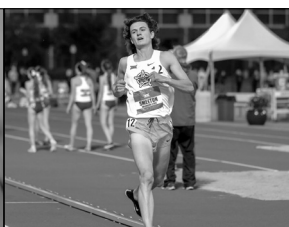

CROSS COUNTRY

Key Points

- OSU has won nine of the past eleven Big 12 team titles dating back to 2008
- The Cowboys have made it to 15 straight National Championships
- Isai Rodriguez and Ashenafi Hatte return to build on last year's All-American performances
- Ryan Smeeton looks to pick up where he left off during the 2019 outdoor season
- Alex Maier is a freshman to keep an eye on

The Cowboys enter the 2019 season coming off of a Big 12 runner-up campaign that ended with a 13th-place finish at the NCAA Championships in Madison, Wisconsin.

The Cowboys enter the season with their eyes on a Big 12 title. Ranked No. 7 by the United States Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association in the Preseason National Coaches' Poll, the Cowboys will look to qualify for their 17th consecutive National Championship and contend for a national title. The USTFCCCA ranked OSU as the No. 2 team in the NCAA Midwest Regional that will be hosted in Stillwater on November 15. The regional will be the debut meet for the Pokes at the newly renovated, state-of-the-art OSU Cross Country Course.

Returning All-Americans Isai Rodriguez and Ashenafi Hatte will look to lead the Cowboys back to the top of the Big 12 and beyond with help from 2019 outdoor 3,000-meter steeplechase NCAA runner-up Ryan Smeeton.

Rodriguez and Hatte took runner-up and third place at last year's Big 12 Championships and both will be in position to contend for an individual title again. Rodriguez ended his stellar redshirt-freshman season with a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, followed by Hatte in 27th. Both Cowboys figure to be in the thick of the All-American hunt again.

Smeeton looks to pick up where he left off during the 2019 outdoor track season in which he cemented himself as one of the nation's best steeplechasers with a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships

in Austin, Texas. Smeeton took runner-up in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the Canadian National Championships this summer to earn a spot on the Canadian team at the 2019 World Championships in Doha in early October.

Director of Cross Country and Track & Field Dave Smith said it will be challenging for Smeeton to handle training for two sports at once, but that he is hopeful Smeeton will be ready for the NCAA Championships.

"I think Isai [Rodriguez] and Ashenafi [Hatte] are both top-20 returners in the NCAA and I think Ryan [Smeeton] the way he's ran on the track could be a third guy in the top-30," Smith said. "When you get three guys in the top-30, all of a sudden, you're looking for a trophy if you can just get some support in the fourth and fifth spots."

Alex Maier is one Cowboy who could contend for one of those spots. The incoming freshman from Flower Mound, Texas, was a three-time All-American and two-time state champion during his high school track and cross country career and has impressed Smith in his workouts so far this year.

Returning Pokes that could be in the mix include Bryce Quigley, Juan Diego Castro, Adam Dayani, Nicholas Kenville, Garrett Calhoun and Jorge Perez.

Smith expects as many as five or six athletes to compete for the fourth and fifth scoring spots in the Cowboy lineup, a testament to how deep the program is.

Smith and the Cowboys are primed to make some noise during the 2019 season. The Pokes will look to make it an even 10 conference titles in the past 12 years and be among the contenders for a trophy at the NCAA Championships in November.

TRACK AND FIELD

Key Points

The Cowboys will enter the 2020 track and field seasons without former All-Americans Hassan Abdi and Jacob Fincham-Dukes, but the Pokes return a plethora of young talent and veteran experience from last year's squad.

Sophomore Isai Rodriguez and senior Ashenafi Hatte project to be national contenders in the endurance races both indoors and outdoors. Rodriguez finished as the conference runner-up in the 3,000 meters and the 5,000 meters at the 2019 Big 12 Indoor Championships before sitting out last year's outdoor season.

Ashton Hicks and LaKyrn Mays are both poised for breakouts in their sophomore seasons. Hicks finished 14th at the NCAA Indoor Championships in the 400 meters to earn Second Team All-America honors and followed it up with another All-American performance at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The Cowboy freshman broke the OSU indoor 400 meters school record twice during the 2019 season, running his best time of 45.6 at the Big 12 Championships in a runner-up finish. Hicks looks to build on his impressive debut season in the orange and black and once again be in All-America contention.

LaKyrn Mays also had a standout freshman season, qualifying for the NCAA West Regional in the 400 meters during the outdoor season. Mays was All-Big 12 indoors and outdoors in the quarter mile and posted a season-best time of 46.56. Mays looks to take the next step and join teammate Ashton Hicks as an All-American in the 400 meters for the Cowboys.

Last year's 3,000-meter steeplechase NCAA runner-up Ryan Smeeton returns for the Cowboys looking to pick up where he left off at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Austin, Texas. At the 2019 Payton Jordan Invitational, Smeeton claimed victory by running the second-fastest time in the world in the steeplechase at that point in the season with a personal-best time of 8:27.90.

Smeeton will represent the Canadian team at the 2019 World Championships in Doha after finishing as the runner-up in the steeplechase at the Canadian Track & Field Championships this summer. The returning NCAA runner-up will be the favorite in the eyes of many to win the outdoor steeplechase in 2020.

For Cowboy field athletes, Torrey Hickel will be back to throw for the Pokes. Hickel finished sixth in the Big 12 in the shot put during the 2019 outdoor season. Hickel will try and build on his solid sophomore season.

The Pokes bring back a talented group of runners and a fresh crop of talent ready to make an impact. OSU will once again be nationally relevant under coach Dave Smith during the 2020 track seasons.

Dave Smith is truly at the top of his profession, and is only getting better.

The Oklahoma State head coach was honored as the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association Men's Division I Cross Country National Coach of the Year in 2009, 2010 and again in 2012. That is the highest honor awarded to a cross country coach.

He was voted by his peers as Big 12 Men's Cross Country Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. He also coached the Cowgirls to their first Big 12 cross country championship in 2015 and was named the 2015 Big 12 Women's Cross Country Coach of the Year, capping a stretch of six seasons of top-four finishes for the Cowgirls at the conference meet. He also recently served as the men's distance coach for Team USA during its stay at the 2014 World Junior Championships and the USA coach for the Great North Cross Country Championships in Edinburgh, Scotland.

Smith led OSU to three NCAA team cross country championships in four years (2009, 2010, 2012) to go with nine straight Big 12 team titles from 2008-16 and has coached six different Cowboy runners to seven Big 12 cross country individual championships.

The Cowboys have finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Cross Country Championships in every year but three under Smith. Additionally, the Pokes placed in the top 25 at the 2009 outdoor track and field meet for the first time since 1985 in his first year as head track and field coach.

The 2019 outdoor track and field season was a reminder to everyone why the Cowgirls own the reputation of being a middle-distance powerhouse. Under Smith, a trio of Cowgirls earned All-America honors in the 1,500 meters.

Sinclair Johnson became OSU's fourth 1,500 meters national champion under Smith at the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas. Johnson ran a meet-record time of 4:05.98 in 97-degree heat to claim the title. Not only was Johnson's winning time a meet record, it was the second-fastest time in collegiate history and met the world standard. Jenny Martinez finished seventh to end her career as a First Team All-American and Molly Sughrue came in 11th to go out with Second Team All-America honors.

For the Cowboys, Ryan Smeeton was the 2019 NCAA runner-up in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. Smeeton ran a world standard time of 8:27.90 at the Payton Jordan Invitational under the guidance of Smith. Smeeton took runner-up at the Canadian Track and Field Championships this summer to earn a spot on the Canadian national team at the 2019 World Championships in Doha.

Smith coached Hassan Abdi to a First Team All-American performance in the 10,000 meters at the 2019 NCAA Outdoor Championships in the final race of his Cowboy career.

In 2017, Smith coached Hassan Abdi to an individual cross country title, becoming the first OSU runner to

do so since Vegard Oelstad in 2015. Abdi and fellow Cowboy Luis Martinez took the top two spots at the Big 12 Championships in Smith's most recent cross country season.

In the 2018 track and field seasons, Smith guided two of his athletes to the outdoor championships round in unfamiliar territory. Blake Scott made it to Eugene in the pole vault and Jacob Fincham-Dukes once again made an appearance in the long jump.

For the Cowgirls, Smith produced a breakout season from Sinclair Johnson, who represented the Cowgirls in Eugene and coached veteran runners such as Molly Sughrue and Ariane Ballner to Big 12 track titles.

The 2015-16 season saw the women's program reach new heights under Smith's guidance. Those Cowgirls finished seventh at the NCAA Cross Country Championships - their highest since 1989 - and pulled off their best finishes ever at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships in 10th and 12th, respectively.

Additionally, the 2015-16 Cowgirl season included a national championship from Edwards in the indoor mile, a Midwest Region cross country championship, a best-ever 107-point, second-place finish at the Big 12 Indoor Championships, NCAA runner-up finishes from Chase Ealey (outdoor shot put) and Aurora Dybedokken (outdoor 5,000m), additional impressive All-America performances from Ingeborg Loevnes (fourth in 3,000m steeplechase), Savannah Camacho (fourth in indoor 800m) and Ealey (sixth indoor shot put), several Big 12 individual titles and a third-place finish for the USTFCCCA Program of the Year award.

The men's program also had a notable year in 2016, with another Big 12 cross country title, Josh Thompson named 2016 Midwest Region Indoor Athlete of the Year, Nick Miller named 2016 Midwest Region Outdoor Athlete of the Year, All-America performances from John Teeters (fifth in the outdoor 100m and fourth in indoor 60m) and the men's distance medley relay team (fifth place) and numerous individual Big 12 titles.

Smith led the Cowboys to back-to-back top 10 finishes at the NCAA Indoor Championships in 2013 and 2014. The Cowboys' eighth-place finish in 2013 was OSU's highest finish since 1984, followed by a sixth-place finish in 2014 which was OSU's second-highest team finish in school history behind a second-place finish in 1965.

In addition to another Big 12 men's cross country championship, Smith's 2014-15 year included an individual cross country conference champion in Kirubel Erassa, an individual NCAA champion in Chad Noelle (outdoor 1,500 meters), a pair of NCAA runners-up and a total of 15 All-America honors for the men's and women's teams.

Smith's recent efforts have included a resurgence of the track program as a whole. Oklahoma State has been known for its elite distance program for years, but Smith has expanded OSU's vision to include elite throwers and sprinters as well. John Teeters and Nick Miller have provided the most evidence of all-around success, with Teeters earning four All-America honors,

including a national runner-up finish in the 60-meters, and Miller earning a total of seven All-America honors in the weight and hammer throws with one NCAA title in the hammer throw. Miller has also earned elite international success, claiming gold at the 2015 Sainsbury British Championships, taking gold at the European Championships and reaching the final at the 2015 IAAF World Championships. Miller competed for Great Britain at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, where he joined Smith's pupils Shadrack Kipchirchir (USA - 10k), Tom Farrell (Great Britain - 5k) and Ingeborg Loevnæs (Norway - steeplechase).

