<p>Yarrow - <i>Achillea millefolia</i></p> <p>Form: This plant grows between 30 and 90 cm tall. White flowers bloom from June to September.</p> <p>Requirements: Moist to dry soils in full sun to partial shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50 each, \$2.25 each over 100, \$2.00 each over 1000</p>		
<p>Sweetflag - <i>Acorus americana</i></p> <p>Form: 30 cm to 1 metre tall. Fan-like foliage. However, contrary to the name, strands of the grass do not make suitable flags.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun to partial shade. Moist to wet soil.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial and very fragrant.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50 each, \$2.25 each over 100, \$2.00 each over 1000.</p>		
<p>Wild Garlic - <i>Allium canadense</i></p> <p>Form: 15 - 45 cm tall. Whitish-pink umbel of flowers. Blooms May to July.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun to partial shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Edible bulb that tastes like an onion.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50 each, \$2.25 each over 100, \$2.00 each over 1000.</p>		
<p>Wild Chives - <i>Allium schoenoprasum var. sibiricum</i></p> <p>Form: Up to 75cm tall, produces a rose or pink colored flower.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun; well drained soil.</p> <p>Notes: Clump forming perennial which is usually found on alvars. Edible.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50 each, \$2.25 each over 100, \$2 each over 1000.</p>		
<p>Wild Leek - <i>Allium tricoccum</i></p> <p>Form: Umbel of white flowers that appear in June or July after the 2 or 3 basal leaves have withered. 15 - 45 cm in height.</p> <p>Requirements: Rich soil in deciduous shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. The bulb of the leek can be used in the same manner as one would use a cultivated leek. This species is slow growing.</p> <p>Price: \$5.00 each mature plant.</p>		














<p>Pearly everlasting – <i>Anaphalis margaritacea</i></p> <p>Form: White flowers that bloom from July - Sept. These woolly whitish plants reach heights of 30 - 90 cm.</p> <p>Requirements: Dry, sun to partly shaded conditions.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Dried flowers retain shape and are used in dried floral arrangements. Larval host to painted lady butterflies.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50 each, \$2.25 each over 100, \$2 each over 1000.</p>		
<p>Sharp-lobed hepatica – <i>Anemone acutiloba</i></p> <p>Form: Flowering stems up to 15 cm tall. Solitary flower white, purple, pink or blue. Blooms from April to May.</p> <p>Requirements: Part sun; well drained, rich soil.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Also known as Sharp-lobed liverleaf.</p> <p>Price: \$5.00/ mature plant</p>		
<p>Canada anemone – <i>Anemone canadensis</i></p> <p>Form: Canada anemone grows to heights of 20 - 70 cm. The white flower of this species blooms from June to July.</p> <p>Requirements: This species grows in dry to moist soil in full sun to partial shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Thimbleweed – <i>Anemone cylindrica</i></p> <p>Form: Thimbleweed has white flowers that bloom in June and July, this plant grows to heights of 30 - 80 cm.</p> <p>Requirements: Thimbleweed requires dry to average soil moisture in full sun to partial shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Plantain-leaved pussytoes – <i>Antennaria plantaginifolia</i></p> <p>Form: This pussytoe is 10 - 40 cm tall. The plant has white flowers and blooms between April and June.</p> <p>Requirements: Average to dry soil in full sun to partial shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. The flowers are said to resemble cat paws, the origin of the common name.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50 each, \$2.25 each over 100, \$2 each over 1000.</p>		






<p>Groundnut – <i>Apios americana</i></p> <p>Form: Vine with a twining stem. Produces fragrant clusters of purplish flowers. Blooms from July to September.</p> <p>Requirements: Part sun, moist rich soil.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Often found in savannas and moist rich forests.</p> <p>Price: \$5 mature plant.</p>		
<p>Spreading dogbane - <i>Apocynum androsaemifolium</i></p> <p>Form: A bushy plant with small, fragrant, pink bell-shaped flowers that bloom between June and July. 30 - 120 cm tall.</p> <p>Requirements: Prefers part shade but is adaptable.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>	 	
<p>Indian hemp - <i>Apocynum cannabinum</i></p> <p>Form: Up to 1.5m tall, this plant produces small elliptical leaves and clusters of inconspicuous greenish pink flowers.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Stem fibers used to create bags and baskets and milky juice in plant has a variety of medicinal purposes.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Wild columbine - <i>Aquilegia canadensis</i></p> <p>Form: Wild columbine grows to heights of 30 - 60 cm, and has red (with yellow) flowers that bloom from May to July.</p> <p>Requirements: Variable; full sun to shade, dry to moist soil.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Attracts hummingbirds.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Jack-in-the-pulpit - <i>Arisaema triphyllum</i></p> <p>Form: Jacks grow to heights of 10 - 60 cm, each plant produces many small flowers (in the spring) located within the well-known pulpit.</p> <p>Requirements: Moist shade</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. This species has both male and female plants. The berries provide food for wild turkey and wood thrushes.</p> <p>Price: \$5.00 mature plant and \$2.25/ 7-10 cm pot (2nd year)</p>	 	












