- 84 receptions and 1,196 receiving yards are the second-best marks in a season in program history
- Caught a touchdown in eight games, including a NU record six-consecutive games from Sept. 10 to Oct. 22
- Six 100-plus yard receiving games
- Scored a career-high three touchdowns at lowa on Oct. 1
- · Scored two touchdowns at Michigan State to become first Wildcat with multiple receiving touchdowns in back-to-back games since Jeremy Ebert in 2011

#### FITZGERALD'S PROGRAM

Dan and Susan Jones Family Head Football Coach Pat Fitzgerald has guided the Wildcats to seven bowl games in the last nine seasons. The 2016 New Era Pinstripe Bowl will be the 'Cats' 13th bowl appearance all time, with Fitzgerald having been a part of 11 of those - seven as a head coach, two as an assistant coach and two as a player. Fitzgerald's 76 wins are the most in Northwestern history and puts him on a short list of just eight active FBS coaches that are the all-time winningest coach at their respective programs.

Junior running back Justin Jackson led the Big Ten with 1,300 rushing yards to earn First-Team All-Big Ten honors, becoming the first player in Northwestern history to rush for 1,000-plus yards in three-straight seasons in the process. Jackson moved his way up the record book and enters the bowl game second in program history with 3,905 career rushing yards, just 580 shy of Damien Anderson's (1998-2001) school record of 4,485. The Carol Stream, Illinois, native scored a career-high 12 touchdowns this season and capped the regular season with a 173 yards and three scores in a 42-21 win over rival Illinois to help Chicago's Big Ten Team even its record at 6-6 to become bowl eligible.

## **MORE ON JUSTIN JACKSON THE BALLCARRIER**

Jackson ranks fourth in program history with 4,478 career allpurpose yards, just 131 shy of Darnell Autry (1994-96) for third in program history. With his 12 rushing touchdowns this season, he

ranks sixth in school history with 27 career scores on the ground. See below for more notes on Jackson's illustrious career thus far:

- Big Ten's active leading rusher with 3,905 career yards
- Has rushed for over 100 yards 19 times in his career, including 14 times in Big Ten play
- Has rushed for 2,871 yards in 25 career Big Ten games, averaging 114.8 yards per contest

## 2016 NORTHWESTERN & NEW ERA PINSTRIPE BOWL

#### THORSON THROWING DARTS

**Sophomore quarterback Clayton Thorson** has been among the nation's elite quarterbacks in his second season as the Wildcats' signal caller. Thorson earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors after completing 257-of-448 passes for 2,968 yards and tying the NU single-season record with 21 touchdown passes. Below are more notes on Thorson's 2016 campaign:

- His 2,968 passing yards are the most by a NU quarterback in his sophomore season and the fourth most in a season all time
- Ranks fourth in the Big Ten in passing yards, touchdowns, yards per game (247.3) and points responsible for per game (13.0)
- Threw three touchdown passes five times this season, becoming the first NU quarterback to accomplish the feat since at least 2000
- His six consecutive games with at least 250 passing yards from Oct. 15 to Nov. 19 were the most by a Wildcat since Brett Basanez accomplished the feat in five straight games in 2005
- Threw for over 300 yards in two games, including a career-high 352 in a 45-17 win at Purdue.
- Already ranks seventh in school history with 28 career passing touchdowns and 10th with 4,490 career passing yards

#### **A ONE-MAN WRECKING CREW**

**Senior defensive end Ifeadi Odenigbo** led the Big Ten with a career-high 10 sacks this season to earn first-team all-league honors. Odenigo ranks second in program history behind only Casey Dailey (1994-97) with 23.5 career sacks. A few notes on Odenigbo's senior season are below:

- Set a Northwestern single-game record and earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors with four sacks in a 38-31 win at lowa on Oct. 1
- Notched two more sacks in 54-40 win at Michigan State on Oct. 15, becoming the first player in program history to record multiple sacks in back-to-back games.
- Recorded a sack in three-straight games from Oct. 1 to Oct. 22.

#### **NO ASSISTANCE NEEDED**

**Junior safety Godwin Igwebuike** was named Second-Team All-Big Ten after leading the Wildcats' defense with 101 tackles, including 75 solo stops. Igwebuike ranks sixth in the country with 6.3 solo tackles per game and had four games with at least eight solo stops, including a career-high 13 in the Big Ten opener versus Nebraska on Sept. 24.

#### **WALK THE WALK**

**Junior linebacker Anthony Walker, Jr.,** also earned Second-Team All-Big Ten honors despite being hampered by a minor injury suffered in preseason camp. Walker finished the regular season with 98 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, two sacks, an interception, three forced fumbles and a pair of fumble recoveries. Since a season-low four tackles in the Big Ten opener against Nebraska, Walker has averaged 9.4 tackles per game over his last eight contests, a stretch that includes 7.5 tackles for loss.

#### **A RAG-TAG BUNCH**

Between Austin Carr, Flynn Nagel, Garrett Dickerson, Andrew Scanlan, Macan Wilson and Solomon Vault, Northwestern's primary receivers entered the season with just 61 career receptions. The group has elevated the Wildcats' offensive attack this season, each setting new career highs in receptions, receiving yards and yards per catch. In total, the six Wildcats have seen a 242 percent increase in receptions (61 to 209) and 249 percent increase in receiving yards (746 to 2,608) in just one season.

## A PAIR OF WILDCATS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS

**Senior wide receiver Austin Carr** (philosophy/3.53) and **junior running back Justin Jackson** (economics/3.31) both earned CoSIDA Academic All-America® Second-Team honors last week. Carr and Jackson became the first pair of Wildcats to earn Academic All-America® honors since 2011.

- Two power-5 programs with a combined 261
  years of college football history meet for the seventh time
  on Dec. 28, 2016, in the Pinstripe Bowl at Yankees Stadium in
  New York, New York.
- Led by second-year head coach Pat Narduzzi, the Panthers posted an 8-4 record during the regular season with wins over Penn State on Sept. 10, 42-39, and No. 2 Clemson on Nov. 12, 43-32. Pitt enters the New Era Pinstripe Bowl having won each of its last three games while averaging 58.3 points per game.
- Nine Panthers were honored on the 2016 All-ACC Football Team, led by first-team selections running back James Conner, return specialist Quadree Henderson, offensive guard Dorian Johnson and defensive end Ejuan Price.
- Conner, who announced earlier this month he will be entering the 2017 NFL Draft, heroically overcame both a knee injury and Hodgkin lymphona to return to the field this season. The bruising back has rushed for 1,060 yards and 16 touchdowns on 208 carries (5.1 avg.). His 20 total touchdowns rank second in the ACC (trailing only Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson's 21) and sixth nationally.
- Henderson has four returns for touchdowns this season, including a nation-leading three on kickoffs. He ranks second in the country in combined kick return yards (1,121), fifth in kickoff return average (31.1) and 11th in all-purpose yards per game (159.75).





## DAN AND SUSAN JONES FAMILY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Already the second-longest tenured Big Ten head coach at the age of 40, Pat Fitzgerald's nine seasons at the helm of Northwestern have been spent building upon the tradition he helped establish as a Hall-of-Fame linebacker for the Wildcats in the mid-1990's. Characterized by his motivational skills, enthusiasm and passion for all things Northwestern, fitzgerald has shaped Chicago's Big Ten Team into one that consistently achieves excellence in all three phases of the student-athlete experience: academics, athletics and community outreach.

Taking over as head coach in 2006 after the sudden passing of his friend and mentor, Randy Walker, Fitzgerald provided leadership and stability in a trying time and has continued Walker's legacy of producing winning football teams while preparing young men for long-term success in life.

Fitzgerald led the Wildcats to their sixth bowl under his guidance with an apperance in the New Year's Day Outback Bowl in Tampa, Florida. Behind one of the nation's stingiest defenses and a ground-and-pound offense in 2016, the Wildcats opened the season with a 16-6 victory over No. 21-ranked and 2016 Rose Bowl Champion Stanford. The victory sparked a 5-0 start for the 'Cats and led to Chicago's Big Ten Team matching a program record with 10-wins, including five straight to close the regular season. NU finished the season ranked in the top 25 in both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches Poll.

From 2008-12, Fitzgerald guided the Wildcats to five consecutive bowl berths, most recently in the 2012 campaign when NU capped a tremendous 10-win season with a landmark victory over Mississippi State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. The 2012 'Cats, who played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the third time in five years, earned a No. 17 year-end ranking in the USA Today/Coaches Poll, the best positioning for any Big Ten team.

Consequently, four consecutive senior classes to graduate from the Northwestern football program during that timeframe set or tied the school record for most career wins by a five-year senior class, with the 2012 group going out as the winningest NU senior class in history with 40 victories to its credit. Likewise, Fitzgerald's Gator Bowl victory on Jan. 1, 2013, marked the 50th of his career, officially making him the winningest head coach in Northwestern Football history.

Away from the gridiron, Fitzgerald's players have achieved at the highest levels in the classroom, last fall placing a record 39 players on the Academic All-Big Ten team en route to posting a program-record 3.14 GPA for the 2015-16 academic year. In 2012, Northwestern collected top national honors in the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for the seventh time since 1998. Additionally, Fitzgerald's program ranked second among all FBS programs in the recently released multi-year Academic Progress Rating (APR), posting a score of 992 out of a possible 1,000 in the measure of player retention and eligibility.

NU also goes to great lengths to make a difference in the community. Fitzgerald, his family and his players partake in countless charitable events, impacting the NU and Evanston communities through their participation in Northwestern Dance Marathon, Special Olympics, Misericordia, the NU chapter of Uplifting Athletes, weekly school and children's hospital visits, and dozens of other organizations. Additionally, a Wildcat also has been selected to the prestigious Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® in eight of the last 11 years (only 11 players from FBS football claim the honor each season), most recently place-kicker Jeff Budzien in 2013.

## GAME 1: WESTERN MICHIGAN 22, NORTHWESTERN 21

**EVANSTON, Ill.** – Junior running back Justin Jackson posted 171 all-purpose yards and a career-high three rushing touchdowns but Northwestern came up just short in its season-opener at Ryan Field Saturday afternoon, falling 22-21 to Western Michigan.

With 124 rushing yards, Jackson recorded his 14th career 100yard game. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Clayton Thorson completed 15 of 22 passes for 196 yards for the Wildcats. On the defensive end, linebacker Jaylen Prater and safety Godwin Igwebuike both had career highs, with 18 tackles and nine solo tackles, respectively.

Having won nine of their last 10 season openers, head coach Pat Fitzgerald and the Wildcats rolled the dice on an aggressive first drive, attempting two fourth-down conversions. The latter was a one-yard plunge from Jackson to give Northwestern the early lead. Jackson, who started the game in sixth on Northwestern's all-time rushing charts, Jackson moved into fourth all-time rushing for Northwestern with a 4-yard rush with four minutes left in first half.

After being held to just three first downs in the first quarter, Western Michigan gleaned seven in the second en route to scoring a pair of field goals to go into the half trailing 7-6.

The Broncos took the opening possession of the second half right down the field, capped by a 13-yard touchdown pass from Zach Terrell to D'Wayne Eskridge that gave the visitors a 13-7 lead.

Jackson again soothed the nerves of the Ryan Field faithful, taking a sweep to the right and bursting through with a 46-yard touchdown rush to regain 14-13 lead halfway through the third.

A third field goal by Butch Hampton – this time a 30-yarder, put the Broncos back in front 16-14 with 17 seconds remaining in the third quarter. However, Jackson again found space on the outside at the start of the fourth, receiving a swing pass and going 37 yards to the WMU 2. Jackson's touchdown rush on the next play reclaimed lead for the #BIGCats, 21-16.

WMU drove down field for a one-yard touchdown run by Jamuauri Bogan to take the lead with 5:38 left in the contest, but Northwestern stopped the two-point conversion to keep the deficit at one. 22-21.

Needing a score, Northwestern charged 66 yards down the field in five plays. On first-and-goal from the 6, Thorson kept the ball for himself and ran towards the east corner of the end zone, where he was met by a Bronco defender on the goal line. The ball popped out, and Western Michigan recovered it in the end zone for a touchback. Western Michigan was able to run out the final 2:54 to preserve the win.

## GAME 2: ILLINOIS STATE 9, NORTHWESTERN 7

**EVANSTON, Ill.** — Austin Carr pulled down seven catches for 73 yards and a touchdown, and Northwestern's defense picked off a pair of Illinois State passes, but the Redbirds nailed a 33-yard field goal as time expired to defeat the Wildcats, 9-7, Saturday at Ryan Field.

Montre Hartage snared his first-career interception in the end zone as well as wrapping up a career high nine solo tackles. Jared McGee also picked off a pass deep with Illinois State deep in Northwestern territory.

The loss moves Northwestern to 0-2, while Illinois State remains perfect at 2-0.

After a first quarter of jostling for field position, Illinois State looked poised to score first, getting to the Northwestern 8 yard-line after a 69-yard drive, when Hartage grabbed an interception to keep the game scoreless.

Illinois State's George Moreira punched in a six-yard run to break the deadlock 32 seconds before the half, with the extra-point going wide left to keep it at 6-0. Northwestern's defense was keeping points off the board, allowing just the one score on three Redbird trips to the red zone in the first half.

Punter Hunter Niswander set a personal best for the second straight game when he blasted a career long 62-yard punt in the second quarter.

Defenses dominated the third quarter, as Northwestern held ISU to just 62 yards in the quarter on four first downs, while NU put together a 76-yard drive, but their fourth-down attempt from the 22 came up empty.

The Wildcats burst out of the stagnant third quarter on the first drive of the fourth. After receiving a punt to open the quarter, Northwestern picked up two quick first downs to move to the ISU 28.

Quarterback Matt Alviti entered for two plays, rushing for three himself, and handing off to Auston Anderson for four yards and a crucial fourth down conversion. On fourth-and-five from the 10-yard line, Thorson found Carr in the corner for the #BIGCats' first score of the day, and Jack Mitchell's extra point split the uprights, giving Northwestern a 7-6 lead with 9:10 to play.

ISU reclaimed possession on their own 13-yard line with 3:11 remaining. Over 10 plays, they drove 68 yards to the Northwestern 16-yard line, taking a timeout with three seconds remaining to set up a 33-yard game winning-field goal attempt. After missing both a 49-yard field goal and an extra point in the first half, Sean Slattery hit the top of the left upright as time expired, giving Illinois State a 9-7 victory.

## GAME 3: NORTHWESTERN 24, DUKE 13

**EVANSTON, Ill.**— Clayton Thorson threw for a career high 320 yards and connected on a trio of long touchdown tosses to Garrett Dickerson, Solomon Vault and Austin Carr as Northwestern defeated the Duke Blue Devils, 24-13, Saturday night at Ryan Field.

Justin Jackson gained 94 yards on the ground and Carr's six receptions netted a career high 135-yards. Anthony Walker, Jr. had five tackles, including two for loss, moving him into 10th in program history with 32, while Jared McGee led the game with nine total tackles, more than double his previous career high.

Jackson started the game by tearing out 36 yards rushing on the first drive. Thorson sealed the drive with a 26-yard pass to Dickerson for the receiver's first-career touchdown. Jackson's 69 yards in the first quarter tied the most he has registered in a quarter in his career.

Both offenses were looking to the air for early yardage, with 298 of the 422 yards gained in the first half from passes. With the Blue Devils driving late in the first quarter, Godwin Igwebuike stepped into a pass at the Northwestern 22, his first interception preserving the Wildcats' advantage.

Duke looked poised to christen the second half with a score on their opening drive, having reached the Northwestern 17-yard line. Duke quarterback Daniel Jones then rolled right, where Walker met him at the line of scrimmage, popping the ball out with his right fist for his both his fifth-career forced fumble and recovery.

With 5:52 left in the third, Duke looked to punt from the NU 47-yard line when their punter could not handle the snap, gifting Northwestern the ball on the 44. For the second-straight season, Solomon Vault gave Northwestern a lead over Duke early in the second half, snaring a 44-yard pass from Thorson to take a 14-7 lead. (Vault returned the second half kickoff to paydirt in the 2015 meeting between these teams.)

Mitchell added a 40-yard field goal seconds from the end of the third quarter, moving Northwestern's advantage to 17-7. It was Mitchell's 33rd career field goal, the seventh most in program history.