The 2013-14 cross country/track & field season can easily be considered the best in school history, as Smith coached the Cowboys to a third-place place finish at the NCAA Cross Country championships, a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Indoor Championships and a 13th-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Additionally, Smith's squad won Big 12 titles in cross country and indoor track & field and had a third-place conference finish in outdoors, helping the team to a second-place finish for the USTFCCCA's Program of the Year award.

Smith has had 163 All-American honors earned under his watch and has coached 136 Big 12 champions. As the head coach for both squads at OSU, he has coached 121 Big 12 champions and 483 All-Big 12 performers. To put that figure into perspective, Oklahoma State had only 13 total All-Americans from 2000-06.

German Fernandez won the 2009 NCAA title in the 1,500 meters and was the Big 12 individual cross country champion in both 2008 and 2011. He swept all of the Big 12's major awards as a freshman, claiming the conference's male athlete of the year honors during both the indoor and outdoor seasons to go with his 2008 cross country crown. Ryan Vail was the 2009 Big 12 individual cross country champion and was a five-time All-American under Smith. John Kosgei was the 2010 NCAA runner-up in the 10,000 meters and was honored as the 2010 Big 12 Outdoor Performer of the Year after winning the 5,000 meters and the 10,000 meters at the conference meet. Girma Mecheso won the 2010 Big 12 individual cross country title and was one of five cross country All-Americans coached by Smith in 2010.

Chad Noelle took home the 2015 NCAA title in the 1,500-meter run to become the 15th Cowboy in school

history to win an outdoor championship. In 2016, Kaela Edwards won an NCAA title in the indoor mile and to become the fourth Cowgirl to ever win an NCAA title. Nick Miller won the hammer throw title in the outdoor season in 2016 as well to give Smith four individual national championships in addition to his three cross country team titles.

That success has rolled over into the classroom as well. In addition to winning the NCAA cross country title in both 2009 and 2012, Smith's Cowboys were honored as the USTFCCCA Scholar Team of the Year for their excellence in the classroom both seasons. Under Smith's watch, Oklahoma State cross country has been recognized as an all-academic team by the USTFCCCA eight times. In 2013, the OSU track and field teams combined for 12 USTFCCCA All-Academic individuals, and both the men's and women's teams had the highest GPA's in the Big 12. Ryan Vail was an *ESPN the Magazine*/CoSIDA First-Team Academic All-American in both 2008 and 2009 to become the first repeat Academic All-American in OSU track history.

Smith arrived in Stillwater in 2002 and served as an assistant coach under Dick Weis for four years before being elevated to head men's cross country coach in 2006. Upon Weis' retirement following the 2008 cross country season, Smith was promoted to head men's track coach and in the summer of 2009, Smith assumed control of both the Cowboy and Cowgirl programs under the title of director of cross country and track and field.

Having placed 10th at the NCAA Cross Country Championships in 2006, third in 2007 and eighth in 2008, the Cowboys entered the 2009 cross country season as a proven commodity and were considered a possible threat to reigning NCAA champion Oregon and traditional power Stanford. OSU spent the entire season ranked in the top five nationally, but was not ranked No. 1 at any point during the campaign. However, the Pokes toppled Oregon by 16 points at the NCAA Championships and overwhelmed top-ranked Stanford by a whopping 227 points to put an exclamation point on their NCAA title season.

Smith's strategy going into the race was to let his senior captain Vail lead the way. Through the first 3,000 meters, OSU was in third place, six points ahead of the Cardinal. At the midway point, OSU created some separation

between itself and the rest of the field, with Vail leading the posse of Cowboy runners. Through 8,000 meters, OSU held a comfortable lead over second-place Oregon. From that point, the Pokes made their final surge to seal the victory.

When the smoke cleared, OSU crowned four All-Americans en route to winning the title, with Vail finishing seventh, sophomore Colby Lowe eighth, Kosgei 11th and sophomore Girma Mecheso 24th. For his efforts, Smith was honored as the USTFCCCA National Coach of the Year.

It was a different refrain in 2010, as the distance-running community had already developed a familiarity with Oklahoma State as the top dog. That said, Smith and the Cowboys still managed to turn heads by destroying the NCAA competition, racking up the fourth-largest margin of victory in the history of the NCAA Championships in defeating the field by a whopping 120 points.

All five Oklahoma State scorers earned All-America recognition at the 2010 NCAA Cross Country Championships, led by the trio of Mecheso, Fernandez and Lowe, who finished seventh, eighth and ninth, respectively. Tom Farrell was 29th and Johnathan Stublaski was 36th. Perhaps the scariest part of the Cowboys' domination of the 2010 NCAA Championships is the fact that Smith actually utilized a conservative strategy in dropping Farrell back in the field. Farrell had run side-by-side with Mecheso, Fernandez and Lowe during the season, but Smith's NCAA strategy was to have Farrell stay back in the field and then make his move at the end in a manner that would help the team in case any other squad threatened.

In 2012, OSU went back and forth with Wisconsin all year at the No. 1 and No. 2 national rankings. The Cowboys took the No. 1 ranking to the NCAA meet, and ran like it, decimating the competition and winning the national title by 63 points over second-place Wisconsin. It was OSU's third team NCAA title in four years. Tom Farrell, Shadrack Kipchirchir, Girma Mecheso and Joseph Manilafasha took home All-America honors.

During the 2009 outdoor season – Smith's first as head coach – the Cowboys placed 25th in the final team standings and Fernandez won the 1,500 meter title. OSU's team finish was the best for a Cowboy team in

24 years and Fernandez became the Pokes' first NCAA champion since Paul Larkins in 1986. Additionally, Vail earned All-America honors in the 5,000 meters.

In the 2013 indoor season, OSU spent most of its time smashing school records. It started at the Razorback Invitational, when Farrell, Kirubel Erassa, Fabian Clarkson and Shane Moskowitz ran sub-four minute miles at the same meet, something that had never been done in NCAA history. It ended with the Cowboys taking eighth place at the NCAA meet, a feat that had not been accomplished since 1984. Seven Cowboys combined for nine All-America honors--the most in OSU indoor history.

The Cowboys took home the Big 12 Indoor title again two years later in a dramatic 1.5-point win over Texas. The Pokes won five individual Big 12 titles en route to the team victory with Josh Thompson winning two titles. OSU scored 27 points in the 3,000-meter final, including 10 points from event champion Craig Nowak, to take the lead back from Texas with one event remaining. In the 400-meter relay, the Cowboys finished fifth to score four points to secure their second team title in three seasons.

Since Smith took over the women's program in 2009, he has already coached the Cowgirls to 45 All-America honors and 55 individual Big 12 championships, led by NCAA champion, eight-time All-American and nine-time Big 12 champion Natalja Piliusina, who also set seven school records during her time in Stillwater.

Piliusina paved the way for a new era of Cowgirl track and field and cross country that has since finished runner-up in the 2016 Big 12 Indoor Championships, and finished in the top-10 at an NCAA Cross Country Championships and Indoor Championships, and 12th at the 2016 Outdoor Championships.

To put those numbers into perspective, the Oklahoma

State women's program had tallied five All-Americans and seven Big 12 champions from 2004-09.

Kaela Edwards added to OSU's trophy case when she won the fourth NCAA Indoor title in Cowgirl history at the 2016 Championships in Birmingham, Alabama. Edwards is also one of two Cowgirls since 2014 to finish runner-up nationally in the 800-meter run with Savannah Camacho.

The 2016 season was by far the most successful in OSU history for the Cowgirls, having finished third in the USTFCCA Program of the Year standings with top-12 finishes at each NCAA Championships during the season.

Ingeborg Loevnnes and Natalie Baker were the two Cowgirl leaders during the cross country season, helping OSU to a perfect regular season and its first Big 12 title and Midwest Region Title. Loevnnes took home an All-America honor and the Cowgirls finished seventh at the NCAA Cross Country Championships.

The Cowgirls carried the momentum from the historic cross country season into a great 2016 indoor season that was capped off with a 10th place finish and Edwards' title. Camacho also scored in the 800 and Chase Ealey in the shot put helped the Cowgirls to their best finish in school history.

Loevnes, Edwards and Ealey were at it again during the outdoor season along with Aurora Dybedokken who finished runner-up in the 5,000-meter final at the NCAA Championships a month after showing off her range and winning the Big 12's 1,500-meter title. Ealey also finished runner-up at the NCAA Championships in the shot put, and earned her 11th and 12th All-Big 12 honor to cement her place in the OSU history books. Loevnnes finished fourth in the 3,000-meter steeplechase and Ed-

wards took sixth in the 1,500-meter final, battling through a nagging injury. Overall the Cowgirls finished 12th for their highest outdoor finish in school history.

Under Smith's watch, the Oklahoma State women's cross country team placed fourth at the 2010 Big 12 Championships and was 17th at the 2010 NCAA Championships. Both of those showings were the best for the Cowgirls since 2005.

Smith came to Stillwater from Texas Tech, where he was the head men's and women's cross country coach, as well as assistant track coach from 1998-2002. Prior to his stint at Tech, Smith was a volunteer assistant coach for the University of Washington track and cross country programs from 1997-1998. He was also the head coach of Club Northwest women's cross country and track those same years. Athletes that Smith coached prior to his arrival at Oklahoma State won two NCAA Championships, 10 All-American awards, 11 Big 12 Championships, and a World University Games gold medal.

While competing collegiately at Michigan State, Smith was the Big Ten Conference champion in the 10,000m in 1993 and placed second in the 1,500m that season. He earned All-Big Ten honors four times in cross country and track during his career. Was also an 11-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and three-time Academic All-America selection. Smith also won the Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor in 1993.

Smith graduated from Michigan State in 1993 with a degree in fisheries and wildlife, and continued his education at the University of Washington, where he earned a Ph.D. in pharmacology in 2000.

ZIVILE PUKSTIENE

JUMPS

17TH YEAR AT OSU | 17TH YEAR OVERALL
SMU, 2003

Zivile Pukstiene is in her 17th year at Oklahoma State after joining the Cowgirl staff in 2003. She assists primarily in jumps. All of Oklahoma State's outdoor women's jumping records have been set under Pukstiene's watch.

Cowgirl high jumper Toni Young earned All-America honors by placing fifth at the 2012 NCAA outdoor meet. She became OSU's first-ever female high jump All-American and shattered the school record by clearing 1.87 meters/6-01.50 at the national meet.

