Pomaderris cotoneaster N.A.Wakef. - Cotoneaster **Pomaderris**

P. cotoneaster is a small tree 1-3m tall found in dry sclerophyll forest. It is listed as endangered under both the Commonwealth's Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 and the NSW Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995.

Distribution and Abundance: It is often growing on skeletal soils in rocky sites in the ranges south from the Moss Vale district and also in far-eastern Vic. Uncommon and poorly known.

Local Distribution: Badgery's Lookout, Tallong

Similar Species: P. costata from which it differs in having smaller leaves.

Stems with a whitish stellate tomentum (also shows upper leaf surface bristles)



Leaves elliptic, mostly 1.5-3cm long, 10-15mm wide, apex obtuse to emargtinate



Leaf lower surface a fine white mat of Buds with whitish simple hairs loose stellate hairs; secondary veins strongly raised





Leaf upper surface ± bristly, hairs scattered to very sparse, at least some hairs stellate; secondary veins impressed



Flowers in short, leafy panicles



Capsule hypanthium, sepals and ovary with long simple whitish hairs