The game opened up in the fourth quarter, with 215 total yards gained in the period. Duke had a chance to pull back within one score with 10 minutes left, but their 34-yard field goal attempt missed wide right. Carr sealed the victory with a career-long 56-yard touchdown reception with five minutes to play.

## GAME 4: #20 NEBRASKA 24, NORTHWESTERN 13

**EVANSTON, Ill.**— Aiming for its second-straight victory under the lights at Ryan Field Saturday night, Northwestern was unable to stymie No. 20 Nebraska in a 24-13 loss to the Huskers to kick off Big Ten play.

Austin Carr set a career-high for receptions for the second-straight week and Clayton Thorson threw for 249 yards on 24 completions. Justin Jackson rushed for 84-yards on 20 rushes, while Godwin Igwebuike led the game with 15 total tackles.

Northwestern moves to 1-3 (0-1 BIG), while Nebraska is now 4-0 (1-0 BIG).

Both offenses shifted up a gear in the second quarter, gaining a combined 307 yards. Northwestern gave their response to Nebraska's score four minutes later when Clayton Thorson ripped off a 42-yard touchdown run for a 7-3 lead. It was Thorson's first scoring run since October 24, 2015, at Nebraska.

Despite giving up yardage, the Wildcats defense was bending but not breaking. With the Cornhuskers again looking ready to score, Igwebuike forced a fumble at the goal line, which Joseph Jones recovered for Northwestern's second touchback off of a fumble in the game.

Northwestern received the ball with just 101 seconds left in the half after Nebraska scored to reclaim a 10-7 lead. Starting from their own 22, the Wildcats drove 57 yards to the Nebraska 23, with 19 seconds remaining. Jack Mitchell lined up for the 40-yarder, but the Wildcats opted for a fake field-goal, which garnered just two yards and sent the game into the half at 10-7.

The offensive floodgates burst in the second half, with the first three drives all going for touchdowns. After Nebraska's opening score, Northwestern went 52-yards in just five plays, with Carr hauling in a 24-yard touchdown to cut NU's deficit to 17-13. It was Carr's third straight game with a touchdown reception, the first Wildcat to do so since Jeremy Ebert in 2011. But the game would again shift back Nebraska's direction, as Mitchell missed a PAT and the Cornhuskers found the end zone once more, taking a 24-13 lead to the end of the quarter.

Needing stops in the fourth quarter, the Wildcats defense pinned the Cornhuskers behind the NU 41 for the final 15 minutes. While Northwestern was able to gain 70-yards in the quarter, including a thrust to the Nebraska 27, but couldn't put more points on the board, falling 24-13.

## GAME 5: NORTHWESTERN 38, IOWA 31

**IOWA CITY, Iowa** — Northwestern's offense exploded for 38 points Saturday at Iowa led by a trio of Austin Carr touchdown catches and 171 Justin Jackson rushing yards en route to a 38-31 Big Ten road victory over the Hawkeyes.

Northwestern jumped out to an early lead in the game and eventually led 17-7 early in the second quarter before lowa came roaring back for a 21-17 lead at the half. After the Hawkeyes made it a seven-point lead over the Wildcats early in the third, NU reeled off 21-straight points to put the game out of reach.

Junior Xavier Washington and senior Joseph Jones set the tone for the Wildcats on the Hawkeyes' opening drive, forcing a three-and-out. That set the stage for a career-best 47-yard punt return to the five-yard-line by sophomore Flynn Nagel, setting up the opening score of the game. It took the 'Cats just two plays to find the back of the end zone as sophomore Clayton Thorson scored from four yards out with 12:20 on the clock to put NU in front, 7-0.

A pooch punt by Iowa quarterback C.J. Beathard flipped the field later in the quarter and pinned Northwestern on its own one-yard line. A three-and-out and a 32-yard punt return from Iowa's Desmond King gave the Hawkeyes their own five-yard field to work with. Akrum Wadley scored one play later to tie the game, 7-7.

Senior Jack Mitchell gave the Wildcats a 10-7 lead with 50 seconds left in the first quarter when he nailed a 25-yard field goal and the Wildcats extended the lead to 17-7 on a nine-play, 54-yard drive that was capped on an 11-yard strike from Thorson to senior Austin Carr.

The Hawkeyes scored a pair of touchdowns to end the first half – the first on a six-yard run by Wadley and the second on a 15-yard pass and catch from Beathard to Riley McCarron – and added a field goal at the start of the second half to score 17 straight points and claim a 24-17 lead.

The Wildcats responded following the Hawkeyes' 25-yard field goal to start the second half, marching 75 yards on 11 plays in 5:14 to even the game at 24 apiece. Justin Jackson got the drive rolling with a 13-yard scamper and Thorson converted a fourth-and-one with a three-yard rush on the 'Cats' side of the 50 to keep the drive going. A 15-yard completion to redshirt freshman John Moten IV put the Wildcats in striking distance and Thorson found Carr in the back corner of the end zone for a 16-yard strike to cap the drive.

After senior Ifeadi Odenigbo's second of FOUR sacks in the game, the Wildcats needed just five plays to reclaim the lead. Facing a second and four from his own 42-yard line, Jackson found a seam in the Hawkeyes' defense and scampered 58 yards for a touchdown and a 31-24 NU lead.

The Wildcats then went ahead two scores when Thorson again connected with Carr, who this time bounced off a Hawkeyes defender and raced 25 yards into the end zone to complete his hat trick and put NU on top, 38-24, with 12:06 to play in the game.

lowa answered quickly to get back within a score, then got the ball back following a #BIGCats three-and-out. With the clock ticking down under three minutes to go and the Hawkeyes approaching midfield, Odenigbo got to Beathard again for his fourth sack, this time forcing a fumble that lowa recovered. The play put the Hawkeyes so far behind the chains, they had to punt the ball away with just 2:35 remaining in the contest.

NU gave the ball back mere seconds later on a three-and-out, but Trae Williams made his first career interception on Iowa's last-ditch drive to secure the win for NU.

## GAME 6: NORTHWESTERN 54, MICHIGAN STATE 40

**EAST LANSING, Mich.** — Less than seven minutes into Saturday's game at Michigan State, Northwestern found itself down 14 points, but the Wildcats responded with a monstrous 33-3 run over the next two quarters to take command in a wildly entertaining 54-40 victory in East Lansing.

Justin Jackson the Ballcarrier led the Northwestern onslaught with a career-high 188 yards on 34 carries, including touchdown runs of 26 and 29 yards. Clayton Thorson connected on 27 of his 35 throws for 281 yards and three scores.

Austin Carr, who entered the game leading the Big Ten in catches, receiving yards and receiving TDs, will stay atop the conference in those categories after hauling in 11 catches for 130 yards and two more scores.

After MSU converted a field goal to start the second quarter, the Wildcats scored 26 straight points between the second and third quarters to turn a 17-7 deficit into a 33-17 lead with 6:49 to play in the third.

Thorson found Carr for a touchdown for the fifth-straight game with to cap a 12-play, 75-yard drive with 10:04 to play in the second quarter and redshirt freshman Joe Gaziano's first career sack on the Spartans' next drive resulted in a safety to cut the deficit to one, 17-16. Senior Jack Mitchell nailed a 33-yard field goal with 6:42 left in the half to give the Wildcats a 19-17 lead at the break.

Chicago's Big Ten Team made quick work of extending the lead to start the second half, scoring on just its fourth play of the half when Thorson found a streaking Flynn Nagel down the visiting sideline for a 57-yard score to extend the lead to 26-17 with 13:28 to play in the third quarter.

After a defensive stop, Thorson and the offense continued to click as the sophomore went 5-for-6 for 60 yards and capped a 10-play, 86-yard drive with a nine-yard touchdown run to extend the lead to 33-17.

The run ended there when Michigan State connected on TD passes of 59 and 86 yards on its next two drives to pull back within two points of NU, 33-31, with 2:08 left in the third quarter.

On the very next football play, Solomon Vault made a huge football play. On an awkward kickoff that bounced in front of him, Vault corralled the ball and picked his way through Michigan State tacklers before cutting upfield and accelerating to the house for a 95-yard return, immediately restoring Northwestern's nine-point lead, 40-31.

NU did not look back from there. Jackson added a 26-yard touchdown scamper with 8:25 left in the game to make the score 47-31. Though MSU immediately answered with another touchdown drive of its own, Northwestern put an exclamation point on the game with five minutes left in the fourth quarter.

On fourth down and six to go from the MSU 29 yard line, the #BIGCats sent the offense back out on the field, and Thorson found Carr wide open on a corner route toward the front pylon of the end zone for another NU touchdown and a 54-37 lead.

# GAME 7: NORTHWESTERN 24, INDIANA 14

**EVANSTON, Ill.** – It was a tale of two halves for Northwestern Saturday in its 2016 Homecoming game against Indiana. The Wildcats blitzed out to a 24-3 halftime lead before the defense took over in the second half to preserve a 24-14 victory, giving NU three victories in a row in the month of October.

Justin Jackson added 34 receiving yards to his 94 yards on the ground.

The Wildcats wasted no time getting on the scoreboard, going 70 yards on 11 plays on the opening drive, with Thorson finding Solomon Vault for the 17-yard touchdown. Northwestern then made it 14-0 on their next drive, with Jackson breaking free for a 27-yard rush before Thorson hit Carr with a 34-yard touchdown.

Carr's ninth touchdown of the season also marked the sixth-straight game in which he's had a touchdown reception, the first Wildcat to do so since 2000. Carr's nine touchdown receptions is also the third-most in program single-season history, three behind D'Wayne Bates' total of 12 in 1996.

The #BIGCats outgained the Hoosiers 192 yards to 54 in the first quarter, and while Indiana converted a late field goal, Northwestern's dominance continued into the second, with Thorson's third touchdown pass of the game coming on the first play, a 32-yard connection with Macan Wilson. Thorson has now thrown for three touchdowns in three-straight games, the longest such streak by a Northwestern quarterback since 2000.

While the offense was churning to the tune of 371 yards in the first half, the Wildcats defense was equally impressive, holding Indiana to just 120 yards in the first half. Hartage ripped a ball out of a Hoosier receiver's hands for an interception on what would have been a 45-yard pass, and when Indiana threatened to score on their next drive, Quiero came up with a huge fourth-down tackle two yards short of a first-down to force the turnover-on-downs and keep the game at 21-3. The Wildcats were then able to take a 24-3 lead into the half when Jack Mitchell completed a 19-yard field goal attempt as time expired.

Northwestern came into the game 54-16 when leading at the half during Pat Fitzgerald's tenure, and was well poised to extend that mark. While the offense cooled down from its blistering pace, the defense continued to shut down the Hoosiers. Walker, Jr., recorded six tackles, including one for loss in the quarter, and while Indiana did score a field goal and touchdown, the Wildcats were able to break up the two-point conversion to keep the score 24-12.

The game quieted down in the fourth, with eight straight scoreless drives. Halfway through the fourth, Quiero made the play of the game, doing his best Odell Beckham impression and reaching all the way back with his right hand to snatch an interception, igniting the Homecoming crowd at Ryan Field.

Indiana had a chance to cut into the deficit with three minutes remaining, but the Wildcats made their second fourth down stop in the red zone on the day. Northwestern brought down the clock to 23 seconds, before taking a safety in an effort to run out the remaining time en route to securing a 24-14 victory.

# GAME 8: #6 OHIO STATE 24, NORTHWESTERN 20

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Northwestern gave No. 6 Ohio State a scare on Halloween Weekend in Ohio Stadium, driving deep into Buckeyes territory with a chance to tie the game late on Saturday before the Buckeyes escaped with a 24-20 win over the Wildcats.

Clayton Thorson threw for 256 yards on 22 completions, and Austin Carr -- the Big Ten's leading receiver -- had another monster day hauling in eight receptions for 158 yards. OSU quickly went up 10-0 in the contest and held a 17-10 lead at the half, but Northwestern fought back to knot the score, 17-17, heading into the final quarter.

Though the Buckeyes regained the lead, 24-17, early in the fourth, the Wildcats came storming right back down the field and had first and goal to go inside the OSU five-yard line with under five minutes to play. NU was forced to settle for a field goal, and OSU ran out the clock from there.

While Ohio State was able to jump out to a 10-0 lead in the first nine minutes, Northwestern's defense largely cracked down on the Buckeyes. After those two drives, the Wildcats tightened the clamps, allowing just two scores the rest of the game.

With time winding down in the first quarter, Carr made a tiptoe catch on the sideline for an 11-yard gain, and Garrett Dickerson's reception converted a fourth-and-two from the four to bring Northwestern within striking distance. Clayton Thorson made it 10-7 when punched it in to open the second quarter, the second consecutive game the Wildcats have scored on the first play of the second quarter.

Ohio State responded with their third score to pull ahead 17-7, but the Wildcats were able to continue their offensive outburst. Thorson broke out a 33-yard run to break into the red zone, setting up a Jack Mitchell 23yard field goal to pull the #BIGCats back within a score at 17-10 to head into the half.

The #BIGCat offense continued to roll in the second half, again changing the scoreboard halfway through the quarter. Thorson found Carr for a 35yard reception to bring the Wildcats to the 5-yard-line, giving Carr over 100 yards on the game for the third straight contest and the fifth overall this season. Three plays later, Thorson connected with Dickerson to tie the game, 17-17.

The Wildcat defense continued to stymie the Buckeyes, holding them to just 85 yards in the third guarter. Ohio State took a 24-17 lead, however, with just under 10 minutes to play. Northwestern clawed back, going 60 yards on 16 plays to get deep into the red zone, where Mitchell drilled a 33-yard field goal with 3:31 to play.

Northwestern needed a stop to upset No. 6 Ohio State, and twice it forced the Buckeyes into 3rd and 7 or longer, but on the second of those thirddown plays, Ohio State's J.T. Barrett was able to scramble for a first down, and the Buckeyes ran out the clock from there.

# GAME 9: #8 WISCONSIN 21, NORTHWESTERN 7

**EVANSTON, Ill.** — Northwestern's Austin Carr caught his 10th touchdown of the season late in the first half Saturday against No. 8 Wisconsin at Ryan Field -- part of yet another career day for the senior receiver -- but the Badgers stymied the Wildcats' offense in the second half to pull away for 21-7 victory.

Northwestern tallied the most passing yards by a Wisconsin opponent this season with 277, led by four Wildcats with at least 30 yards receiving. Carr was the star, snaring a career-best 12 throws from sophomore Clayton Thorson for 132 yards, giving him 1,010 receiving yards on the year.

Defensively, juniors Brett Walsh and Tyler Lancaster each had career highs of eight tackles, while classmate Godwin Igwebuike had a game-high 10.

Two of the best scoring defenses in the Big Ten showed their mettle in the first quarter, allowing just nine first downs in the quarter. Despite Wisconsin possessing the ball for 10 minutes in the first, the Wildcats held the Badgers scoreless with just 98 yards of offense.

Both offenses began to find gaps in the second quarter, and Wisconsin was the first on the scoreboard after hitting a 40-yard field goal four minutes into the period. The Badgers added a rushing touchdown on their next drive to mount a 10-0 lead midway through the second.

The Wildcats clawed back with their final drive of the half. Starting on their own 22 with 1:41 left on the clock, Justin Jackson ripped off a 28-yard carry to get to midfield. On an ensuing fourth-and-one, Garret Dickerson broke a tackle for a 28-yard gain, reaching the 13-yard line. Thorson then split the seam to find Carr to head into the half 10-7. The touchdown was Carr's 10th of the season, the third-highest mark in program history.

Fresh off the halftime break, the stalwart defenses returned to dominate the third quarter. Both offenses combined for just six first downs, 138 total yards, and a solitary drive of more than seven plays. Walsh and Igwebuike led the #BIGCats with three tackles in the period, holding the Badgers to a lone field goal.

With Northwestern trailing 13-7, Carr again had a strong finish to a quarter. Carr caught a short pass over the middle before scampering down the sideline to the Wisconsin 30. The 32-yard reception clinched the receiver's fourth consecutive -- and seventh total -- 100-yard receiving game this season. An eight-yard completion to Andrew Scanlan had the Wildcats driving as the third came to a close. But in the fourth, Thorson was hit as he began to throw and the ensuing loose ball was ruled a fumble. The Badgers recovered to end the scoring threat.

