What a year. Major events jolted our world, in particular the Arab Spring, and the earthquake and tsunami in Japan. The College experienced them through the lives of our students and their families, and through our alumni, engaged as protesters and reporters in Tahrir Square, and as Red Cross workers and volunteers in Canada and Japan. Every day we were—are—reminded of the impact our fearless alumni are having on the world.

At the College, it was a year of rebuilding. We began the renovation of Calgary House, 10 rooms funded through a quiet word-of-mouth campaign. We put our fiscal house in order, too, balancing our operating budget for the first time in many years. And the gifts kept coming: alumni set records for total number of donors and number of recurring donors. Years 4-5-6 alumni generously funded a new dock, which floated into the bay in April.

Our students came from every imaginable background and location—from big cities, rural villages, refugee camps, orphanages, public schools, private schools and no schools at all—all on full scholarship. They, too, were part of campus renewal, helping to revitalize the Pearson experience. They worked tirelessly to create a new daily schedule, establish a student-led afternoon dedicated to fitness and develop ways to make campus life healthier for everyone.

All of what happens at Pearson College is made possible through the generous contributions of others, both in terms of financial support and the hours of expertise given to the College. We are grateful. On behalf of the entire Pearson College community, it is a privilege to say: Thank you.

The past year has been one of significant progress for Pearson College, justification for the optimism the Trustees share following the difficult decision we took in 2010 to downsize the student enrollment by 20%.

Positive steps that occurred in the past year include:

- Balancing the operating budget (there was a small surplus!) for the first time in many years.

- Taking advantage of the reduction in student enrollment to upgrade the campus infrastructure. We have now raised sufficient funds to cover all rooms in Calgary House, with renovations well underway.

- Improving our fundraising capabilities with the hiring of Sarah Nelems as Vice President of Philanthropy and Engagement. Susan Green and her committee are to be commended for their hard work in this regard.

- Converting Vision 20/20 into more of a strategic plan.

- Launching a formal capital campaign under the chair of Trustee Jim Hayhurst, with the goal of overcoming our longstanding infrastructure deficit.

We continue to attract high-quality individuals to serve as Trustees (1/3 are now alumni), people committed to Pearson College and determined to see the College succeed. David Hawley, beginning a new five-year term as Director, and his team also continue to do an outstanding job.

As I complete my term as Chair, I want to express my appreciation for the efforts of David Hawley and all of our Trustees. It has been a privilege to work with you. I admit, this position has had its “moments,” but when I see the opportunities provided to the students, and the enthusiastic way in which they embrace them, I am full of hope, and I know that Pearson College will make the world a better place.

