OVERVIEW OF REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR HAZARDOUS WASTE GENERATORS IN ARKANSAS

Identification of Hazardous Waste	All generators of waste(s) are responsible for identifying whether those waste(s) are hazardous as defined by APC&EC Regulation 23 (Hazardous Waste Regulations). In general, wastes are considered hazardous if they 1) are listed as a hazardous waste, or 2) meet the Ignitability, Corrosivity, Reactivity, or Toxicity characteristics outlined in the Regulation(s). <i>Reg. 23; Notification Requirements 261, §262.10-11</i>			
Waste Generation and Accumulation Limits	Generates more than 1000 kilograms 2200 lbs) of hazardous waste in 1 calendar month, and/or generates more than 1 kg. (2.2 lbs of acutely-hazardous waste in 1 calendar month; and	Generates between 100 kilograms (220 lbs) and 1000 kilograms (2200 lbs) of hazardous waste in 1 calendar month and generates no more than 1 kg (2.2 lbs) of acutely-hazardous waste in 1 calendar month; and	Generates no more than 100 kilograms (220 lbs) of hazardous waste in 1 calendar month and/or generates no more than 1 kg (2.2 lbs) of acutely-hazardous waste In 1 calendar month; and	
	May accumulate hazardous waste generated on-site up to 90 days. <i>Reg.</i> 23, §262.34	may accumulate no more than 6000 kg (13200 lbs) of hazardous waste and/or up to 1 kg of acutely-hazardous waste on-site, with no waste stored on-site more than 180 days. <i>Reg. 23, §262.34</i>	may accumulate up to 1000 kg (2200 lbs) of hazardous waste or up to 1 kg (2.2 lbs) of acutely-hazardous waste on-site. <i>Reg 23., §261.5</i>	
Notification Requirements	Facility must notify ADEQ of hazardous waste generation and must obtain and use an EPA Identification Number, <i>Reg. 23, §262.12</i>		Notification of waste generation is not required. EPA Identification Number is not required. <i>Reg. 23, §261.5</i>	
Inspections by ADEQ	All hazardous waste generators are subject to inspection by ADEQ at any given time. A.C.A. §8-7.201 et seq.			

NOTE: This table is provided as a general guide for hazardous waste generators to determine their Generation Status and their basic regulatory obligations. This document is not intended to, nor does it provide a comprehensive review of regulatory requirements for ANY hazardous waste generator. Complete regulatory requirements can be found in Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission Regulation 23 (APC&EC Reg. 23), Hazardous Waste Management; copies of which are available from this Department.

Containment of Hazardous Waste	Hazardous waste(s) must be managed in containers, tanks, or containment buildings meeting appropriate standards. Containers must be properly labeled, in good condition, and inspected weekly. Tanks require Engineer certification, secondary containment, and regular inspection. Level of waste and other operating conditions must be inspected each operating day. <i>Reg. 23 §262.34, §262 (see below – Preparedness and Accident Prevention)</i>		Waste(s) must be stored in a safe manner so as to prevent any release(s) to the environment. <i>Reg. 23; §265.170-177</i>
Preparedness and Accident Prevention	Contaminated systems must meet appropriate air emission standards. Ignitable or reactive waste(s) must meet additional requirements. Preparedness and prevention plans, training, contingency and emergency procedures, appropriate testing, and monitoring systems must be in place. <i>Reg.</i> 23; §262.34, §265.16, §265.30-37, §265.50- 56, §265.111-114, §265.70-178, §265.190-200-202, §265.440-445, §265.1030-1091, §268.7(a)(4)	Emergency coordinator is identified. Transportation/Disposal of Hazardous Waste	Hazardous Waste must be properly contained and labeled and must be transported by a permitted hazardous waste transporter. Arkansas Hazardous Waste manifest is required by ADEQ. <i>Reg. 23; §262.10(d), §262.12, §262.13, §262.20, §262.40, §262.42</i> Waste(s) must be shipped to a permitted (or granted interim status) Treatment Storage and Disposal Facility (TSD). <i>Reg. 23, §262.13-33</i>		Hazardous Waste must be transported by a permitted hazardous waste transporter. Arkansas Hazardous Waste Manifest is required by ADEQ. <i>Reg. 23; §262.12, §262.13(d), §262.35, §263.10(d)</i> Waste(s) must be shipped to a permitted (or Interim status) TSD Facility or a facility which beneficially reuses, recycles, or
Reporting Requirements		waste disposal is required by ADEQ – Reporting ar. Fees	A Remedial Action Trust Fund (RATF) Fee ("Superfund" fee) based on total waste generated, is due annually on July 1 for facilities generating more than 30,000 lbs of waste in a calendar year. A Monitoring and Inspection Fee based on total waste generation is due annually on January 1 for facilities generating more than 2640 lbs of waste in a calendar year. All fees are invoiced by ADEQ 45 days before due. <i>Reg. 23; §6(n-r), §25(a)</i>		No fees are invoiced.

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
