Ranunculaceae Obscure buttercup





**Plant** is a herbaceous perennial, glabrous, 5-15 cm tall, stems reclining. **Leaves** mostly basal; basal leaves triternately divided, finely dissected, primary divisions long petiolate, lobes filiform-linear to linear-spatulate, obtuse, dissected blade deltoid to reniform, cauline leaves similar. **Inflorescence** on nearly naked stalks, flowers yellow with 5 broadly ovate petals. **Fruits** are numerous

small achenes. Lookalikes Ranunculus spp.


Featured plant differs from other *Ranunculus* species by its triternately divided leaves, and cauline leaves similar to basal leaves
