Hints on where to bench your Orchids

All orchids are benched by their genera which mean which family of orchids they belong to. Some orchids e.g. Laeliinae (cattleyas) which have 4 classes, are also benched by size which is measured across their widest part whether it is the petals or sepals.

Open Classes



Laeliinae: All Cattleyas are usually measured across the petals as this is the widest part of the flower, but not always as you can see from these two flowers. For Cluster Cattleyas in Class 2, there must be a <u>minimum of five</u> fully opened flowers.





Oncidiinae: The Oncidium group are often measured across the lower sepals which may be wider than the petals. In the case of the varicosum type that have lovely yellow skirts, they are usually measured across their labellum.



Many orchids can be classified by their flowers or growth habit as to which class to put them in. However, some are difficult to decide where to put them and this is when you ask the Show Marshal, Garrie Bromley, or his assistant, Fred Gorginian.

At North Shore we have 10 classes in the Open section for benching species, but only one class goes by size. This is Miniature Species (less than 12mm and the distance between 1st and last flower is less than 200mm) while all the rest are by genera.

Intermediate Classes

These classes often combine hybrids with species as this is a stepping stone from being a novice grower to being thrust into the open classes with members who have been growing orchids for a long time.

Novice Classes

These classes are more limited as this is where members start. Classes are for both species and hybrids and the first thing you must learn is that Australian Native Dendrobiums must go in that specific class, **not in the Dendrobium class**.
