Written in late Caroline minuscule. 1-line initials are in brown rustic capitals filled or dotted with red; the lower loop of the letter "g" is usually dotted with red. Punctuation consists of the punctus, punctus elevatus and punctus interrogativus.

The fragment was used as a wrapper for a thick volume measuring ca. 175 x 95 mm. The name "Laymann" and the letter "C" are written on the spine.
