Moscow Synagogue Is Burned

Russian anti-Semites started fires on Rosh Hahannah at a Moscow synagogue and at the cottage of a caretaker of a Jewish cemetery located in a Moscow suburb. An American traveler reported the burnings and said that firemen saved the small, wooden 300-seat synagogue from total destruction. However a woman of 70 was burned when she tried to take some possessions out of the burning cottage. . . Five of 11 defendants accused of harassing Kur Sumpf, a Jewish cafe owner in Koeppern, Germany, and his family were convicted of breaking the peace, assorted misdemeanors and public anti-Semitic libel. Fines of 30 to 400 marks were levied. . . . Rabbi David Treital of Milan, Italy, escaped a possible fine or jail term for refusing to take an oath in court because his evidence was ruled not vital to the case. Rabbi Treitel said his faith forbid him to take the Italian court oath. . . .

Six neo-Nazi students were injured in Vienna when an innocent academic parade turned into a Hitler-like demonstration. . . . Sixteen Jewish members were relected to the South African provincial parliament. . . .

Israel May Fight Renault Boycott

The Israeli government has hinted it may openly fight the Renault automobile company's decision to close down Israel operations following Arab pressure on the French firm. . . . Israel President Ben-Zvi was given a 21-gun salute when he arrived for a visit in Burma. . . . David Ben-Gurion quietly celebrated his 73rd birthday at the Negev village of Sde Boker. . And 80-year-old scholar, Dr. Yehoshua Yeivin, won the Israeli bible competition this week. . .

High School "Troopers" Uncovered

The existence of a "Nazi Storm Troop" of about 20 high school boys was disclosed in Alexandria, Va., with the arrest by police of three teen-aged anti- Semites. The group was suspected of recent activities involving defacement of property with anti-Jewish slogans, arson and theft of rifles and ammunition. The father of one of the boys involved revealed the existence of the "Storm Troopers". . . The synagogue where Al Jolson first sang in Washington was demolished last week in an urban redevelopment movement. . . . Joan Crawford has been honored by the United Jewish Appeal for her devotion to the work of UJA....