Wisconsin was able to find the end zone off of the short field and converted a two-point conversion to take a 21-7 lead with eight minutes to play. While Northwestern held Wisconsin to just 33-yards in the quarter, the offense couldn't capitalize on their five first downs in the period, as they fell by that 21-7 score.

# GAME 10: NORTHWESTERN 45, PURDUE 17

**WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind.** — Northwestern's offense exploded for 605 yards while the defense picked off four Purdue passes to lead the Wildcats to a massive 45-17 Big Ten road win Saturday over the Boilermakers.

Clayton Thorson threw for a career-high 352 yards with a rushing touchdown and three passing TDs, including a pair of scores to all-world receiver Austin Carr. Justin Jackson scampered for 127 yards on the ground and John Moten IV tallied a career-best 119 rushing yards to give the Wildcats two 100-yard runners in the game. Montre Hartage had his first multiple-interception game with a pair of picks to lead the Northwestern Sky Team.

Purdue jumped out to an early lead, going ahead 10-0 after its opening two drives. Hartage flipped the momentum on Purdue's third drive however, intercepting a pass on the Purdue 26. Four plays later, Thorson found Carr on a short crossing route to pull within 10-7 with three minutes left in the quarter.

The touchdown flipped the momentum of the game. After allowing eight first downs in the first quarter, the Wildcat defense didn't allow one in the first 11 minutes of the second, and conceded just two in the period. Anthony Walker recorded nine tackles in the half en route to a team-best 12 in the game.

With eight minutes remaining in the half, Thorson fired from the midfield-logo to hit Austin Carr for a 33-yard touchdown. The touchdown was Carr's 12th of the season, tying him for the most in single-season program history. The #BIGCats got the ball back deep in their own half with a minute remaining in the quarter and gained 75 yards to reach the 12, but were unable to find the end zone.

No worries, though: Northwestern pulled away with a big third quarter, scoring touchdowns every time they touched the ball. Jackson capped off a seven play, 71-yard drive with a 14-yard TD run. Jackson broke 1,000 yards on the season with the run, making him the first Wildcat in program history to do so in three-consecutive seasons. A

After Walker came up with an interception near midfield, Thorson had his second long touchdown of the day, finding Garrett Dickerson with a 42-yard score. Northwestern racked up 267 yards in the quarter, before Jackson scored his second touchdown of the game on the first play of the fourth to extend the Wildcats' lead to 35-17.

The sky team, Northwestern's vaunted secondary, showed their mettle, recording three of their four interceptions in the second half. Hartage recorded his second, and Trent Goens picked off his first collegiate interception. Thorson added a late TD scamper and Jack Mitchell tacked on a field goal as Northwestern cruised to a 45-17 victory.

# GAME 11: MINNESOTA 29, NORTHWESTERN 12

MINNEAPOLIS -- Northwestern traveled to Minnesota Saturday for its final Big Ten road trip of the 2016 season and had trouble getting its high-octane offense heated up the cold TCF Bank Stadium weather, falling to the Gophers, 29-12.

Minnesota got off to an early start, scoring on their opening possession, but missing the extra point. From there on, both defenses clamped down. Northwestern held Minnesota to just 13 yards the rest of the quarter. The offense almost got on the scoreboard with two minutes left in the quarter, but Jack Mitchell's 44-yard field goal attempt into the wind was dragged wide.

Northwestern continued keeping points off the board to start the second. On a deep Minnesota pass, Marcus McShepard outjumped a Golden Gopher receiver for an interception, preventing a probable score. Minnesota did tack on a field goal halfway through the quarter, extending its lead to 9-0. Northwestern responded by driving 56-yards on nine plays, but, facing fourth-and-one in the red zone, its conversion fell short. The Golden Gophers would score just before the half to go into halftime leading 12-0.

Things began to turn around for the Wildcats in the third quarter. While Minnesota used a field goal to take a 15-0 lead, Northwestern's defense shut them down for the rest of the quarter. Minnesota would record just 34 yards in the quarter while earning just two first downs.

Northwestern was dealt a setback when Austin Carr was on the receiving end of a targeting foul, knocking him out of the game. But the Wildcats quickly galvanized, going the length of the field with a 12 play, 75-yard drive, capped off by Justin Jackson plunging into the end zone with a four-yard run. After failing to convert a two-point conversion, the #B1GCats were kicking off down 15-6. On the kickoff, Anthony Walker, Jr., stripped the Minnesota kick-returner of the ball, giving Northwestern possession on the 22-yard line. On fourth-and-one, Thorson's pass to Eric Dickerson fell incomplete, leaving NU short on the opportunity.

Minnesota found the end zone to start the fourth quarter, leading 22-6, but the Wildcats continued to claw back. Getting the ball with 6:46 remaining, the Wildcats picked up three first downs before needing to convert on fourth-and-12 from the Minnesota 42. Minnesota committed a defensive holding penalty to keep the drive alive, then three plays later, Clayton Thorson found Flynn Nagel in the corner of the end zone to claw back to 22-12 with two and a half minutes remaining. The two-point conversion failed again, and the ensuing onside kick was returned inside the NU 15-yard-line.

The Golden Gophers added a late touchdown to account for the 29-12 victory over the Wildcats.

# GAME 12: NORTHWESTERN 42, ILLINOIS 21

**EVANSTON, Ill.** — Northwestern built a quick 21-0 lead Saturday in the battle for the Land of Lincoln Trophy against Illinois at Ryan Field before holding off the Illini, 42-21, to earn bowl eligibility. The hat has remained in Evanston four of the last five years.

The Wildcats ran for a season high 278 yards and five touchdowns to finish the regular season 6-6 (5-4).

Both Justin Jackson and John Moten IV rushed for over 100 yards in Saturday's game, the second time this season that has happened. Jackson scored three times in the annual trophy game for the Land of Lincoln hat, while Moten added two scores of his own.

Northwestern's defense forced four turnovers, including three fumbles, and limited Illinois to just 57 yards on the ground, while sacking Illini quarterback Wes Lunt three times.

The Wildcats got on the board first midway through the opening quarter on a nine-yard run by Moten, the first touchdown of the redshirt freshman's career. Moten followed that on the next drive with his second touchdown on a career-long 43-yard run to put Northwestern up 14-0.

Jackson put the 'Cats up 21-0 with his 10th rushing touchdown of the season, which tied his career high set in 2014. He then scampered 54 yards for his second touchdown of the day and career high 11th of the season to put Northwestern up 28-14.

Illinois scored late in the third quarter to make it 28-21 and looked to have some momentum with the Wildcats punting on their next possession. Offensive lineman J.B. Butler made the tackle and forced a fumble on the return that was recovered by the 'Cats.

The Northwestern offense marched down the field, and Thorson found superback Garrett Dickerson on a nine-yard flip throw to put Chicago's Big Ten Team up, 35-21.

The 'Cats broke the game wide open with Jackson's third rushing touchdown of the day to make it 42-21 after a 60-yard interception return by sophomore cornerback Montre Hartage put the ball at the five-yard line.

Anthony Walker, Jr. finished the day with a game-high nine tackles, two of them for loss. He moved into fourth place on the Northwestern all-time TFL list with 39.5 for his career, passing Corey Wootton. Matt Rice is up next at 42 career TFLs.

Quarterback Clayton Thorson played an efficient game, completing 65 percent of his passes. His 13 completions went to six different receivers for 121 yards and a touchdown.



WILDCATS HISTORY

### **WILDCAT LEGEND OTTO GRAHAM**

hen Otto Graham graduated from Waukegan, (III.) High School in 1938, it was safe to say that he did not envision one day becoming a member of college football's Hall of Fame, let alone the NFL's. In fact, he did not even come to Northwestern to be a football player. Otto Graham originally attended Northwestern on a basketball scholarship. It was only after Northwestern football coach Pappy Waldorf watched one of Graham's freshman intramural football games that Otto got his chance. In one of the greatest coaching decisions in Northwestern football history, Waldorf invited Graham to try out for the football team. The rest of Graham's story is written in the record books.

Nicknamed "Automatic Otto" for his precision passing, Graham broke every existing Big Ten passing record during his tenure (1941-43). He was a two-time All-American and won the Big Ten Most Valuable Player Award. He still holds the Northwestern record for most points (27) scored in a single game. As a senior, he averaged 38 yards per punt, four yards per carry rushing, and converted on seven extra points. In addition, Graham won eight letters in three sports at NU (football, basketball and baseball) and is one of two Northwestern athletes ever to earn All-America status in two sports (football and basketball).

After leaving Northwestern, Otto was a commissioned officer in the United States Navy Air Corps and served for two years in World War II. After serving his country, he played professional football with the Cleveland Browns. With the Browns, Graham



passed for 23,584 yards and 174 touchdowns in his career and led them to four-straight America Football League titles. After merging with the NFL in 1950, he played in six-straight title game appearances with Cleveland.

Graham retired from professional football after Cleveland's 1955 championship

Graham will forever be synonymous with triple-threat football—rushing, passing and kicking. In 1956, he was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. In 1965, Graham was inducted into pro football's Hall of Fame. He was named Northwestern football's greatest player ever in the Big Ten's 75th anni-

versary year—all because Coach Waldorf was impressed at a freshman intramural football game and decided to give a kid named Otto a

Otto Graham passed away during the 2003 season. In memory of the legend, the Wildcats donned "Otto" decals on their helmets during the Motor City Bowl.





#### **COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME**

A total of 15 former Wildcat coaches and players are enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame. They range from Paddy Driscoll, a halfback for the 'Cats from 1915-16, to Pat Fitzgerald, a two-time All-American, Chuck Bednarik and Bronko Nagurski award winner, who was NU's most recent inductee in 2008. There are four former Northwestern coaches in the Hall, Charles Bachman, 1919, Alex Agase, 1964-72, Ara Parseghian, 1956-63 and Lynn Waldorf, 1935-46.

The College Football Hall of Fame is a hall of fame and museum devoted to college football. In August 2014, the College Football Hall of Fame and Chick-fil-A Fan Experience opened in downtown Atlanta, Georgia. The National Football Foundation (NFF) launched the Hall in 1951 to immortalize



the players and coaches of college football. In 2009, Atlanta Hall Management, Inc. partnered with the NFF to construct and operate the new Hall of Fame facility, which will also provide a platform for community outreach, education and character development initiatives, as well as serve as a special event space in Atlanta.

The Wildcats were the first college football team to visit the new Hall of Fame. The tour fired up NU so much that the next day it upset Notre Dame, 17-15.

The first members of the College Football Hall of Fame were selected in 1951. Today there are more than 700 players and coaches in the Hall.

The Hall of Fame is a part of the National Football Foundation, which was conceived in 1947 by the late Grantland Rice. In addition to sponsoring the Hall of Fame, the Foundation has awarded more than \$3 million in graduate

school scholarships to college football players.

## 1949 ROSE BOWL



#### **GAME SUMMARY**

Northwestern's first bowl appearance came on Jan. 1, 1949, when the Wildcats—considered by many to be the surprise team of the season—knocked off California in the 1949 Rose Bowl, 20-14.

The Wildcats got on the scoreboard first when left halfback Frank Aschenbrenner burst through the right side for a 73-yard touchdown, at the time the longest run from scrimmage in Rose Bowl history. Jim Farrar's extra-point made the lead 7-0. On Cal's next play, All-American back Jackie Jensen scampered 67 yards over the left end to tie the game at 7-7. The score remained deadlocked until midway through the second

quarter when Art Murakowski capped a 78-yard drive with a one-yard plunge into the end zone for a 13-7 lead. The touchdown was marred by controversy as Murakowski fumbled the ball in the end zone, but the officials ruled it had crossed the goal line first.

Early in the third quarter, California lost Jensen to a back injury, and many felt the Wildcats would roll through the remainder of the game. This was not the case as the Bears converted a Wildcat fumble into a 56-yard touchdown drive and a 14-13 lead heading into the fourth quarter. With the clock winding down, the Wildcats had the ball at their own 12-yard line and seemingly needed a miracle to win. Early in the drive, NU came up with its only pass completion of the game, an Aschenbrenner to Donald Stonesifer connection which put Northwestern on the California 45- yard line. Two plays later, on a direct snap from center, right halfback Ed Tunnicliff reaped the benefits of excellent blocking and raced 43 yards down the sidelines to give NU a 19-14 lead. Farrar's extra-point increased the Wildcat lead to six at 20-14 with 2:59 remaining.

The Bears gave it one final shot, but Loran "Pee Wee" Day intercepted the ball at the five-yard-line inside the final minute. Two keepers by NU quarterback Don Burson ran out the clock and the Wildcats brought home the roses.

#### 1996 ROSE BOWL



#### **GAME SUMMARY**

The 1995 Wildcat team was the college football story of the season, shocking the experts in capturing the team's first winning season since 1971, and first bowl game appearance since the 1949 Rose Bowl.

USC scored first in the opening minutes of the game, but NU quickly evened the score when Darnell Autry capped off a 68-yard scoring drive with a three-yard touchdown run. The Trojan offense attacked in the second quarter, scoring on two touchdowns and a field goal. Brian Gowins kicked a 29-yard field goal to cap a drive that began when Tim Scharf forced a USC fumble with 12 seconds remaining in the half, cutting the gap to 24-10.

In the third quarter, Gowins started NU's scoring bonanza with a 28-yard field goal. The Wildcats then completed an on-side kick, which Josh Barnes scooped up. Three minutes later, Autry scored on a nine-yard run to narrow the gap to 24-19. USC struck back with a touchdown midway through the quarter, but the 'Cats answered with Schnur's one-yard TD plunge. NU took the lead for the first time early in the fourth when Autry ran two yards for his third touchdown of the game. USC regained the lead for good with a field goal on the next possession and then converted a rare Schnur interception into a touchdown. The Wildcats gave it one last effort late in the game. Gowins' 48-yard field goal attempt with 35 seconds left had the distance, but hit the left upright and bounced out.

Steve Schnur had a career-best day, connecting on 23-of-39 passes for 336 yards with one rushing touchdown.

#### **1997 CITRUS BOWL**

#### GAME SUMMARY



Northwestern defied the odds again in 1996, capturing its second-consecutive Big Ten Championship and the third January 1 bowl game in school history. The Wildcats traveled to Orlando, Fla., to take on the ninth-ranked Tennessee Volunteers in the 1997 CompUSA Florida Citrus Bowl.

Despite rallying from a 21-0 first quarter deficit to tie the score, Peyton Manning and Tennessee were too much for Northwestern as the Volunteers posted a 48-28 victory.

Manning threw two TDs and ran for another as the Vols built a 21-0 lead with 2:00 left in the first quarter. Northwestern hung tough, though, and it paid off as Darnell Autry cut the lead to 21-7 on

a two-yard run midway through the second quarter. Steve Schnur then hooked up with Brian Musso, a little over four minutes later, on a 22-yard scoring strike to cut the lead to seven.

Almost immediately, NU got the ball back as Tim Scharf jarred the ball loose from the runner and Mike Nelson recovered for the Wildcats. Autry then broke free on a 28-yard scoring scamper to knot the score at 21-21.

The Volunteers went back up by seven and 30 seconds later, added a field goal as time expired to go up, 31-21, at half. On the third play of the second half, Tennessee intercepted a Schnur pass and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown and a 38-21 lead. NU would add one more score on a 22-yard TD pass from Schnur to D'Wayne Bates, but it wasn't enough.

Schnur threw for 228 yards and two scores. Barry Gardner led the way on defense with 10 tackles.

#### **2000 ALAMO BOWL**



#### GAME SUMMARY

When the 2000 college football season began, the idea of Northwestern and Nebraska meeting in a bowl game was nearly laughable. After all, the Wildcats were coming off a 3-8 season in 1999, while the Cornhuskers began the season ranked No. 1 in the country.

**BOWL HISTORY** 

Yet on December 30, the two teams with 'N' on their helmets stood toe-to-toe on the astroturf housed by the Alamodome in San Antonio.

Northwestern gave the Huskers fits in the early part of the game, and even held a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter. However, it was all Nebraska from that point on, as the Huskers outscored the 'Cats 31-7 before halftime and

then tacked on 28 unanswered points in the second stanza for the win.

