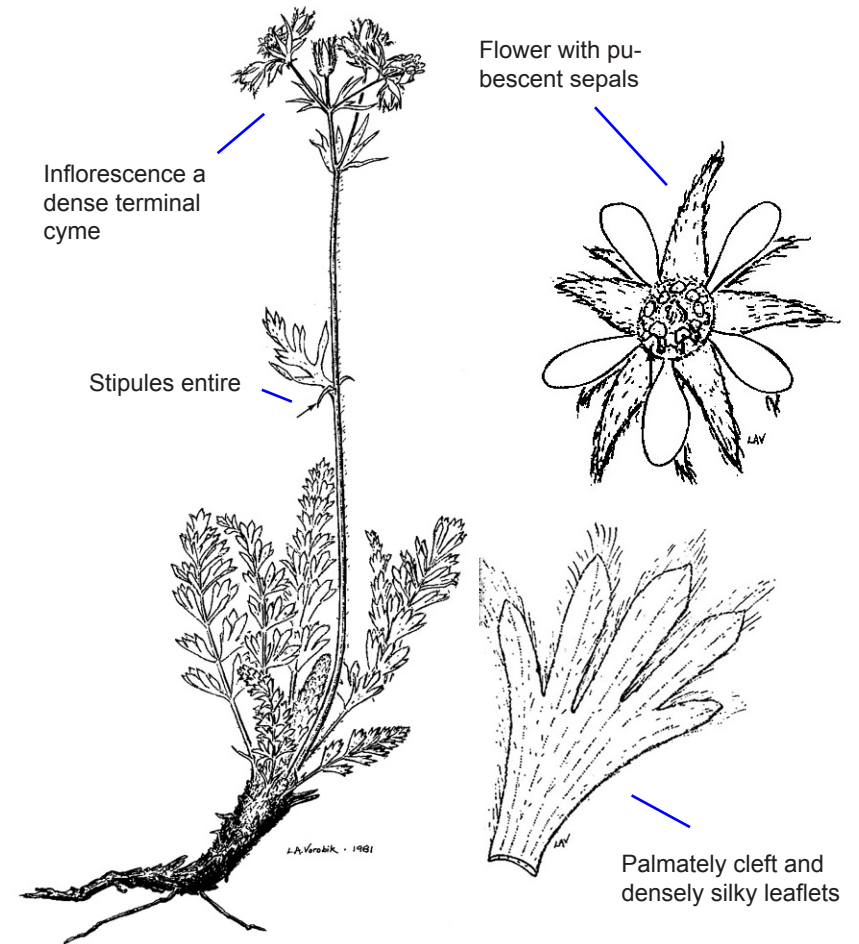

Plant is perennial with a branching, woody crown. **Stems** simple, 10-15 cm tall, hirsute below, not glandular. **Leaves** densely silky, 4-6 cm long, compound, with 11-19 palmately cleft and rather crowded leaflets, stipules subulate and entire. **Inflorescence** a dense, terminal cyme, villous; calyx lobes broadly lanceolate, acuminate, petals oblong-linear, white or pink, filaments pubescent.

Lookalikes
Horkelia spp.

differs from featured plant by
Featured plant may be distinguished from other *Horkelia* species by its pubescent filaments, entire stipules, densely silky leaves, and its alpine habitat.

Distribution: Siskiyou Mountains, Jackson County, Oregon.

Habitat: Granitic peaks at high elevation above tree line.

Elevation: 2280 m

Best survey time (in flower): June through August

Castilleja arachnoidea (Cobwebby paintbrush)

Trisetum (Oatgrass)

Erigeron compositus (Cutleaf daisy)

Penstemon davidsonii (Davidson's penstemon)