<p>Wild ginger - <i>Asarum canadense</i></p> <p>Form: Ginger grows to low heights of up to 10 cm, the inconspicuous maroon flowers bloom in spring. Ginger spreads well by rhizomes.</p> <p>Requirements: This species requires shady, mesic (medium soil moisture) conditions.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$5.00/ mature plant</p>		
<p>Swamp milkweed - <i>Asclepias incarnata</i></p> <p>Form: 60-120 cm tall. The pink-purple flowers bloom from July to September.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun to partial shade. Average to moist conditions.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. The bright flowers attract many butterflies. This is a member of the family Asclepiadaceae which are larval hosts to Monarch and Queen butterflies.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Butterfly milkweed - <i>Asclepias tuberosa</i></p> <p>Form: A generally low growing plant, butterfly milkweed is between 30 - 75 cm tall. The bright orange flower clusters bloom from June to September.</p> <p>Requirements: Requires sites with dry soil and full sun.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. The bright flowers attract many butterflies. Larval host to Monarch and Queen butterflies.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>	 	
<p>Canada milkvetch - <i>Astragalus canadensis</i></p> <p>Form: Up to 125 cm tall. Produces small cream coloured flowers in clusters during the summer.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun; dry soil conditions.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Marsh marigold - <i>Caltha palustris</i></p> <p>Form: Up to 60 cm tall, this wetland plant is one of the first to bloom in the Spring. Produces large bright yellow flowers from April to June.</p> <p>Requirements: Full to part shade and... water. Muchos, muchos water.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Found in wet swamps, edges of streams, and marshes.</p> <p>Price: \$5 mature plant.</p>		



<p>Harebell Campanula - <i>rotundifolia</i></p> <p>Form: The purple, bell-shaped flowers bloom from June through Sept. This plant grows to heights of 15 - 50 cm.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun in moist to dry soils and low competition.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Nice garden plant because it blooms for most of the summer.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Two-leaved toothwort - <i>Cardamine diphylla</i></p> <p>Form: Up to 50 cm tall. Cluster of white or pale purple flowers at top. Blooms May to June.</p> <p>Requirements: Moist rich soils in deciduous shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Also known as Broad-leaved toothwort.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Indian paintbrush - <i>Castilleja coccinea</i></p> <p>Form: Clusters of spectacular, showy orange to red bracts appearing from May to July. Grows to heights of 30 - 60 cm.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun to partial shade in average to moist soils.</p> <p>Notes: Annual or biennial that is parasitic on the roots of other plants.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Turtlehead - <i>Chelone glabra</i></p> <p>Form: White, tubular flowers bloom in Aug. - Sept. Can be between 30 and 90 cm tall.</p> <p>Requirements: Moist, sunny or partly shaded conditions</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Does well in garden situations.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Field thistle - <i>Cirsium discolor</i></p> <p>Form: Up to over 2m tall, this plant has spiny teeth from top to bottom, and produces a purple flower at its apex.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun; can handle a wide range of soil conditions.</p> <p>Notes: Monocarpic. Blooms from July to September.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		











<p>Virgin's bower - <i>Clematis virginiana</i></p> <p>Form: A slender, climbing, woody vine (2 - 6 metres long) with clusters of white flowers that bloom from July to Sept.</p> <p>Requirements: Prefers moist soil in sun or part shade.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. The seeds conspicuously remain on the plant through the winter.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Blue bead lily (yellow clintonia) - <i>Clintonia borealis</i></p> <p>Form: With 2 - 4 large green leaves at ground level, this lily has a flowering stem up to 40 cm. Produces 3 - 8 greenish-yellow nodding flowers for May and June.</p> <p>Requirements: Full shade, lots of water.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Fruit blue berries in clusters of 3 - 8.</p> <p>Price: \$5 mature plant.</p>		
<p>Bunchberry - <i>Cornus canadensis</i></p> <p>Form: A small shrub that reaches heights of 10-20 cm. Four conspicuous white bracts surround the centre cluster of small greenish flowers.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun to partial shade in acidic moist soil.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial.</p> <p>Price: \$5.00 mature plant</p>		
<p>Pale corydalis - <i>Corydalis sempervirens</i></p> <p>Form: 12 - 60 cm tall. Pink and yellow flowers. Blooms between May and September.</p> <p>Requirements: Full sun to part shade. Average to dry soil.</p> <p>Notes: Biennial</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>		
<p>Showy tick-trefoil - <i>Desmodium canadense</i></p> <p>Form: 60 - 180 cm tall. Bushy plant with pink flowers that bloom in July and August.</p> <p>Requirements: Sun to partial shade in moist to dry soils.</p> <p>Notes: Perennial. Improves soil nitrogen.</p> <p>Price: \$2.50/each, \$2.25/each orders over 100, \$2/each orders over 1000.</p>




