Citations of Merit Upon Retirement

H. Walter Steffens, Academic Vice President and Professor, Emeritus

Dr. H. Walter Steffens began his distinguished career at the University of Idaho as a graduate assistant in zoology in 1929. Moving up through the professional ranks, he became professor and head of the Department of Biological Sciences and Director of Premedical Studies in 1948. Three years later he was made Dean of the Graduate School. Then, in 1953, he became the University's first Executive Dean, and, in 1961, its first Academic Vice President. He pioneered the reestablishment of Lewis-Clark Normal School in the Fifties, serving as its first administrator. His honors have been many. He has served as President of the Idaho Academy of Science, Idaho Representative to the National Tuberculosis Board of Directors, and Vice President of the National Fraternity of Delta Chi.

E. Mildred Burlingame, Associate Professor of Psychology, Emeritus

Dr. Burlingame came to the Department of Psychology in 1942 from teaching positions in Florida and California. She has been closely associated with psychology laboratory instruction since her arrival. Her students from the General Psychology laboratory and advanced laboratory courses remember her zeal for the experimental method in studying human behavior. This interest has motivated many students to seek advanced degrees in psychology, as well as other disciplines. Outside the laboratory, Dr. Burlingame has been very active in American Association of University Women. She has served as president and in almost all other positions in the AAUW.

Esther Nystrom, Extension Clothing Specialist

Miss Esther Nystrom retired in January 1969, after 20 years with the University of Idaho Agricultural Extension service. A graduate of Washington State University, Miss Nystrom was a teacher and home economics agent before becoming Idaho's Extension clothing specialist. Under her leadership, Idaho has won eight national championships in the Make-It-Yourself-With-Wool contests. She has conducted clothing classes and has written numerous brochures as guidelines for making and wearing fashionable clothes.

Dan Warren, State 4-H Leader

Dan E. Warren, who had been on the University of Idaho Extension service staff for 39 years, retired July 31, 1968. A graduate of the University, he taught at Rupert and was a 4-H club agent before becoming state 4-H club leader. Under Warren's leadership, enrollment in 4-H clubs increased from about 7,200 to nearly 20,000 in 1967. There are approximately 2,000 clubs in the state with 4,000 volunteer leaders. Since his retirement, Warren has worked with the National 4-H Foundation and the Department of Health and Welfare.

Herbert A. Winner, Chairman, Department of Agricultural Education, and Professor Emeritus

During his 30 years at the University of Idaho, Herbert Winner played an important role in educating vocational agriculture teachers to staff schools in Idaho and throughout the nation. Winner worked closely with the State Department of Vocational Education and with Future Farmers of America. In 1967, he was presented a life membership in the American Association of Teacher Educators in Agriculture. He was also recognized for distinguished service by the Idaho Vocational Association, and the Idaho Association of Future Farmers of America.

Lucretia F. Maughan, Franklin County Extension Home Economics Agent

Lucretia (Mrs. C. P.) Maughan retired February 28 after 22 years as Franklin County's first and only home economics agent. Before her appointment as a staff member at Preston in 1947, Mrs. Maughan was a 4-H club leader and member of the leader's council. She has been awarded national recognition for long and efficient service. She is a member of Idaho Extension Home Economics Agents' Association; Epsilon Sigma Phi, which honored her for outstanding work in 1961, and the American Home Economics Association.

John C. Thomas, Assistant Director of Athletics

John C. Thomas has completed 13 years at the University of Idaho. He came to the University athletic program first as ticket manager and business manager. He has served as assistant athletic director, acting athletic director, and for the past nine years as secretary-treasurer of the Idaho Vandal Boosters. In those positions he aided three athletic directors and four football coaches. A native of Malad, Thomas was with the National Park Service in Glacier Park nine years and managed the Grange Supply Co. in Pullman, Washington, prior to his appointment at the University.

Fund for the Performing Arts Center

Special thanks go to the Music Department of the University for sponsoring the Utah Symphony performance for the benefit of FPAC, and to the Chinese Students Association for its promotion of a Chinese art film to raise additional funds for the construction of the Performing Arts Center.

Local interest and support of FPAC is continuing, as groups organize bridge tournaments and other special events, utilizing their talents and inspiration to make the Performing Arts Center a reality.

FPAC: Symbol for Creative Education

The creative ideas of many alumni and friends have contributed immeasurably to the current success of The Fund for the Performing Arts Center. To single out a few is almost an impossible task. The following recognitions of dedication to the vision of the Performing Arts Center must therefore stand as a symbol of the efforts of all those who have already contributed, and of those who will contribute in the future.

A CHALLENGE ISSUED:

Bob Campbell, area chairman for the FPAC Campaign in Utah, has challenged Mike McKevitt, area chairman for Colorado, to a contest to determine which area can bring in the highest total in contributions to The Fund for the Performing Arts Center. Area competitions such as the one involving Utah and Colorado express the continued enthusiasim of alumni in making the dream of a Performing Arts Center come true.

A CHALLENGE ACCEPTED:

Indicative of the response of alumni in the West to the challenge of the FPAC is the work of Dr. Glenn G. Havens, founder and president of Havens International in San Diego, California. His work on the steering committee of the San Diego Alumni Chapter of the University of Idaho accents the concern of alumni for the continued progress in excellence in education at their alma mater.

A DISTINGUISHED GIFT:

C. Fred Pearson, University of Idaho alumnus from San Diego, California, stands as a symbol of the dedication of hundreds of alumni and friends in the campaign to raise more than \$2 million for the Performing Arts Center.

Mr. Pearson's gift of \$1,050 to The Fund for the Performing Arts Center is but one of his projects which have given light to many people. Mr. Pearson was born in Moscow, Idaho, in 1896, the youngest of eight children. At the age of eight he was stricken with measles, resulting in atrophy of the optic nerves in both eyes. At the age of thirteen he was totally blind, but had already begun to adapt himself to a dark world, and gradually adjusted himself to a new way of life. In 1922 he received a B.A. degree in history from the University of Idaho and two years later a Master's degree in English. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa.

While working for his Master's degree at the University of Idaho, Mr. Pearson wanted to become a teacher for the blind. After settling in San Diego, California, however, an attorney encouraged him to enter the insurance business, and, with the help of friends, who read to him, he began to study. His first company appointment was with Girard Insurance Co., one of the Loyalty Group companies in 1929.

Together with a friend, who had suffered a stroke in childhood, Mr. Pearson formed the partnership of Pearson Insurance Agency, which he and his partner built into one of the leading agencies in San Diego.

Mr. Pearson has served as second vice-president of the California Council for the Blind, as a member of the advisory committee of the council to the California State Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation, and as chairman of the advisory board of the San Diego Center of California Industries for the Blind.

Mr. Pearson retired in 1961 and in 1964 he was honored with an award as Senior Citizen Of The Year by the Hillcrest Kiwanis Club. Since his retirement, Mr. Pearson has traveled extensively in Europe and America. He has been president of the San Diego Chapter of the National Rehabilitation Association and a member of the California Rehabilitation Council.

His gift to FPAC lights the way for the response of alumni to the challenge of a Performing Arts Center on the University of Idaho campus.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doc-tor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve with a slit near the up. his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the up-per part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACH-ELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRAD-UATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institu-tions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree—for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab. HONOR CORDS Honor Cords draped over the shoul-ders designate the students who are graduating with honors; cum laude with silver cords and summa cum laude with gold cords.