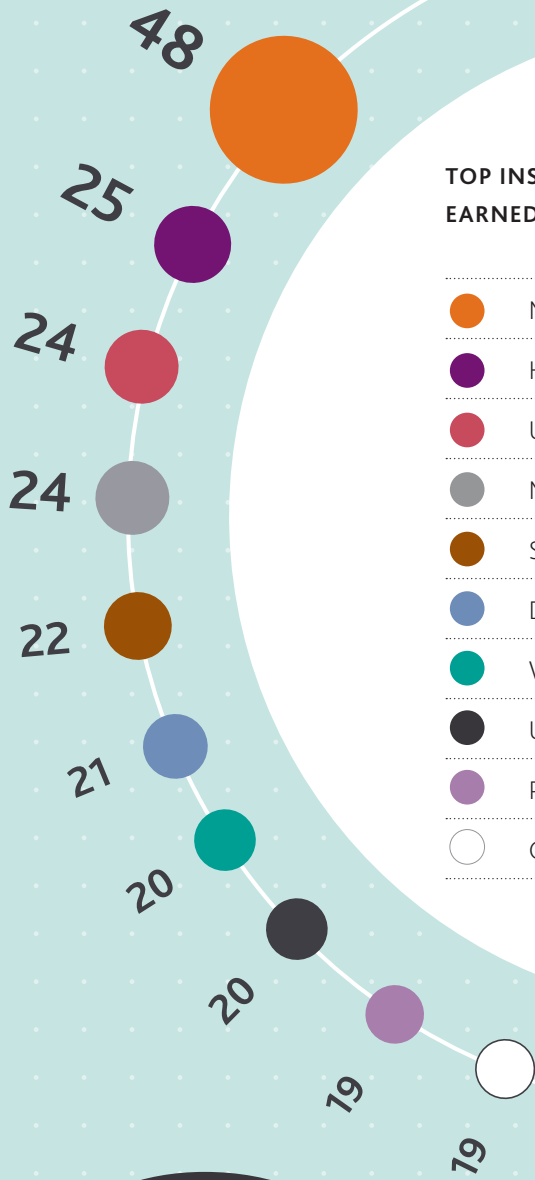

I came to Holland six years ago after handing over the management of AfriCap to my African partner. At Oikocredit, I manage the growing equity investment portfolio, working with colleagues in 35 country offices, which requires patience, cultural sensitivity and good relationships, as well as negotiation skills. We invest in social enterprises with good potential for growth and investment value and also social purpose (eg. Microfinance Institutions, Fair Trade companies, Agricultural processing businesses). The equity portfolio is now about €50 million in total commitments. Oikocredit is a somewhat unique organization—an international investment cooperative that is not profit-maximizing but profitable, very democratic with active members, and committed to dual returns, both investment and social. The unique attributes of my work at Oikocredit involve finding the balance between sustainability, ie profit, and development impact; communicating across cultures; and building solid partnerships based on common values.

KAYAKING THE INSIDE PASSAGE

During the past year I witnessed the transformational experience of a challenging expedition when I joined Pearson College students Matthew (Canada—Manitoba), Logan (USA), Ghazi (Jordan), Marissa (Canada—Alberta), Laurence (Canada—Quebec) and Marc (Canada—Alberta) on the United World Kayaking Expedition, a 1,200-km kayak exploration from Prince Rupert to Pedder Bay via BC's spectacular Inside Passage.

Although the group had been mainly self-selecting, it was one that inspired confidence. Matthew and Logan were strong kayakers. Ghazi impressed with his determination to meet the fitness and skills standards that would be required. Marissa and Laurence brought a dynamic enthusiasm that raised group motivation; both were good paddlers. Laurence was a

veteran of 30-day canoe trips back home in Quebec and quickly showed equal aptitude with kayaking. While Marc had the least paddling experience, he had a quiet determination and strong work ethic that enabled him to quickly catch up. He also had strong first-aid skills, providing the group with backup to my wilderness first-aid certification.

Right from the start a strong team unity developed. The students were open, honest and respectful in their communication with each other and clear about their individual and mutual responsibilities, with all members feeling their views were respected and valued. The students displayed self-discipline and maturity in preparing for the expedition, organizing regular training sessions with the stronger paddlers instructing those less experienced. They also held each other accountable to regular fitness training. Ghazi went from being capable of only swimming a few

lengths to being one of the strongest swimmers on campus.

The students were involved in all aspects of the expedition. It was necessary to seek sponsorship. I focused on sponsors for the expedition kayaks while the students approached outdoors companies for camping equipment. In doing so, they learned to write proposals detailing the goals of the expedition and our specific needs. This also led to them learning to overcome the disappointment of their enthusiasm going unrewarded, as most companies we approached rejected our proposals. But Stellar Kayaks and North Face came through with discounted kayaks and expedition tents respectively. Ocean River Sports in Victoria also provided us with discounted kayaking and camping gear.

