi (8), a former tie factory and now an international cult destination for the latest design trends





I enjoy looking at wine through different eyes. They are the eyes of people who come to Italy from all over the world to taste our special 'flavor'.

My work is a constant discovery. During a tasting, while

deciding with which wine to start, an American client of mine gave her simple solution "Let's start from the best one", explaining that usually, at her home, she offers the best wine first so people get drunk and then they do not understand that the other ones are not as good.

I thought I had to deal with questions like "What wine can I match with my favorite food?" "Where can I store my wines at home?"... Instead I was asked: "In which phase of the production is the strawberry fragrance added into the wine?

The stranger the questions, the more I understood that

every time and that their curiosity toward the nectar of Bacchus is sincere and total. In my conversations with new clients, I often get the impression that for them wine is a wonderful alchemy, which always maintains an aura of mystery as if it were a magical potion. And this is because there is nobody who really takes time to explain to them what wine is. They say that I invented a new profession: I am a Personal Wine Shopper. What do I do? I support people in the purchases of wine, I organize wine trips and tailor-made food and wine experiences. I create events in which people can learn and share their emotions about wine. I assist

them in finding the right selections for dinners and weddings.

Have I invented this? I would say that it came naturally to my mind ... This profession was born from my passion for wine and the joy of sharing it with others, from my sunny personality and from the observation that there are only two things that I can't resist buying:

Because I want to share with people a more lively and healthy lifestyle using Italian wine and food as emotional companions of our life so that everybody can enjoy spending time together enriching their cultural knowledge and pleasing their palates.

Tasting wine is getting to know its story

Wine is the perfect companion to many nice moments of our life. It can be a toast for a wedding, it can be a refreshing white for a summer picnic, it can be a nice glass of red while relaxing on the sofa. Choosing the right wines will make us live our experiences to the fullest. The basics of tasting can help in our choice.

I always say that wine is lived, not learned. With this I mean that wine has to be enjoyed and not looked upon as a mysterious potion to be studied. It is just wine! Tasting is a subjective moment. It is influenced by our own experience. People have a different sense of smell, more or less refined, but usually, at the first sniff, we all perceive the strongest scents and the ones that we can associate with something. Olfactory memory is very powerful but every person has his/her own. So it can be possible that you won't recognize the scent that your partner is smelling in the same wine! So why learn how to taste? What is the purpose?

Tasting a wine has also an objective part and this can really be useful. Analyzing the wine with the senses can tell you if the wine is correct (meaning without faults) and what its characteristics are. Understanding what we are drinking can help us make decisions about the most suitable pairings with food and, why not, also to evaluate whether the price is fair or if there are discrepancies between the quality and what we are paying for.

But, most important, tasting a wine will tell us its story: where it comes from, which grapes have been used, how the weather in that vintage was, how the winemaker decided to produce it.

The standard tasting has 5 steps which involve the sense of sight, smell, taste, and somehow even touch. To make them easier to remember, they are often called "the 5 S's".

Hold the glass up in front of your eyes, and tilt it slightly. The color of the wine can tell you something about its age, where it comes from, and its concentration. Wines from northern, cooler climates tend to be lighter in color (color not as intense) as wines from warmer, southern climates.

Swirl

Swirling the wine in your glass aerates it, bringing oxygen into the wine and allowing it to release its aroma. Reminder: it's best not to completely fill the glass, so you'll have room to swirl the wine around.

Smelling is one of the key moments of wine tasting. Flaws usually can be identified immediately: the wine will smell dull and stale. Take a sniff and try to name the scents: they can be flowers, fruits, spices and vegetables. They can even be associated with animals, leather, tobacco or stones. The list of possible fragrances is really long! The combination of the aromas is called bouquet or nose of the wine.

Sip in order to bring out the full flavor of the wine to the palate. Be sure to move the wine around in your mouth to cover all of your taste buds. You'll be able to taste the fruit and varietal characteristics, the acidity, the tannins, and the aftertaste. A long, pleasing aftertaste, or finish, is a sign of a quality wine.

