



Acacia bakeri – family: **FABACEAE**

MARBLEWOOD

Medium rainforest tree to 10m
Fluffy pale yellow flower heads in spring

Cultivation: Prefers rich soil and adequate moisture.

Seeds germinate quickly. Can begin to germinate in the pods before they fall from the trees. Unlike most wattles, this species can be struck from cuttings.



In demand due to its bushy foliage and decorative red-tipped new growth. Sometimes called the “Rainforest Acacia”, ‘Marblewood’ or ‘Hickory’. Natural occurrences range from north-east NSW to Maryborough in south-east Qld.



It is almost always found in lowland subtropical rainforest.