A large quantity of food is required for an expedition of this size and ambition, and pre-trip planning and organization

has to be meticulous. The students assisted by suggesting suitable quick-cooking camp meals; our final menu plan covered one week (7 breakfasts, 7 lunches, 7 dinners), with overall planning based on eight repetitions of this menu. The students helped with the bulk-food shopping. They also spent time measuring the required quantities for each individual meal into Ziploc bags and organizing these meals into food drops that were mailed or delivered to towns along the route for later collection. The time spent planning paid off: all of the students maintained their weight despite the huge amount of energy they expended each day.

The expedition also presented the students with the opportunity to develop outdoor leadership skills. Each student took turns assuming responsibility for the safety of the group and making appropriate leadership decisions: researching the upcoming area, planning the route, recording marine weather

forecasts, calculating tides and currents, and being responsible for chart reading and navigating when on the water.

One goal of the expedition was to introduce the students to the beauty of coastal British Columbia. We observed orca and humpback whales, porpoises, dolphins, bears, wolves, sea otters, sea lions and many bird species. We travelled past snow-covered peaks and steep cliffs, crossed large channels and made our way through island mazes, camped on tiny, rocky islets as well as sandy beaches, and visited ancient native village sites. The four students who had taken the College's marine science course were able to apply their knowledge as we travelled, identifying various species and ecosystems.

Other service and educational aspects of the expedition presented themselves through connections made with the Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup, Sea to Stream and Ocean Networks Canada. At various locations we collected and bagged trash, providing the coordinates to the Canadian Coast Guard for later pick up. In conjunction with Ocean Networks Canada, we collected oceanographic data along the way, such as ocean temperature and salinity.

During the first three weeks we were in true wilderness, speaking to only two people outside our group during this time. This isolation enabled us to quickly become confident in our self-reliance as a group. Later in the expedition we started travelling through more populated areas and the students were able to meet many

interesting people and gain insight into the attractions of and difficulties with living and working in remote coastal communities.

While I was confident in the students' ability to complete this challenge and cope with any hardships along the way, I had not expected it to be so easy! Throughout the expedition there was not a single disagreement or harsh word spoken, a rare enough event in any expedition let alone one comprised mainly of young adults. And there were hardships: we encountered miserable campsites, horrendous bugs, two solid weeks of drizzle, fog and rain where our gear couldn't dry, and paddled long, fatiguing days. Yet the group approached everything with a positive attitude and never failed to maintain a high morale. At all stages they proved themselves excellent ambassadors of Pearson College and the UWC movement, embodying and exemplifying the UWC values.

Kurt Hahn believed that educators have a responsibility to provide challenging experiences that go beyond the classroom. I consider myself fortunate to have had the opportunity to share in this experience with students, who were inspirational to me. It was their enthusiasm and dedication that inspired the United World Kayaking Expedition. Now, having witnessed the personal growth and transformations that Kurt Hahn believed these life-changing expeditions were capable of providing, I look forward to being inspired by the possibility of another expedition, United World Kayaking II.



SAVING AVATAR GROVE

Our College campus is secluded, situated on 75 acres of old-growth rainforest, designed for minimal human impact amid endangered Garry Oak meadows and coastal Douglas Fir ecosystems. The forest, inspiring reverence, humility and respect for the environment, embodies the Pearson mission for peace and a sustainable future. It provides a natural setting away from a consumer-driven world for us to learn and develop as global citizens.

The Pacific Northwest is host to the largest area of temperate rainforest on the planet. It is an exceptionally fragile ecosystem. On Vancouver Island, most of the old-growth rainforest has been logged, including 90% of the valley bottoms where the richest biodiversity and biggest trees are found.

I find these statistics saddening and alarming. Old-growth forests are not only awe-inspiring, but they support unique wildlife and biodiversity, purify

water for salmon, wildlife and people, and curb climate change by acting as carbon sinks. Their spiritual value is central to many First Nations cultures. Their magnificence attracts tourists from all over the world. It is imperative to save the old-growth rainforests remaining in our local community, beginning with Avatar Grove in Port Renfrew.

