

## Thelypodium howellii ssp. howellii

Brassicaceae Howell's thelypody





**Plant** is a short-lived, glaucous annual or biennial,10-90cm tall. **Stem** branched above the middle. **Basal leaves** in a rosette, oblanceolate, short-petiolate, 2-10 cm long, mostly lobed. **Stem leaves** 1-4 cm long, numerous, lanceolate to linear, with clasping lobes at the base. **Inflorescence** is open, elongated and attached with a stout pedicel. **Flowers** are light purple with a greenish base, oblanceolate to spatulate petals, somewhat crinkled at the base, sepals oblong, 7mm. **Fruit** a cylindrical silique with plump, brown seeds.



its larger flowers and distribution limited to Malheur County. its greater size (60-200 cm tall).






## Thelypodium howellii ssp. howellii S. Watson