Pukstiene coached Clarissa Andrews to lengths never before reached for a jumper at Oklahoma State, as Andrews claimed the school record in both the outdoor long jump and the outdoor triple jump under Pukstiene's watch.

Andrews' triple jump mark of 13.11 meters/43-00.25 at the 2011 Big 12 Championships obliterated the previous school record of 12.89 meters/42-03.5.

In 2014, Pukstiene coached Viktoriia Sadokhina to two Big 12 titles at both the Indoor and Outdoor Big 12 Championships. She also broke Andrews' school record with a 13.35m jump to take the outdoor crown.

Pukstiene guided Jacob Fincham-Dukes to an outstanding senior season that included All-American performances

in the long jump at the 2019 indoor and outdoor NCAA Championships.

Fincham-Dukes was the indoor Big 12 champion in the long jump and went on to finish fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The former Cowboy capped off his impressive career with fifth-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Austin, Texas, breaking his own school record on his third jump with a mark of 8.00m. Fincham-Dukes exits as the indoor and outdoor school-record holder in the long jump, adding to Pukstiene's long list of school records set under her guidance.

Pukstiene also helped a pair of Cowgirl jumpers reach the NCAA West Regionals during the 2019 outdoor season. Schuyler Wood-Hilderbrandt qualified in the long jump and Ryan Roane qualified in the triple jump.

Jacob Fincham-Dukes once again starred in his junior season, earning an All-Big 12 honor indoors and making it once again to the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

In the 2017-18 seasons, Pukstiene made her impact felt through Jacob Fincham-Dukes, the former star jumper for the Cowboys. Fincham-Dukes had a successful sophomore campaign, winning the 2017 Big 12 title in long jump and setting a personal best along the way, all under the guidance of Pukstiene.

At the 2016 Big 12 Indoor Championships, Pukstiene's jumpers recorded a crucial 13 points in the long jump when Fincham-Dukes finished second, Arlando Brewer-Johnson took fifth and Simon Imagbe claimed eighth.

Those 13 points helped push the Cowboys over Texas in a 1.5-point win at the Championships. It was the Pokes' second conference indoor title in three years.

Pukstiene's work with the Cowgirl jumpers has resulted in five of Oklahoma State's all-time top seven indoor marks in the long jump and each of the top three indoor marks in the triple jump being set during her time in Stillwater.

The success of Pukstiene's pupils has also extended to the outdoor season, where five of the top eight marks in the long jump and five of OSU's all-time top seven marks in the triple jump have been set since Pukstiene's arrival.

In 2009, Andrews and Baiba Blumbaha logged the two best outdoor long jump marks in school history at the Big 12 Championships and both went on to compete at the NCAA regional meet. Blumbaha then went on to suit up for the Cowgirls at the national meet.

Pukstiene also had an impressive addition to her resume in 2011, as she coached men's walk-on Taylor Buck to some of the best high jump performances in school history. Buck's high jump of 2.14m/7-00.25 was the highest mark at Oklahoma State in decades and ranks third in school history.

During her career at Oklahoma State, Pukstiene coached triple jumper Paula Ogunbanjo to a third-place finish at the 2004 Big 12 Indoor Championships and helped develop Ogunbanjo into an NCAA qualifier in 2005. Pukstiene also coached heptathlete Tihana Sarac to a school record in 2005.

Pukstiene attended Southern Methodist University after beginning her jumping career in her home country of Lithuania. Pukstiene not only set the school record in the triple jump for the Mustangs, but also represented SMU at the 2003 NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. Pukstiene placed ninth in the Indoor Championships, while claiming a 12th-place finish at the Outdoor Championships.

Before completing her career at SMU, Pukstiene was Lithuania's national champion in the triple jump in 2001 and 2003. She set the Lithuanian junior national record in the triple jump in the under-18, under-20 and under-23 divisions.

Pukstiene is married to Mindaugas Pukstas. The couple has two children, Rokas (born in 2004) and Gabija (born in 2007).

FOURTH YEAR AT OSU | 11TH YEAR OVERALL
UNM, 1999

Giles McDonnell is in his fourth year as an assistant track and field coach at Oklahoma State as a sprints coach.

McDonnell comes to OSU after spending a year at Utah State, four seasons as the long sprints and hurdles coach at Texas State and two seasons at his alma mater, New Mexico, as an assistant coach, where he coached the sprints, hurdles, relays and jumps.

In his second year at OSU, he coached 4X100-meter and 4X400-meter relays that earned All-Big 12 honors as well as standouts Malik Givens and Brandon Singleton.

McDonnell played a large role in a strong 2019 season for Cowboy and Cowgirl sprinters.

In 2019, McDonnell had two Cowboy freshmen burst onto the scene under his guidance in Ashton Hicks and LaKyrn Mays. Hicks was a two-time All-American in the 400 meters during his freshman campaign that included setting the OSU indoor quarter mile record with a mark of 45.6 in a runner-up finish at the Big 12 Championships. Hicks also ran the second and third fastest outdoor 400 meters times in OSU history. Mays got stronger as the season progressed and qualified for NCAA Regionals during the outdoor season.

Tulsa transfer Aaliyah Birmingham flourished during her first season as a Cowgirl under the coaching of McDonnell. Birmingham turned in a runner-up finish in the 60 meters at the 2019 Big 12 Indoor Championships with a school-record time of 7.25. The first-year Cowgirl followed that up with a school-record shattering time of 51.51 in the 400 meters at the Big 12 Outdoor Championships to claim her first Big 12 crown. Her time was good for a world standard and was the seventh-fastest time in the NCAA to that point in the season. Birmingham advanced to the NCAA Championships to cap off her debut season in the orange and black.

He also coached the squad that set the women's Outdoor 4X400-Meter Relay school record last season.

McDonnell played an integral role in shaping Malik Givens' 60m third-place finish at the Big 12 Championships in 2017. Another athlete under McDonnell's tutelage, Brandon Singleton, finished sixth in the 600-yard run and DMR in Ames, Iowa. Under his direction, the 4x100-meter relay team made it to the West Regionals and Jacob Fincham-Dukes recorded a personal best in the 100-meter dash.

In 2016, McDonnell was recognized as the Mountain Region's Coach of the Year by the USTFCCA for leading the Aggies' 4X400-meter relay team to first-team All-America honors in Eugene, Oregon.

During his time at New Mexico and Texas State, McDonnell coached 22 individual NCAA West Preliminary qualifiers, five relay NCAA West Preliminary qualifiers, one relay NCAA Outdoor Finals qualifier, two individual Outdoor Finals qualifiers and one individual NCAA Indoor qualifier. He also coached 14 conference champions, 50 all-conference performers, 64 indoor/outdoor conference finalists and scorers, a second-team NCAA All-American, four USTFCCA Academic All-Americans and a pair of USA Junior National Outdoor Championship competitors.

In his time at Texas State, McDonnell had a tremendous impact on the program, helping the program capture four conference team championships. He worked with the athletes in the long sprints, 400-meter hurdles and 4x400m relay. In all, he coached 25 all-conference performers, four individual conference champions, two scholar-athletes of the year and guided his group to produce 37 top-10 all-time Texas State performances. He also coached his athletes to success on the national level with 19 NCAA West Preliminary participants and three USTFCCA Academic All-Americans.

In particular, 2015 was a banner year for the long sprint group at Texas State, highlighted by the first relay squad to qualify for the NCAA national meet for the school since 1989. Working with the 4x400m was one of McDonnell's primary responsibilities and the results were impressive. Overall, Texas State had a 4x400 qualify for the West Prelim every year McDonnell worked at Texas State. The women's indoor 4x400m school record was broken, and he helped guide the second-fastest relays in school history for both the men's indoor/outdoor relay and the women's outdoor relay. The athletes he worked with all enjoyed considerable improvement under his guidance, with a high percentage of them establishing marked improvements on individual personal records.

In his first season with the Bobcats, McDonnell worked directly with the long sprints group (400m/400m hurdles), but also assisted with both the 100 and 200-meter groups, and the team saw immediate improvement. Numerous school records were established, the men's team scored a runner-up finish at the 2012 Southland Outdoor Championships and a record number of athletes qualified for the NCAA West Preliminary rounds. Athletes coached by McDonnell ran on the first 4x100m relay to win a conference title in school history. In the 400 hurdles, McDonnell guided athletes to an individual conference title, an all-conference performance and two NCAA West Prelim berths. Both those women cut more than two seconds off of their personal records and one set the Southland Conference meet record.

While at New Mexico, McDonnell helped the Lobos, at that time, enjoy their highest conference finishes in 2010 and 2011. In 2011, New Mexico to date, had its highest combined finish in program history and set records for most points scored for both programs in the Mountain West. UNM sent athletes to the NCAA

Championships in the men's 100-meter dash, men's long jump, men's triple jump, men's 4x100-meter relay, women's 400, women's long jump and women's triple jump.

An Albuquerque native, McDonnell returned to UNM in 2009 after a stint as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona, where he worked with the sprinters and jumpers. While at NAU, the Lumberjacks won four Big Sky Conference titles in a span of two years and sent athletes to the NCAA Regional Championships in the men's 200 meters, men's 400 meters, men's 4x100-meter relay and the women's triple jump.

McDonnell began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Albuquerque's Eldorado High School. In his five years there, McDonnell guided more than 40 athletes to the New Mexico 5A State Championships with titles coming in the sprint relay, 4x400-meter relay, 400 meters, 110-meter hurdles and long jump. In 2007, the 4x100-meter relay team broke a 20-year old school record after the 4x200-meter relay broke a 19-year-old record in 2006. McDonnell had five top-five team finishes at the state meet, and five of his athletes went on to compete at the NCAA Division I level.

As a Lobo, McDonnell competed in the jumping events from 1994-99. He placed in both the long jump and triple jump when he was part of the first Lobo team to compete in the Mountain West Conference Championships.

McDonnell earned a bachelor's degree in communications at UNM. He holds a Level I USATF Certified Instructor Certification, Level I USATF Track and Field Certification and two Level II Certification in sprints, hurdles and combined events.

Josh Langley is in his fourth year as assistant throwing and multis coach at Oklahoma State.

After helping Blake Scott become the first Cowboy to earn All-America honors in the pole vault in nearly 30 years during the 2018 outdoor season, Langley coached Scott to a strong follow-up showing during the 2019 outdoor season which included an NCAA Regional appearance. Scott earned All-Big 12 honors twice in 2019 with top-eight finishes at the indoor and outdoor Big 12 Conference meets under the guidance of Langley.

Langley also helped both Elissa White and Allie Stern set the Cowgirls' school record in the pole vault during the 2019 season.