Nebraska drew first blood with a 15-yard touchdown run by Dan Alexander just 2:11 into the contest before Northwestern got on the board with a 44-yard Tim Long field goal three minutes later. In the second quarter, the Wildcats briefly took the lead when Zak Kustok found Teddy Johnson in the corner of the end zone for a 10-yard TD reception.

The lead lasted all of 20 seconds. Nebraska stormed back, as QB Eric Crouch scampered 50 yards for a touchdown, starting a 24-point explosion. Down 31-10, Northwestern briefly revived itself when All-American running back Damien Anderson broke off a 69-yard touchdown run with just 1:10 left before halftime. The Huskers took the momentum right back, however, as Crouch hit Bobby Newcombe with a 58-yard TD pass to give Nebraska a 38-17 halftime lead.

Anderson finished the game with 149 yards on 18 carries to lead NU.



#### **2003 MOTOR CITY BOWL**



#### **GAME SUMMARY**

In what turned out to be one of the more exciting bowl games of the 2003 season, Bowling Green and quarterback Josh Harris got the final word with Northwestern and Jason Wright. Harris and Wright turned in two of the more impressive postseason performances and shared the game's MVP honors. The Wildcats led for three-plus quarters until Harris fired an 11-yard TD pass with 11:32 remaining in the game, which gave BGSU a 21-17 advantage.

NU countered, however, thanks to an 88-yard kickoff return by Wright. Noah Herron, who tallied two touchdowns, scored on a 2-yard scamper with 10:01 left to put the 'Cats back in front, 24-21. But Harris and the Falcons had one

more scoring drive left in them, and NU was unable to muster an offensive threat on its final possession. Wright finished with a bowl and school-record 336 allpurpose yards. He totaled 237 rushing yards, also a bowl mark.

## **GAME SUMMARY**



Despite returning two interceptions for touchdowns and winning the turnover battle 4-3, Northwestern fell 50-38 to No. 17 UCLA in the 72nd annual Sun Bowl held in El Paso, Texas.

NU jumped to an early 22-0 first-quarter lead when Kevin Mims and Nick Roach each returned UCLA quarterback Drew Olson interceptions for touchdowns. The two defensive touchdowns followed a Joel Howells' 33 yard field goal and sandwiched a 19-yard Mark Philmore reverse for a touchdown. Northwestern's defense picked off Olson three times in the first quarter alone, equaling the number of interceptions Olson threw in his first 11 games combined

The Bruins, however, came storming back from the 22-0 deficit, scoring 36 unanswered points for a 36-22 lead. Amado Villarreal

booted a 31-yard field goal at the end of the third quarter to halt the UCLA scoring string.

The Wildcats mounted a furious comeback. A Brett Basanez touchdown pass to Philmore cut the score to 36-31 with 2:29 left in the game. Then, UCLA's Brandon Breazell recovered NU's onside kick and returned it for a touchdown. The Wildcats came charging back, scoring on Shaun Herbert's 5-yard TD catch with 24 seconds left, trimming the UCLA lead to 43-38. Then the unthinkable happened. Breazell returned another onside kick for a score to ice the contest with 18 seconds left.

Despite the disheartening defeat, Northwestern set a Sun Bowl record with 584 yards of offense, with 448 coming courtesy of Brett Basanez.

#### **GAME SUMMARY**



C.J. Bachér tied a Valero Alamo Bowl record with three touchdowns passes and threw for more than 300 yards, but No. 21 Missouri kicked a game-tying field goal late in the fourth quarter before defeating No. 23 Northwestern in overtime, 30-23.


In a game against former Heisman finalist Chase Daniel, Bachér won the battle of the QB's. The fifth-year senior completed 27-of-43 passes for 304 yards and three scores. Mizzou's offense came into the game averaging almost 500 yards per game, but was held to under 300 yards in regulation.

Eric Peterman opened the scoring with a 35yard scoring reception in the first quarter. Rasheed Ward took a season-long 46yard catch into the end zone to begin the second half before Ross Lane gave the Wildcats a 23-20 advantage with an acrobatic 23-yard TD grab late in the third quarter. Ward finished the game with a career-best 101 receiving yards on seven catches.

Senior Tyrell Sutton came back from a wrist injury in the eighth game of the year to record his 16th-career 100-yard rushing game. He finished with 114 yards on 29 carries, adding 29 yards on five catches.

Northwestern held its 23-20 lead until late in the fourth quarter when Missouri's Jeff Wolfert made his third field goal of the contest. He had another chance to end the game in regulation, but his 44-yard effort as time expired sailed wide right. The Tigers scored a TD on their opening possession of overtime before keeping the Wildcats out of the end zone to secure the victory.

#### **2010 OUTBACK BOWL**



#### **GAME SUMMARY**

Senior Mike Kafka broke an Outback Bowl record with a school-record 532 passing yards, throwing for four scores and running for another to lead a furious Northwestern comeback to force overtime, but the Wildcats ultimately fell to Auburn, 38-35.

**BOWL HISTORY** 

With NU trailing by 14 and three minutes to play, Kafka scrambled for a 2-yard score to draw the Wildcats within eight, 35-27, after the extra point was blocked. On the ensuing Auburn possession, Brad Phillips forced a fumble recovered by Sherrick McManis, setting up a Kafka to Sidney Stewart 18-yard strike with 1:15 to go. A tricky 2-point conversion pass from Andrew Brewer to Brendan Mitchell tied the game.

A fumble on the ensuing kick gave NU the ball back again, but a field goal attempt went wide to force overtime. After Auburn kicked a field goal on their possession, Northwestern first attempted one of its own, but it clanged off the right upright. Auburn drew a roughing the kicker penalty to give NU another shot, however. A fake field goal on fourth-and-goal from the 2 was not successful, ending the game.

Kafka recovered from five interceptions in the game to set NCAA records for total plays by an individual (98) and total plays by a team (115). He hit Brewer for two scoring strikes and also found Drake Dunsmore in the flat before Dunsmore broke several tackles on a 66-yard catch-and-run touchdown scamper.

Brewer finished with 133 yards receiving while Dunsmore had 120. Zeke Markshausen caught 12 passes while Stewart caught 10.

### **2011 TICKETCITY BOWL**



#### GAME SUMMARY

Trailing 31-9 midway through the third quarter, Northwestern staged a furious rally at the inaugural TicketCity Bowl, pulling within one touchdown before falling to Texas Tech, 45-38.

Texas Tech held a 10-0 lead after the first before NU got on the board in the second with a 15-play, 78-yard drive capped by a Colter one-yard rush. The PAT failed, making it 10-6 before TTU pushed its lead to 24-6 at the half.

The third quarter was a wild one on the scoreboard, with both teams combining for 32 points. NU forced a fumble on the opening kickoff of the second half, converting the turnover into an

18-yard Stefan Demos field goal, but Texas Tech got an 86-yard touchdown run on the next play from scrimmage to make the score 31-9 with 11:05 left in the third. Kain Colter scored on the ensuing drive on a 15-yard rush before he found Josh Rooks on a two-point conversion pass to make it 31-17. After Texas Tech scored another touchdown. Northwestern recovered an onside kick attempt and needed just two plays to punch it in on a four-yard Evan Watkins' rush, making the score 38-24 entering the fourth.

NU scored on its third-straight drive when Watkins found Demetrius Fields for an 18-yard touchdown on fourth-and-four, cutting the deficit to 38-31 with 10:33 left to play. Texas Tech kept punching, extending its lead back to 45-31 with 7:13 left during a drive that saw Hunter Bates, NU's leading tackler with 11 at that point, carted off the field with a major leg injury.

Jordan Mabin kept the 'Cats alive with an 39-yard interception return for a touchdown to make the score 45-38 with 5:37 left, but Texas Tech all but ran out the clock on its next drive to secure the win.

#### **2011 MEINEKE CAR CARE BOWL OF TEXAS GAME SUMMARY**

Appearing in a bowl game for a fourth straight year, Northwestern came out on the short end of 33-22 outcome against Texas A&M in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas. NU scored the first touchdown of the game but TAMU ran off 27 straight points to take command.

In the final game of his NU career, quarterback Dan Persa established himself as Division I's (FBS or FCS) all-time record-holder in completion percentage. Persa wraps up his tenure at 72.7 percent (460-of-633), besting the previous NCAA record of 70.4 as set by Hawaii's Colt Brennan.

Senior safety Brian Peters came up with his 12th career interception in the game, giving him sole possession of third place on NU's all-time list, with three of those coming in bowl games.

Against the Aggies, Persa threw for 213 yards, but the Wildcats were held in check by a stout A&M defense that collected eight sacks on the day. NU gained a 7-3 lead early in the second quarter when Houston native Venric Mark scored his first career rushing touchdown on a pitch from Persa. That score capped a 13play drive that ate up nearly five minutes off the clock. Texas A&M, however, then dominated the game's next 25 minutes, running off 27 unanswered points to take a 30-7 lead with 5:59 remaining in the third quarter.

The Wildcats responded and scored back-to-back touchdowns to cut the TAMU lead to eight, 30-22. But A&M then converted a third-and-13 deep in its own territory before gaining another first on a circus catch that set up a field goal and put the game on ice, 33-22, with 30 seconds to play.



#### **GAME SUMMARY**

Northwestern jumped out to a fast 13-0 lead at the 2013 TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl and rode an NU-bowl-record four interceptions to a 34-20 victory over Mississippi State and its first 10-win season since 1995. The Gator Bowl win also gave Pat Fitzgerald his 50th victory as NU's head coach, giving him sole possession of first place on Northwestern's career coaching wins list.

The Wildcats' four interceptions matched the program's previous bowl best set in the 1949 Rose Bowl, which Northwestern won over California. Mississippi State QB Tyler Russell, who was responsible for all four interceptions, had thrown only six picks in the Bulldogs' 12 regular season games this year.

With a game-high 10 tackles and a near interception late in the game, Jared Carpenter was named the 2013 Gator Bowl MVP.

Offensively, quarterback and Florida native Trevor Siemian finished 12-of-20 passing for 120 yards—including several clutch third-down conversions—and one rushing touchdown. Among his most popular targets on the day was freshman superback Dan Vitale, who led the 'Cats with seven catches for 82 yards.

As they have all season, the Wildcats started fast when, on the third play from scrimmage, senior DL Quentin Williams dropped into coverage and intercepted Mississippi State's Tyler Russell. Williams went untouched 24 yards on the return for his first career touchdown and a quick 7-0 Northwestern advantage.

The Bulldogs regrouped on their next drive and moved inside the Wildcats red zone, but the NU defense answered the bell again when safety Ibraheim Campbell stepped in front of a Russell pass on the sideline for his fourth career interception.

Northwestern brought a 13-10 lead into the locker room but found itself in a tied game early in the third. Siemian led a quick six-play, 76-yard TD drive to restore an NU lead, then scored on a 4-yard TD rush of his own to put the 'Cats ahead by 14. MSU would pull with one score early in the fourth, but cornerback Nick VanHoose helped ice the win with an interception and long return to set up Mark's 12th rushing TD of the year and a bowl-clinching score.







#### **GAME SUMMARY**

No. 13 Northwestern returned to the New Year's Day bowl scene Friday at the 2016 Outback Bowl after the fourth 10-win season in program history, but fell in the game to No. 23 Tennessee,

Despite the loss, Northwestern's second 10-win campaign in the last four years marked a return to upper echelon of the college football world.

Northwestern's 24-member Senior Class is the lone class in #B1GCats history to win 10 games in two different seasons, winning the 2012 Gator Bowl during a 10-3 campaign and finishing 2015 with an identical 10-3 record.

Two offenses largely trying to find their way early struggled to make huge gains in the first quarter. Tennessee had a field goal try doink off the upright after intercepting an NU pass at the Wildcats' 22-yard line while Northwestern took advantage of three Volunteers late-hit penalties in the quarter -- including two on back-to-back plays -- to drive deep into UT territory prior to missing a field goal of its own.

Tennessee would open the scoring late in the first quarter with

a 14-yard Joshua Dobbs run, then add a field goal on its next possession early in the second to take a

Northwestern bounced back with an effective, well-executed 12-play, 75-yard drive capped by a Justin Jackson five-yard scoring scamper. Jack Mitchell's extra point sailed wide, making the score 10-6 after

Tennessee answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive of its own to take a 17-6 lead into the half. Coming out of the break, the Wildcats never were able to get momentum, and the Volunteers added touchdowns late in the third quarter and again on a long quarterback scramble early in the fourth to make it a 31-6 game before one final touchdown and a pick-six with eight seconds remaining made the final 45-6.

Defensively, senior Traveon Henry set a new career-high and tied the Outback Bowl record with 16 tackles, while sophomore Godwin Igwebuike had a career-high 14 stops.

## Anthony Walker, Northwestern's 'superhero,' embracing his preseason hype

Anthony Walker's teammates call him "The Franchise," and Northwestern has built a promotional campaign that depicts the linebacker as a superhero, able to stop a moving car from hitting a pedestrian.

Walker originally resisted the campaign. The son of a football coach, he said: "You don't want to be seen as arrogant. But you embrace it because your teammates are giving you that praise."

Mostly, his teammates are giving him good-natured crap.

"They're having a blast with it," NU coach Pat Fitzgerald said, "totally making fun of him."

NU tailback Justin Jackson led the Big Ten with 312 rushing attempts last season. A major key: avoiding big hits.

So does Walker tag him in practice?

"Of course," Jackson replied. "He's a superhero."

He is pretty super, reflected in SI.com's ranking him the 39th-best player in college football. The rangy and powerful Walker, a redshirt junior, tallied 201/2 tackles for a loss last season, most in the Big Ten.

"He's got a lot to improve on," Fitzgerald said, "but he's a sideline-to-sideline, physical player who can play great in the run game and pass game. Very talented."

Backup tailback Auston Anderson first tagged Walker with "The Franchise" nickname.

"I blame him and I love him for it," Walker said. "But I embrace it. We have nicknames for everybody. Clayton (Thorson) is QB1. Justin is BB&J: Bread, Butter & Justin. He's the bread and butter (of the offense), and you know what you will get from him every time."

Northwestern figures to have a similar defense to the one that ranked fourth in the Big Ten in points allowed (18.6 per game) and third in yards per rush (3.54) and opponent passer rating.

But NU's passing game was atrocious, largely because of a combination of poor receiving and Thorson's inexperience. Fitzgerald pointed to Austin Carr and Andrew Scanlan as receivers he expects to show more production.

Jackson said Thorson's confidence is "sky high" heading into his redshirt sophomore season.

"You can see it in his walk, in his face," Jackson said. "He knows it's a huge year for him."

## A 'superhero' linebacker? Northwestern's Anthony Walker fits script Bill Bender / SportingNews.com / July 28, 2016

CHICAGO — There came a point late in the recruiting process where Anthony Walker could have played at Miami.

Walker grew up in Miami. He idolized Ray Lewis, Micheal Barrow and Randy Shannon for the Hurricanes. He watched Sean Spence, Quavon Taylor and Lavonte David play together at Miami Northwestern High School. He emerged as a star at Monsignor Edward Pace High School.

"Miami was the dream school for everybody that was from Miami," Walker said at Big Ten Media Day.

Yet he knew what his father told him at an early age. Not everybody can play there. So when the Hurricanes swooped in late and were unsure whether Walker would play linebacker or safety there, Walker had made his choice.

Four years later, Walker is an All-American linebacker. He has a viral superhero campaign touting him as "The Franchise." He has a bright NFL future. He found those self-described blessings at Northwestern.

"I think that's why they (Northwestern) stayed as my choice," Walker said. "They knew I was only going to be myself. Nobody offered me anything like that. I wasn't changing my decision at that point."

Walker enjoyed that breakout season in 2015 with 122 tackles and 20.5 tackles for loss, which ranked second in the FBS. He popped in the opener in Stanford, and that's something Northwestern coach Pat Fitzgerald, a two-time Big Ten defensive player of the year who led Northwestern to two conference titles in 1995-96, noticed right away.

"I think it's his athleticism," Fitzgerald said. "You watch from the opener Stanford to Tennessee in the bowl game, two very-explosive football teams with great talent offensively. There was a non-issue when it came to athleticism, speed, not only playing in the box but more importantly playing out in space for Anthony."