Swallow (or spit)

Professional tasters usually spit, especially if they have many wine glasses in front of them. But swallowing is the perfect conclusion to savoring the taste of the wine and having the whole experience.

START TASTING WITH...

When tasting white wines, start from dry to sweet. On the other hand, if you're into reds, make sure to progress from light to full-bodied. Some of the best Italian white wines come from Friuli Venezia Giulia, a region in the north-east of Italy. Attems is a winery in the heart of Friuli, the quality and personality of whose wines serve as a true expression of this area. Its astute selection of whites and reds make for a good start when practising with tastings.

For example, allow yourself to be seduced by the beauty of the colour of Pinot Grigio Ramato. Its name derives from the ancient documents of the Republic of Venice, in which the term 'ramato' referred to Pinot Grigio in contracts. Its magnificent colour stems from a special wine-making process in which the juice spends extended time (in this case, 12 hours) on the skins, to give the wine its distinctive coppery hue. Boasting an intense, fruity bouquet, Ramato is a rich, crisp wine.

Wine to drink

A wine doesn't have to be expensive to be good. Italy offers a really wide "shelf" from which you can choose delicious labels within a fair price range. What do you need to have a basic but complete private cellar?

- > First of all, some bubbles! Sparkling wines are versatile and everybody loves them. You can keep them in your storage area and chill them in the fridge or in a bucket of ice before serving them. Some Italian labels to try: Franciacorta, Oltrepo Pavese, Trento DOC, Prosecco.
- > Then, a few white wines. I suggest buying and drinking them as soon as possible, don't keep a large quantity, most of the time they are meant to be drunk young. Choose from among Gavi, Vermentino, Soave and many others besides.
- > Light reds are good for many meals. Barbera, Dolcetto, Valpolicella, Montepulciano are some names you could look for. Store them horizontally in a cool place.
- > You should buy also some reds with a good ageing potential. However, keep in mind that they require special attention otherwise you might run the risk of waiting many years before actually tasting a wonderful wine only to discover that, in the meantime, it has lost its flavour. Although these important reds often cost more than € 20, they are worth the outlay! Ask for Chianti Riserva, Brunello di Montalcino, Barolo and Amarone. One trick to check how well they age is to buy several bottles of the same kind and taste
- > Insofar as **sweet wines** are concerned, I suggest keeping just few bottles and drinking them when you need to treat yourself.

Which is the right investment to give more value to your money? Gold? Diamonds? Art? I find it really interesting to invest in wines: in the worst case scenario, you can enjoy it with your loved ones! Your goal is to "buy low, sell high". So, looking for luxury bottles, keep in mind which factors can affect the price.


- > Limited Quantity Most of the best wines are produced by a single vineyard, from the few, most prized hectares of the estate. Only a few thousand bottles are produced for distribution all over the world. Therefore, you cannot but be really proud of being one of the owners of these rarities.
- **> Vintages** Vintages with favorable harvest conditions (or whose wines have developed well over time) almost always attract higher prices.
- > Ageing potential Old doesn't automatically mean expensive, but the ageing capacity is taken into consideration when assessing the overall value of the wine.

TOP QUALITY. Luxury has many subjective definitions, not always linked to price. Italy produces many exceptional wines, well known all over the world. Here are my suggestions for some Iconic wines, the ones I had the luck to taste!



TENUTE LUCE DELLA VITE

Luce > The radiant sun on the label represents the Divine Light, the most powerful strength that gives life. Luce is an outsider from the famous area of Montalcino. a blend that mixes the Tuscan Sangiovese with the international Merlot. A wine and a story to discover.



GIACOMO CONTERNO

Monfortino Riserva >

Nebbiolo, the grape of this Barolo, is a mysterious and charming storyteller of the hills in Piedmont. Conterno chooses to craft his "normale" Monfortino with only best years and his Monfortino Riserva even more rarely A wine expression of the territory



TUA RITA

Redigaffi > This 100% Merlot is a friend that I met on the Tuscan Coast and that has never left my heart; a great wine from a small family winery that remains humble and passionate about their land. A wine that speaks to the soul.