During his second season in Stillwater, Langley coached Mace Metcalf to an All-Big 12 award in the decathlon and Hootie Hurley to an All-Big 12 honor in the heptathlon. Langley has been setting a groundwork for the future, expanding the talents of Zachary Andrew, Torrey Hickel and Wesley Hallof.

In his first year at OSU, Langley led Ieva Zarankaite to the NCAA West Regionals after qualifying in the discus and shot put at the Big 12 Championships. Langley also played a large role in Cole Verble and Donovan Nunley's heptathlon personal bests. Langley is already helping add to the Cowboy record books, as Nunley was the first runner in OSU history to score in the 60m hurdles at the Big 12 Championship.

Langley comes to Stillwater from Chapel Hill, North Carolina, where he was the assistant head coach, specializing in multi-events, javelin and pole vault, as well as the other throws.

Langley and his athletes were huge staples for the UNC program, earning 44.5 of the Tar Heel women's 62.5 points at the ACC Indoor Championships back in 2015.

2015 was a banner year for his multi-athletes as well, as he coached two athletes to three ACC titles in the women's pentathlon and heptathlon, and the men's heptathlon.

For his coaching excellence in 2015, the USTFCCA recognized him as the Southeast Region's Women's Coach of the Year for the indoor season.

In his debut season with the Tar Heels, two of Langley's pupils earned All-America honors in the decathlon.

Prior to his time at UNC, Langley spent three seasons at Clemson and two at Gardner-Webb in Boiling Springs, North Carolina.

At Clemson, he coached the men's field events, all multi-events and the men's and women's pole vault. He had athletes qualify for the NCAA Championships in each year of his tenure, and one finish as the national runner-up and qualify for the U.S. Olympic Trials in 2008. Back in 2007, Langley received USTFCCA honors for the first time as he was named the East Region's Coach of the Year.

Langley earned his master's degree in Sports Science – Pedagogy from Gardner-Webb in 2005 while he was an assistant coach for the Bulldogs and helped them to the 2006 Atlantic Sun Conference men's outdoor crown, with his men's throwers scoring 92 points.

He graduated from Western Carolina in 2003, where he was also a javelin thrower and a part of two conference titles.

He advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships of the 1,500-meters twice in his career, highlighted by a trip to the semifinals in 2009. When he left Tulsa, he was a member of the school record 4x1,600-meter relay team. He also ranked in the top four of seven other events.

Duncan then attended the University of Toronto, where he served as a graduate assistant with the track and field program's distance runners while pursuing a master's degree. He stayed with the program until his move to Stillwater in January.

Duncan graduated from Tulsa in 2011 with a degree in exercise sport science and received his master's in exercise physiology from the University of Toronto in 2015. He and his wife, Kristen, have one son, Cullen.

The Big 12 is nearing its silver anniversary as it begins its 24th year in 2019-20 as one of the nation's premier athletic conferences under the direction of eighth-year commissioner Bob Bowlsby.

TCU and West Virginia joined the league on July 1, 2012 and became the Big 12's first additions since inception, joining Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas Tech.

With 10 members, the Big 12 remains as the only autonomy conference to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field of play with a full round-robin schedule. The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first 22 years. Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 63 NCAA team titles and 664 individual national championships.

The Big 12 has been at the forefront in college athletics reform, specifically with student-athlete welfare issues to include cost of attendance, student-athlete time demands and strengthening its policy for concussion diagnosis and management. In 2014-15, the Big 12 introduced and hosted three "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums to examine the issues facing college athletics. Two were conducted in Washington, D.C and one in New York City. Panelists included respected authorities from intercollegiate athletics, university leadership and sports journalism. The third forum featured a special session comprised of student-athletes. The Big 12 has continued

the "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums the past five seasons with Dallas serving as the host site for three events and one staged in Atlanta.

The award-winning Big 12 Champions for Life, an initiative of the Conference, begins its fifth year in 2019-20. It features student-athletes, selected by league institutions, in a series of public service announcements highlighting the positive impact an athletics scholarship has had on their lives leading to stories of personal growth and success.

The Big 12 was the only conference to place a team in the Final Four and CFP semifinals in both 2017-18 and 2018-19. Texas Tech played in the 2019 national championship game while Kansas competed in the 2018 Final Four. Oklahoma was in the CFP semifinals in both seasons. Additionally, the Big 12 was the lone conference that had teams play in the 2019 men's (Texas Tech) and women's (Baylor) Final Fours, and the NIT (Texas, TCU) and WNIT (TCU) semifinals. Baylor won the women's basketball national title while Texas was the NIT champion. The Big 12 also claimed both of the Associated Press basketball coaches of the year as Kim Mulkey (Baylor) captured the women's award while Chris Beard (Texas Tech) picked up the men's honor.

In addition to Baylor's women's basketball crown, national championships were won by Texas Tech men's outdoor track & field, Texas men's tennis and Oklahoma women's gymnastics while Iowa State claimed the National Invitation Volleyball Tournament. NCAA runner-up finishes besides

Texas Tech men's basketball included UT men's swimming & diving and men's golf along with OU softball.

The Big 12 placed 70% of its teams in 2018 bowl games highlighted by No. 2 Oklahoma competing in the CFP Semifinal at the Orange Bowl and a Texas win over No. 5 Georgia in the Sugar Bowl. The Big 12 has made eight appearances in a CFP News Year's Bowl in the five years of the structure, including OU and UT in 2018. The Sooners made their second-straight CFP semifinal appearance and third in four years.

Additionally, the Big 12 added its seventh Heisman Trophy winner since 1996 when Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) took home the award, following former Sooner QB Baker Mayfield (Oklahoma) in 2017. The Conference has had a finalist in 15 of its seasons for a total of 20 with two finalists in five seasons. Thirty-nine major individual awards have been won by Big 12 student-athletes in football over the past nine campaigns. Overall, more than 4,800 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Ty Darlington (Oklahoma) was the recipient

of the 2015 William V. Campbell Trophy, known as the Academic Heisman. Jevon Carter (West Virginia) was presented the NCAA Today's Top 10 Award in January 2019. It recognizes former student-athletes for their successes on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. Since 1996, the Big 12 has a total of 12 honorees for this prestigious award. In the last eight seasons, 19 student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 90 Award with Baylor's Lauren Cox (women's basketball) and Colin Kober (men's golf), Oklahoma State's Sofia Blanco (women's tennis), Texas' Johnny Goodwin (men's tennis) and Texas Tech's Davide Moretti (men's basketball), picking up the most recent honors in 2017-18. The accolade showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has over 680 Academic All-America recipients, averaging about 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Fourteen times in the past 15 years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport, including Jevon Carter (West Virginia) for men's basketball in 2017-18 and Bianca St. Georges (West Virginia) for soccer in 2018-19.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the

Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsperson of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 441 scholars have received over \$3.3 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 23 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big 12 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 38 million people. Nearly 5,000 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference currently conducts postseason championships for 21 of its 23 sports with the Football Championship Game returning in 2017 after a six-year absence. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition.

The Conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

THE OKLAHOMA STATE TRACK & FIELD COMPLEX

OPENED - AUGUST 2013 | AREA - 20 ACRES | INVESTMENT - \$9 MILLION

The Oklahoma State Track and Field Complex is one of the nation's most pristine facilities that gives the Cowboys and Cowgirls an edge.

Opened on Aug. 17, 2013, the state-of-the-art facility was built to precise specifications set by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The complex features a nine-lane 400-meter track with a steeplechase turnout; infield and adjacent areas for field events, including shot put, discus, hammer throw, pole vault, high jump, and long jump.

Multiple buildings on the complex are for use by teams and athletes, with natural seating areas for spectators and a surrounding landscape with drainage and retention areas.

The amenities at the facility are among the best in the country, with locker rooms, bathrooms, a hydrotherapy pool and a student-athlete lounge that rival any in the country.

At a cost of approximately \$9 million, the OSU Track and Field Complex was built on 20 acres of land on the northeast side of the Oklahoma State University campus.

The project was the latest in a long line of OSU Athletics Facility upgrades, which included the upgrade of Boone Pickens Stadium, the Cowboy and Cowgirl basketball locker rooms, the Sherman E. Smith Training Center, Michael & Anne Greenwood Tennis Center as well as Neal Patterson Stadium and a new baseball stadium in the works, set to open in 2020.

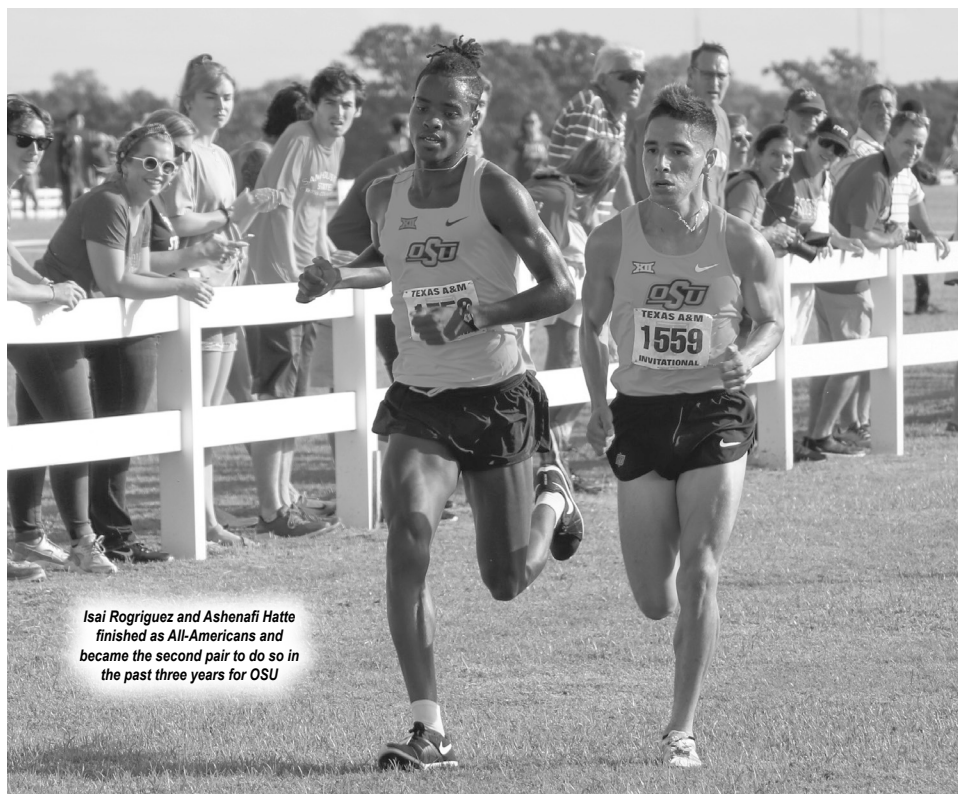

The Cowboys used a historic season from Isai Rodriguez to bounce back in 2018.