Though 75% of Avatar Grove's territory is open to logging, it stands as a thriving ancient ecosystem. It is also easily accessible by road and draws tourists. As a result, the Port Renfrew Chamber of Commerce has joined the Ancient Forest Alliance in advocating for the protection of the Grove because it is essential to the economy of the small town. This forest has also attracted international media coverage, thousands of petition signatures and hundreds of citizen letters to the BC government, calling upon it to create an old-growth management strategy for systemic change in the protection of these areas.

I am grateful my co-years and I had the opportunity to create a documentary, "Making a Stand", with the assistance of the Ancient Forest Alliance and the people of Port Renfrew. The community welcomed us with open hearts. With the guidance and support of the Ancient Forest Alliance, we had the opportunity to learn about one of the most unique ecosystems in the world. We also gained skills—editing, planning, networking and raising awareness—as we cultivated a true passion for saving the forest. Thanks to this experience, I am now determined to pursue a path of environmental activism.

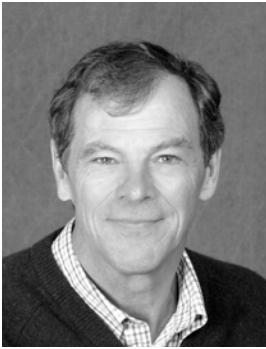

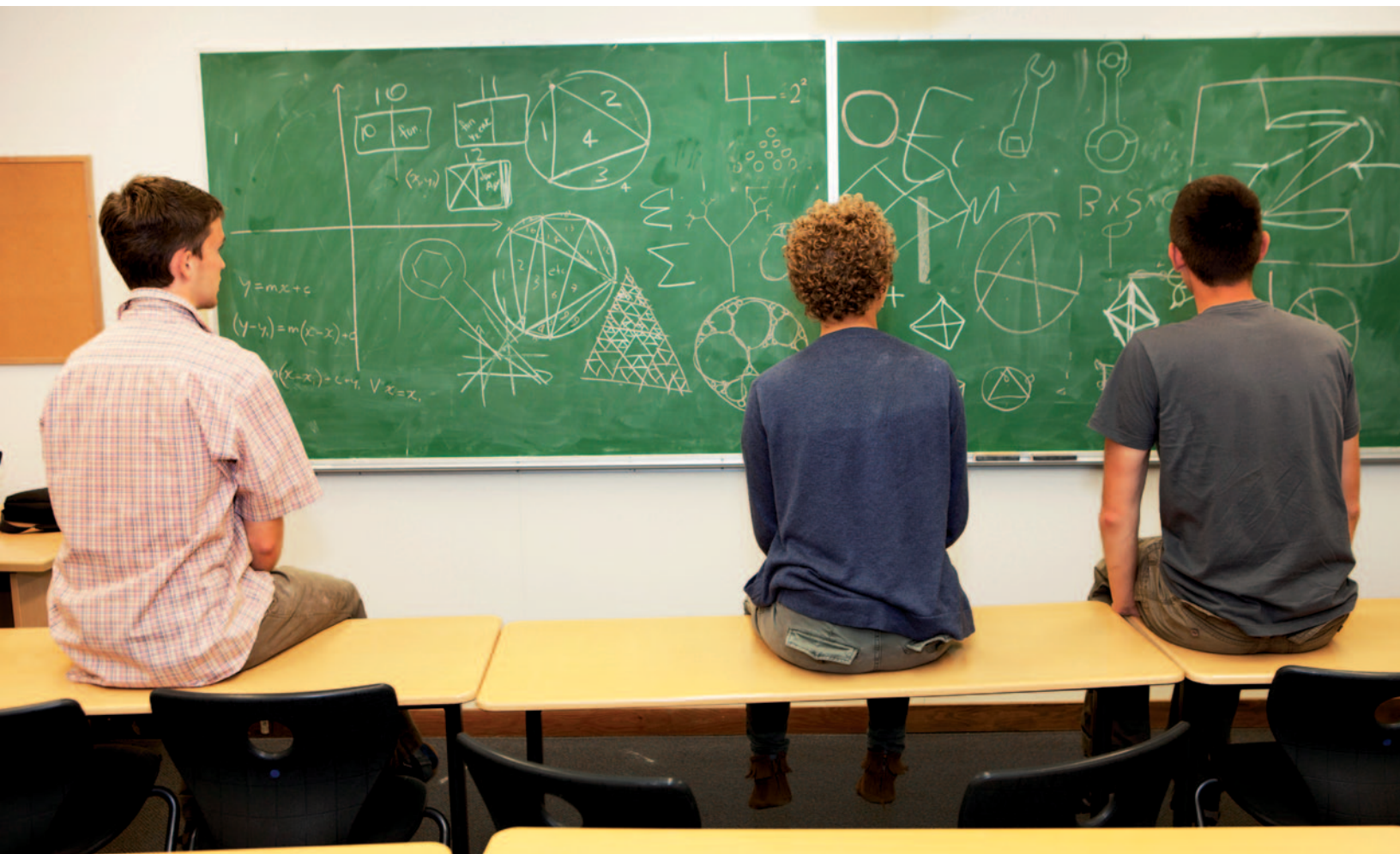

Astronaut **JULIE PAYETTE**, OC, CQ, took on another mission—as a member of the Board of Trustees of Pearson College UWC. Canada’s high-flying hero and the college have long been connected through Pearson’s sister school in Wales, UWC Atlantic, where Payette received her International Baccalaureate in 1982.

“I am honoured to join the Pearson Board. As part of the United World College movement, Pearson embodies the vision I have of education, one that embraces the spirit of international and intercultural understanding.”

Payette is an ideal Pearson Trustee. Both she and the college are international in scope: Payette is a French Canadian who speaks five languages; she was selected by the Canadian Space Agency as one of four astronauts from a field of 5,330 applicants in June 1992. Her career has taken her literally out of this world, through two missions in 1999 and 2009 to the International Space Station—an internationally developed research facility operated as a joint project between five space agencies: NASA, CSA (Canada), ESA (Europe), RKA (Russia) and JAXA (Japan).

Payette began serving her 3-year term as a Pearson Trustee on January 27, 2011.



