

SOUTH AFRICA, POLITICS, AND DIVESTMENT

Potluck dinner and discussion with Mfundi Vundla and Dumisani Kumalo

Mfundi Vundla, Program Coordinator for the Funding Exchange/ National Community Funds and member of the African National Congress (ANC), will speak on the current political situation in South Africa. Mfundi will outline the nature of domestic opposition within South Africa and the anti-apartheid activities being carried out by the trade unions, the ANC, the churches and other groups. He will also discuss South Africa's economic and military aggression towards the "frontline" countries (Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Namibia, Botswana, Angola, and Lesotho).

Dumisani Kumalo, Project Director for the Africa Fund (associated with the American Committee on Africa) and former South African journalist, will speak about divestment of funds from corporations in South Africa. Dumisani has spoken extensively throughout the country on this issue and will address the social and economic consequences of corporate investments and U.S. bank loans to South Africa and the results of divestment campaigns to date.