Rodriguez finished fourth at the NCAA Cross Country Championships, which was the highest finish by a Cowboy ever.

One star wasn't going to be enough for the Cowboys to jump back into the nation's top 15. They needed more than just one to replace All-American and Big 12 champion Hassan Abdi.

Ashenafi Hatte became the second-half of the Cowboys' leading duo. Hatte finished as an All-American at the national meet, becoming an All-American alongside his teammate.

The pair of All-Americans led the way for the OSU men to finish 13th in the team race, which was a 16-place improvement from 2017.

Rodriguez and Hatte were the top two Cowboys in every race they ran together, including top-five finishes for both at the Big 12 Championships and the Midwest Regional. Rodriguez and Hatte held hands to finish 1-2 at the Arturo Barrios Invitational where Hatte was given the win.

Luis Martinez returned for his final season on the cross-country course for the Cowboys. He was third for

OSU in all four of his races. He ended the season with All-Big 12 and All-Region honors and was named the Big 12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the third consecutive cross-country season.

Bryce Quigley and Alec Haines showed signs of promise during the cross-country season. Haines scored for OSU in four races including all three postseason meets. Quigley finished fourth for the Cowboys at the national meet and scored in three meets. He was also OSU's best finisher in the Nuttycombe B race with a 10th-place finish.

The Cowboys' history of postseason success continued. They made their 32nd appearance at the national championships. They now have a streak of 25 appearances in the past 26 years.

The OSU men have also placed in the top two spots at the Big 12 Cross Country Championships in 12 of the past 13 years.

The Cowboys also found success in the classroom. They earned three USTFCCCA All-Academic individuals and were honored as a USTFCCCA All-Academic team. The OSU men also tied for the Big 12 lead in Academic All-Big 12 honors. They claimed nine first team awards and had two athletes on the All-Academic second team.

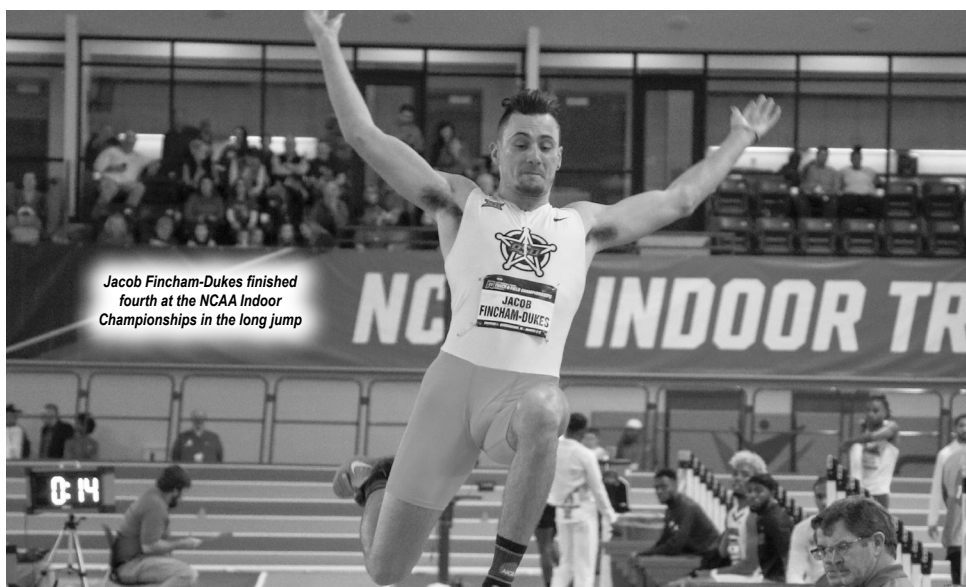

Jacob Fincham-Dukes finished fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships in the long jump

With one final indoor season remaining in his career, Jacob Fincham-Dukes made the most of it.

The English long jumper went out in style, winning the Big 12 in the long jump, placing fourth at nationals to become an All-American and setting two school records along the way.

Fincham-Dukes predictably broke his own school record in the indoor long jump, improving his mark to 7.99m/26-2.75. He also broke the OSU 60-meter hurdles record in his season opener. He ran a time of 8.32 to claim his third school record.

On the other end of the age spectrum, true freshman Ashton Hicks showed star potential in his opening season. The 400-meter specialist ended the season at the NCAA Indoor Championships where he earned second team All-America honors for a 14th-place finish.

Hicks set the school record in the indoor 400 meters when he ran a time of 45.60 to finish as the Big 12 runner-up in the 400 meters. He was beaten only by Wil London, an All-American from Baylor.

Hicks led a freshman class studded with potential for sprints coach Giles McDonnell. LaKyrn Mays and Justin Long both came in as highly touted recruits and showed why they were heavily recruited.

Mays finished seventh at the Big 12 Championships in the 400 meters, and Long finished 12th overall in the prelims of the 600-yards. Both contributed legs on the All-Big 12 4X400-meter relay team.

Isai Rodriguez carried over his success from the cross-country season. He finished as the conference runner-up in both the 3,000 and 5,000 meters.

Rodriguez also ran a 3,000-meter time of 7:54.33 at the Husky Classic to put himself at No. 8 in school history in the event.

Ryan Smeeton pulled off an impressive double at the Big 12 Indoor Championships. He qualified for and finished third in the Mile final. He then went on to run the 3,000 meters where he finished sixth.

Two middle distance freshman showed promise in their first indoor seasons. Juan Diego Castro and Isaiah Priddey put together formidable debut seasons for the Cowboys.

Castro, the Costa Rican U20 800-meter record holder, finished fourth at the Big 12 Championships in the 800 meters, while Priddey missed out on the Mile final, but missed out by two spots.

Both Castro and Priddey ran on the distance medley relay team that scored for OSU at the Big 12 Championships.

Two Cowboys scored in the heptathlon at the Big 12 Championships. Mace Metcalf set the school record with 4,999 points and Cole Verble took eighth for his first career scoring performance.

In the team race in Lubbock, the Cowboys finished in fourth place, which was a three-spot improvement from 2017.

Two years had gone by since the Cowboys put together a team performance at the NCAA Outdoor Championships that caught anyone's eye. The Oklahoma State men hadn't finished in the top 50 since 2016.

The competition in 2019 brought back some attention to the Cowboys. They had three top-five finishes to score a total of 16 points. They finished in a tie for 18th overall, which was the OSU men's best finish since 2014.

Ryan Smeeton had a phenomenal season. He ran and won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the Payton Jordan Invitational. He ran a time of 8:27.90 to earn the world standard and qualify himself for the IAAF World Championships in the fall of 2019.

Smeeton went on to finish as the NCAA runner-up in Austin, Texas. He became the first first team All-American in the steeplechase at OSU since 1998.

Hassan Abdi wrapped up his career with a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 10,000 meters. Abdi added another All-America honor. He ended his career with four first team All-America honors.

Abdi was also the 10K champion in the Big 12. He closed out his Cowboy career with four individual Big 12 titles, including a cross country title from 2017 and two outdoor 10K titles.

Jacob Fincham-Dukes capped off his career with a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He jumped 8.00m/26-3 to break his own school record in the outdoor long jump. He leaves OSU with three school records to his name and five All-America honors.

Those three Cowboys (Abdi, Smeeton and Fincham-Dukes) combined for the Cowboys' 16 points.

Ashton Hicks also made it back to the national championship meet. He qualified for the final meet of the year in both of his seasons as a freshman and scored at the Big 12 Championships in Norman with a sixth-place finish. The indoor 400-meter school record holder also nearly set the school record in the outdoor 400 meters with a time of 45.68 at the National Relay Championships.

Blake Scott followed up his breakout outdoor season in 2018 with a solid 2019 outdoor season. He finished fifth at the Big 12 Championships and advanced to the NCAA West Regional.

The young group of sprinters for coach Giles McDonnell came through with a season admirable for freshmen. The Cowboys' sent a 4X400-meter relay team to the West Regional. The team that ran and finished 18th at the West Regional included two freshmen and two sophomores.

Garrett Calhoun also ran at the West Regional. He found success at the Big 12 Championships as well, placing fourth in the 1,500-meter final. Freshman Isaiah Priddey joined him on the podium. Priddey finished sixth in his first Big 12 championship race.

The Cowboys combined for 16 All-Big 12 performances at the Big 12 Outdoor Championships on the way to a seventh-place team finish.

The Cowboys were without cross country All-Americans Isai Rodriguez and Ashenafi Hatte. Both Cowboys redshirted the outdoor season and are slated to return next year.

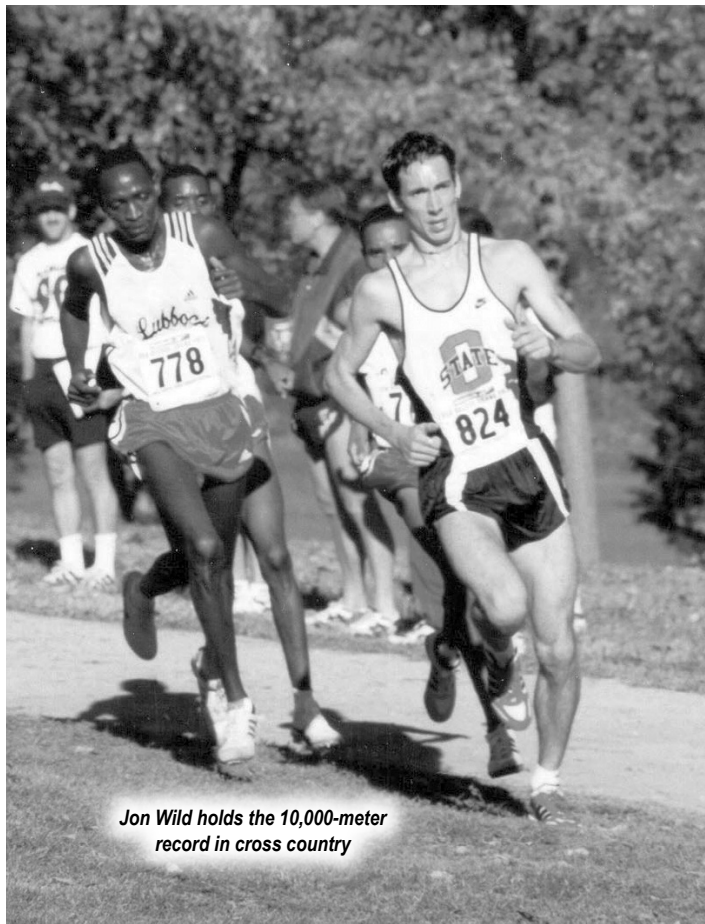

OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY



Oklahoma's only university with a statewide presence, Oklahoma State University is a five-campus, public educational system that improves the lives of people in Oklahoma, the nation, and the world by adhering to its land-grant mission of high-quality teaching, research and outreach.

