







Eucalyptus acmenoides - family: MYRTACEAE

WHITE MAHOGANY / YELLOW STRINGYBARK

Tall tree to 35 metres White flowers spring to summer

Cultivation: It is suited to well-drained loam or clay soils in most coastal regions where there is little frost.

An excellent timber tree, *E.acmenoides* yields strong, tough, termite resistant wood which is suitable for poles, fencing, round timber, firewood and sawn timber. It has a heavy crown that makes it suitable for shade, ornamental and windbreak planting. It is a major pollen source for European bees. A medium-sized to tall forest tree occurring from north of Sydney through coastal New South Wales to Proserpine

Queensland. It bears a grey to redbrown fibrous bark held in flattish strips, slightly discoloured adult leaves with dense reticulation.

Attracts an array of wildlife including native birds, mammals, bats, butterflies and bees.