Walker was the leader for a 10-3 Northwestern team that ranked in the top 15 nationally in both scoring defense and total defense, but he has a different perspective of the game film against Tennessee, a 45-6 loss in the Outback Bowl.

"You have to look at the Tennessee game and say we were flat-out embarrassed on national television when we had all this hype around us after a pretty good season," Walker said. "We embraced it. Nobody was down about it. We embraced it and we took it into spring practice and spring workouts."

So that's the mindset Walker is taking into the offseason, which has generated the viral campaign touting him as a superhero. Fitzgerald said Walker's self-awareness makes the campaign possible. Walker, meanwhile, continues to learn from Fitzgerald and other linebackers.

Walker is part of a loaded class of inside linebackers. Ohio State's Raekwon McMillan and Iowa's Josey Jewell also were in attendance. Walker also said he enjoys watching Carolina's Luke Kuechly and Buffalo's Reggie Ragland in the NFL. Walker mentioned those Miami linebackers again, too. Still, the NFL future and award watch lists "aren't something he's worried about right now."

With that comes responsibility. Fitzgerald said Walker will see more below-the-waist blocks this season, and he'll have to see that coming. But he also sees a team leader that is looking to take Northwestern to the next step toward a Big Ten West Division championship.

Fitzgerald did that a few times. Now it's Walker's turn.

"He's poised to have a special year and poised to be one of the best we've ever had," Walker said. "It's exciting times for him and for us."



## Watch list or not, Northwestern's Justin Jackson can't be ignored

Making the Doak Walker Award watch list is not exactly as tough as being a Heisman Trophy finalist.

More than 80 players were highlighted, including studs such as LSU's Leonard Fournette and Saquon Barkley of Penn State. Also included were those with major potential, such as Illinois' Ke'Shawn Vaughn and Notre Dame's Josh Adams.

Not included was the man who finished second to Ezekiel Elliott last year on the Big Ten rushing list, a player who amassed 2,605 yards in his first two seasons.

"Figures, right?" he said.

Justin Jackson doesn't have a complex about it. Based on a Google search, he's not even the most famous Justin Jackson in college sports. (That would be the 6-8 forward from North Carolina.)

It was just emblematic of playing for Northwestern, which went 10-3 last season and made few, if any, preseason top-25 lists.

"Happens all the time," he said. "No one expects us to do what we do. No one expected us to beat Stanford last year. People don't respect us, so we have to go earn that. And we're willing to do it."

It turned out that Jackson's exclusion was a simple error, not a snubbing. He was added to an updated list.

But still ...

"We need to do a better job of helping him become a household name," coach Pat Fitzgerald said. "You can't fault the media. Think about the junior and senior running backs in this league the last few years; it has been phenomenal. If Justin continues to earn it on the field, those positive things will be there."

Jackson did make second-team All-Big Ten last season, joining Barkley behind Elliott, the No. 4 overall pick in the NFL draft, and Indiana's Jordan Howard, whom the Bears grabbed in the fifth round.

You get the sense, though, that Jackson cares little about acclaim.

He's much more determined to expand his game to help redshirt sophomore quarterback Clayton Thorson, who passed for 200 yards only once last season.

"Be there (for him)," Jackson said of his plan. "Be a viable option, not only at running the ball but on check-downs, pass pro(tection). Make sure I'm blocking that sixth guy — that safety, linebacker or corner who is blitzing."

Jackson's favorite NFL backs are Adrian Peterson ("he goes so

strong, so fast") and LeSean McCoy ("he has the moves; he has the juice").

He is striving to be an all-around back who can boost his receiving numbers — 21 catches for 162 yards last season.

"I did more JUGS work than ever," he said of his summer. "I've always been pretty good at catching the ball. It really comes down to reps, muscle memory. I'm trying to evolve my game so if they need me in that spot, I'm ready."

Jackson has been so reliable that teammates call him "BB&J." Defensive backs coach Jerry Brown coined it.

It combines the ol' reliable PB&J with the sentiment that Jackson is the team's bread and butter.

"It's cool," Jackson said. "I like knowing they rely on me to make a play, heavily at times."

Jackson's 312 rushes last season put him in elite company, behind Alabama's Derrick Henry (395) and Stanford's Christian McCaffrey (337).

"I love the workload," he said. "At 15 to 20 carries, I'm in the rhythm and able to succeed in the late parts of games."

A good sentiment, but Jackson's teammates are protective of him. Watch list or not, they know he's one of the game's best tailbacks and want to keep him whole.

"He gives so much of himself day in and day out," cornerback Matthew Harris said. "I want to make sure there's no pressure on him."

## Barfknecht: Northwestern workhosrse Justin Jackson uses his wits, too

Northwestern tailback Justin Jackson's final carry of the 2015 football season was a 4-yard run in the third guarter of an Outback Bowl loss to Tennessee.

That was on New Year's Day.

Now, guess how long it took for the general soreness of football to leave his body.

"Late March or April," Jackson said.

That's no exaggeration, considering the number of collisions he had while carrying the ball 312 times, an average of 24 per game. That was third nationally, trailing only the Nos. 1 and 2 finishers in the Heisman Trophy voting — Alabama's Derrick Henry (395, 26.3) and Stanford's Christian McCaffrey (337, 24.1).

Jackson, at 5-foot-11 and 190 pounds, isn't tiny. But he has neither Henry's size (6-3, 242 pounds) nor McCaffrey's size/ speed combo (6-1, 201, 4.45-second 40-yard dash) to naturally assume such a workload.

One thing in his favor is a knack for avoiding monster hits.

"That's what I hang my hat on," Jackson said. "It's a way to protect myself. Every single carry is important, but sometimes you have to take a loss. If you are getting stood up by two guys, you want to fight for every yard, but you can't take that punishment every time."

The other plus is a burning desire to carry the ball again and again and again.

"I love the workload," he said. "I think any back wants the ball as much as possible. After 15 or 20 carries, I get in that really good rhythm. That's why I'm able to succeed a lot later in games."

Jackson, from the western suburbs of Chicago, drew high interest in recruiting, with offers from Iowa, Vanderbilt, Indiana, Minnesota, Arizona State, Syracuse, Mississippi State, Cal and Kentucky.

One suitor — Nebraska, under the previous regime — wanted him to change positions.

"I paid my own way to Lincoln for an unofficial visit," Jackson said. "They wanted me at cornerback. I wanted to play running back. We just mutually agreed to go different ways. It was a good exchange. There are no hard feelings."

It was while driving to Iowa for a visit that Jackson blurted out to his father that he wanted to commit to Northwestern.

As a true freshman, he started fall camp fifth on the Wildcats' depth chart. But after senior starter Venric Mark was suspended and transferred a week before the season, and two other backs suffered early injuries, Jackson got in the lineup quickly.

He rarely left.

Jackson ran 245 times for 1,187 yards and 10 touchdowns, earning honorable mention All-Big Ten. Last season, he moved up to second-team All-Big Ten with his 1,418 yards and five touchdowns, including 139 yards against Wisconsin's No. 2-ranked defense and 186 against Penn State's No. 14 defense.

"I feel better going into this season than last season," he said. "I feel I'm more knowledgeable in ways to take care of my body."

Jackson also has studied his craft in another way.

"This year, I want to break some longer runs so maybe I won't need quite as many carries," he said. "You'd be surprised how little a thing can be the difference between a 10-yard run and a 60-yard run.

"I've added a few things to my repertoire to hit some home runs. But I'm still that durable back you can count on in the first quarter or fourth quarter, first game or 12th game."

Jackson has run the past two seasons in the shadows of Big Ten backs such as Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon, Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah, Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott, Indiana's Tevin Coleman and Michigan State's Jeremy Langford.

Now, Wildcats coach Pat Fitzgerald said, it's time for the nation to learn about Jackson.

"We need to do a better job of helping him become a household name," Fitzgerald said. "You can't fault the media. Think about the junior and senior running backs in this league the past few

Another strong season from the team also would help Jackson.

Northwestern finished 10-3 and returns several key players (Jackson, guarterback Clayton Thorson and middle linebacker Anthony Walker). But most polls have the Wildcats picked fourth or fifth in the West Division, with pundits citing blowout losses to Michigan (38-0), Iowa (40-10) and Tennessee (45-6).

"We want to prove we were better than last year," Jackson said. "We had some huge games we didn't show up in. A lot of people look at us not negatively, but not as positively as they should."



## CFB Rank Big Ten player spotlight: Northwestern's Anthony Walker, Jr.

ESPN is unveiling its ranking of the top 100 players in college football this week, and there are no shortage of Big Ten players on the list. In total, 15 players from the league made the cut. On the Big Ten blog this week, we're highlighting each of those 15.

Up next: Northwestern linebacker Anthony Walker, who is No. 52 overall

He's already got his own comic book and lunchbox. Now all Walker needs is some hardware to complement his superhero marketing campaign.

Winning an end-of-the-year award is certainly no stretch. Walker is on every conceivable preseason watch list, and Northwestern coach Pat Fitzgerald – a two-time Bednarik and Nagurski Award winner – said in the spring, "I think he's got the opportunity to be the best we've ever had here."

The junior addressed expectations and his marketing campaign during his time representing the Wildcats in Chicago for Big Ten media days. Here are a few excerpts:

Q: How do you deal with "The Franchise" nickname and all these marketing videos?

"You take it as it comes. It's a blessing; it doesn't happen every day. Being a small kid from Miami, Florida, I was never the guy who was hyped up or talked about. Those guys earned who did get that, so I wanted to earn it as well. And I think I've done that. I've had a lot of help ..."

Q: What's been the most fun part about the marketing campaign?

"Everything. Every moment of it has been fun. The [Northwestern] media guys do a great job of keeping me in the loop of everything. And they asked me if I originally wanted to do it and I was like, 'Go ahead.' It's all fun and games. And, me being there throughout it all, I think the best part was probably stopping the car. That was all the media guys; I just do what they say."

Q: I thought you resisted it early on.

"I did, I did. Of course, you don't want to be seen as arrogant with it or anything like that. But you embrace it as it goes along because your teammates are just trying to embrace you and give you the praise that you're doing pretty well. So I just decided to go ahead and embrace it, and it's been fun."

Q: Last year there was no hype. This year, there is hype. So how are you blocking that out and improving upon last year?

"Like you said, there was no hype last year. So we didn't have any target on our shoulders. We just went out and did it. And this year, people are expecting us to be great – or at least be somewhat of what we were last year. But as we came into the offseason, we took those 10 wins and put them aside and said, 'OK, the three losses, we were dominated. The two games in the Big Ten we lost by a score of 78-10.' Seventy-eight points will get you beat every time, no matter who you're playing against. So we have to be able to go out and play our game week in and week out. Defensively, we want to be the best team in the nation. People may laugh at it because it's coming from Northwestern but, if you don't have that swag, then nobody's trying to believe in you. We believe in ourselves."

## Northwestern gets up off the canvas, beats Duke 24-13 for first win

Wouldn't it be strange if the turning point of Northwestern's season came when an opposing punter dropped a perfectly good snap?

That's what flipped Saturday night's game, helping Northwestern to a 24-13 victory over Duke on a gorgeous night in Evanston.

Could the victory mark a second life for the 1-2 Wildcats? That seems doubtful, given their continued offensive woes.

But thanks to a killer defense and the ability to capitalize on the slippery fingers of Duke punter Austin Parker, Northwestern finally did get a victory following home losses to a team from the Mid-American Conference and one from a basketball league, the Missouri Valley.

"You can't feel sorry for yourself," coach Pat Fitzgerald said. "You'd love to have those games back, but you are your record - and you have to work to get better."

The game could not have started any better for the Wildcats. They marched 75 yards on 10 plays, powering forward with the lone exception of receiver Cameron Green's hold.

Six rushes produced 48 yards, with Justin Jackson's 21-yard effort the highlight. Superback Garrett Dickerson got open on a slant pattern, and Clayton Thorson rifled one to him. The 26-yard touchdown was the first of Dickerson's career.

"It was just as we'd practiced it," Dickerson said. "Worked out perfectly."

Added Thorson: "He widened (his defender) and took him right up the seam."

On top of that, the offensive line performed flawlessly in that first drive. And then Northwestern's defense got a three-and-out.

But if you thought this victory would be easy, you don't know the Wildcats.

Their remaining first-half drives ended like this: punt, punt, interception, missed field goal.

The usual culprits were there: receivers not getting open; the line not clearing enough holes for Jackson, who finished with 94 yards on 28 carries; and Thorson, sacked five times, not recognizing corner blitzes and/or coaches not adequately preparing him for them.

Things looked even bleaker in the third quarter as Northwestern's first three plays went for minus-9 yards. Its second drive ended when Andrew Scanlan slipped coming out of a break, resulting in an interception.

But then two things went Northwestern's way: Linebacker Anthony "The Franchise" Walker finally made his presence felt, stripping Duke quarterback Daniel Jones to kill a Blue Devils drive. Fitzgerald said Walker is "finally getting back into game shape" after missing two weeks of training camp.

And then Parker, the punter, dropped a snap for a loss of 9 yards. Northwestern took a 14-7 lead on the next play as Thorson fired a perfect strike to Solomon Vault, who got open thanks to excellent footwork on a post route.

Thorson was hammered by lineman James Hornbuckle just as he released the spiral, making the 44-yard touchdown strike all the more satisfying. He completed just 18 of 39 throws but passed for 320 yards.

"He saw just about every pressure he'll see in his career," Fitzgerald said. "We have to do a better job helping him. We had some route-running that we have to get cleaned up.

"He hung in there pretty well with the amount of heat that we got."

Northwestern's defense was terrific, allowing just seven points until 51 seconds remained in the game. One of the highlights was safety Godwin Igwebuike cutting in front of tight end Daniel Helm for an interception.

Harassment charges: Northwestern quarterback Clayton Thorson wears purple on Saturdays, but his body must have purple bruises every day. Thorson got beat up again Saturday night, hit seemingly every other time he dropped back to pass. But Thorson did not miss a play, and last week he came out only to replace a contact lens. Good thing he's a sturdy 6-foot-4 and 220 pounds.

Try, try and try again: Jack Mitchell was a hero in NU's 43-40 stunner at Notre Dame, forcing overtime with a 45-yarder and ending the game by nailing one from 41. But that was 2014. And since that game, he has been mediocre. Mitchell missed from 33 yards against Illinois State, and he had a brutal time just before halftime Saturday. He came up short from 49 yards but got another chance from 34 after a roughing call. He missed that left. Mitchell dropped to 20 of 32 since the game in South Bend but did redeem himself in the third quarter, striking a 40-yarder for a 17-7 lead.

Heady player: Austin Carr nearly got decapitated going across the middle in the fourth quarter. Duke's Deondre Singleton leveled him in the shoulder/helmet area, prompting a targeting call and ejection. Remarkably, Carr (six catches for 135 yards) bounced right up and remained in the game.

What started out as a nickname to gig a teammate turned into a football marketing campaign at Northwestern.

The Wildcats razzed middle linebacker Anthony Walker, who led the Big Ten in tackles for loss last season with 20.5, by calling him "The Franchise." The fourth-year junior from Miami took a dim view of that moniker at first.

"You don't want to be seen as arrogant," Walker said. "But you eventually embrace it because your teammates are giving you that praise."

You also embrace it because if guys see a nickname bothers you, they will mercilessly taunt you with it.

"We're all having fun with it," tailback Justin Jackson said. "He has accepted it and ran with it."

Can "The Franchise" tackle Jackson?

"Of course, he's a superhero," Jackson said, smiling. "In the beginning, he hated being called 'The Franchise.' He's a really humble guy, and this kind of put him on a pedestal. But he deserves it."

To help spread the word this summer about Walker — a first-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore — Northwestern put together a mock superhero marketing kit, complete with a lunchbox, T-shirt and comic book.

"You have to be able to live up to it," Walker said. "I have guys around who can help me do that."

Any marketing sizzle about Northwestern has cooled in the wake of the Wildcats' 1-2 start ahead of Saturday's game with No. 20 Nebraska (3-0).

Home losses to Western Michigan by one point and FCS Illinois State by two points led to fan panic. Coach Pat Fitzgerald wasn't wild about the start himself, essentially throwing open all jobs in the offensive and defensive lines.