FRATELLI LUNELLI

Giulio Ferrari Riserva > Luxury sparkling wines usually originate from Champagne. I think this is a good example of what Italians can achieve Available in a limited edition, it has a perfect perlage, a wonderful nose and an excellent quality/price ratio: for me, this is luxury.



LaVerdi's long hot summer

This summer will see an action-packed events calendar at the Auditorium di Milano in largo Mahler featuring not only the 'Around the World' series of concerts but also a non-stop program of symphony music.

n July three dates have been scheduled as part of the **Around the World** series, a program created especially for Expo 2015: the Symphonic Orchestra of Milano Giuseppe Verdi, conducted by Francesco Maria Colombo (see photo), will take Italian and foreign audiences on a long musical trip around the world. The program will include 14 concerts (at 8.30pm) dedicated to 14 countries supporting the initiative. On Monday 6, the USA will treat audiences to pieces by Ives, Barber, Grofè and Porter; the program will continue on **Monday** 13 with a tribute to France (Debussy, Magnard, Saint-Saëns, Ibert and Offenbach); on **Monday** 20, it will be the turn of **Belgium** with music by Frank, Vieuxtemps, E. Flavours from the Orient

Since 1978, thanks to Mister The Lian Tjo, known for masterfully balancing music and flavours, colours and aromas, the Hong Kong restaurant has been offering diners an authentic taste of Chinese cuisine, in a truly evocative atmosphere. By **Stefania Vida**

he restaurant is distinguished by the authenticity and sophistication of its cuisine, a skilful meld of the delicate flavours of Cantonese culinary art and the more decisive flavours of Western China, but also a number of delicacies from the Beijing area and the whole of Northern China, prepared in keeping with time-honoured recipes.

Throughout history, Chinese notables have considered food and, above all, the way it is cooked, served and then eaten, an important cultural element, therefore according it all the necessary passion and skill.

Firmly anchored to the traditions of its country, each and every dish prepared at the Hong Kong restaurant is executed with painstaking **attention to detail**, concentration and professionalism.

Confucius said that "There is no body but eats and drinks. But they are few who can distinguish flavours." For this reason, Hong Kong prides itself on preparing each dish just before it is eaten, asking its clientele to abandon the frenetic pace of modern society in order to respect and savour the meal by dedicating it the time that it justly deserves. Its menu is widespread and varied. You can start your meal with a simple spring roll, before choosing between main meal options that include delicious shi jin chao mian (noodles delicately flavoured with eight aromas) and zhì jì (chicken with lychees), finally ending on a high note with the restaurant's delectable sweet tou sa quo pin (a crêpe spread with soy jam), discovering in each dish the same quality, sophistication and authenticity for which traditional Chinese recipes are renowned.

A tribute to taste

The guru of the sought-after cuisine served by the Hong Kong restaurant is chef Zhang Xiao Ming (see photo). He began his meteoric rise to fame in 1995 when, as a very young man, he won a competition organized by Patron Tjo who was looking for a starred talent to helm his restaurant. Since then, they have continued to work together, regularly enriching and enhancing the menu with new flavours and specialities.

Three transport links provide easy access to the Expo site:

>Trains (Rho Fiera Milano station - roughly 20 minutes from Stazione Centrale and from Stazione Garibaldi). Visitors arriving by High-Speed trains can access the Exposition site via a new station at Porta Ovest, also served by suburban lines and two regional lines, connected in turn to the subway system.

> Taxis and Shuttle Buses (entrance from Roserio Est access point with direct access on foot to the Expo Site):

> Metro M1 red line (roughly 25 minutes from piazza Duomo, 2.5€ extra-urban ticket). The **Rho Fiera Expo Milano 2015** subway station is directly connected to the site via the Fiorenza Ovest access point.