OSU research, scholarship, and creative activities promote human and economic development through the expansion of knowledge and its application.

Established as a result of the Morrill Act, the Stillwater campus is the home of the OSU System. OSU was founded on Dec. 25, 1890, as Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College. On July 1, 1957, Oklahoma A&M College became Oklahoma State University.

The OSU System has an enrollment of more than 34,000 students across all its campuses. Named Oklahoma's inau-

gural Truman Honor Institution for its production of Truman Scholars, OSU today boasts students from all 50 states and around 100 nations. There are more than 275,000 OSU alumni throughout the world.

When it comes to outreach, OSU reaches across the state of Oklahoma. It has five campuses: Stillwater, which includes the Center for Veterinary Health Sciences; OSU-Tulsa; OSU-Oklahoma City; OSU Institute of Technology in Okmulgee; and the OSU Center for Health Sciences in Tulsa, which includes the OSU Medical Center. OSU also boasts 16 agricultural experiment stations statewide, extension offices serving all the state's 77 counties and research facilities in Stillwater and Tulsa.

With more than 320 undergraduate and graduate degrees and options, as well as professional degree programs in medicine and veterinary medicine, OSU provides unmatched diversity of academic offerings.

OSU conducts innovative research and technology transfer that enhance Oklahoma's economic vitality and its quality of life. The focus has expanded greatly since 1890, but the third cornerstone of the university's land-grant mission remains as crucial for the future of Oklahoma as it was at statehood. Interdisciplinary collaborations with academic institutions, government agencies, private business, and industry ensure that contributions of faculty and student researchers to the development of new knowledge and its dissemination are pertinent and lasting.

Areas of emphasis include: alternative energies and conservation; animal-based agriculture and biotechnology; environmental protection; food production and safety; health and medicine; manufacturing and advanced materials; national defense and homeland security; sensors and sensor technologies; aerospace and unmanned aerial systems; and transportation and infrastructure

OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY

Although OSU is a large, comprehensive university, its size does not minimize the personal attention given to each student. OSU encourages all students when they first enroll to identify the college in which they wish to major. Because the average number of students majoring in any one department is less than 150, the student can count on personal attention in a friendly environment.

OSU offers students many distinct advantages. It has nearly four million volumes in the library; modern research laboratories and equipment; excellent physical education, recreation and student union facilities; nationally-recognized residence hall programs; outstanding cultural and sporting events; more than 500 student organizations; and nearly 50 nationally affiliated fraternities and sororities that provide a stimulating educational and social environment.

UNIVERSITY HISTORY

The story of Oklahoma State University began on Christmas Eve, 1890, at the McKennon Opera House in Oklahoma's territorial capital of Guthrie when Territorial Governor George W. Steele signed legislation establishing an Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College (OAMC) in Payne County.

OAMC's first students assembled for class on Dec. 14, 1891, even though there were no buildings, no books, and no curriculum. The college's first students attended classes in the Stillwater Congregational Church. The original campus consisted of 200 acres of prairie that were donated by four local homesteaders. The college's first six graduates received their diplomas in 1896.

Visitors to the OSU campus often marvel at its beauty and consistency of architecture. Much of the credit goes to legendary president, Henry G. Bennett, who served from 1928-1951. Dr. Bennett's 25-year campus master plan envisioned some of the university's most famous and beautiful structures, including the Edmon Low Library and the OSU Student Union.

A new campus master plan is guiding unprecedented construction that is making OSU more competitive in academics and athletics. Since the fall of 2008, OSU has opened the Multimodal Transportation Terminal, the North Classroom Building, the west end zone of Boone Pickens Stadium, a refurbished Old Central, the Donald W. Reynolds Architecture Building, an upgraded Murray

Hall, the Henry Bellmon Research Center and a renovated Student Union, considered the most comprehensive union in the country. Most recently, the university has opened University Commons residential life facility, Bert Cooper Engineering Structures Lab, a new information technology building, library annex, Greenwood Tennis Center, a new outdoor track, a renovated Atherton Hotel, a new wing to the College of Human Sciences building, the Ferguson Family Dairy Center, a new business building, a new Central Plant, and the Endeavor engineering lab. The McKnight Center for the Performing Arts will open in 2019. Hall of Fame Avenue on the north, University Avenue on the south, and Monroe Street through the campus core have been significantly upgraded, and the university is making numerous upgrades to its campus landscape.

OSU grew quite rapidly following World War II. The post-war years were marked by a huge enrollment surge. The mid-1940s also were a golden era for athletics at Oklahoma A&M. In a 90-day period in early 1945, A&M teams won the Cotton Bowl, the NCAA championship in wrestling, and the NCAA championship in basketball. The next year, the wrestling and basketball teams repeated as national champions, and the football team won the Sugar Bowl to clinch a national title, which was retroactively awarded by the Football Writers Association of America.

By the 1950s, the college had grown substantially. In 1957, Oklahoma A&M became The Oklahoma State University for Agriculture and Applied Science.

During the next three decades, OSU would build academic programs to match its new status. Enrollment more than doubled from 10,385 in 1957 to more than 23,000 in the 1980s. OSU became a statewide university system, adding branches in Okmulgee in 1946 and Oklahoma City in 1961. OSU merged with the Oklahoma College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1988, and OSU-Tulsa was born in 1999.

Today, OSU has more than 34,000 students across five campuses and a presence in every Oklahoma county through its extension offices and experiment stations. From six graduates in 1896, to more than 7,000 annually today, the small college on the prairie has grown and prospered far beyond the dreams of its founders. OSU teaching, research and graduates are making a bigger impact on the lives of people around the world than ever before. It's a great time to be a Cowboy!

Burns Hargis was named the 18th President of Oklahoma State University and the OSU System in December 2007 and took office March 10, 2008.

Hargis oversees one of the nation's most comprehensive land-grant university systems with more than 34,000 students, 7,400 employees, and campuses located in Stillwater, Tulsa, Oklahoma City and Okmulgee.

He has guided OSU to record enrollment and record fundraising, reaching the \$1 billion Branding Success campaign goal in April 2013, nearly two years ahead of schedule. The campaign focused on student scholarships, faculty and other vital resources and programs. He also is overseeing a construction boom that is transforming the OSU campus to be more competitive in academics and athletics.

Hargis has a bold vision of creating a modern land-grant university that cuts across disciplines to better prepare students for success.

Hargis, who holds degrees in accounting from Oklahoma State University and in law from the University of Oklahoma, is the second OSU graduate to lead the university as president. Oliver S. Willham, who served as president from 1952 to 1966, graduated from then Oklahoma A&M in 1923.

He is past chairman of the Big 12 Conference Board of Directors and represents the conference as a member of the NCAA Division I Board of Directors and the NCAA Board of Governors.

Before being named OSU President, Hargis had a long and distinguished legal and business career, with active civic and philanthropic leadership across many fronts. He also is familiar to many Oklahomans through the political perspective and wit he provided on the award-winning television program "Flashpoint".

Prior to coming to OSU, he was Vice Chairman of Bank of Oklahoma, N.A. Before joining Bank of Oklahoma in 1997, Hargis practiced law in Oklahoma City for 28 years, most recently with the firm of McAfee & Taft. He is a former president of the Oklahoma County Bar Association, former president of the Oklahoma Bar Foundation, and is a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation.

Hargis served as vice-chairman of the Oklahoma State Election Board, the Oklahoma Constitutional Revision Commission, and served as Chairman of the Oklahoma Commission for Human Services. Hargis was a candidate for the Republican nomination for Governor of Oklahoma in 1990.

A firm believer in the power of imagination and collaboration, Hargis was the first chair of the Oklahoma Creativity Project. He has served and chaired many boards, including the Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges of Oklahoma State University.

Hargis received the state's highest honor when he was inducted into the Oklahoma Hall of Fame in 2009. Hargis and his wife, Ann, have two children and three grandchildren.

Mike Holder won eight NCAA team titles as head men's golf coach at Oklahoma State from 1973-2005, but what he's done for his alma mater while serving as athletic director since then is perhaps even more remarkable, especially in the realm of facilities and fundraising.

FACILITIES

When Holder took over as athletic director on September 16, 2005, he set out an audacious facilities master plan that has nearly come to fruition.

The facilities renaissance was actually set into motion during Holder's coaching days when he was a central figure in bringing Karsten Creek Golf Course into existence. The home of Cowboy and Cowgirl golf is widely recognized among the very best public courses in the nation and hosted the NCAA Championships in 2003, 2011 and 2018, along with several men's and women's NCAA regionals.

Holder's first major facilities move as athletic director came with a total overhaul of Boone Pickens Stadium that was completed in 2009. With Holder serving as athletic director, both the north and the west sides of the stadium were brought to their current form and the stadium is now recognized as one of the finest in college football.

Built from the ground up during Holder's tenure as athletic director are the Sherman Smith Indoor Training Center and the Michael and Anne Greenwood Tennis Center. Located right across the street from Boone Pickens Stadium, the 94,000-square-foot Smith Center serves nearly all of Oklahoma State's teams and is the primary practice home for Cowboy football. Just north of that is the 50,000-square-foot Greenwood Tennis Center, which was completed in 2014 and in 2016, was recognized by the United States Tennis Association as the nation's outstanding college tennis facility.

Additionally, the soccer program moved into Neal Patterson Stadium in 2018. The sparkling \$20 million facility is a showcase for college soccer with club seats, plaza and upper bowl gathering areas and a north end zone terrace area and seating designed specifically for OSU students. Team facilities include locker rooms, meeting areas, kitchen facilities, sports medicine areas and equipment rooms.

In the spring of 2018, Holder announced plans for a new baseball complex that is scheduled to be ready in time for the 2020 season. Inspired by Boone Pickens Stadium and promising to be among the elite college baseball facilities in the country, the \$75 million home of the Cowboys will include approximately 3,500 permanent seats, 13 suites and 400 premium seats in dedicated club and suite areas. Seating can be expanded to 8,000 as needed.

FUNDRAISING

Any discussion about fundraising at Oklahoma State must start with Holder's close friend, Boone Pickens, who has given more than \$500 million to his alma mater. Holder's vision for athletic facilities inspired Pickens to give \$165 million toward the project in 2006, marking the largest donation in the history of college athletics.

At Holder's urging, OSU Athletics has placed an emphasis on scholarship endowments. The "Leave A Legacy" endowment drive has seen Oklahoma State climb from dead last in the Big 12 to the top with gifts and commitments of approximately \$61 million. As recently as 2009, OSU's endowment stood at just \$2.1 million.