The defense has had trouble getting off the field, with the opponents holding a seven-minute-a-game edge in time of possession. Meanwhile, the offense has "left too many runners on base," as Fitzgerald said, by not finishing drives that get into opposition territory.

The Wildcats got reorganized last week with a 24-13 victory over Duke. A big assist goes to Walker.

With the score tied 7-7 at half, Duke took the third-quarter kickoff and drove to the Northwestern 17. But on a quarterback keeper,

Walker punched the ball loose and recovered it. Northwestern scored the next 17 points, and the defense didn't allow another score until the final 90 seconds when the backups played.

"Frankly, it was one of those 'it's better to be lucky than good' plays," Fitzgerald said Tuesday. "He missed the tackle, and punched out the ball. He's lucky he did.

"This week, if he does that against Tommy Armstrong, the Nebraska fight song is going to be playing."

Through three games, Walker, at 6-foot-1 and 245 pounds, has 19 tackles, including 2.5 for loss and one sack. But it wasn't until last week that he looked like himself. Fitzgerald revealed that Walker suffered an undisclosed injury in fall camp.

"It was the first Wednesday practice and he got twisted up," Fitzgerald said. "He missed about two weeks of camp. Missing two weeks of camp is tough. But I definitely think he's getting himself back into better game shape."

That's unwelcome news for Nebraska. One of Walker's best games last year was in the Wildcats' 30-28 victory in Lincoln. He had 13 tackles, including one for loss.

Last year's victory against Nebraska started a five-game Northwestern winning streak. Is another one imminent? Fitzgerald sounds unsure.

"We're far from where we need to be," he said, citing incomplete preparation. "I'll say it until I retire — you have to prepare, and part of that is mental.

"Right now, I don't think we have enough guys who trust in themselves. We don't have enough guys who just cut it loose. They get in their own heads."

That had better stop by Saturday, said "The Franchise."

"It's Big Ten play," Walker said. "We came here to play big-time football. It starts right now."

## Northwestern upset of Iowa gives doubting Thomases reason to believe

Will Northwestern fans remember this one as the Austin Carr game? The Ifeadi Odenigbo game? The game that made Wildcats football watchable again?

Yes, yes and yes.

The Wildcats awoke from a season-long funk and stunned lowa as a two-touchdown underdog. They scored early and often in a 38-31 victory that had many wondering: Where was this offense in the first four games?

Carr had three touchdown catches Saturday, not bad for a fifthyear senior who walked on and began the season with two career scores.

Odenigbo, who entered the program as a top-100 recruit, has been invisible on far too many Saturdays. But he was a demon against the Hawkeyes, sacking C.J. Beathard four times.

"Ifeadi is like a handful of our older players who were not very pleased with how they played in that first month," Northwestern coach Pat Fitzgerald said. "You get that fork in the road: You can feel sorry for yourself or you can do something about."

His contributions actually began Friday night at chapel, which is non-denominational and optional for Northwestern players. The 40 to 45 players who attended at the team hotel heard Odenigbo read from John 20:24-29 in the New Testament. It's the story of Thomas, a.k.a. Doubting Thomas.

"I don't like (public) speaking," Odenigbo said. "It's one of my pet peeves. So I was doubting myself: Will I say something that touches people?"

Odenigbo applied that to football. The Wildcats needed to stop doubting the game plan, or themselves, or whatever else had contributed to their ugly 1-3 start.

Carr said Odenigbo's message "inspired a lot of the guys."

Including Odenigbo, who said he woke up Saturday in a bit of a rage.

"We're 1-3, we're not in a good place and I'm pissed off," he said.

"We're in Iowa City. We've lost three straight games (to Iowa). We're not leaving without a win."

Northwestern typically swoons in October, but on the first play Oct. 1, the Wildcats drove tailback Akrum Wadley back two yards. They sacked Beathard on third down, and Flynn Nagel returned a punt to the Iowa 5, leading to a quick score.

Game on.

Northwestern's offense produced every which way, as Justin Jackson rushed for 171 yards on 26 carries and Clayton Thorson connected with 10 receivers. His favorite target was Carr, who scored touchdowns on half of his six receptions.

Two were spectacular: After admittedly running the wrong route, Carr worked free toward the side of the end zone and got a foot down after Thorson bought time with a scramble. Northwestern's final touchdown came after Carr caught a pass and bounced off 210-pound safety Brandon Snyder.

"(Carr) is really the key to our offense right now," said Jackson, who actually is the key to Northwestern's offense.

Iowa (3-2, 1-1 Big Ten) trailed by seven and got the ball back with just more than two minutes left. The Hawkeyes drove to midfield but when Beathard rolled to his right and fired, Trae Williams made a sliding interception to cement the victory ... and perhaps save Northwestern's season.

At 1-1 in Big Ten play, their goals are still in reach.

That seemed barely plausible for a team that entered Saturday with the worst scoring offense in the Big Ten — and 125th of 128 FBS teams.

"What was the message to staff, to the team?" Fitzgerald asked. "I'm going to keep grinding you. What we do works when we do it the way we are capable of doing it. It works. It works. We have won a lot of football games by doing it the right way. When we do it the wrong way, we've lost our fair share, too. It's a simple choice."



## After rough start, Northwestern eager to prove Iowa win was no fluke

Over the summer at Big Ten media days, when Northwestern running back Justin Jackson donned a charcoal-colored suit and smiled in front of reporters, this wasn't the season he envisioned.

A 2-3 start wasn't broached, wasn't even thought about. Back-to-back losses to Western Michigan and FCS school Illinois State remained an unlikely nightmare at that point.

"But," Jackson said Tuesday night, "just because that happened, we weren't going to let the rest of the season go by the wayside. It took us a little while to get going, but we feel like we're hitting our stride."

Saturday's upset win over two-touchdown favorite Iowa -- Northwestern's first win over the Hawkeyes since 2012 -- proved Jackson's point and potentially saved the Wildcats' season. Even Northwestern's star back didn't try to pretend otherwise: "Yeah, I mean, with having two losses in the Big Ten, it's pretty tough to get where you want to be."

Jackson said this team entered lowa City with the mindset that its back was up against the wall, that it was "angry and pissed" and needed to do whatever necessary to win. That sense of urgency carried over in practice, where players said they went at it harder last week than in the past month. It showed on the field.

Against Western Michigan, quarterback Clayton Thorson made a series of bad decisions and fumbled at the goal line. Against lowa, he beat the blitz, tossed three touchdowns "and probably had the best game of his career," according to coach Pat Fitzgerald. Against Illinois State, four Northwestern drives stalled after holding penalties. On Saturday, the Wildcats combined for just a single 5-yard flag.

"We feel like we're much better than we've shown at times in those first four games," Thorson said. "Saturday was a step for us in the right direction."

Added linebacker Anthony Walker: "Don't get me wrong, we played some great opponents -- but a lot of those games, we beat ourselves. The proof is on the film. We actually beat ourselves."

In the first four games, Northwestern's offensive line surrendered 31 tackles for loss. Against Iowa, that number dropped to just two. In the three losses, Northwestern allowed its opponents to go 6-for-6 on fourth downs -- compared to 1-for-3 in the two wins.

Signs of improvement are plentiful in Evanston, but there are still plenty of question marks. Special teams remain an issue -- the Wildcats allowed five returns of at least 32 yards Saturday -- and it's possible the Hawkeyes aren't the West contenders many thought in the preseason.

But Northwestern has built a reputation on overcoming the odds and proving doubters wrong. Thorson was quick to point that, during his career, no one gave his team a shot against Wisconsin, Notre Dame or Stanford. And last season, half of the Wildcats' 10 wins came against the Vegas favorite.

"Losing to a very good Western Michigan team and Illinois State, we're not going to be favored in a lot of games and people aren't going to pick us to win," Thorson said. "And that's all right. We kind of like that. It's fun being the underdog; it's fun beating teams that people think you shouldn't but you know you can."

This isn't the kind of season that Thorson or Jackson -- or anyone -- imagined for the Wildcats. But after Saturday's win against lowa, Jackson said this team still has reason to believe, that their disappointment has been replaced with anger and resolve.

This may not be the start Jackson hoped for back on Big Ten media days, when he laughed and talked about conference titles and better bowl games. But Northwestern still has a shot at the ending he envisioned, Jackson said, and he's not giving up on that just yet.

"If anything, we're only one game out -- and that's how we're looking at it," Jackson said, referring to Northwestern's 1-1 conference record. "If we pile up those wins, we can still be where we want at the end of the season. We're not dwelling on the past."

## Northwestern WR Austin Carr a talented performer on and off the field

Nerves aren't tiptoeing the end zone sideline for the game-tying touchdown catch in a critical early season Big Ten game. You want nerves? Try auditioning for the spring high school musical as a freshman by singing Frank Sinatra's "Luck Be A Lady." Or prepping for the California state finals of Poetry Out Loud, a national poetry recitation contest. Or sitting on stage with nothing but a chair and a Casio keyboard, performing renditions of Kings of Leon's "Use Somebody" and John Legend's "Ordinary People" in a college student-athlete talent show.

Meet Northwestern fifth-year senior wide receiver Austin Carr. Philosophy major. Academic All-Big Ten student. Musician. Singer. Actor. And, oh by the way, the Big Ten's leader in receptions, touchdown catches and yards this season.

Yes, Carr just might be the most interesting man in Big Ten football. And his on-field accomplishments don't come anywhere close to telling the full story for someone used to performing on a big stage.

"He's a guy that, he could be the President of the United States if he wants to," Northwestern coach Pat Fitzgerald said. "He's got just an unbelievable skill set. He's got acting skills, he's got singing skills, he can play the piano. He's a really, really talented young man. It's just an honor and a joy to coach a young person like him."

First, the football part. Carr may not be a household name yet among fans, but the numbers he has produced this season have been exceptional. He ranks first in the conference in touchdown catches (six), receptions (32) and receiving yards per game (93.0) despite the fact he had just 23 career catches before this season. During Northwestern's 38-31 victory against Iowa on Saturday, Carr caught six passes for 73 yards with three touchdowns in a game that could change the Wildcats' fortunes this season. Northwestern improved to 2-3 overall and 1-1 in a seemingly wideopen Big Ten West.

"I did not expect this," Carr said. "I expected to be productive this year. But, man, I just look across the Big Ten West and Big Ten East and see all the talent. It's an honor to be where I'm at right now. Everybody notices now, but there was no shortcut to have the kind of production that I and our offense has had."

That Carr is in this position is even more amazing considering coaches never actually recruited him. Instead, it was Carr who initiated contact after he was admitted to Northwestern for his academics. Once his high school coach sent the Wildcats' staff some game tape, they decided he could be a good fit -- if he were willing to walk on to the team.

Carr, a Benicia, California, native, considered walk-on options at San Diego State and TCU. Sacramento State offered him a preferred walk-on role, and smaller schools such as the Coast Guard Academy, Willamette University and Cal Lutheran expressed interest. But he wanted to truly challenge himself academically and athletically, and thought playing Big Ten football would allow him such an opportunity.

Fitzgerald called him "a self-made player," whose diligence in the weight room and on the field had allowed him to rise up the depth chart. Carr didn't play at all his first two years in the program because of injuries but eventually earned a scholarship before the 2015 season.

Carr has excelled, he said, in part because he understands the work ethic required to be a top-level performer in other fields. In high school, he participated in four musicals and two plays. He won his school's Best Lead Actor award for his role as Beast in "Beauty and the Beast." He became a member of Benicia's varsity improv team for two years and was the school and county champion for poetry recitation. And he has performed every year in Northwestern's student-athlete talent show, winning first place as a freshman in 2013 for his Kings of Leon/ John Legend medley.

"Success is, I think, directly related to the confidence you have in your preparation," Carr said. "That applies to both. There are people expecting a good performance,

people expecting greatness, people expecting to be entertained. In one way or another, both performing on stage and playing a football game is entertainment. High-quality entertainment comes from high-quality skill and high-quality preparation.

"College is an opportunity I've had to really invest in the athletic side of things. And maybe after football, I'll focus more on music."

Carr's talents in the arts as a composer, singer and pianist run deep. His mother was a concert pianist in college, while his father played drums growing up. Carr's affinity for music began, he said, in the fifth grade when he started playing songs on a 1917 ivory key baby grand piano passed down from his great grandmother.

"He's first-team all-bowl game," Fitzgerald said. "When you have the competitions at bowl games, he kills it."

Carr remembers seeing the "Lion King" musical in downtown San Francisco with his mother and thinking about how much fun it would be to perform on stage. He sang in the church choir and began taking drama classes in middle school. By high school, he was ready to further pursue his passion as an actor and singer. He first took the plunge when he sang that Sinatra song from "Guys and Dolls" as part of an audition for the musical "Once Upon a Mattress."

"They took a chance on the freshman that they'd never seen before," Carr said. "I fell in love with the theater atmosphere. I fell in love with singing on stage and putting on a performance."

Through five weeks this football season, no Big Ten receiver has performed better. That's music to Northwestern's ears.



## Northwestern offense continues turnaround in 54-40 win at Michigan State

EAST LANSING, Mich. — When coach Pat Fitzgerald declared after Northwestern's Sept. 24 loss to Nebraska, "we can't do the things that losers do," and pledged to "fix" the problem, few believed he could.

At that point Northwestern was 1-3 with a home loss to Illinois State and an offense that put fans to sleep faster than an Ambien.

The Wildcats have not lost since that night. And perhaps even more surprising, they are playing wildly entertaining football.

They erupted for a 54-40 victory Saturday at Michigan State, their highest output since beating Indiana 59-38 in 2011.

And to think, the over-under for this game (i.e. expected point total) was 42.

Northwestern is now 3-3 and 2-1 in the Big Ten. September seems long ago.

Fitzgerald made a half-serious plea to reporters to stop asking about the beginning of the season.

"We weren't very good," he said. "I have zero answers other than that we didn't coach well enough and didn't play well enough, but we have stayed the course and kept grinding. Good things usually happen when you respond."

Perhaps this performance at Spartan Stadium will turn out to be a microcosm for the season.

Northwestern trailed 14-0 midway through the first quarter after Clayton Thorson made a bad decision, firing across the field on third-and-6. His pass was a gift to cornerback Justin Layne, who returned it for a touchdown.

"It was my fault; everyone realized it," Thorson said.

But from that moment on, Thorson was spectacular. He finished 27 of 35 for 281 yards, three scores and the lone interception. He also rushed for a 9-yard touchdown, opting not to pitch before charging up the middle.

"We're usually yelling, 'No, no,' when he cuts it back," joked tailback Justin Jackson, who scored on touchdowns of 29 and 26 yards.

Thorson closed out the game in style, hitting Austin Carr with a perfect fourth-down pass on a corner route that made it 54-37 with about five minutes to play. Michigan State fans began exiting en masse, something the NU players noticed.

"The silence was deafening," Thorson said. "It felt good."

Said defensive end Ifeadi Odenigbo: "When A.C. scored, everyone started packing. We said, 'Yes, this is a victory."

Odenigbo pointed out that NU's last two road games fell on homecoming, often a sign of low respect for the opponent.

"We got a taste of that at Iowa," he said. "We talked about it: This is our homecoming here."

Their actual homecoming will be Saturday, when Indiana visits Ryan Field.

Northwestern, which entered the game 107th nationally in total offense, had season highs with 490 yards and 26 first downs. The offense was balanced (281 passing, 209 rushing), did not commit a single holding penalty and went 10-for-19 on third down.

Angry fans were ready to escort offensive coordinator Mick McCall out of Evanston after the first four weeks, but the Wildcats have completely flipped the script.

Michigan State, meanwhile, remains in free fall. Since clubbing Notre Dame to start 2-0, the Spartans have lost four straight, three at home. The 54 points were the most they've ever allowed in a home game.

Asked about his team's poor tackling, Michigan State coach Mark Dantonio replied: "I'm not going to sit up here and point fingers at particular players. It's a team sport. And without watching the film, it's difficult to say who missed what."

And easy to say Northwestern is in the midst of a remarkable turnaround.

## Joe Gaziano brings fresh spark to Northwestern's defensive line

In July, Joe Gaziano's father, Frank Gaziano, was sworn in as a judge on the Massachusetts Supreme Court.

