

Toechima tenax – family: SAPINDACEAE

PITTED-LEAF STEELWOOD - BRUSH TEAK

Small rainforest tree 5 –15 metres approximately Cream white flowers in panicles April to June Fruit is an orange/yellow capsule ripening Sept. – Nov

Cultivation: Hardy in most locations but will benefit from extra nutrients and water; full sun or partial shade.

This handsome, densely foliaged small tree is found in complex microphyll forests with Araucaria emergens and subtropical and dry rainforests from



northern NSW to Gympie in Queensland. In a rainforest situation it may well reach 15 meters but in cultivation it is a more manageable size averaging from 5 to 8 meters. Small

creamy white flowers appear in autumn and the orange/yellow pear shaped fruit which follows matures from September to November.

With its attractive dense foliage it makes a good specimen for hedges and screens; and the colourful fruit will attract birds to the garden.
