

... from Pastor Melissa:

Dear People of Olivet,

My husband and I have routine conversations about expectations. He has learned over the years that lowering his expecta-



tions leads to less frustration and disappointment. This used to feel like a cop out to me. I came from the Les Brown school of thought on the matter: "Shoot for the moon. Even if you miss, you'll land among the stars."

Now that our adult leaders and youth participants have entered the final countdown to the ELCA National Youth Gathering in Houston, I'm assessing my expectations. The ELCA planning committees have been hard at work to ensure the Gathering is first and foremost an event that forms faith.

The clergy spirit at work in me desires that each of our young people (and adults, for that matter) encounters God in a meaningful way as a result of our Houston experience. The reality is that the Holy Spirit has long been at work in the lives of our youth and continues to guide, nurture, and enlighten them in faith. This is actually core to our faith in Christ as Lutherans. Remember these words spoken at baptism and when our youth confirm their faith:

Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. Amen.

Stir up the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, this spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. Amen.

Summertime at Olivet

Olivet is always a "happenin' place" — and summer is a time when we really step it up to get needed things done. If you are reading this in early June, it's not too late to stop by and witness the wonder of VBS. Opening and closing sessions are really full of spirit and energy — 9 am and 11:45. Stop by the Christian Life Center, June 11 — 15.

On to projects...

In the June 3 Olive Branch, we shared the fact that the Building sub-group of the Congregation Mission Emphases Team has been busy working on planning various building signage (introduced by fall). Accomplished June 4 was the **restriping of the front Monroe Street parking area** with the angled parking direction being reversed. Studies have helped us decide this was a necessary improvement to streamline traffic through front area. Thanks to a benevolent Olivet couple who have underwritten this expense.

Also related to front entrance—there will be a **new concrete pad** poured that will be a handicap accessible approach to the Welcome Center area to replace the step up. Completion: last week of June.

Painting of the steeple as well as the west side cupola is a priority this year. Council approved the application of RHINO SHIELD rather than painting. Research indicates that this should be longer lasting than paint. The steeple was last painted in 2008 and began looking poorly two years ago. Cost: approximately \$7,000 (slight variable depending on days renting lift). Scheduled for late June/early July.

Pr. Melissa acquired nice office furniture as a result of furniture available when Directions Credit Union relocated to their new downtown location. Thanks to Barry Shaner and his accommodating staff. The only cost was moving furniture from Maumee to Olivet.

Two Gifts to Olivet (read on for the story*)

- New elevator for Sanctuary. We have contracted with Vertical Mobility, a local elevator company, to replace our existing elevator with new, quieter equipment. Expected useful life: 35 years. Cost of elevator: \$25,000; approximate cost to build platform: \$5000; total cost \$30,000.Tom Reynolds of Reynolds Construction, LLC, will assist with any necessary details related to the platform. Scheduled for late summer installation.
- Eight new Pella windows will replace the seven large upper/east facing Sanctuary windows including the half circle windows and one smaller window, all of which are 60-year-old single pane glass. Expected useful life: 35-50 years. Total cost: \$22,063. July installation.

*Olivet received a gift of \$51,666 from deceased member, Evelyn Wisnofske, which was designated to be used for something special and long-lasting. Her heir approached Olivet and asked for a list of projects, so we created a wish list that included six special projects. The two projects chosen were the elevator and sanctuary windows because the heir felt those would most suitably honor Evelyn and her legacy. What a great gift these will be to all of us!!

Still on the wish list:

- Carpet—Replace all of the red Sanctuary carpet with new. Expected useful life 25 years. Total cost: \$13,961.46.
- **Lighting**—Replace all rear parking light fixtures and fixtures on the Christian Life Center with LED fixtures. This will increase safety and security. Expected useful life 30 years. Total cost: \$8775.
- **Security Cameras**—Install new security cameras on the exterior and selected interior locations. This enhances security and safety. Expected useful life: ten years. Total cost: \$3000.
- Windows—Replace the 14 remaining lower level double hung windows on the east and north side. Expected useful life: 35-50 years. Total cost: \$9284.

Update of Ongoing Projects of the Congregation Mission Emphasis Group

- ♦ A hymnal ribbon project was led by Judi Paul. Ribbon markers were created and assembled by our committee, as well as office staff and volunteers, to place in the hymnals located in the Chapel and Sanctuary. The purpose is to help visitors, and members alike, mark pages of liturgy and hymns used during the service to aid in easily finding these components during worship. The project was completed and markers inserted prior to the goal of Pentecost Sunday, May 20.
- Work continues on interior and exterior signage to make our building and entrance/ exit areas more welcoming and easier to navigate.
- ♦ The parking area in front of church was restriped to align parking spaces with the direction of our entrance driveway. People will no longer have to drive around the back of the building to follow the proper direction of the parking spaces. The cost associated with this was underwritten by one generous Olivet couple.

GLOBAL MINISTRIES

FLOODING IN EASTERN KENYA May 16, 2018

Floods and heavy rains in Kenya have now displaced at least 311,164 people across the country. The death toll has risen to 132 people and 33 have been injured according to the Kenya Red Cross Society (KRCS). More than 100,000 people are affected in Tana River County alone.

On May 9, a dam in Nakuru burst killing at least 30 people and forcing 500 households to seek shelter, according to KRCS. The latest OCHA Flash Update reports that, while the extent of the total damage remains unknown, 6,000 livestock have been killed and nearly 8,500 hectares of farmland are submerged.

On May 15, the Government of Kenya issued a warning to those living in Tana County that the Masinga Dam will reach capacity in the coming days and residents should seek higher ground immediately. The climate outlook for May 2018 indicates continued above-normal rainfall in Western and Central Kenya. KRCS says it may be four months until families are able to return to their homes

Emergency shelter, food supplies and non-food items (NFI) are needed as the displaced population increases.

Lutheran World Relief has committed an initial \$25,000 for food and non-food item distribution in one of the temporary camps in Tana River County, which currently hosts about 3,000 families.