But last Saturday, it was Joe who delivered justice, demolishing Michigan State quarterback Brian Lewerke for a safety in his first career sack.

"I used my hands well against the offensive tackle, and I was able to beat him," Gaziano said. "As soon as I got a step, I was just thinking to get to the quarterback as fast as possible ... and that speed that I used getting around the block just propelled me through him."

Highlight clips of the redshirt freshman's sack went semi-viral on the Internet, and the Big Ten received its first glimpse of the man expected to become Northwestern's next dominant defensive lineman. After the game, coach Pat Fitzgerald credited the play with turning the tide in the 54-40 win — the Cats were losing 17-14 prior to the safety.

Gaziano arrived in Evanston last fall as the defending Gatorade Player of the Year in Massachusetts and the second-highest ranked member of NU's 2015 recruiting class. He soon discovered, however, that he had a lot left to learn — and a host of great defensive ends, including future NFL players Dean Lowry and Deonte Gibson, from which to learn.

"They taught me a lot of what the base defense was, of what we're trying to do as defensive linemen at Northwestern," Gaziano said. "Dean played with a lot of tenacity and a relentless effort, and it was great to learn from and see him do that. ... Deonte also played with a lot of speed and power, and it was great to watch him and how he would translate that to the field."

Throughout his 2015 redshirt year, Lowry and Gibson, in addition to defensive line coach Marty Long, helped Gaziano adjust to the college game.

"A year ago, he played really, really high; he didn't use his hands as well," Long said. "Now he's punching and separating and getting off blocks and making plays."

This fall, the 6-foot-4, 265-pound lineman began seeing sporadic playing time, recording nine tackles through the first five games of the season.

But when junior starting defensive end Xavier Washington went down with an injury last week, Gaziano knew his role was about to increase dramatically — and he was prepared.

After studying the playbook "in and out" all week, Gaziano aced a written test on gap exchanges, blitz packages and other memorized material on Friday night, Long

"He did perfect on it, and I told him that he needed to go out and play that way," Long said. "And he did."

Playing primarily on third downs, Gaziano was 7-for-7 at the "point of attack" by the method the team uses, Fitzgerald said. In the box score, he recorded a careerhigh four tackles — including the gamechanging sack — and alertly recovered a loose-ball fumble in the third quarter.

He was awarded the team's Defensive Player of the Week award for the performance.

"We needed a big play having (Washington) down last week, and Joe came through," senior defensive end C.J. Robbins said. "You could see by the first couple drives that we came out flat, and that (sack) really gave us the spark that we needed."

Washington is again not expected to play in Saturday's homecoming game against Indiana, but Long said Gaziano's performance in East Lansing earned the young lineman more playing time moving forward regardless of the rest of the team's injury report.

The key to that increased playing time could be his versatility: Despite playing mostly end so far, Gaziano can play all four positions on the defensive line.

"I have a good first step, and I'm quick off the ball, so I'm able to play end, and I'm able to chase down a running back or quarterback because I've got that speed," Gaziano said. "But also I have the ability to play low to the ground and take on blocks well and be stout on the inside."

The same high level of adaptability which made Gaziano a top recruit two years ago has now molded him into an important fill-in contributor for the defense during the second half of the season — and the likely heir to an every-week starting role once Robbins and senior Ifeadi Odenigbo graduate in spring.

"He'll play all four positions because he has the ability to do that," Long said. "He has the size, the range and he understands the complete package."



## Why is Northwestern's offense humming? Its receivers are catching on

For much of last season, Northwestern quarterback Clayton Thorson was a liability.

Now he's an asset, made clear by his performances in victories at Iowa and Michigan State. In those two games, the redshirt sophomore completed 45 of 65 passes (69.2 percent) for 445 yards and six touchdowns with one interception. He also rushed for two touchdowns and took just two sacks.

Several things have helped him, starting with a line that is blocking better and not committing holding penalties to put the offense in third-and-long.

Another huge factor has been the sticky hands of Thorson's receivers.

Top wideouts Austin Carr and Flynn Nagel have been uber-reliable, according to Pro Football Focus data. Entering Saturday's homecoming game against Indiana, Carr has dropped just two passes while hauling in a Big Ten-best 43 catches for a drop rate of 4 percent. He also leads the conference with 595 receiving yards and eight touchdown catches.

Nagel's drop rate is even lower — 0. The sophomore from Lemont has snared all 16 catchable balls thrown his way. Neither Andrew Scanlan nor Macan Wilson has dropped a pass, either, in a combined 17 catchable balls.

The team drop rate of 4 percent is in stark contrast to last season, when NU receivers dropped 16 percent of Thorson's throws. They caught just 92 passes and mishandled 17. Christian Jones had a drop rate of 23 percent.

Coach Pat Fitzgerald said NU receivers went "all-in" during offseason workouts after being judged as the team's weak link. That work is paying off, hands down.

## Northwestern comes out firing vs. Indiana, holds on for third straight win Mike Helfgot / Chicago Tribune / Oct. 22, 2016

The offensive transformation from cloud of dust to pick your poison went on for another 30 minutes, then abruptly stopped.

Consistent with the all-or-nothing nature of the Northwestern offense this season, the Wildcats did nothing after halftime — unless you count 37 yards as something.

The 371 they piled up in the first half still carried the day.

A week after a performance for the ages at Michigan State, Northwestern came out firing again, riding Clayton Thorson's three first-half touchdown passes to a 24-14 victory over Indiana before a homecoming crowd of 35,417 on Saturday at Ryan Field.

The Wildcats had scored 116 points in 10 quarters before being shut out in the second half. They'll take a three-game winning streak and Big Ten West title aspirations with them to Columbus, Ohio, next weekend for a meeting with No. 2 Ohio State.

Northwestern (4-3, 3-1) upset Iowa and Michigan State on the road before knocking off the Hoosiers (3-4, 1-3).

"In a way, we're not really satisfied with how this game ended," said Austin Carr, whose seven receptions for 125 yards and a touchdown extended his Big Ten lead in all three departments. "That's a good thing because we are going to go into next week even hungrier.

"We felt we left a lot out there ... a lot of drives sputtered, and this week we're going to have those memories of ... some of the things that should have been different. It was kind of a blessing in disguise because this coming week, we've got to be better."

Coach Pat Fitzgerald was more measured.

"A month ago 408 yards would have been an epiphany for our offense," he said, "so let's keep some things in perspective."

Indiana amassed 403 yards, but the Wildcats were happy with their defensive effort.

A week after calling his injury-riddled secondary "abysmal" in the 54-40 victory over Michigan State, Fitzgerald said his defensive leaders — linebacker Anthony Walker Jr. (11 tackles, two for a loss) and safety Godwin Igwebuike — played their best games of the season.

The Hoosiers scored only one touchdown and were 5 of 19 on third down. Safety Kyle Queiro and cornerback Montre Hartage intercepted Richard Lagow, who needed 59 passes for his 319 yards.

The Wildcats were without their top four cornerbacks entering the season for most of the game.

"I have to attribute our DBs' success to Godwin," Queiro said. "He had us all focused, all ready to play."

Fitzgerald said he was "furious" Thursday night when he found the door to the defensive backs' meeting room unlocked.

"I open the door and there's all the secondary guys in there watching tape," he said. "I was pleasantly surprised. ... I told them after the game, this goes back to the way we prepared."

Early on it looked like the Wildcats might treat the crowd to another 50-point explosion. Thorson (24 of 43, 285 yards) led them right down the field on their first two possessions, connecting with Solomon Vault on a 17-yard score and Carr from 34 yards out.

Macan Wilson followed with his first career touchdown on a 34yard post route on the first play of the second quarter.

"We haven't put together three phases of 60-minute football," Fitzgerald said. "We're not going to stop coaching the heck out of these guys until we get that accomplished."

Catch of the day: Northwestern's Montre Hartage and Kyle Queiro will have to settle for a tie because both came up with spectacular interceptions. Beat in man coverage in the second quarter, Hartage made up ground when the ball was in the air and without turning his head raised his arm just in time to deflect the ball, which landed in his other arm. With NU clinging to a 24-12 lead midway through the fourth, Quiero leaped and reached behind his back to come down with a one-handed interception that essentially sealed the win.

Unsung hero: Marcus McShepard moved from cornerback to receiver in the offseason because the Wildcats needed help there. But with Austin Carr, Flynn Nagel and Solomon Vault emerging and a slew of injuries at cornerback, he moved back a few weeks ago and saw major time Saturday after Alonzo Mayo was injured in the first quarter. Indiana tested him all day, and McShepard held up well with two passes defended and seven tackles. "What an unselfish guy," coach Pat Fitzgerald said.

Just short: Justin Jackson came up 6 yards shy of his third straight 100-yard game on 28 carries. The Big Ten rushing leader coming in, he is 208 yards from his third straight 1,000-yard season.

# Big Ten Leading Receiver. Gifted Musician. Northwestern Walk-on Austin Carr is Not Throwing Away His Shot

If football didn't work out, Austin Carr had a back-up plan. It involved costumes, make-up and sing-a-longs. It would have been set to a soundtrack.

Sounds strange, right? It makes sense if you understand the foundation: Carr, the Northwestern receiver who leads the Big Ten with 112.2 yards per game, was raised in a household that celebrates music, with a drummer father (Evan Carr's band, Bozaque, did shows with Ice-T) and piano-playing mother. He is what you might call well-rounded, excelling on the football field and on stage, where he starred in musical theater productions each of his four years at Benicia High in Northern California. His crowning achievement, he says, came his junior year, when he headlined Benicia's production of Beauty and the Beast, playing the Beast. "Please do not look up pictures from that," he begs, only half-kidding. He also had roles in Once Upon a Mattress (village ensemble person), Into the Woods (Cinderella's Prince) and The Music Man (barbershop quartet).

When it came time to choose between his two loves, he decided to invest fully in football, eager for an opportunity to contribute to one of the top college programs in the country. It did not mater that he had no Power 5 scholarship offers coming out of high school; Carr believed he could compete at the highest level. Much like the characters in Hamilton, the wildly popular musical that's sold out Broadway every night since its August 2015 debut and which Carr has recently become a fan of, he could relate to being young, scrappy and hungry. You could say ... he didn't want to throw away his shot.

"Lin-Manuel Miranda is a genius, obviously," Carr says, digressing into a completely different topic. His favorite musical, he says, is probably Miranda's first hit, In the Heights. Carr holds a special affinity for the classic Hairspray.

But back to football. At Benicia, Carr was an explosive, versatile weapon on offense, rushing for 1,481 yards, recording 844 receiving yards and accounting for 30 total touchdowns. He graduated as the all-time leading rusher and scorer in Panthers program history. But he received next to nothing, scholarshipwise. Sacramento State showed some interest, as did Division-III schools Cal Lutheran of Thousand Oaks, Calif., and Willamette University in Salem, Ore. (D-III schools do not offer athletic aid.) He applied to Northwestern on a whim, thinking, "Chicago would be a really dynamic place to be." He also considered San Diego State and TCU. Wherever he went, he knew he wanted to try football.

A spring visit to Northwestern's campus confirmed he wanted to move to the Midwest. He contacted Wildcats coach Pat Fitzgerald, who told Carr there was a spot for him on the roster and that maybe, possibly, he could contribute one day.

"It was basically a cold call, from him, asking about football and I

was like, 'Well, sure,'" says Fitzgerald, Northwestern's 11th-year head coach. "Then, his freshman year, I get the injury report from our trainer, and Austin has cut his finger with a butter knife. The trainer tells me he might need surgery because he's 'almost a concert pianist' and we're going to get an MRI because he needs to make sure there's no ligament damage. And I'm like, 'You have got to be kidding me."

Carr says his first few weeks of college football were the same as any other walk-on trying to adjust to a major jump in the size and speed of other players. "I'm looking around my class and seeing guys who got offered by Louisville, Ohio State, Michigan," Carr says, "And I'm thinking, 'There is so much talent here, this might be a process."

Carr, who measures 6'1" and 200 pounds, spent the first two seasons "just trying to get better," redshirting in 2012 and not seeing any game action as a redshirt freshman in 2013. After that season, when Northwestern finished 5–7, receivers coach Dennis Springer pulled Carr into his office for a reality check. "You're getting better," Springer told Carr. "But you need to fight to stay relevant. You need to give me a reason to put you on the field."

Carr decided it was time for an overhaul. He didn't think it was possible to commit to being better just at football; it would take discipline on and off the field to accomplish his goals. He says that manifested itself in a myriad of ways: studying every single day to up his GPA, not cutting corners in the weight room, being "the guy who was willing to put in extra work." He saw instant results. That winter he started to win one-on-one battles with defensive backs.

"When I started to catch passes it was like, 'Oh wait that was Austin getting open?'" Carr recalls. "Heads started to turn and people were saying 'Wow!'"

He played for the first time the following season, as a redshirt sophomore, taking advantage of injuries to appear in all 12 games and catch seven passes for 100 yards. His first reception came on Aug. 30, 2014, against Cal, a moment and game where he still remembers numerous details. After hauling in a three-yard catch, Carr ran back to the middle of the field thinking, "There are tens of thousands of people here watching me play football!"

"I'd never had that," he says now. "I was so excited I almost started to hyperventilate. Typical for a rookie."

Carr became integral last season, finishing with 302 receiving yards, second on the team. But he's exploded this year, leading the conference in receiving and totaling 1,010 yards and 10 touchdowns on 70 catches. (The Wildcats' next-best receiving option is Flynn Nagel, who has just 289 yards on the season.) Fitzgerald says that's both a testament to Carr's personal

improvement—he notes Carr's route-running ability and smooth hands that allow him to catch almost anything thrown his direction and turn it into a big play—and the development of Wildcats quarterback Clayton Thorson, who last season completed just 51% of his passes but is up to 57% this year and has more than doubled his passing yardage per game.

For his part, Carr is grateful he walked on at a place where "they really do give you an opportunity, for an extended period of time, to prove yourself." Sometimes he's still puzzled that he belongs, lined up across from four and five-star prospects, players who had so much recruiting mail they couldn't keep track of it all.

"When I'm out there making plays and playing with them, the world gets to see that," Carr says. "But my teammates always remind me, no one was saying anything about Austin Carr a year ago."

He's still not convinced people are talking about him. While Fitzgerald says Carr will have the chance to play on Sundays, Carr can't even wrap his mind around playing professionally. "I mean, you're not talking about me, right?" he says. "You're talking about those guys who are twice as big as me, who will play in the NFL for 5–10 years, right?"

He pauses. "Of course I hope I get that opportunity but to be honest, those letters haven't even registered in my vocabulary yet."

Plus, he's got other things to think about. While football has worked out so far—much better than he could have anticipated—Carr still finds time for music. He won Northwestern's student-athlete talent show his freshman year, when he played the piano and sang a medley of "Use Somebody" by Kings of Leon and "Ordinary People" by John Legend. He took third his sophomore year as part of a band and had a "recorder face-off" with Northwestern's defensive tackle Max Chapman his junior year. Last year he sang again, this time an original song he'd written (in his oodles of free time) called "Broken In."

"I love performance and music, and being in that show is a taste of that," Carr says. "It fills that creative desire and allows me to stretch that muscle. It's kinda my opportunity to shine off the field."

Music's a suitable backup plan, for sure. For now, though, Carr is busy shining on the field.



## Northwestern takes step toward bowl with 45-17 pounding of Purdue

Yes, Northwestern fans, feel free to utter the b-word.

Scan those bowl projections. Study the locations. Thirsting to visit wine country? Think Foster Farms. Prefer to protest near Trump Tower? Cross your fingers for the Pinstripe Bowl.

"Getting to the postseason," Northwestern coach Pat Fitzgerald said, "is a great motivator."

Now, a warning: Northwestern still is not bowl eligible. And its 45-17 demolition of Purdue needs to be viewed in this context—it came against Purdue, which is pitiful.

But the Wildcats (5-5, 4-3 Big Ten), with remaining games at Minnesota and against Illinois, are primed to play a 13th game. And if they can finish 7-5, they're sure to play somewhere desirable.

"We view these last three games as a three-game playoff," receiver Austin Carr said. "One down, two to go. We want to win out, get a quality bowl game."