Perhaps Holder's adept fundraising stems from his "fund-giving". He and his wife, Robbie, illustrated their commitment to Oklahoma State when they donated \$500,000 for the first fully endowed scholarship for Cowboy football. The scholarship is named for former OSU player, the late Vernon Grant. The Holders' lifetime giving to OSU surpasses \$2.5 million, including \$1 million for an entrepreneurship super chair at OSU in the Spears School of Business.

"Robbie and I made the gift to the college of business because of (OSU donors) Malone and Amy Mitchell," Holder said at the announcement. "Having two degrees in business was the icing on the cake. I would like to see the new program nationally recognized and make a difference in the lives of young people."

Malone and Amy Mitchell had made a \$57.2 million gift to OSU, split evenly between athletics and academics, on the day the Holders announced their \$1 million gift.

SUCCESS IN COMPETITION

Oklahoma State has won six NCAA team titles under Holder's watch and entering the 2018-19 academic year, 11 different OSU programs have combined to win 52 conference titles with Holder in the athletic director's chair. Locally, OSU has won the all-sports Bedlam Series over in-state rival Oklahoma in five of the past six years.

Holder has presided over the best sustained era in Cowboy football history. The Pokes won the Big 12 Conference title outright in 2011 and have appeared in 13 straight bowl games, with four appearances in New Year's Six contests since 2010. In that same time span, the Cowboys have averaged 9.4 wins per season and rank 13th nationally with 85 wins this decade.

BACKGROUND IN GOLF

During his tenure as OSU men's golf coach, Holder's successes included not only his team's results on the course, but his players' performances in the classroom and beyond.

In 2000, Holder's Cowboy golf team claimed the national championship, marking the eighth time his squad carried home the NCAA trophy. And while high national finishes are the norm at Oklahoma State, the accomplishments of his teams never stopped at the 18th hole.

Holder took over his OSU coaching post on July 1, 1973, and during his tenure, his teams set student-athlete standards that were unequaled. While he coached 112 All-America selections, including 38 first-team choices,

and has numerous former players competing on the PGA Tour, overseas and on mini-tours, Holder saw to it that his players also excelled in the classroom. During his tenure, OSU produced three Ben Hogan Award winners, which was based on academic and athletic excellence nationwide. Kevin Wentworth earned the honor in 1990, Trip Kuehne claimed the prestigious award in 1995 and Hunter Mahan was named the 2003 recipient. Kuehne was OSU's outstanding male graduate in 1995 as well.

Holder is one of five coaches in NCAA history, regardless of sport, to win a national championship in four different decades. Three times Holder coached the Cowboys to the national team title the same year an OSU individual also claimed medalist honors (1978, 1987 and 2000). Along the way, he claimed 25 conference championships. His 21 Big Eight championships were the second most by a head coach in any sport, trailing only Kansas basketball coach Phog Allen.

As a student-athlete, Holder was the 1970 Big Eight medalist and led OSU to the conference team title. He was a third-team All-American as a junior and a senior and an honorable mention All-American as a sophomore.

PERSONAL

A graduate of Ardmore HS, Holder earned his degree in marketing from Oklahoma State in 1970 and completed work on his MBA at OSU in 1973. His wife, Robbie, graduated as salutatorian from Jasper High School in 1966, and attended the University of Houston where they met at the All-American Intercollegiate golf tournament in 1968.

Very few athletic departments produce the kind of consistent success found at Oklahoma State.

OSU boasts NCAA team championships in five different sports – wrestling (34 titles), men's golf (11 titles), men's cross country (four titles), men's basketball (two titles) and baseball (one title). Additionally, OSU football and equestrian have been recognized as national champions by other organizations, with football honored as the American Football Coaches Association national champion in 1945 and equestrian winning four team national titles as recognized by the National Collegiate Equestrian Association.

Counting NCAA team titles plus football, OSU has won 53 national championships - a mark that ranks fifth among all Division I schools.

That same success translates on the conference level, where Oklahoma State has amassed 408 team conference championships entering the 2019-20 academic year. A team-by-team look at OSU athletics:

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY/TRACK AND FIELD

Oklahoma State has won three NCAA cross country team championships since 2009 and finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships in six of the last 10 seasons. OSU has won nine of the last 11 Big 12 team titles and Cowboy Isai Rodriguez took fourth at the 2018 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

OSU won the 2014 and 2016 Big 12 Indoor Track and Field team championships and placed 18th at the 2019 NCAA outdoor championships. A Cowboy has won an NCAA title in two of the past five outdoor seasons, with Chad Noelle winning the 1,500 meters in 2015 and Nick Miller winning the hammer throw in 2016. Hassan Abdi was the 2017 Big 12 cross country individual champion.

In the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) data released in 2019, the OSU men's cross country program earned a perfect single-year score of 1,000 and its multi-year score of 991 ranked second in the Big 12.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY/TRACK AND FIELD

The Cowgirls won the 2015 Big 12 cross country title and have placed in the top four at the Big 12 meet in each of the past eight seasons. For context, OSU had only three top-three finishes at the Big 12 meet from 1990-2010.

Sinclair Johnson won the 2019 NCAA Outdoor 1,500 meters and OSU became the first program since 2011 to place three runners in the NCAA women's 1,500 meter final.

In the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) data released in 2019, OSU posted a perfect single-year score of 1,000 in both women's cross country and women's track and field. In 2018, the Cowgirls had three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans in Stephanie Ferrante, Emily Hart and Ariane Ballner.

SOCCER

Champions of the Big 12 in 2017, the Cowgirls have earned berths in 10 of the last 13 NCAA Championships and advanced to the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2011. From 2008-11, OSU celebrated four consecutive Big 12 championships. Forward Courtney Dike played in the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup and goalkeeper Adrianna Franch played in the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup.

In 2017, the Cowgirls matched a program record with 15 Academic All-Big 12 honorees.

FOOTBALL

Mike Gundy has coached the Cowboys to a bowl game now referred to as one of the New Year's Six four times since 2010. The Pokes appeared in the 2010 Cotton Bowl, the 2012 Fiesta Bowl, the 2014 Cotton Bowl and the 2016 Sugar Bowl. OSU posted three consecutive 10-win seasons in 2015, 2016 and 2017. Notable products of Cowboy football include 1988 Heisman Trophy winner Barry Sanders, five-time NFL Pro Bowler Thurman Thomas and current NFL Pro Bowlers Russell Okung, Dez Bryant and Dan Bailey.

In 2018, Oklahoma State was one of only five FBS programs to earn the AFCA's Academic Achievement Award. Cowboy football posted a perfect score of 1,000 on the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) that same year. Also in 2018, the Cowboys led the Big 12 and set a program record with 26 overall Academic All-Big 12 selections.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

With two national championships, six appearances in the Final Four, 11 appearances in the Elite Eight and 14 trips to the Sweet 16, OSU basketball is a consistent power. The Cowboys have won 20 games or more in 21 of the last 29 seasons.

In 2017, Cowboy point guard Jawun Evans became the 22nd All-American in program history. Other notable OSU products include Hall of Famers Henry Iba and Bob Kurland, plus coach Eddie Sutton. Two of the NBA's fiercest defensive standouts - Marcus Smart of the Boston Celtics and Tony Allen of the Memphis Grizzlies - hail from Oklahoma State.

In the classroom, the men's basketball program recorded a perfect score of 1,000 on the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) in 2018.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

OSU has eight NCAA Tournament appearances in the last 13 seasons and advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2008 and 2014. The Cowgirls have won 162 games over the past eight years (20.3 wins per season) and produced the 2016 Big 12 Player of the Year in Brittney Martin and the 2016 Big 12 Coach of the Year in Jim Littell.

The Cowgirls had a league-best seven players named to the 2019 Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball Team and in 2018, Loryn Goodwin was the 18th overall pick in the WNBA Draft.

EQUESTRIAN

Winners of five of the past eight Big 12 team titles, including the 2018 crown, the Cowgirls have four national championships to their credit (2000, 2003, 2004 and 2006). OSU added Western titles in 2005 and 2013. In 2019, 27 Cowgirls secured spots on the NCEA Academic Honor Roll.

WRESTLING

The winningest program in all of North American sports - NCAA or professional - Cowboy wrestling boasts 34 NCAA team championships and 142 NCAA individual crowns. The Cowboys have won 10 of the last 11 Big 12 team titles and produced the 2016 Hodge Trophy winner in Alex Dieringer. OSU finished third at the 2019 NCAA Championships.

The Cowboy wrestling program has become fertile ground for UFC champions, as Randy Couture, Daniel Cormier and Johnny Hendricks wrestled for OSU before earning UFC title belts.

Six Cowboy wrestlers earned spots on the 2019 Academic All-Big 12 team.

SOFTBALL

OSU has made eight trips to the Women's College World Series, the most recent of which came in 2019. Cowgirls Melanie Roche, Michele Smith and Lauren Bay all represented their countries in the Olympics.

Samantha Show and Madi Sue Montgomery were both All-Americans in 2019. Vanessa Shippy was the Big 12 Player of the Year in 2016 and 2018 and became the first Cowgirl to be named an All-American on the field and also a CoSIDA Academic All-American for her work in the classroom three consecutive years.

The softball program posted a perfect score of 1,000 on the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) data released in 2018 and again in 2019.

MEN'S GOLF

A truly elite program within the sport, Oklahoma State won the 2018 NCAA team championship - the 11th in program history - and claims nine NCAA individual champions and 55 conference titles all-time.

Matthew Wolff won the 2019 NCAA individual championship and both Wolff (Jack Nicklaus Award) and teammate Viktor Hovland (Ben Hogan Award) were honored as national player of the year in 2019. Hovland won the 2018 U.S. Amateur title and was the low amateur at The Masters Tournament in 2019.

Included on Cowboy golf's list of alumni are PGA performers Rickie Fowler, Hunter Mahan, Peter Uihlein, Morgan Hoffmann, Alex Noren, Charles Howell III, Bo Van Pelt, Scott Verplank and Kevin Tway.

Cowboy golf has posted a perfect score of 1,000 on the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) in 13 of a possible 14 seasons.

WOMEN'S GOLF

One of the top programs in collegiate golf, the Cowgirls have claimed 23 conference championships, including nine Big 12 titles, which is tops in league history. OSU has advanced to the NCAA Championships 21 times, which ranks 11th in NCAA history, and own 13 top-10 finishes.

Cowgirls have claimed 26 All-America selections, 25 individual conference crowns and 10 Big 12 Golfer of the Year awards. Nearly a dozen former Cowgirls currently play pro golf across the globe, including 2018 major champion Pernilla Lindberg.

