FULL SUN CONTAINER ATTRACTIVE FOLIAGE DRY TOLERANT

FEATURES:

- Long flowering - masses of deep blue flower spikes throughout warmer months.
- Dry tolerant and frost hardy once established.
- Forms a tight, compact mound of foliage which is aromatic when crushed.
- Hardy and easy to grow.

SUGGESTED USES:

- Mass plant for long lasting colour impact.
- Mixed perennial borders.
- Fast results for new gardens.
- Aromatic or sensory gardens.
- Coastal zones.
- Large containers or general garden use.

CULTURAL CARE

Grows well in most soil types which are moist but well draining. Best colour is achieved in a sunny location. Prune hard in late winter to encourage a new, fresh flush of foliage.

An application of slow release fertiliser during early spring is recommended for best performance. Not tolerant of high humidity.

Salvia nemerosa varieties are some of the most compact and showy of this large family commonly known as sage. Flowering begins from early summer and continues through to autumn. Reblooming is faster with regular deheading of spent flower spikes. They add a nice vertical element to the front of a mixed border and can be cultivated well in containers if preferred. To emphasise blooms plant with contrasting plants such as the silvery foliage of Santolina 'Little Silver', Buddlieja 'Silver Anniversary' leaves or a perhaps a low growing ground cover such as a member of the Convolvulus MOON collection.