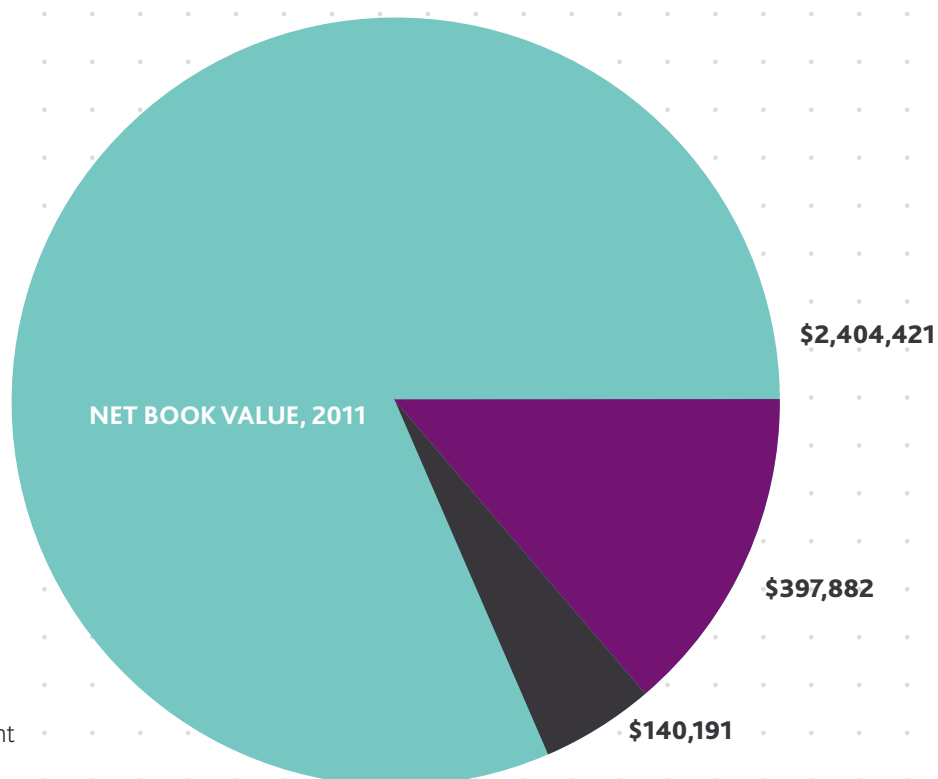

YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2011

(the "College") is incorporated under the Canada Corporations Act and is registered under the Society Act (British Columbia) as an extra-provincial society and is a registered charity under the Federal Income Tax Act. The College promotes the cause of international understanding by creating an environment in which students from many countries and cultures are brought together to study and to serve the community.

NOTE 1

BASIS OF PRESENTATION

These summary financial statements are prepared for the purposes of this annual report and do not include all of the information and disclosures contained in the complete financial statements. These summary financial statements are derived from the complete audited financial statements, prepared in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. The complete financial statements include cash flow information and more detailed explanatory notes.

NOTE 3

BANK LOAN

The College has a revolving demand credit facility agreement with a major Canadian bank. The credit facility is secured by a mortgage on land, buildings and equipment and is repayable on demand. It bears interest at the bank's prime lending rate of 3.0% at June 30, 2011 (2010 - 2.5%). The maximum borrowing under the credit facility is \$3,500,000.

NOTE 4

RELATED ORGANIZATIONS

(A) PEARSON COLLEGE OF THE PACIFIC FOUNDATION

The College receives contributions from the Pearson College of the Pacific Foundation (the "Foundation") to supplement its fundraising activities. The College has an economic interest in the Foundation. The Foundation is a separate tax-exempt organization formed to raise funds for furthering the interests of the College and to provide operating and capital grant funding to the College. The College provides certain administrative services which the Foundation reimburses to the College. During the year the total reimbursement was \$73,381 (2010 - \$92,260). During 2011 the Foundation contributed \$1,896,198 (2010 - \$2,122,752) to the Operating Fund and \$189,787 (2010 - \$195,121) to the Capital Fund. As at June 30, 2011, the Foundation's net assets were \$39,514,954 (2010 - \$37,278,694).

(B) PEARSON COLLEGE OF THE PACIFIC U.S. FOUNDATION

The College receives contributions from the Pearson College of the Pacific U.S. Foundation (the "U.S. Foundation") to supplement its fundraising activities. The College has an economic interest in the U.S. Foundation. The U.S. Foundation is a separate tax-exempt organization formed to raise funds for furthering the interests of the College and to provide operating and capital grant funding to the College. The College provides certain administrative services without charge to the U.S. Foundation. During 2011 the U.S. Foundation contributed \$61,678 (2010 - \$126,461) to the Operating Fund and \$488 (2010 - \$nil) to the Capital Fund. As at June 30, 2011, the U.S. Foundation's net assets were \$nil (2010 - \$nil).

NOTE 5

VANCOUVER FOUNDATION – LESTER B. PEARSON COLLEGE OF THE PACIFIC SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT FUND

A Lester B. Pearson College of the Pacific Scholarship Endowment Fund was established with the Vancouver Foundation. In accordance with the provisions of the Vancouver Foundation Act, the fund balance of \$1,160,000 (2010 - \$1,160,000) (market value 2011 - \$1,605,814; 2010 - \$1,468,383) is held permanently by the Vancouver Foundation. A distribution is received annually by the College as scholarship revenue.