MEN'S TENNIS

The Cowboys have piled up 18 conference championships through the years and have competed in the NCAA Championships in 13 of the last 17 seasons, including a trip to the Sweet 16 in 2016. Including a final ranking of No. 22 in 2019, OSU has earned a top-25 final ranking in each of the last six seasons.

Jay Udvardi was honored as the ITA Central Region Coach of the Year in 2017 and has led the program to a perfect score of 1,000 in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) in four of the last five years.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

The Cowgirls have advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight in two of the past four seasons and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 in four of the last five seasons. OSU ranked No. 12 in the final Oracle/ITA rankings in 2019, marking the fifth straight season with a top-15 final national finish for the Cowgirls.

OSU has produced at least one All-American in each of the last six seasons, including Katarina Stresnakova, who was a singles All-American in 2019.

Sofia Blanco was a CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2018 and earned the NCAA's Elite 90 Award in 2019.

BASEBALL

One of the sport's most revered programs, Oklahoma State has made 45 trips to the NCAA Tournament and 20 trips to the College World Series and boasts 33 conference championships, including the 2019 Big 12 tournament title. OSU has made seven consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament, with Super Regional appearances in 2014, 2016 and 2019 and a College World Series trip in 2016.

In Robin Ventura and Pete Incaviglia, the Cowboys claim two of the greatest college baseball players of all time.

MR. T. BOONE PICKENS



T. Boone Pickens is arguably OSU's (and the state's) most visible personality. His various endeavors and colorful demeanor have been chronicled on the covers of most American business publications and by some of the most-watched television programs in the country.

During the span of his long career, T. Boone Pickens has created thousands of jobs and made billions of dollars—for others as well as himself—and he isn't timid about spreading it around. "I like making money. I like giving it away.... not as much as I like making it, but it's a close second," he has often said.

The breadth of his philanthropy—which approaches \$1 billion during his career—includes health and medical research, treatment and services; entrepreneurship; kids at risk; education and athletics, with a particular focus on his alma mater, Oklahoma State University; corporate health and fitness; and conservation and wildlife management. While many donations involve tens of millions of dollars and attract headlines, there are hundreds more ranging from hundreds of thousands to several hundred. Each is important in its own way.

The establishment of the T. Boone Pickens Foundation has ensured his continued ranking as one of the top U.S. philanthropists. The Pickens Foundation is improving lives through grants supporting educational programs, medical research, athletics and corporate wellness, at-risk youths, the entrepreneurial process and conservation and wildlife initiatives.

In 2007, Pickens brought his innovative entrepreneurial approach to the philanthropic sector, announcing the Foundation's largest gifts yet—\$50 million each for two University of Texas health care institutions: UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas and The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston. Under unique agreements, the gifts create special funds at the

institutions, requiring that they grow to \$1 billion (\$500 million each) within 25 years from earnings on the original principal and/or from new outside donations solicited by the institutions. When the \$500 million marks are reached, the institutions will be able to distribute the funds as they deem fit.

In many ways, Pickens is a record-setting philanthropist. His \$165 million gift to his alma mater, Oklahoma State University, in 2005 is the single largest gift for athletics in NCAA history, and the \$7 million donation to the American Red Cross in 2005 is the largest individual contribution in the 150-year history of that organization. His unprecedented giving to athletics has triggered a renaissance in Oklahoma State University's football program and was a key factor in its first Big 12 championship in 2011 and its first BCS Bowl win in the Fiesta Bowl matchup with Stanford in 2012.

On May 21, 2008, Pickens gave \$100 million for the endowment of major faculty chairs and professorships at Oklahoma State University. The OSU School of Geology already bears his name from previous gifts to OSU.

Over the years, Pickens has donated close to \$600 million to Oklahoma State, split virtually equally between athletics and academics. Backed by the record donation in 2005, Pickens and OSU athletic director Mike Holder set into motion the acquisition of land that has produced OSU's sparkling Athletic Village, which now includes the Sherman Smith Training Center, the Michael and Anne Greenwood Tennis Center, O'Brate Stadium and OSU's track and field facility.

In 2010, OSU launched its campus-wide "Branding Success" campaign and T. Boone Pickens again led the charge with yet another \$120 million gift to his alma mater.

A hall-of-famer in both Oklahoma and Texas, Pickens is a national and indeed a world leader on the energy front with the launching of the Pickens Plan, which is a unique private sector initiative formed to address the economic and national security threats posed by America's ever-increasing reliance on OPEC oil.

A presence at every Oklahoma State home football game for years, Pickens enters the 2019 season at age 91 and has endured a number of health setbacks that have limited his attendance, but have not slowed his passion for the Cowboys.

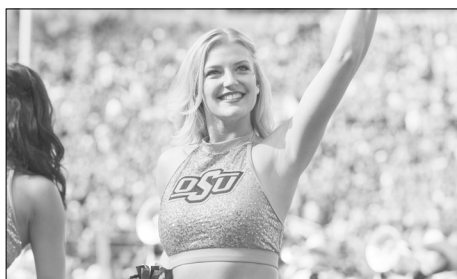

Wearing school colors and displaying emblems of the university are life-long symbols of allegiance. Oklahoma State's famed Homecoming is a yearly celebration that brings much activity and excitement.

THE COWBOY TRAIL

Dating back to the 1890s, Oklahoma A&M sports teams had been referred to as Agriculturists or Aggies, the Farmers, and officially but unpopularly, the Tigers. But by 1924, Charles Saulsberry, sports editor of the *Oklahoma City Times*, and other writers who regularly covered college events, had begun to refer to Stillwater's teams as the A&M Cowboys. Reporters' constant search of colorful synonyms started sprinkling Cowpokes, Pokes, Waddies, Cowpunchers and Punchers in conversation. "Cowboys" had a Southwestern flavor and flair that fit like a favorite pair of boots.

The Athletic Council authorized athletics director Edward C. Gallagher to have 2,000 balloons printed, "Oklahoma Aggies—Ride 'Em Cowboy" for sale at football games in 1926.

PISTOL PETE

Around 1923, when Oklahoma A&M College was searching for a new mascot to replace its tiger (copied along with the school's orange and black colors, from university founders who hailed from Princeton), a group of students saw Frank Eaton leading the Armistice Day Parade. He was approached to see if he would be interested in being the model for the new mascot, and he agreed. A likeness was drawn and began to be used on sweatshirts, stickers, etc., and a tradition was born.

That caricature was the basis for what is used today as the official Oklahoma State University mascot. For 35 years, the crusty old cowboy was a living symbol of OSU, representing the colorful past of the area. As such, he would attend OSU athletic events, building dedications, etc., and sign autographs, pose for photographs and reminisce about the Old West with anyone who would listen.

To this day, his likeness is a visible reminder of the Old West to literally millions of people yearly as a symbol of colleges whose mascots pay homage to the cowboy. Each year, OSU students tryout for Pistol Pete. A panel of former "Petes" judge the try-outs and select the two best candidates based on an interview, a mime, and posing as mascot in different "game situations." The two who are selected split the approximately 500 appearances annually. These appearances include all athletic events, pep rallies, business openings, weddings, birthday parties, and public school events.

FRANK EATON - BEFORE PISTOL PETE

"My boy, may an old man's curse rest upon you, if you do not try to avenge your father...You must never stop until they are all accounted for!" These words, according to one of Eaton's many stories, were spoken by a family friend following the brutal murder of his father, and guided the formative years of Frank's life.

Born in 1860, in Hartford, Connecticut, Frank moved with his family to Kansas shortly after the close of the Civil War. When Frank was eight years old, his father, a former Union soldier, was shot and killed by a group of lawless former Confederates. Frank was a witness to the murder and each of the murderers' faces was imprinted in his memory.

After being challenged to avenge his father's death by Mose Beaman, (the family friend), Frank set out to learn how to handle guns. Mose gave him a gun and holster, and taught him how to handle and shoot guns. Frank quickly learned to "shoot a snake's head off with either hand". During the next few years, Frank's days were spent helping his mother with chores and practicing shooting. With each passing year, he became faster and more accurate with his guns.

When Frank was 15, he learned of the location of one of his father's killers. After deciding it was almost time to set out on his mission, Frank wanted to make sure his shooting skills were good enough. He decided to visit Fort Gibson, a cavalry fort, to try to learn more about handling a gun. There he competed with the cavalry's best marksmen, beating them each time. After many competitions, the fort's commanding officer, Colonel Copinger gave Frank a marksmanship badge and a new name. From that day forward, Frank would be known as Pistol Pete.

BULLET

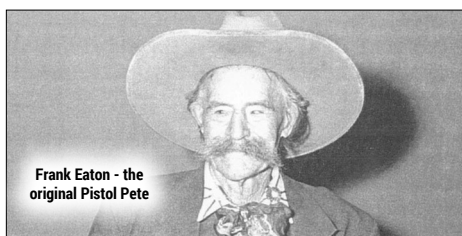
The Oklahoma State University Cowboys have many symbols of their western heritage, but none is more appropriate than their mascot, Bullet. The Spirit Rider program debuted in 1984 with the first few Spirit Riders providing their own horse to serve as mascot for the OSU Cowboys.

However, in 1988, Stars Parr Money was donated to the OSU Athletic Department to be used specifically as the mascot. Since that time, Bullet has delighted crowds with his traditional sprint across the football field following every Cowboy touchdown. The heart of the Cowboy Spirit Rider Program, Bullet is not only seen at Boone Pickens Stadium and other OSU football games, he's made appearances at local elementary schools, parades, rodeos and other special events, including the opening ceremonies of the Oklahoma State Special Olympics.

The tradition of the Spirit Rider can be attributed to the late Eddy Finley, who wanted to promote school spirit the "cowboy way," on horseback. Since that time, additional support has come for the Spirit Rider and Bullet, much of it due to Finley's hard work. A horse trailer, custom-tooled saddle and uniform dress for the Spirit Rider and ground crew have been donated to OSU. In honor of the Spirit Rider and its tradition, Jim Hamilton sculpted the Spirit Rider bronze statue that sits next to the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in Stillwater.

Friday night's Walkaround attracts thousands to campus for Homecoming.

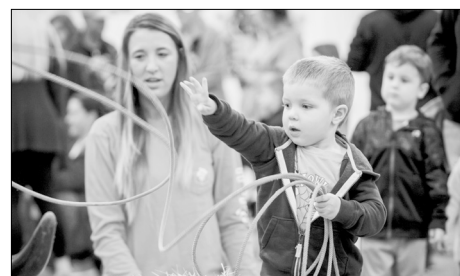
Ask any Oklahoma State University graduate what OSU's greatest tradition is, and you'll hear one word - Homecoming.