For a team that started 0-2 with a home loss to Illinois State, that would be a nice accomplishment.

Now back to Saturday's game, which was played before an official crowd of 30,548 at roughly two-thirds empty Ross-Ade Stadium on a cloudless 52-degree day.

Northwestern actually trailed 10-0 early, Northwestern quarterback Clayton Thorson made just enough questionable decisions in the first half to keep Purdue close even though Fitzgerald took the blame for a red-zone interception in which Thorson tried to hit a well-covered Carr.

"That was on us," Fitzgerald said. "We shouldn't have called that He was a stud here." play."

Perhaps Purdue (3-7, 1-6) has been drinking spiked Gatorade in the locker room. The Boilermakers were outscored 83-10 in the second half of their previous three games, and Saturday brought more of the same — a 31-7 Northwestern advantage.

With a 14-10 lead, the Wildcats pounded away in their first drive after the break. They rushed five times for 69 yards, ending with Justin Jackson's nifty 14-yard run.

He finished with 127 yards on 22 carries, and redshirt freshman backup John Moten IV went for 119 yards on 16 carries. It marked Northwestern's first game with two 100-yard rushers since Treyvon Green and Kain Colter did it against Western Michigan in 2013.

Thorson was happy to see Moten contribute, saying: "Justin is

one of best backs in the country, but we can't have him taking 85 snaps a game."

Four plays after Jackson's touchdown, Purdue's David Blough threw one of his three interceptions.

He fired a ball right to linebacker Anthony Walker, who said: "Good things happen when you're in position."

On Northwestern's next play, Thorson found superback Garrett Dickerson streaking down the seam, wide open for a 42-yard score.

"Mick called a really good game," Fitzgerald said of offensive coordinator Mick McCall, who certainly deserves credit for helping to pull this offense out of the gutter.

Make no mistake: West Lafayette is where you come to get fat, and we're not talking about pork tenderloin sandwiches.

The Boilermakers entered Saturday last in the Big Ten in scoring defense (37.7 per game), total defense (451.6 yards per game) and rush defense (5.7 yards per carry).

The Wildcats took full advantage, gaining a season-high 605 yards. (Previous high: 490, at Michigan State).

Thorson played a tidy second half to finish 23 of 36 for 352 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. Carr caught two touchdown passes, giving him 12. That ties D'Wayne Bates single-season school standard set in 1996.

"Pretty rare air," Fitzgerald said.

Said Carr: "I would love to meet him sometime, shake his hand. He was a stud here "

## **Austin Carr Named Burlsworth Trophy Finalist**

EVANSTON, III. — Northwestern senior wide receiver Austin Carr has been named one of three finalists for the 2016 Burlsworth Trophy awarded to the nation's most outstanding player who began his career as a walk-on.

Carr, Oklahoma quarterback Baker Mayfield and Washington State quarterback Luke Falk were chosen from 52 nominees that were narrowed down to 10 semifinalists last week.

The winner will be announced at a ceremony on Dec. 5 in Springdale, Arkansas, and is presented by the Springdale Rotary Club.

Carr has been among the nation's best receivers this season, ranking sixth in the country with a Northwestern single-season record 12 touchdowns. He ranks ninth nationally with 1,102 receiving yards and 7.5 receptions per game. He has caught a touchdown in eight of 10 games, including a nation-best streak of six-consecutive games from Sept. 10 to Oct. 22.

Below is a list of Carr's accomplishments in 2016 thus far:

- Leads the Big Ten in receptions (75), receiving yards (1,102) and touchdowns (12).

## Austin Carr Named Finalist for 2016 Biletnikoff Award

EVANSTON, III. — Northwestern senior wide receiver Austin Carr has been named one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the outstanding receiver in college football by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation.

Carr, Oklahoma's Dede Westbrook and East Carolina's Zay Jones were selected in voting by the 530 members of the Biletnikoff Award National Selection Committee in a year of an exceptional profusion of superb receivers and in the heaviest vote in the history of the award.

## Northwestern's 42-21 romp over Illinois sets it up to go bowling

Before Northwestern decided its postseason fate, another question loomed Saturday at Ryan Field.

It was answered in the affirmative when cheerleader Amber Newell accepted backup linebacker Josh Roberts' proposal near midfield during a senior day ceremony a few minutes before kickoff against Illinois.

"He came to see me last week, and I gave him the crusty old coach: 'You want to do what? When? Are you kidding me?'" Northwestern coach Pat Fitzgerald said. "He thought I was going to say no. ... The guys were fired up. Josh came running into the locker room before the game. They were like, 'Did she say yes?' It was an important deal."

The Wildcats got another important yes answer Saturday.

And now the important invitation Northwestern fans will be waiting on is whether they RSVP to the Pinstripe Bowl or the Foster Farms Bowl after beating Illinois 42-21 in the rivals' regular-season finale.

Securing back-to-back bowl engagements is a notable achievement for the Wildcats (6-6, 5-4 Big Ten), who started the season 1-3.

"We've responded to a lot of adversity," quarterback Clayton Thorson said. "Everyone counted us out after those first four games. That's not how we wanted the season to go. ... It's interesting when everyone from the outside is doubting you and everyone on the inside comes together."

Junior running back Justin Jackson proved essential again, rushing for 173 yards and three touchdowns on 21 carries. John Moten IV added to Northwestern's rushing attack, supplying another 128 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries.

Northwestern's defensive toughness was on display as well. The Wildcats took advantage of the error-prone Illini, recovering three fumbles and snagging an interception and turning each one into a touchdown.

Illinois had fought back from an early 21-0 hole to be in position to tie the game early in the third quarter, but running back Reggie Corbin fumbled at the Northwestern 8-yard line. The Wildcats scored on Jackson's 54-yard touchdown run three plays later for a 28-14 lead.

The victory marked a second-straight season Northwestern secured the Land of Lincoln rophy against Illinois (3-9, 2-7).

"Everything was riding on it: the rivalry, the Land of Lincoln Trophy, the ability to get ourselves into the postseason," Fitzgerald said. "All those things make it extra special."

The Wildcats now are waiting on a couple of meaningful postseason dates.

"We talk a lot in our world about legacy and impact," Fitzgerald said. "The first couple of weeks of the season sure didn't look very good. To the players' credit, they're the ones who kept it together and they're the ones who responded."



## Five Wildcats Earn All-Big Ten Honors on Defense/Special Teams

EVANSTON, III. — Northwestern defensive end Ifeadi Odenigbo was voted 2016 First-Team All-Big Ten by the media, the Big Ten announced on Monday. The senior was one of five Wildcats to earn all-conference honors on defense and special teams, a list that was unveiled Tuesday evening on Big Ten Network.

Odenigbo earned first-team honors from the media and a second-team plaudit from the Conference's coaches after leading the league with 10 sacks in the regular season. He picked up his 10th sack of the season in the 'Cats' 42-21 win over Illinois to help Chicago's Big Ten Team become bowl eligible for the 13th time in program history. The Centerville, Ohio, native's season was highlighted by back-to-back multi-sack games in which he set a Northwestern single-game record with four sacks at lowa before recording two more sacks in a victory at Michigan State. Odenigbo ranks second in program history with 23.5 career sacks.

Junior linebacker Anthony Walker, Jr., and safety Godwin Igwebuike were named to the second team by the league's coaches and third team by the media. Junior kick returner Solomon Vault was a third-team selection by the media as a return specialist and sophomore cornerback Montre Hartage received an honorable mention plaudit from the media.

Igwebuike led all Big Ten defensive backs and ranked 10th in the country in the regular season with 101 tackles. He had at least eight tackles in eight games, including three double-digit performances and a career-high 15 tackles versus Nebraska. The Pickerington, Ohio, native ranks seventh in the country with 6.3 solo tackles per game.

Walker enters the bowl game two tackles shy of recording back-to-back 100-tackle seasons as he ranks 11th in the league with 98 tackles through 12 games. Hampered by an injury sustained during training camp, Walker has been dominant over the final eight games of the season averaging 9.4 tackles per game. He had at least eight tackles in seven games this season, including double-digit performances at lowa, versus Indiana and at Purdue. The Miami, Florida, native has 10 tackles for loss, two sacks, three forced fumbles, a pair of fumble recoveries and one interception.

Vault earned Third-Team All-Big honors as a return specialist for the second-straight season. The Gaithersburg, Maryland, native ranked third in the Big Ten and seventh in the country with a 25.3 kick return average and scored his fifth career kick return touchdown with a 95-yard score in the Wildcats' win at Michigan State.

A first-year starter, Hartage led the Wildcats with five interceptions and nine pass breakups. He was fifth on the team with 56 tackles, including 46 solo stops.

In addition, senior defensive lineman C.J. Robbins was named Northwestern's Sportsmanship Award nominee. The 14 student-athletes selected are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. These students must also be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting.

## Austin Carr Named Richter-Howard Big Ten Receiver of the Year

EVANSTON, III. — Northwestern senior Austin Carr has been named the Richter-Howard Big Ten Receiver of the Year, becoming the first player in program history to earn the distinguished award.

Carr led the Big Ten in receptions (84), receiving yards (1,196) and receiving touchdowns (12), and is one pace to join Desmond Howard (Michigan, 1990) and Allen Robinson (Penn State, 2012) as the only players since 1990 to lead the league in all three categories. His 12 touchdown receptions have tied the Northwestern single-season record, while his 84 receptions and 1,196 receiving yards are the second most in a season.

The Benicia, California, native set a Northwestern record with a touchdown reception in six-consecutive games from Sept. 10 to Oct. 22. He caught at least four passes in all 12 games and finished the regular season ranked 12th in the country in receiving yards and touchdowns and 13th in receiving yards per game (99.7) and receptions per game (7.0). Carr is also a finalist for the 2016 Burlsworth Trophy.

The Biletnikoff Finalist became the Wildcats' first consensus All-Big Ten First Team selection on offense since Drake Dunsmore in 2011. He was joined on the all-conference offensive squad by junior running back Justin Jackson (first team media/second team coaches) sophomore quarterback Clayton Thorson (honorable mention), sophomore offensive lineman Tommy Doles (honorable mention) and junior superback Garrett Dickerson (honorable mention media).

Jackson earned first-team honors after being named a consensus second-team selection last season. He led the Big Ten with 1,300 rushing yards and set a new career-high with 12 touchdowns. The junior running back became the first player in program history to post 1,000-plus rushing yards in three-straight seasons and already ranks second in program history with 3,905 yards. A native of Carol Stream, Illinois, Jackson posted five 100-yard rushing performances, including a season-high 188 yards and two touchdowns in a 54-40 win at Michigan State. He capped the season with 173 yards and career-high three touchdowns in Northwestern's 42-21 win over Illinois.

Thorson earned honorable mention honors after etching his name in the Northwestern record book by tying the single-season record with 21 touchdown passes. His 2,968 passing yards this season are the most by a NU quarterback in their sophomore season and the fourth most overall with a bowl game still to be played. Thorson threw for over 250 yards in six-consecutive games from Oct. 15 to Nov. 19 and tossed a career-high three touchdown passes five times, becoming the first Northwestern quarterback to accomplish the feat since at least 2000.

Doles started all 12 games for the Wildcats as a redshirt sophomore, including 11 at right guard and the regular-season finale at right tackle. He helped pave the way for the Big Ten's leading rusher in Jackson and helped Chicago's Big Ten Team rank fourth in the conference in passing yards.

Dickerson also earned honorable mention honors for the first time in his career after ranking second among Big Ten tight ends with four touchdowns. He caught a pass in all 12 games and had at least two catches in seven contests. A starter in all 12 games, Dickerson finished the regular season with 29 catches for 272 yards.



# Jackson, Carr Named to CoSIDA Academic All-America® Second Team NUSports.com / Dec. 1

EVANSTON, III. — Senior wide receiver Austin Carr and junior running back Justin Jackson were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America® Second Team Thursday morning, the organization announced.

Carr and Jackson are the first Academic All-Americans since Brian Arnfelt (second team) and Patrick Ward (first team) in 2012.

A economics major with a 3.31 grade point average, Jackson leads the Big Ten in rushing with 1,300 yards. He was named to the All-Big Ten first team on Wednesday and is the first player in program history to rush for 1,000-plus yards in three-straight seasons. Jackson scored a career-high 12 touchdowns during the regular season, including three in the season opener versus Western Michigan and in the season finale versus rival Illinois.

Carr has had one of the best seasons by a receiver in program history. He was named the Richter-Howard Big Ten Receiver of the Year after leading the league in receptions (84), receiving yards (1,196) and touchdowns (12). His 12 scores tied the Northwestern single-season record, while his receptions and yards marks are the second most in a season by a Wildcat.

The Benicia, California, native earned a bachlelor's degree in philosophy with a 3.53 GPA and is currently pursuing a master's degree from the Kellogg School of Management.

## Northwestern to play Pittsburgh in Pinstripe Bowl on Dec. 28

After waiting until the last game of the season to secure bowl eligibility, Northwestern learned Sunday it will play Pittsburgh in the Pinstripe Bowl at New York's Yankee Stadium on Dec. 28.

"Our entire football family is ecstatic for the opportunity to take the field one more time this season in an iconic setting," coach Pat Fitzgerald said in a statement. "I have great respect for Pat Narduzzi, his staff, and the Panthers student-athletes. They've done a remarkable job this season. This is going to be a tremendous challenge against a disciplined and physical opponent. We can't wait to get to New York."

The Wildcats (6-6) are playing in a bowl game for a second straight season, following last season's 10-win campaign. They turned around their season this year after a 1-3 start that included home losses to Illinois State and Western Michigan.

They bounced back with a 5-4 Big Ten season that included victories against bowl-bound teams Iowa and Indiana. Northwestern earned its sixth win by beating Illinois at home in the regular-season finale behind another impressive performance from running back Justin Jackson.

Pittsburgh (8-4) owns some impressive victories. The Panthers handed No. 2 Clemson its only loss, and its victory against Penn State essentially kept the Nittany Lions out of the College Football Playoff.

The Panthers, who are coached by former Michigan State defensive coordinator Narduzzi, have won three straight games. Three of Pitt's losses were by seven or fewer points.

"You see (Narduzzi's) DNA all over the team," Fitzgerald said. "They're tough. They're physical.

The schools last played in 1973, a 21-14 Pitt victory in Evanston when Tony Dorsett rushed for 265 yards. The all-time series between the teams is 3-3, and they've never met in a bowl game.

Despite playing in a lower-level bowl than last season, Northwestern hopes to secure a bowl victory after losing 45-6 last season to Tennessee in the Outback Bowl.

"We have some memories from last year and we want to erase and get that taste out of our mouths," Fitzgerald said.

The Wildcats offense has shown significant improvement with key players Jackson and receiver Austin Carr.

Carr won the Big Ten's Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year award after leading the conference with 84 receptions, 1,196 yards and 12 touchdowns. Jackson moved into second on Northwestern's all-time rushing list, jumping ahead of Tyrell Sutton (2005-08), with 3,905 career yards, including 1,300 this season.

"It's for our seniors," Fitzgerald said. "It's been a little bit of a roller coaster with wins and losses. ... The opportunity to play in the Pinstripe Bowl is a terrific honor for us."



## Carr Named to a Pair of All-American Teams

EVANSTON, III. — Northwestern senior wide receiver Austin Carr has been named a College Football All-America Second-Team selection by Sports Illustrated and USA Today.

Carr, a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award given to the nation's top receiver, has already been named the Richter-Howard Big Ten Receiver of the Year after leading the league in receptions (84), receiving yards (1,196) and touchdowns (12). His 12 touchdown catches tied a Northwestern single-season record.

The Benicia, California, native could become just the third player since 1990 to lead the conference in all three categories, joining Penn State's Allen Robinson (2012) and Michigan's Desmond Howard (1990).

A consensus first-team All-Big Ten selection, Carr had six 100-yard receiving games this season and caught a touchdown in a NU-record six-straight games from Sept. 10 to Oct. 15. Some of Carr's highlights from the 2016 season include:

- Career-high three touchdown catches in a 38-31 win at Iowa.
- 11 catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns in a 54-40 win at Michigan State.
- Eight catches for a career-high 158 yards at No. 6 Ohio State.
- Career-high 12 receptions for 132 yards and a score versus No. 8 Wisconsin.
